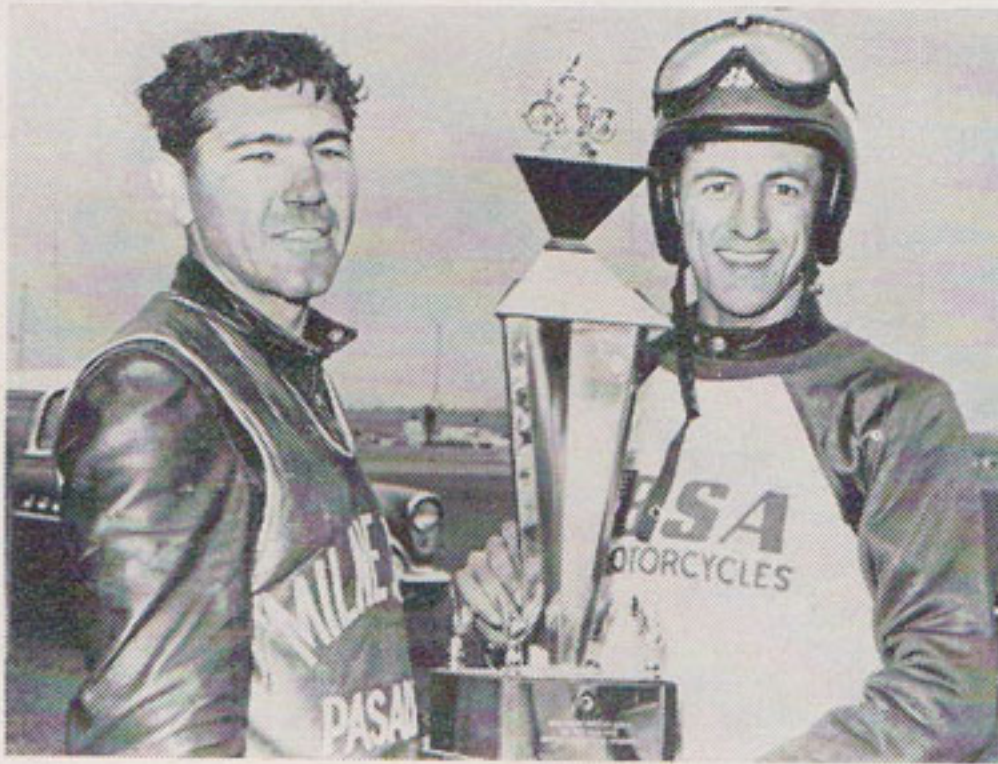

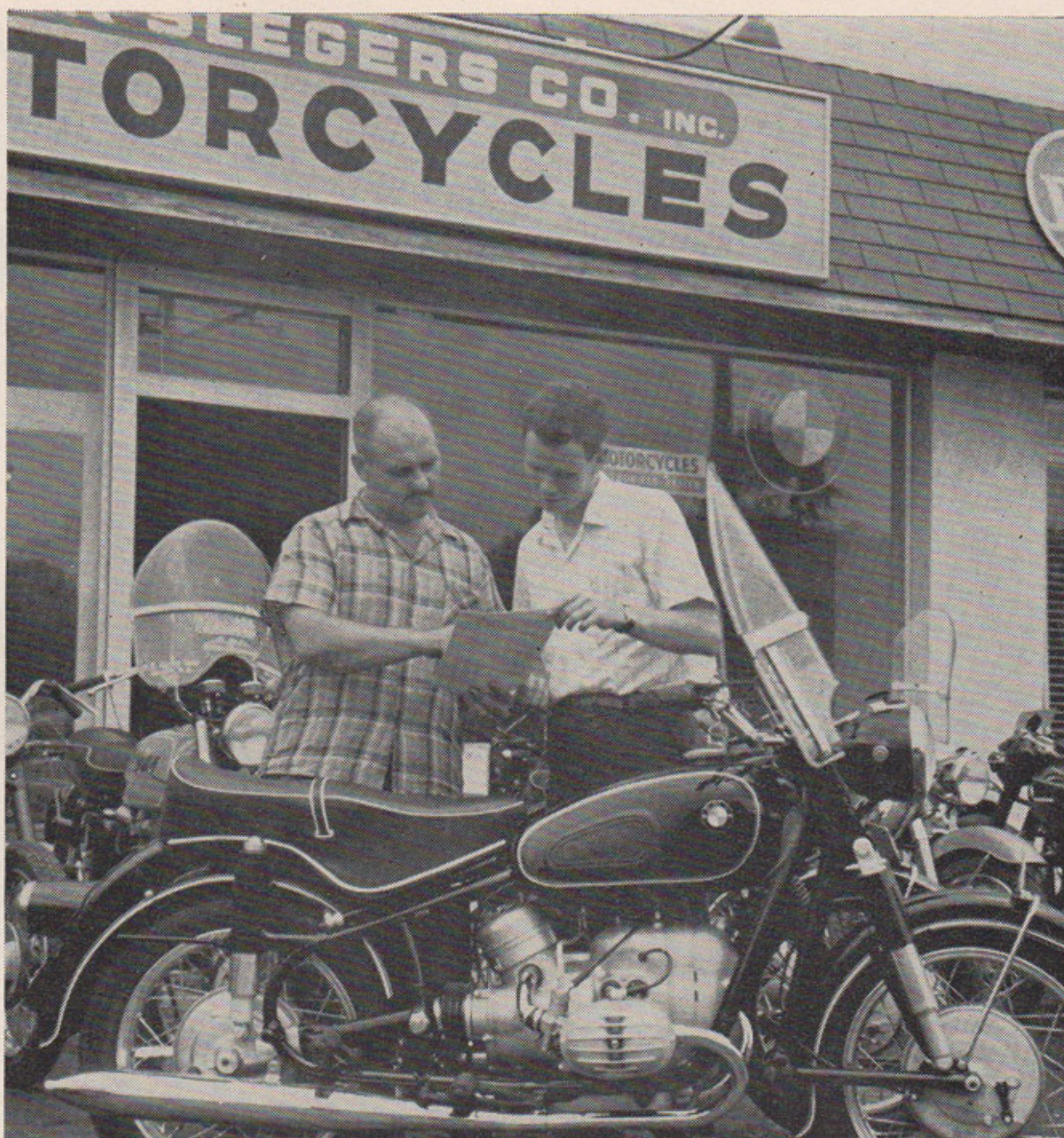

The Finish Line



Motorcycling will again hit the "big time" in the June issue of SEVENTEEN magazine, a publication for young people that has a circulation of more than 1,000,000 readers.

The magazine will feature a story entitled "The Young Adventurers" which will include a feature on Jody Nicholas, Nashville, Tenn., youngster who finished sixth at Daytona in his first test as an expert rider this year. Young Nicholas, who was featured in a cover story in AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING last June, is an accomplished violinist and a college student at the University of the South at Sewanee, Tenn.

Jody will share honors in the SEVENTEEN feature with three other young men — a fencer, a rock climber and a parachute jumper.

While at Daytona, free lance photographer Kim Massie spent several days with Nicholas, shooting scores of pictures showing Jody at the track, working on his machine, during the actual race, and in leisure moments.

After two national championships Ralph White is leading the national point standings with 12 points — a third at Daytona and second at Bossier City. Don Burnett, by winning Daytona and placing sixth at Bossier City, holds down second place in the standings with 10 points. Carroll Resweber is third with nine points from the 130-miler and Roger Reiman holds fourth place with eight points. Rounding off the present list are Dick Mann, 7 points; Bart Markel, 3; Sid Payne and Larry Williamson, tied with 2; and Jody Nicholas, 1 point.

Old Timers Plan Rally

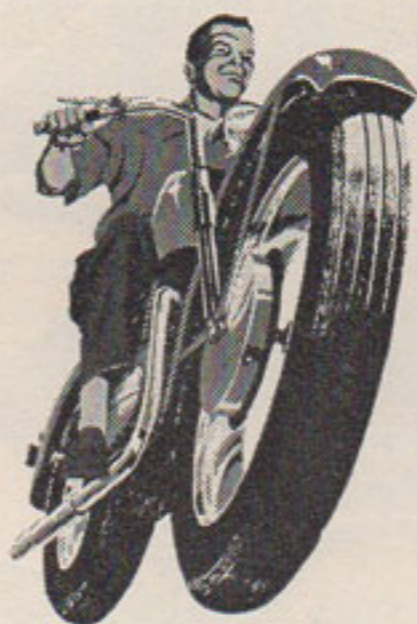

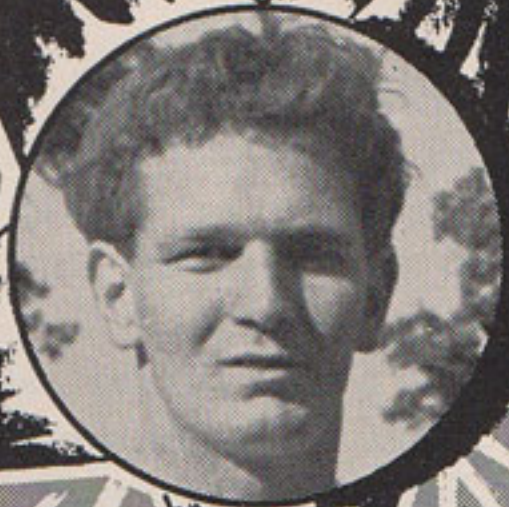

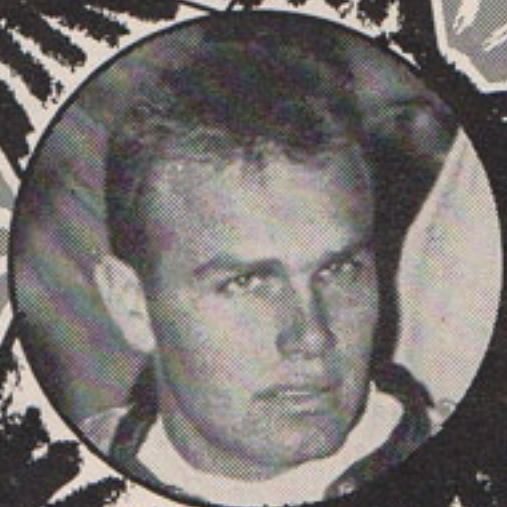

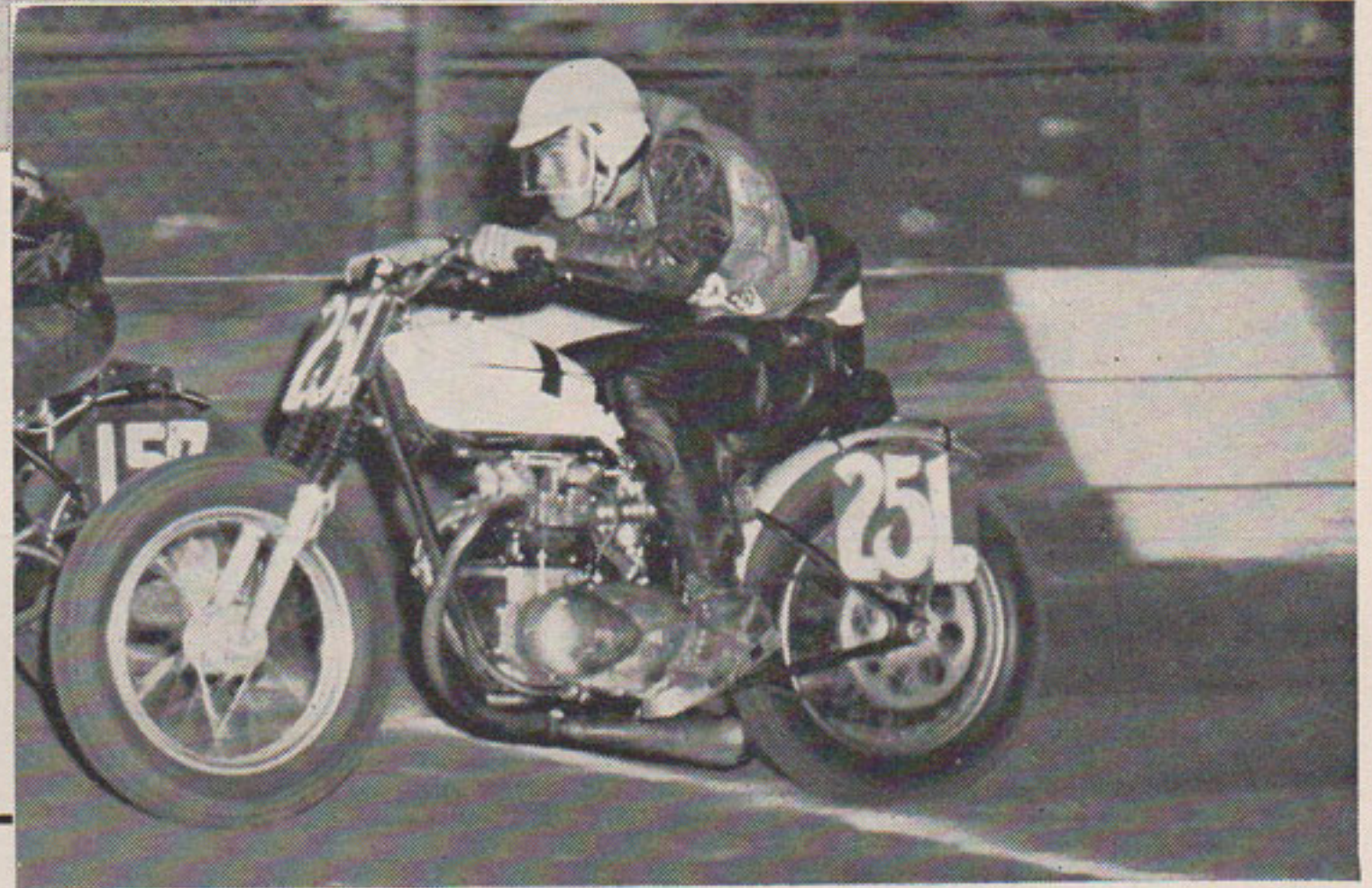

← Edward Clifford, 88, demonstrates Triumph "Go" as he leads pack through a turn, in a recent short-track race held in the East.

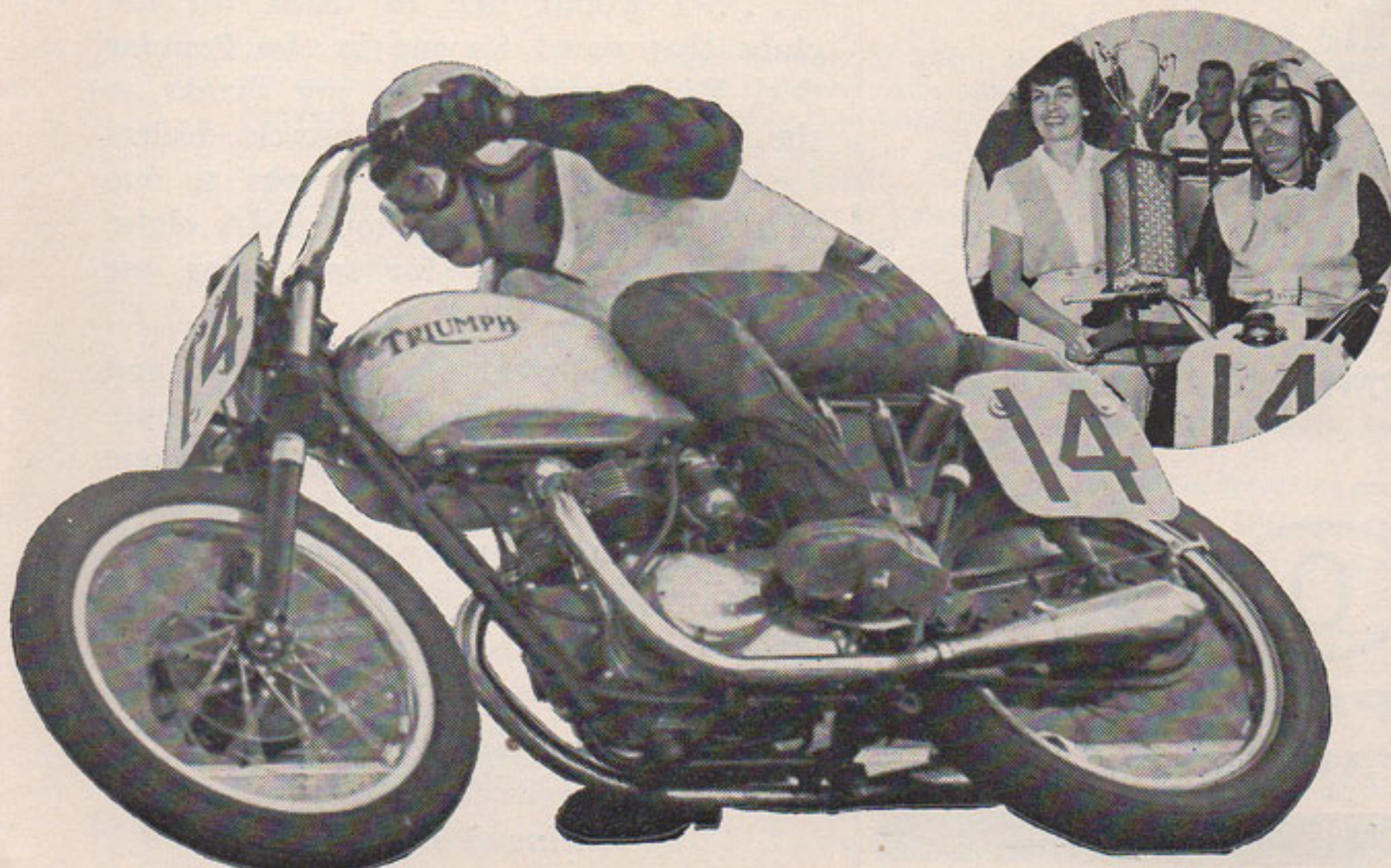

As always members of the AMA and those that join at the rally will receive the free tour award.

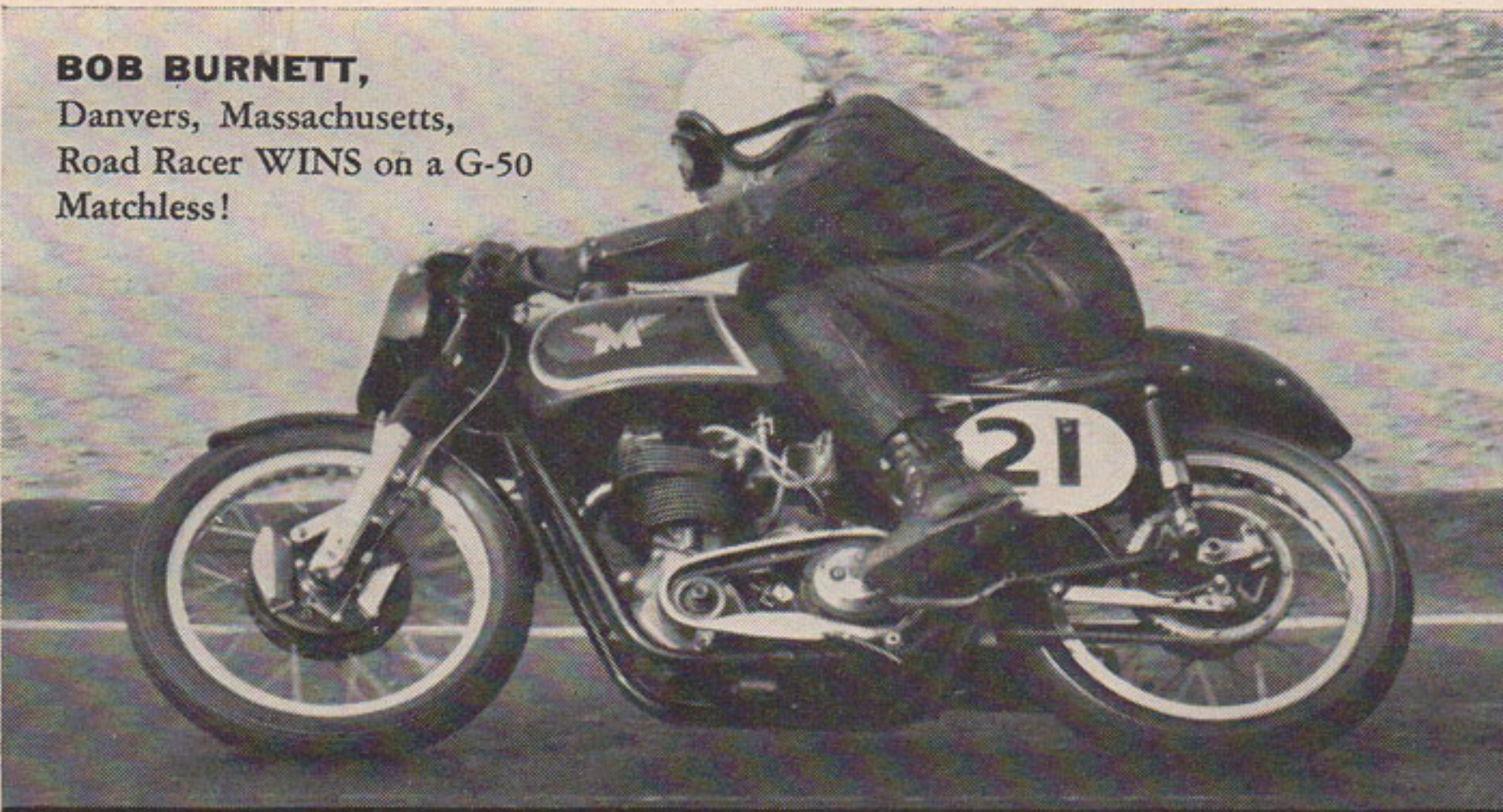

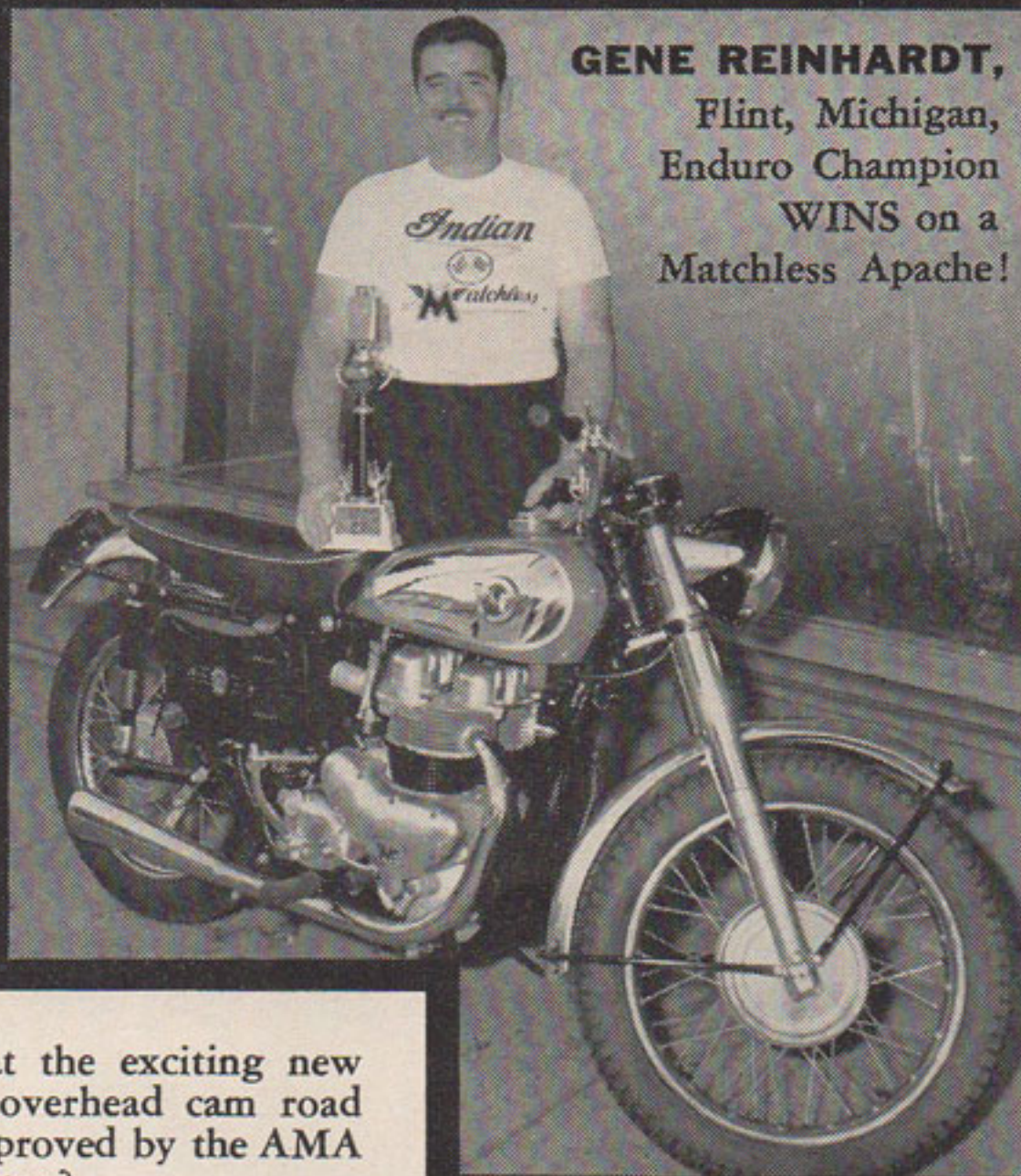

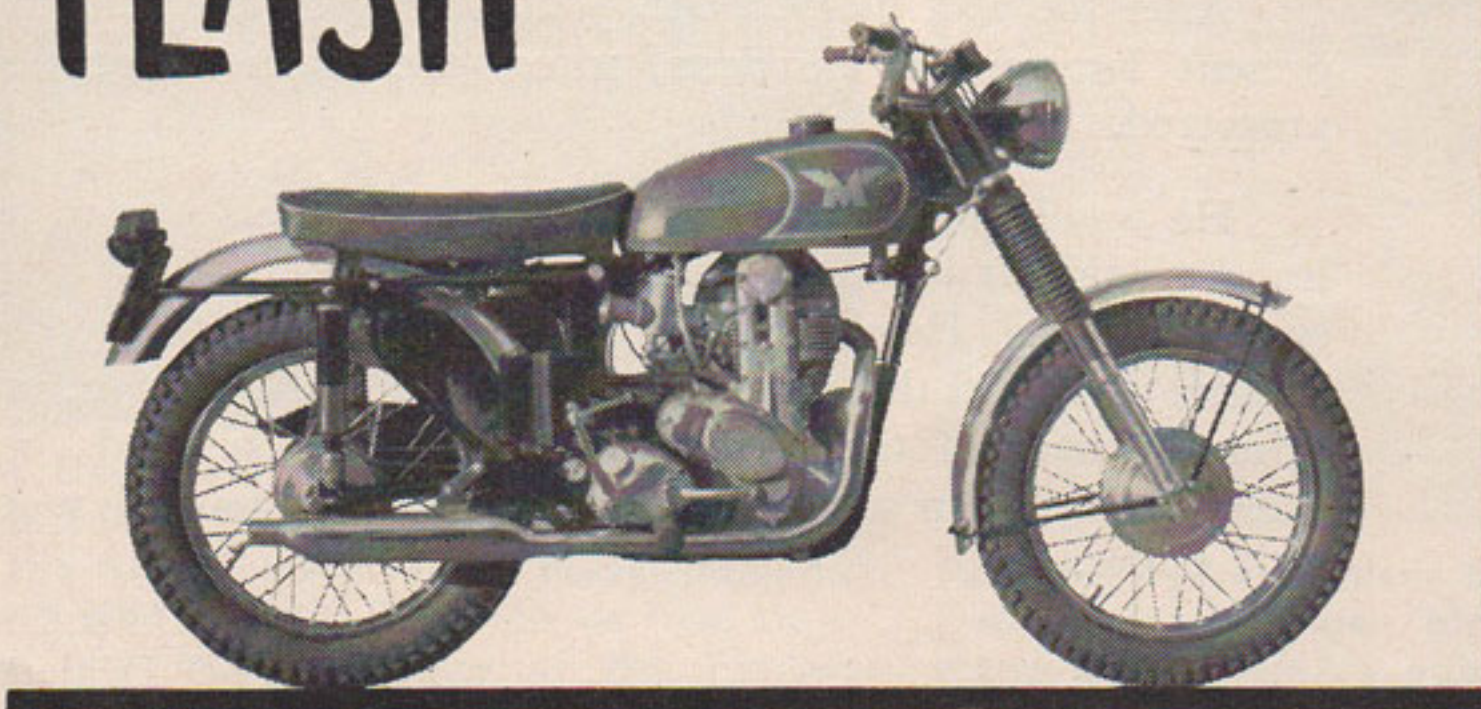

William E. "Bill" Johnson Jr.

Pioneer West Coast Importer



William E. "Bill" Johnson, Jr.

WILLIAM E. JOHNSON, JR., president of Johnson Motors, Inc., died on March 4, 1962, at the age of 57 after suffering what at first seemed to be a mild stroke.

Surviving him are his widow, Vivien, of La Canada, Calif., a sister Mrs. Florence Salsbury, a niece Mrs. Florence Dietz and a nephew Clarence Fleming, vice-president of Johnson Motors, Inc.

Mr. Johnson graduated from Stanford University and the University of Southern California Law School. He was admitted to the California State Bar in 1932 and practiced law in Los Angeles for five years before entering the motorcycle business in 1938.

However, his interest in motorcycling started in 1936 while on a trip to Hawaii where he became interested in a motor-scooter called the Salsbury. Johnson finally purchased one from Foster Salsbury who eventually became his brother-in-law and close friend. From this association grew a keen interest to learn more about two-wheeled motorized vehicles of all types and he became an avid reader of British motorcycle trade and technical publications.

The natural outcome was that in 1937 he purchased an Ariel Square Four and from this experience he became convinced there was a market in the U.S. for British motorcycles.

In 1938, he formed a company in Pasadena, California, with the help of Mr. Wilber J. Ceder, general manager and secretary-treasurer of Johnson Motors, Inc., which was called British and American Motors, later to be known as Johnson Motors, Inc. Although some British motorcycles were imported to the U.S. prior to the formation of his company, his was the first commercial venture which launched a new era in the U.S. motorcycle business.

By 1940, the business was moved to 1240 W. Pico Blvd. in Los Angeles where during the war they engaged in war work. This building no longer exists as the property now is part of the Los Angeles Harbor Freeway system.

After the war, in 1946, Mr. Johnson moved the firm to its present location in Pasadena, where the business grew and prospered.

He was highly respected in the trade and his passing will leave a void for his many friends and associates in the motorcycle fraternity. Heading the long list of motorcycle industry leaders, who paid their respects, was Mr. Edward Turner, managing director of the Triumph Engineering Co., Ltd., with whom Mr. Johnson was closely associated throughout his motorcycle career.

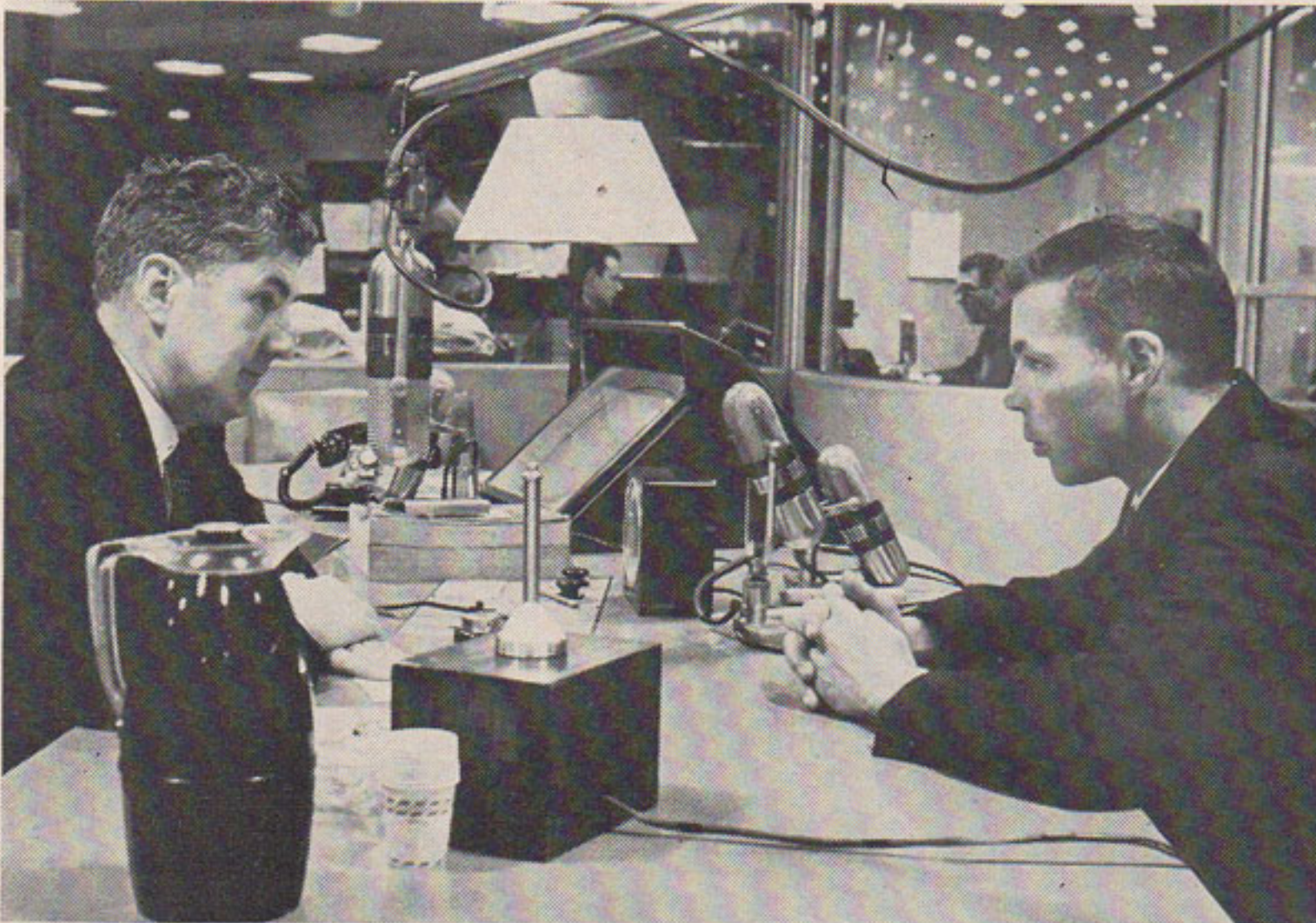

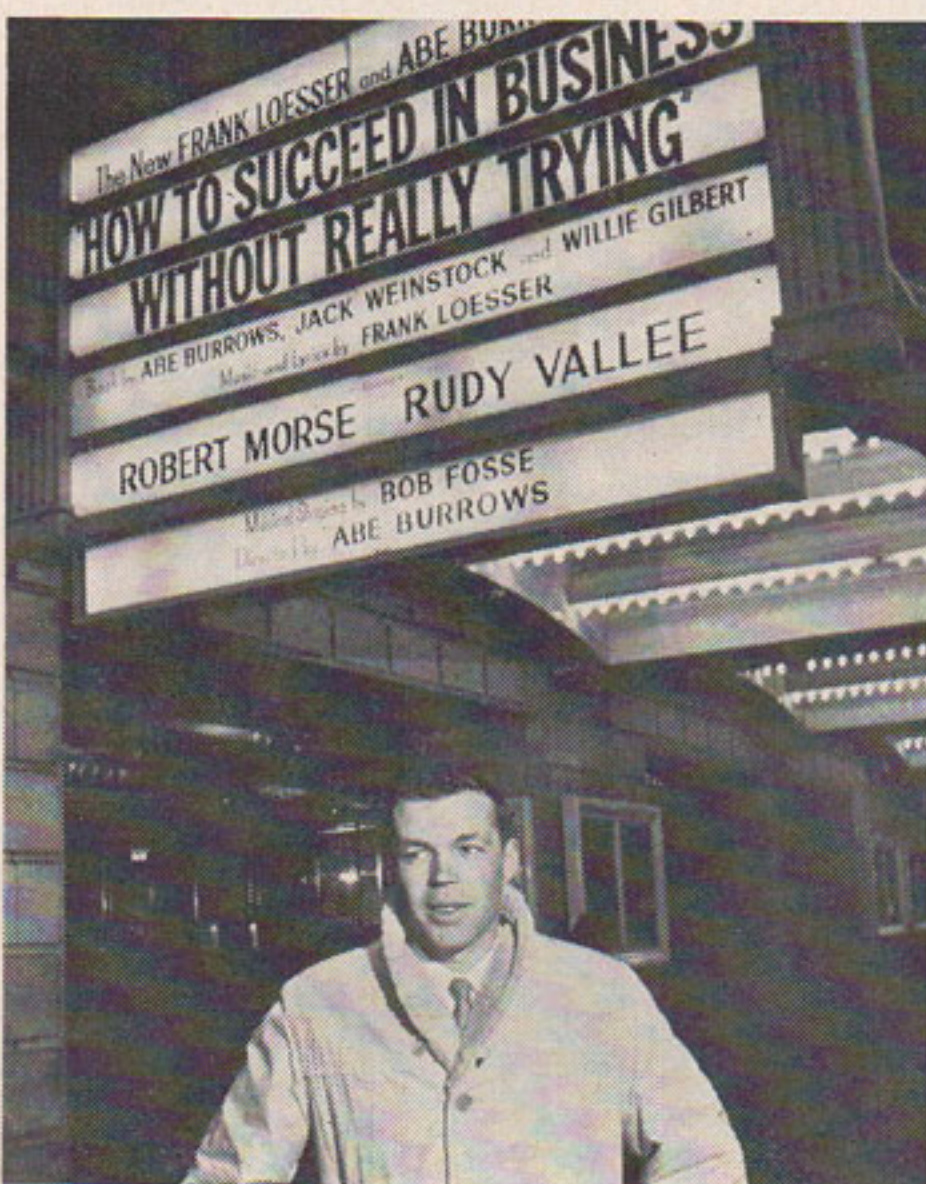

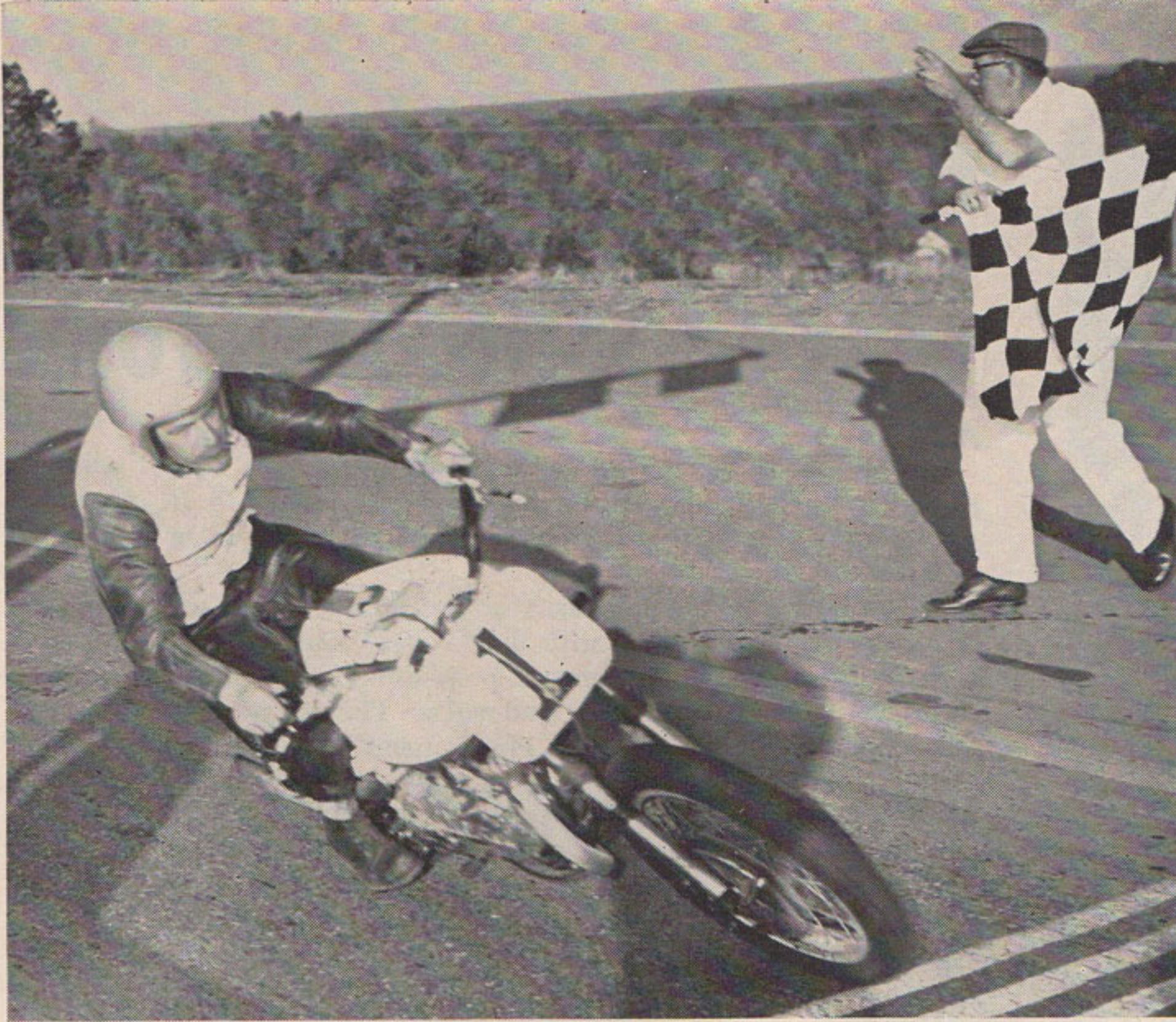

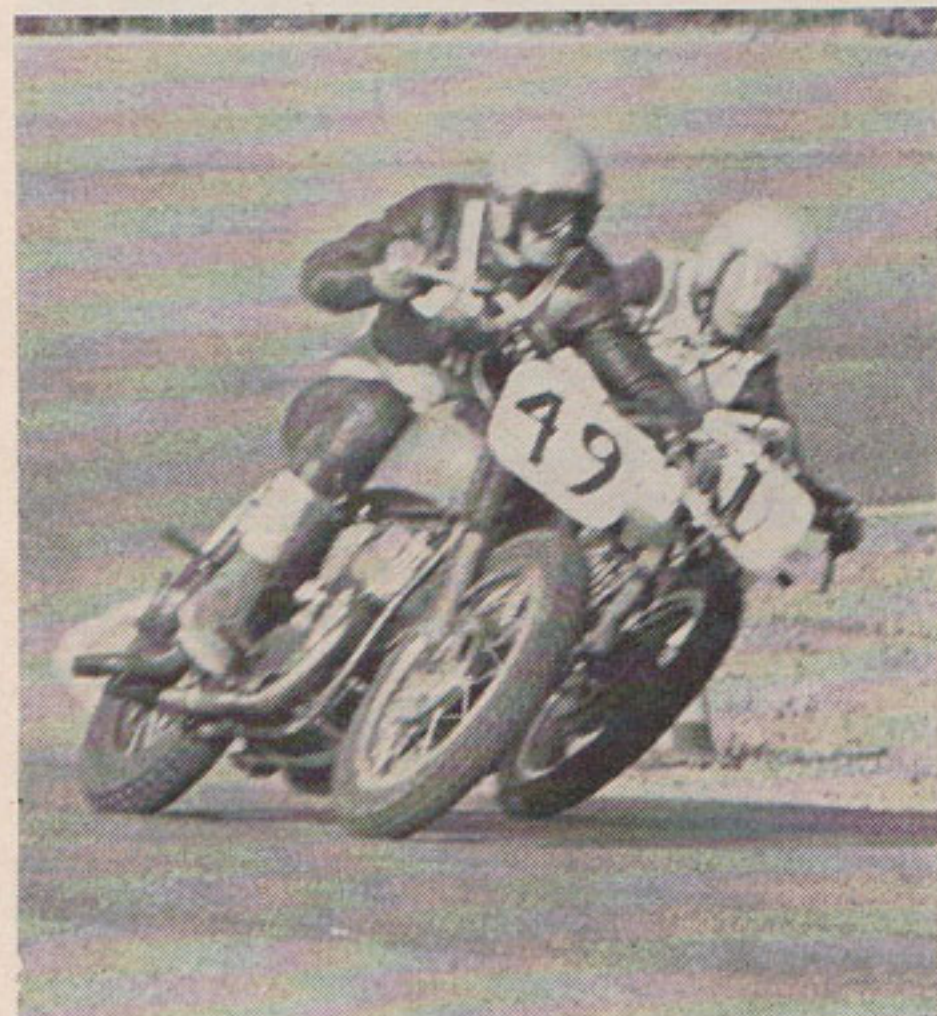

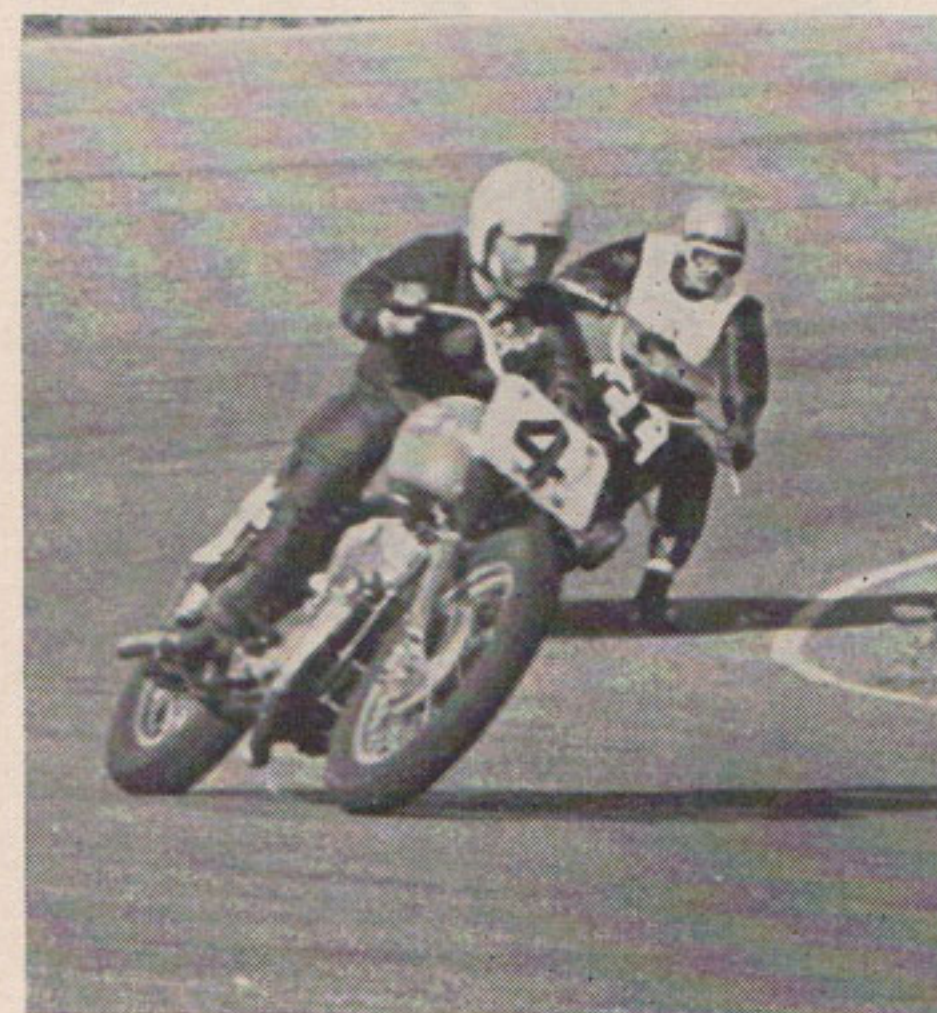

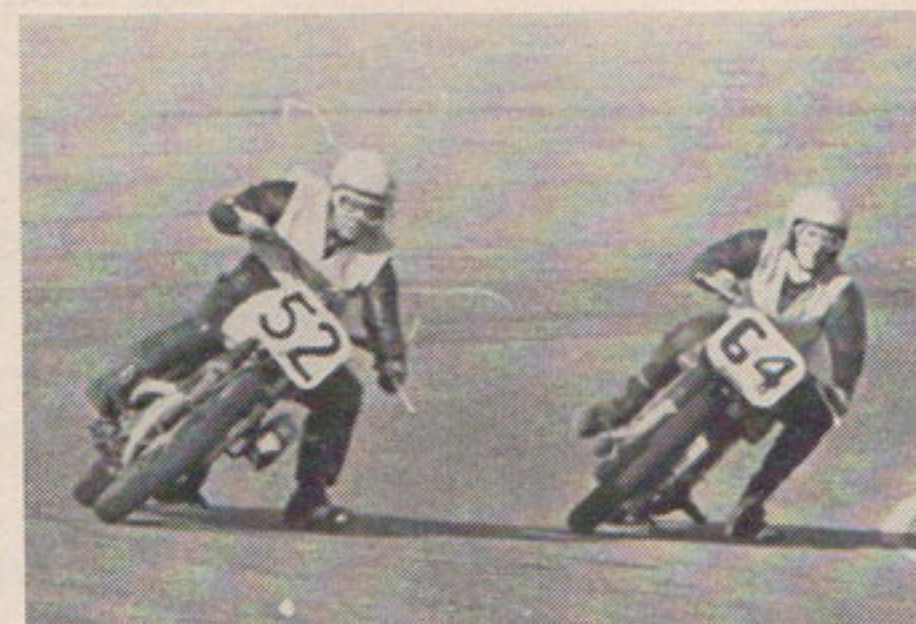

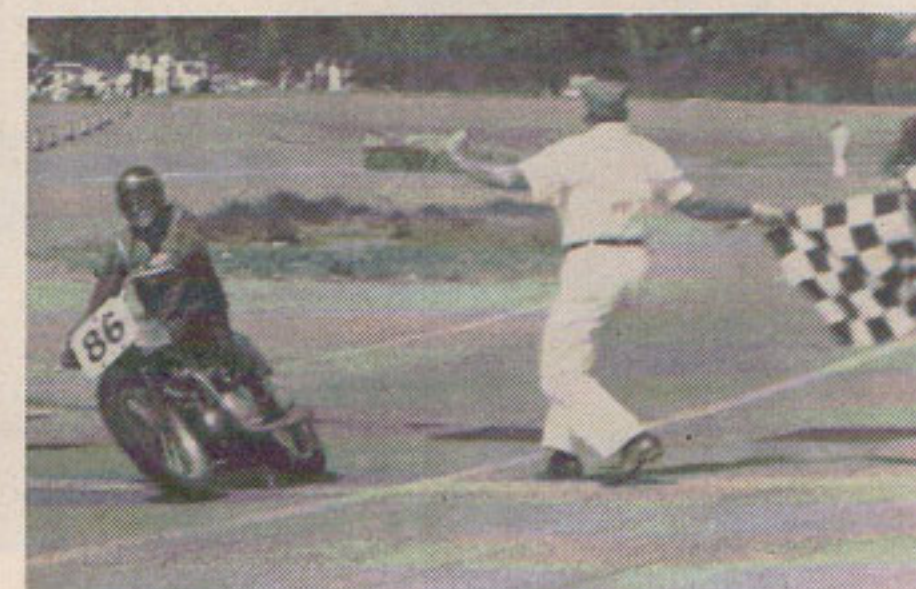

Resweber Wins 130-Mile Crown At Hilltop Raceway

CARROLL RESWEBER, Cedarburg, Wis., Harley-Davidson mounted, in a most convincing manner annexed the 130-mile national championship April 14, on the Louisiana Hilltop Raceway at Bossier City, La.

Starting in the pole position, earned by a new course record qualifying lap of 1:48.41, Resweber covered the distance in 1 hour, 59 minutes and 31.98 seconds for an average speed of 65.26 mph.

Resweber ran the race without a pit stop and led 64 of the 65 laps, missing only the first which went to Larry Williamson. Williamson hung on to the 13th lap when Ralph White took over and finished in the runner-up spot. At one time White was only five and one-half seconds behind but when the checkered flag fell he was trailing by a mile. Holding third was Roger Reiman who picked up the decision for this spot over Markel and Williamson.

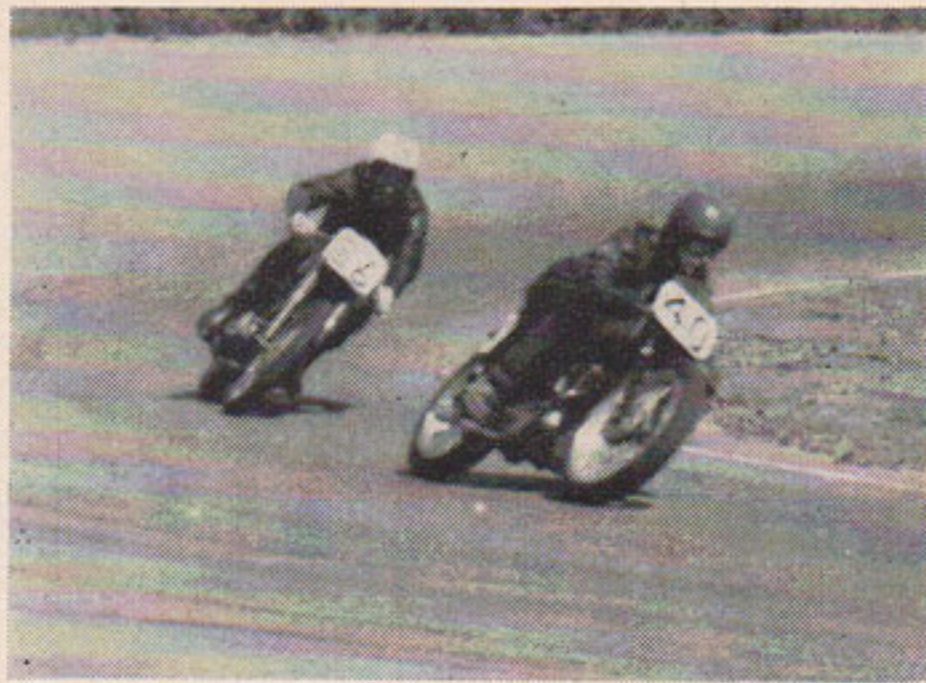
The main position battle then developed between Markel, Harley-Davidson and Mann, Matchless, for fourth place. After battling wheel-to-wheel for the last 25 laps, Mann ran out of gas short of the finish line and had to push his bike across for fifth spot. Eleven times Markel and Mann changed positions with Markel pulling ahead on the turns and Mann pulling out on the straightaways.

When the checkered flag dropped Resweber was several laps ahead of the field with the exception of his immediate pursuers White, Reiman, Markel and Mann.

Prior to the national, Triumph mounted Tony Dennis of Denver, Colo., won the 60-mile amateur event in 58 minutes, 06.51 seconds for an average speed of 61.94 mph. Following him home in order were Dale Norlund, Bobby Davis and Dave Estep.

In the combined 20-mile sportsman lightweight event Jess Thomas, riding a Motobi, took command in the fourth lap and came home the overall and class 4 winner in 12 min., 53 sec. Bill Powers riding sixth overall won class 2. In the class 5 30-mile Sportsman race Jimmy Cook took the lead, on his Honda, in the second lap and was never headed. Cook's time was 34:08.

Following the Sportsman, the novice event saw Howard Utsey cross the finish line in 29:24.47. Utsey pushed his BSA out front in the opening lap and remain-

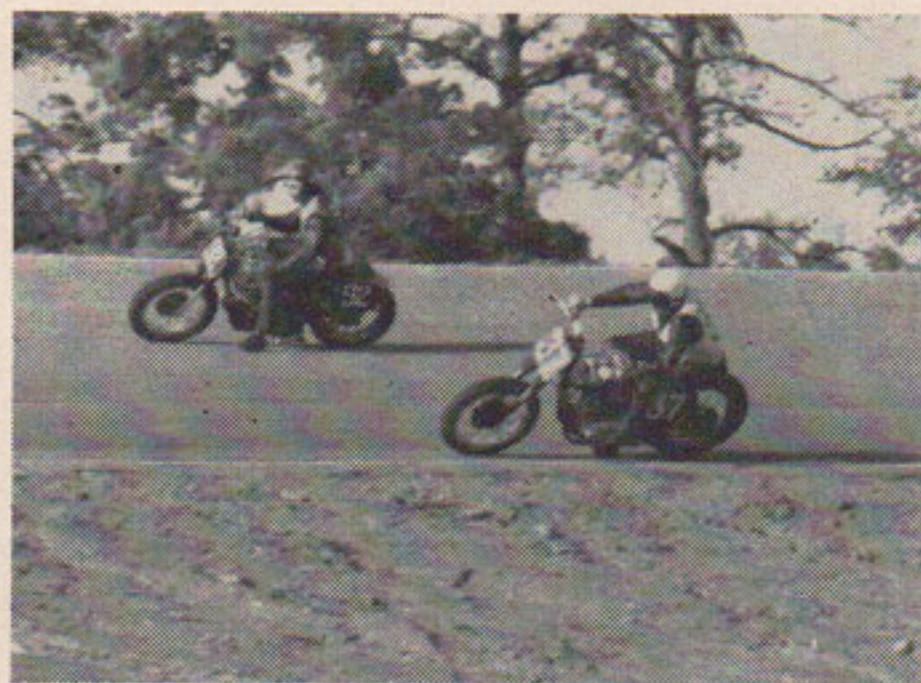


Cliff Guild leads Jess Thomas, but not for long as Thomas moves well ahead to win.

ed there for the 15 laps. By the second circuit Bill Jasper, on a Harley-Davidson, moved up to second and dogged Utsey's heels the rest of the way. Twice Jasper almost lost control but recovered to keep on the pressure. Utsey in winning duplicated his victory at Daytona where he scored in the novice 70-miler.

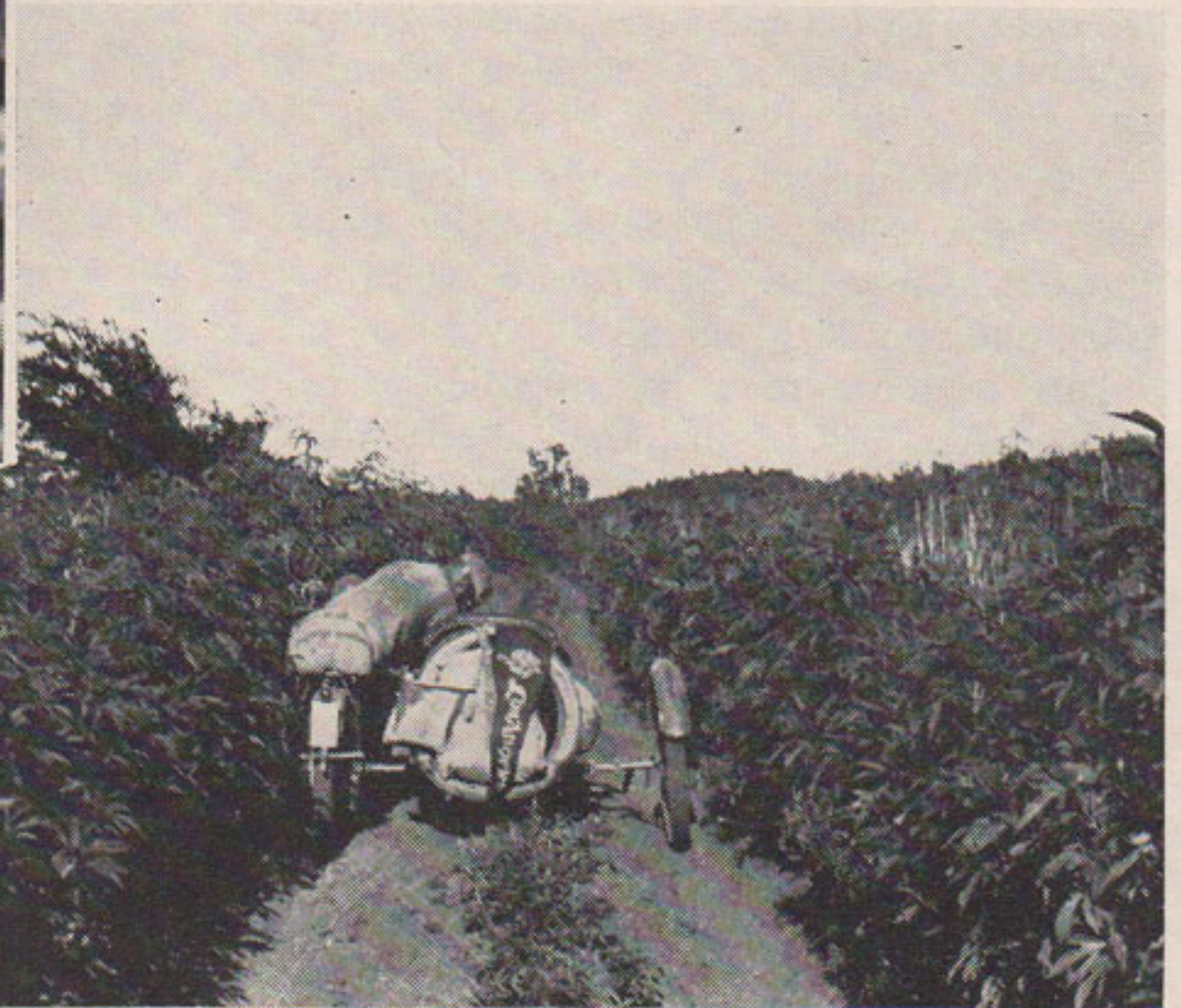

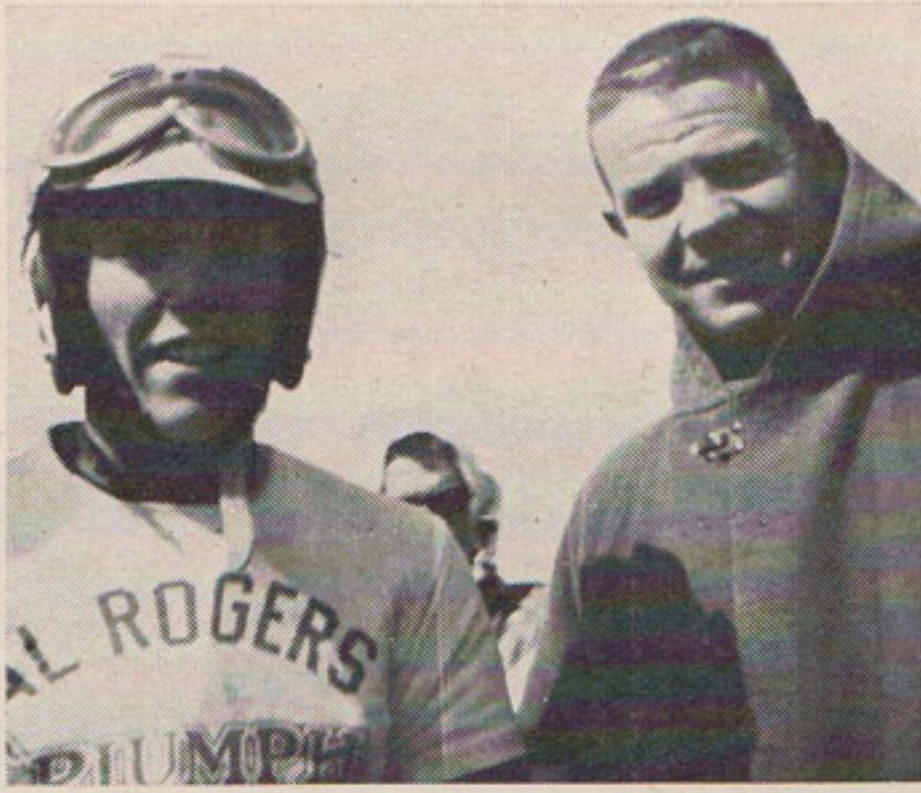

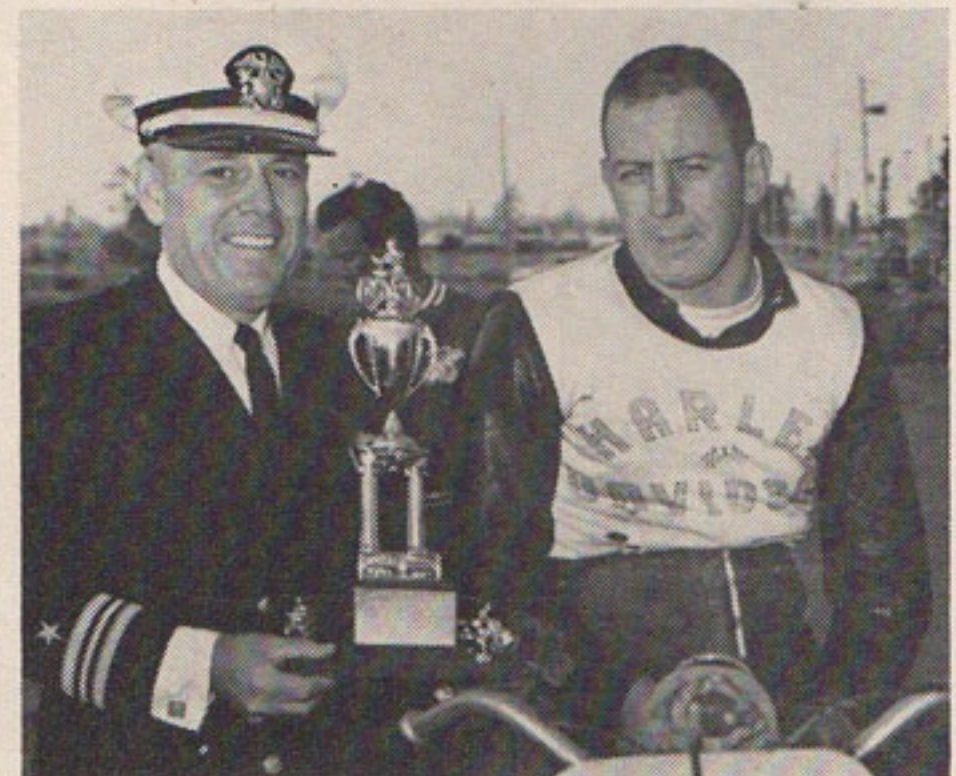
Dave Estep of Columbus, Ohio, roared to the amateur division finals first place and also won his amateur heat. Marshall Lamm of Richmond, Va., was second.

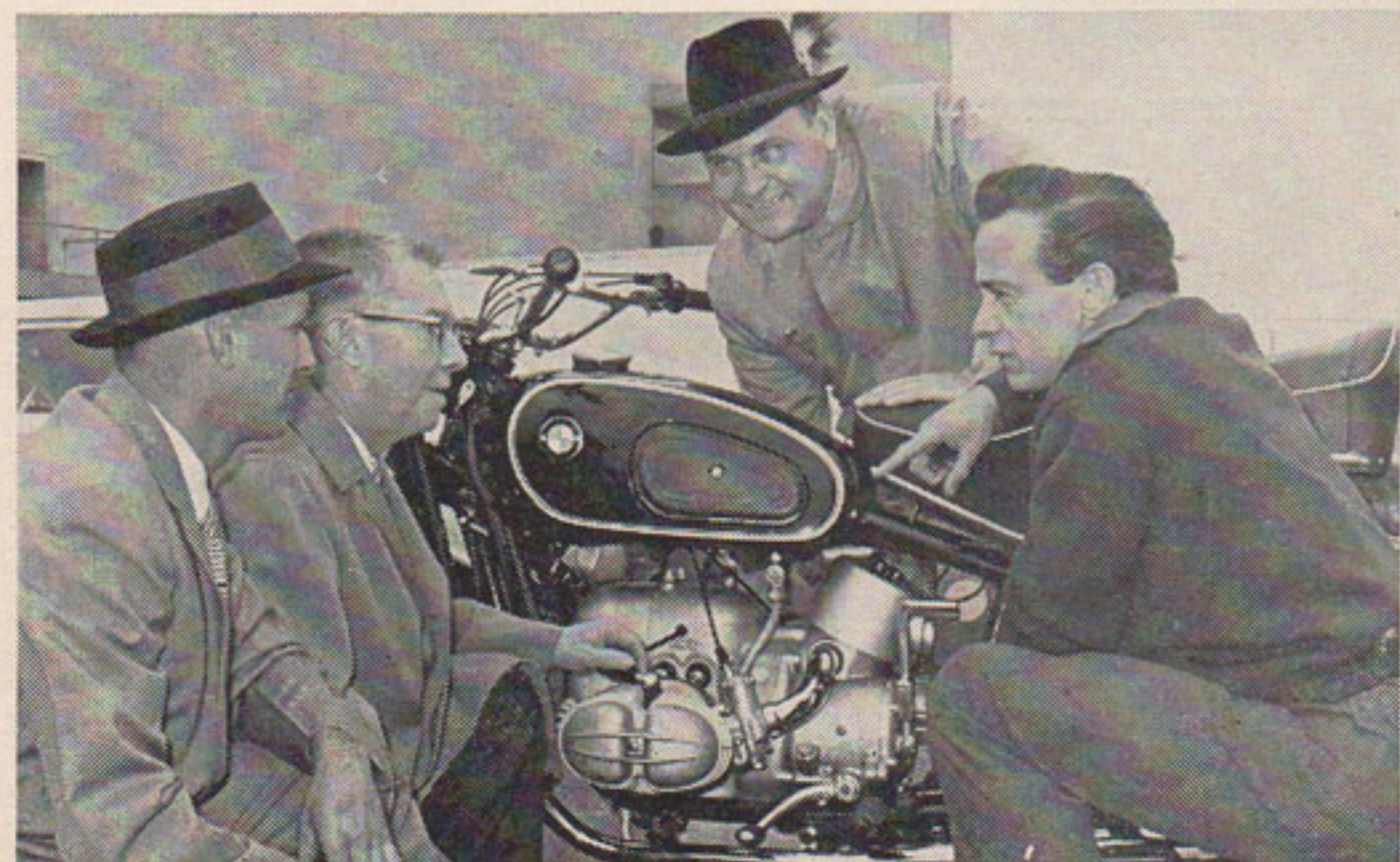

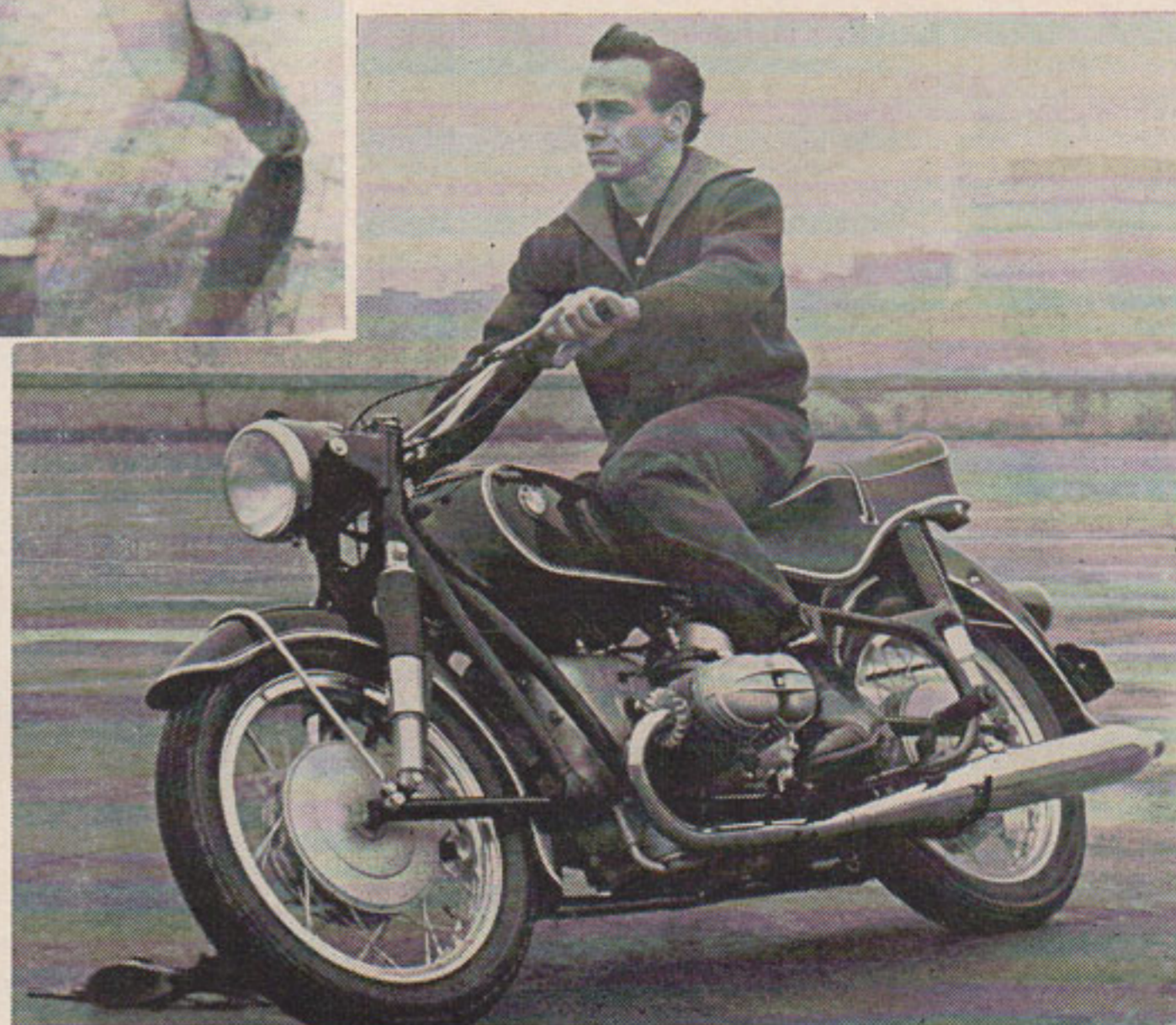

Wrestler Takes To The Hills

Ray Stevens, who holds the title of U.S. heavyweight champ, qualifies as an expert villain in the wrestling world. Just ask any pro grappling fan. They recoil at the sound of his name.

But these same grunt-and-groan followers might be surprised that Stevens does not spend his idle hours terrorizing neighbors, beating his mother-in-law or kicking harmless canines.

The abundantly-muscled Stevens spends his spare time in the saddle of a motorcycle . . . or in a garage working on one.

Ray is not a hellcat on wheels either. You won't find him leading a leather-jacketed assault on an unsuspecting town.

When he settled in Haywood, Calif., he was immediately impressed by the local terrain.

"These hills are ideal for motorcycling," thought Ray, who has been a devotee of the two-wheeler since his adolescence.

So the 26-year-old grappler dropped into Aubrey Isham's Harley-Davidson Shop and met the proprietor, a three-time national hillclimbing champ.

Isham introduced Stevens to hillclimbing as an organized sport and Ray was an immediate convert. He now competes reg-

ularly with the Roughriders MC in sportsman hillclimbs as well as endurance runs.

And Stevens now has a convert of his own in Jay York, a wrestling cohort who wrestles under the name of "The Alaskan". York had been riding only one week when

he attempted the hillclimb grind and turned in a creditable time, according to his wrestling buddy.

Ray has been competing in "sportsman hillclimbs" and Isham hopes to graduate Stevens to the novice professional class by spring but it would still be a sideline.

"This is just a hobby," says blonde Ray. "Wrestling is too profitable to give up."

In fact, Stevens hopes to labor on the mats for another 20 years, if possible. Actually, Stevens is well-experienced in wrestling for his 26 years. He started young — at 16 — and hit the top early — at 18.

Ray has blossomed into one of the top gate attractions in the mat circuit. He holds the record for drawing the biggest crowds wherever he has wrestled in California and that included the Cow Palace, where he headlined a card that set an all-time gate record for that arena of 17,044.

One may wonder what sort of a reception this villain of the canvas is accorded when he shows up on a motorcycle for a hillclimbing event.

"I keep my helmet on most of the time. Otherwise I'd get too many beefs," says Stevens with a wry smile.

Ray also has a ready answer to the accusation that the pro grappling show is a phony one.

"Everything people see is the real thing. And so are the injuries," he adds, pointing out that he is recovering from a dislocated arm.

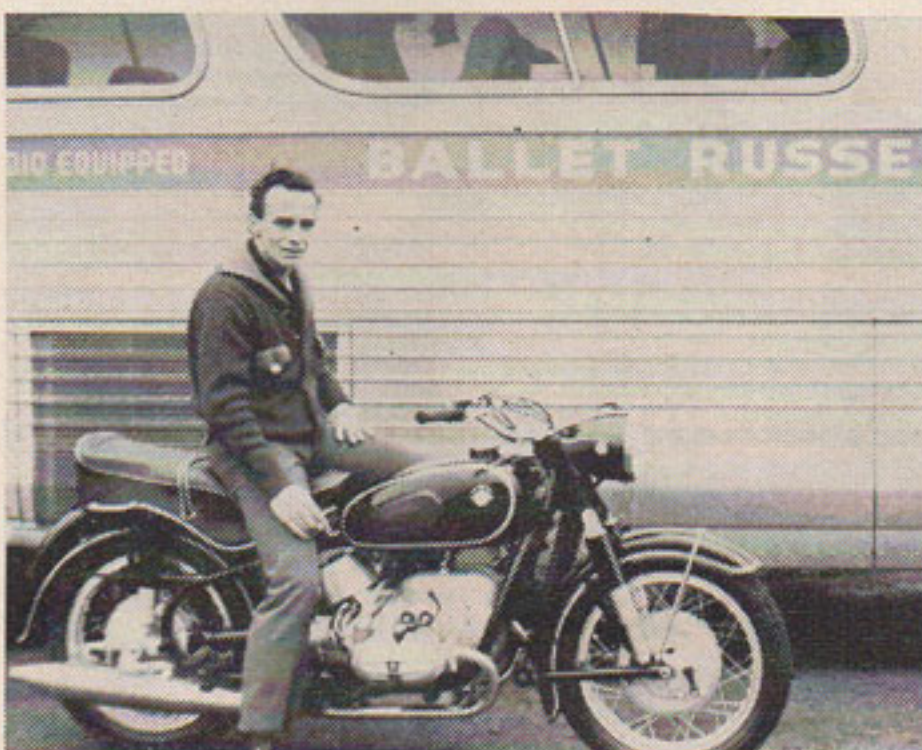
This was the biggest, brightest, most exciting evening in many young lives. After the performance they were really given the "Red Carpet" treatment. They were

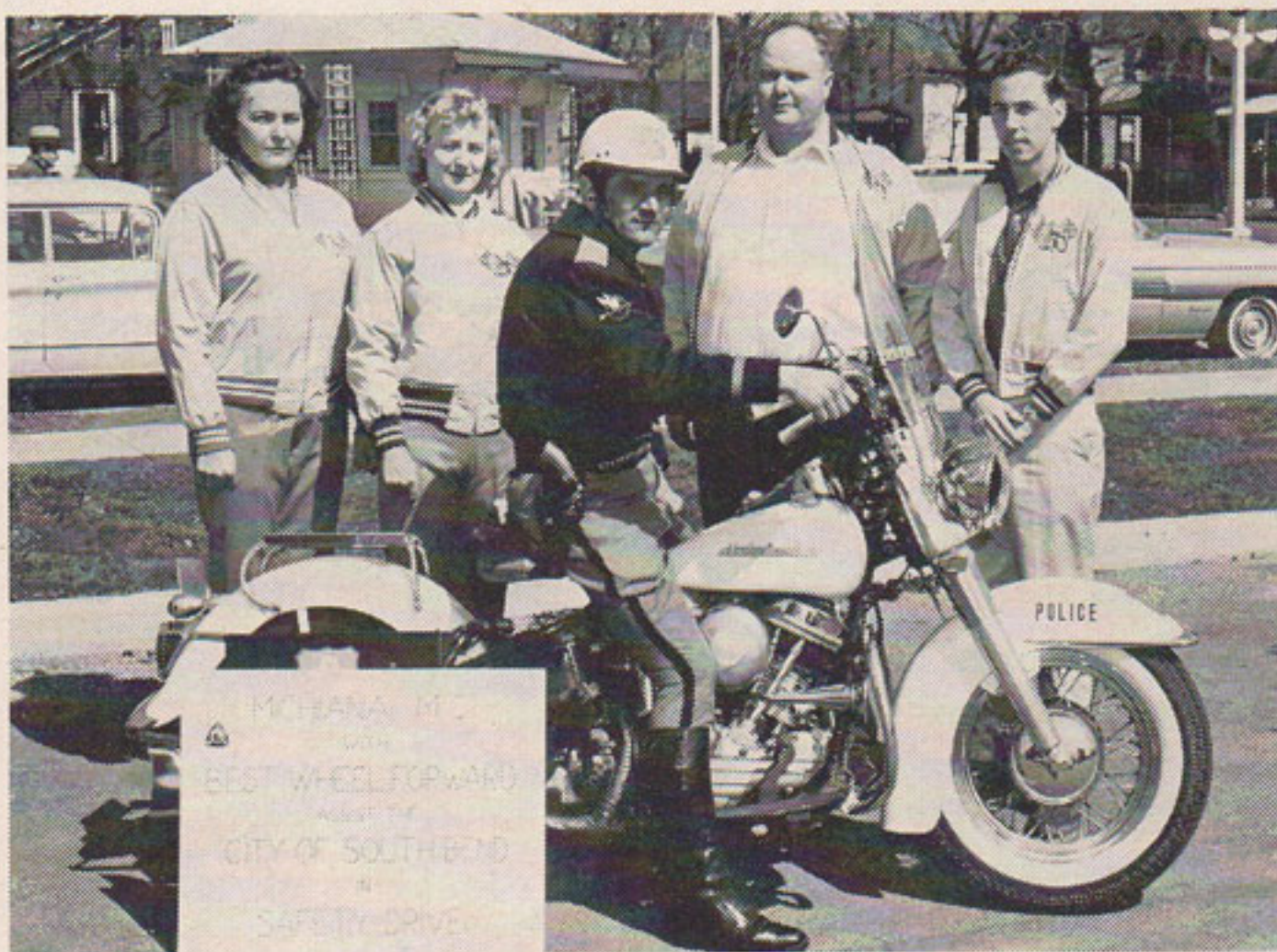

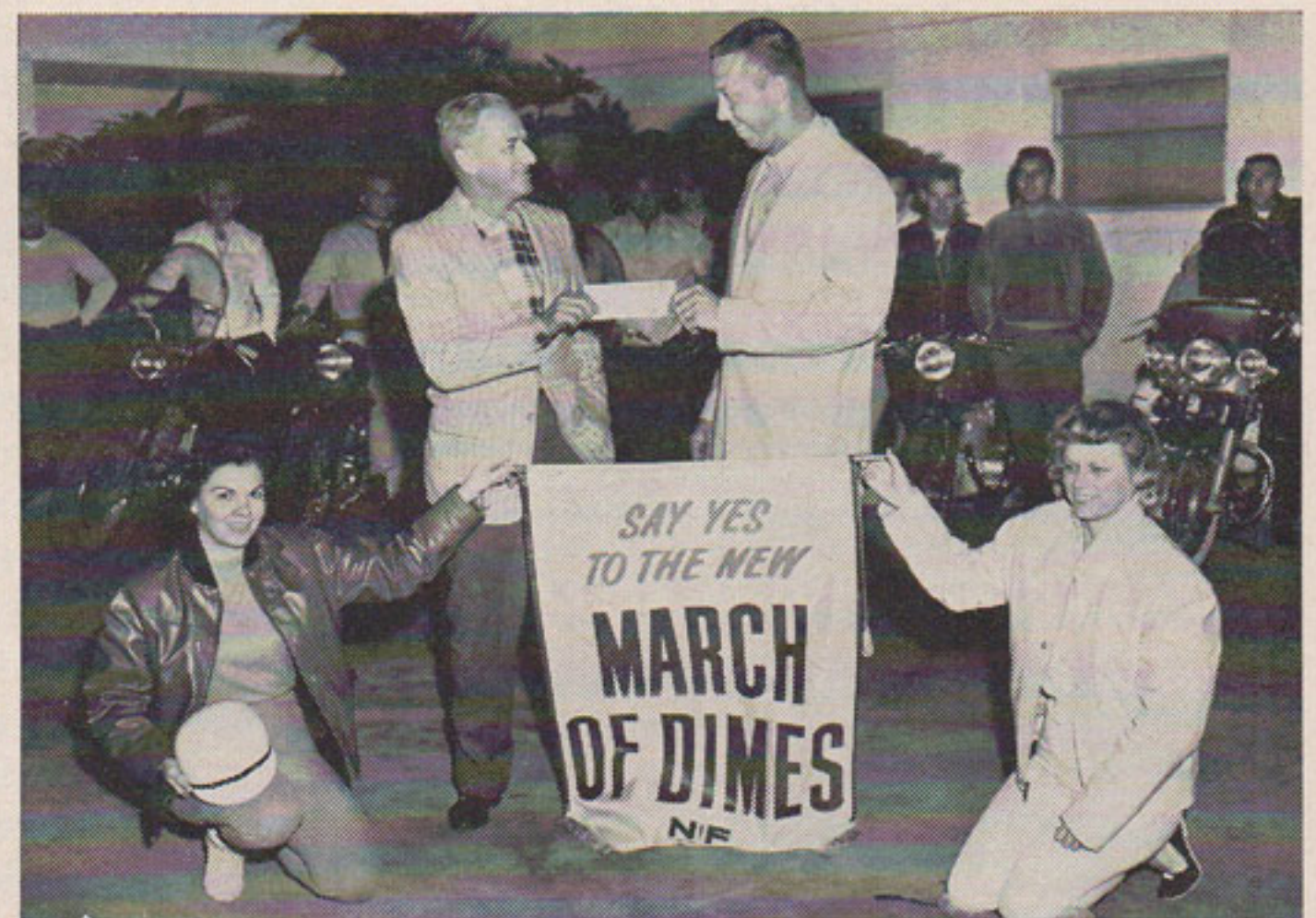

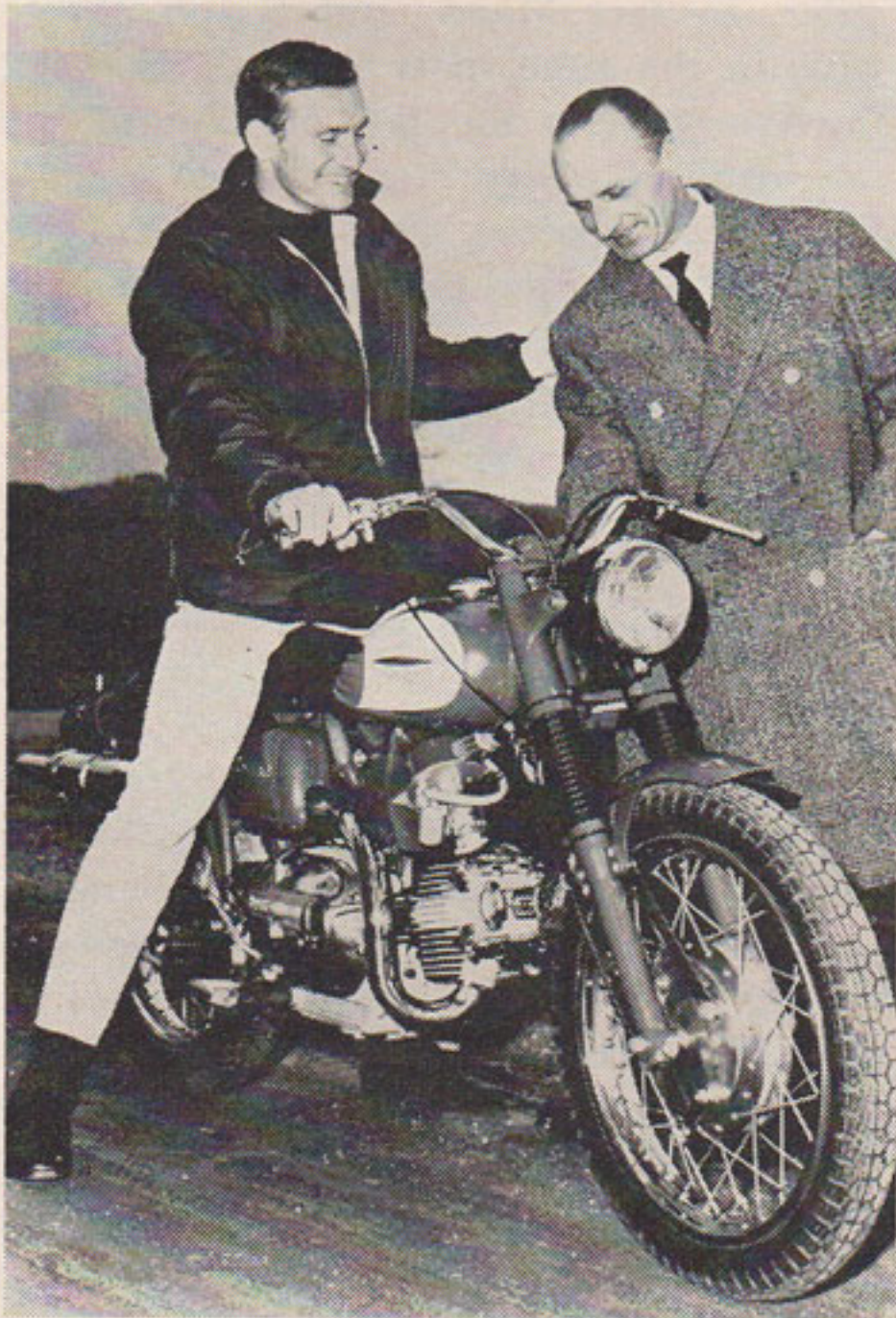
New Motorcycle From Harley-Davidson

The Sprint H, a new 250cc, is powered by a hotter version of the horizontally mounted, single cylinder, ohv engine used in the 250cc Harley-Davidson Sprint.

It has a cast iron cylinder head, aluminum alloy piston and forged steel connecting rod. Bore and stroke are the same (2.60 x 2.84 inches), with compression ratio raised to 9.2 to 1.

Designed for scramble, enduro and road riders, its minimum ground clearance is 5.3 inches, has bobbed fenders and 18-inch diameter wheels with off-the-road tires. Ball-end clutch and brake levers give a sure grip, and 1/8 inch diameter control cables stand up under hard use. The frame is reinforced to take the impact of jumps and the telescopic front fork and swinging arm rear suspension are hydraulically damped.

The backing plates for the 7-inch diameter front and rear brakes are designed to keep dirt and water out of the drums. Rubber sleeves protect the sliding joints of the front fork, and the Dell'Orto carburetor breathes through a shrouded air cleaner with a cleanable wire mesh filter. The exhaust system is carried high and dry on the rear fender, as is the plastic breather tube that vents the crankcase.

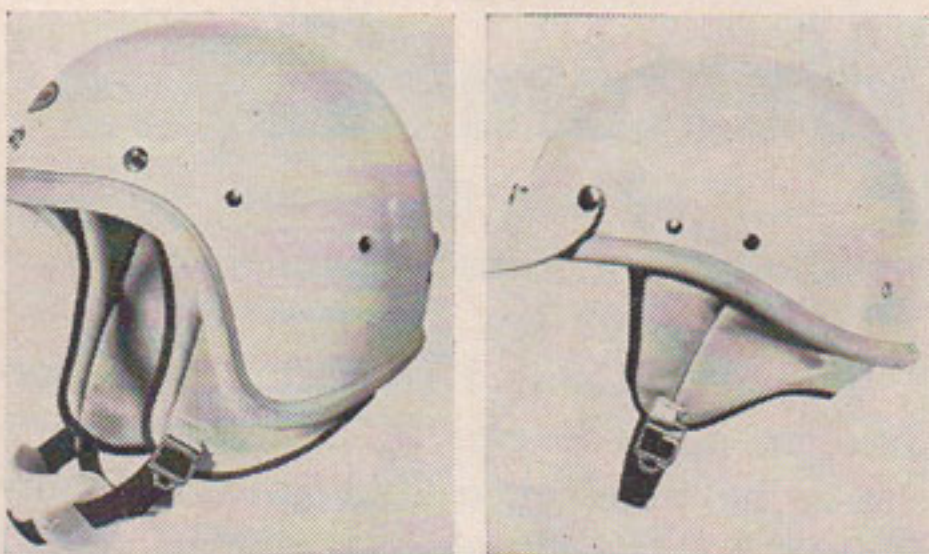

It is equipped with a dual beam headlight, combination tail light and stop light and a horn. Its generator output is rated at 60 watts, has an improved battery, and ignition is by spark coil and circuit breaker.

Power from the engine is transmitted to the rear wheel through a multiple plate clutch, 4-speed transmission, helical gear primary drive and single-row chain final drive. Overall drive ratios are: 4th . . . 6.33:1, 3rd . . . 8.90:1, 2nd . . . 11.15; 1, 1st . . . 18.44:1.

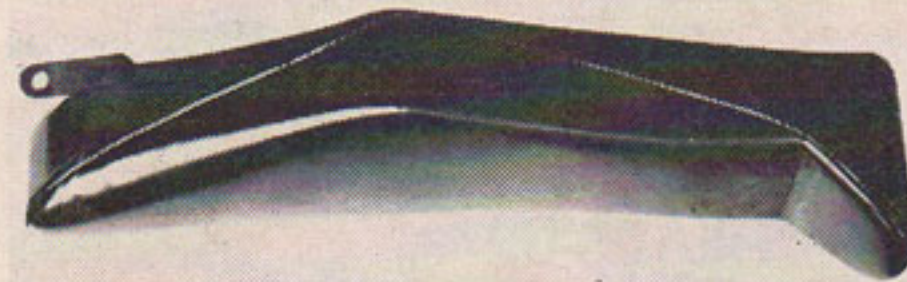

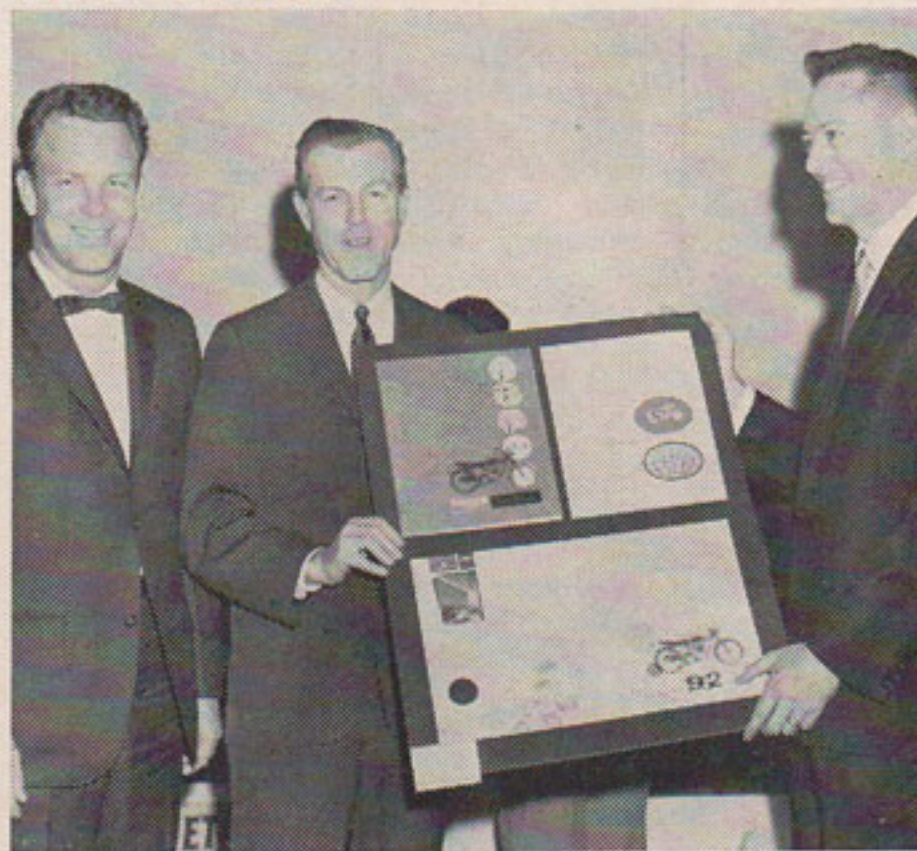

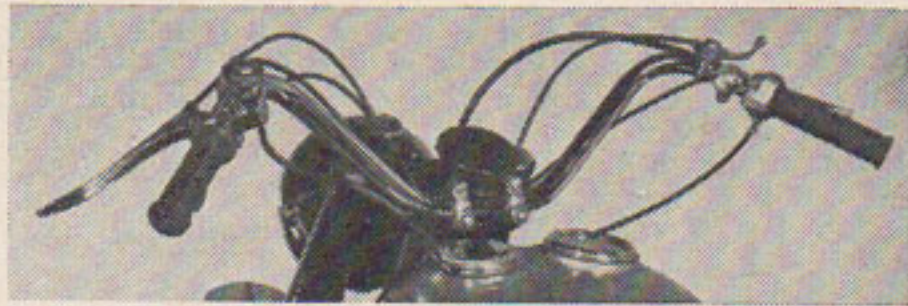

Dorresteyn wins second annual
100 lap TT race

The West Coast TT master, Dick Dorresteyn, made it two in a row on April 1st as he won the second annual Jimmy Philips 100-lap steeplecase race in record time.

Dorresteyn lapped all the other riders, except Dick Mann, at least once and set a new track record by over two minutes!! He was over forty seconds ahead of second place rider, Dick Mann at the finish.

Dorresteyn, the fastest qualifer last year, had to settle for second spot this time out as Dick Hammer grabbed the pole position and was the only rider to get around the track in less than fifty seconds. Eddie Kretz timed in third position to round out the front line.

Clark White took the lead at the start and held it until the second lap. Dorresteyn got by, but went into a wobble that threw him all the way off the machine. Somehow, Dick landed on his feet—still holding the machine up and got back in the fracas in fourth place.

White continued to hold the lead until the fourth lap when Double D came charging through once again to take the lead—this time for good.

The pace settled down with Clark White in second and Kretz third with Van Leeuwen, Hammer, O'Brien and Simmons all battling it out for fourth and fifth place.

Jimmy Plain started way back in 24th place but tore through the pack and running just out of the first ten by the fifteenth lap. Ralph White was also moving towards the front after getting off to a slow start.

Van Leeuwen was the first of the front runners to drop out. Dick Mann moved into the picture about this time and started chopping the leaders off, one by one. O'Brien and Simmons soon went to the pits as did Eddie Kretz. Clark White then made the first of two pit stops as did Dick Hammer, both were running in the first five at the time.

Mann then took over second with Ralph White in third and Jimmy Plain right behind in fourth.

However, the finish saw Clark White back in fourth, amateur Harlan Best, fifth, Plain in sixth, Hammer, seventh, Novice Eddie Mulder, eighth, Wayne Sumner, ninth and amateur Clyde Litch, tenth.

BEHIND THE SCENES: Mann was one of the few riders to ride a 500cc single in the event. . . He again rode a G-50 Matchless, the same type as he rode at Daytona. . . Mann also pulled an iron-man stunt when he rode the last half of the race without goggles or a face shield, result, two very red eyeballs. . . Lap 98 was unlucky for Joe Leonard who went out at that point with a broken primary chain, running in about sixth place. . . Another oddity in the race is that the finish by brand name is the same as Daytona's 200 miler, in fact Mann and Ralph White were in the same spots for both races. . . Dorresteyn rode the last 50 laps of the race with no brakes. . . A year ago he rode the last 25 laps the same way. . . only 17 riders were around for the finish. . . D.D. has now taken a real tight hold on the point lead in the expert class. . .

TANNER WINS HALF MILE SEASON OPENER:

The "Flying Flea", Sammy Tanner, was the big gun in the first Friday night race of the new season at Ascot on April 6th. The weather warmed to a record high during the day which helped produce a record crowd for a regular Friday night show.

In the time trials Al Gunter emerged as the fast man for the night, but Jack O'Brien edged Tanner by a matter of feet for the fastest heat race win. First time expert Bob Kircher came from behind to beat Dick Hammer and Ralph White in the second heat and Stu Morley won his five lap affair with room to spare. Gunter dropped a plug wire in the heat and never got going soon enough to transfer to the semi or the main event.

The four fastest qualifiers made up the dash and it was Gunter by inches over O'Brien with Morley third and Hammer a close fourth.

O'Brien took the lead in the expert final, but Tanner got by halfway through lap two. Tanner looked like the Flea of old as he stretched it to eight lengths before O'Brien got moving again on the tenth lap and closed back to three lengths. Kircher had third place wrapped up until the thirteenth lap when he fell on the south turn. Morley finished third with Hammer running fourth. Neil Keen, the semi winner, came from last to take fifth with White in for sixth place money.

Clyde Litch and Russ Bacarella traded positions on every lap in the ten-lap amateur final with both riders taking the one-lap flag running dead even. Litch came in first by inches for his first win as an amateur.

The novices looked great their first time out and three lightweight road racers took the biggest share of the purse. San Diego's Jim McMurren won his heat and then led the main all the way. Dean Noggle got by Cal Rayburn for second. Rayburn is also from San Diego.

The fifteen event program was again run off in rapid fire manner with no injuries occurring.

IN THE PITS: This was the first time in fourteen years that Johnny Gibson and Don Hawley were not entered for an opener. Both were in the stands as spectators. . . Reg Mull, former Michigan rider rode his first race in over seven years and didn't look too bad. . . Dick Mann was not on hand due to getting ready for Shreveport. . . Another Emde is on the scene, Bob Emde, son of former great, Floyd, made the novice main in his first

try at oval racing. . . Sam Arena Jr. has given up racing to devote full time to married life and the shop. . . Ron Boyarsky back on the scene and looking for his best season, as an expert. . . George Roeder to ride at Ascot starting April 20th, former rider "Rosy" Rosswurm will be with him in the pits. . . Brad Andres is now "Dad" for the first time. The new little Andres arrived late in March and tipped the scales at over 8 pounds—no racer this time, he's a she. . .

SCRAMBLES: Dick Hammer is not only one of our best Class C riders, but has yet to lose an open expert scrambles race since the first of the year. To date he has won eight main events in a row.

There has long been talk as to whether the North or the South has the best scrambles rides and the question may be answered on May 27th when the Falcons MC host a scrambles that will pit Dorresteyn, Mann, Clark White, Sid Payne and Ralph White against Hammer, Van Leeuwen, Mulder, Spargur and one other rider yet to be selected.

This will be the first time that all of the top class C TT riders have met on a rough scrambles track.

RACING ROUND-UP: Saturday night TT racing at Selma is now underway every week. The riders will also run TT events at Bakersfield at least two Sunday nights a month this year. There will be two TT's at Ascot in May. The first on May 6th and the first night TT will run on May 29th, the night before Memorial Day.
