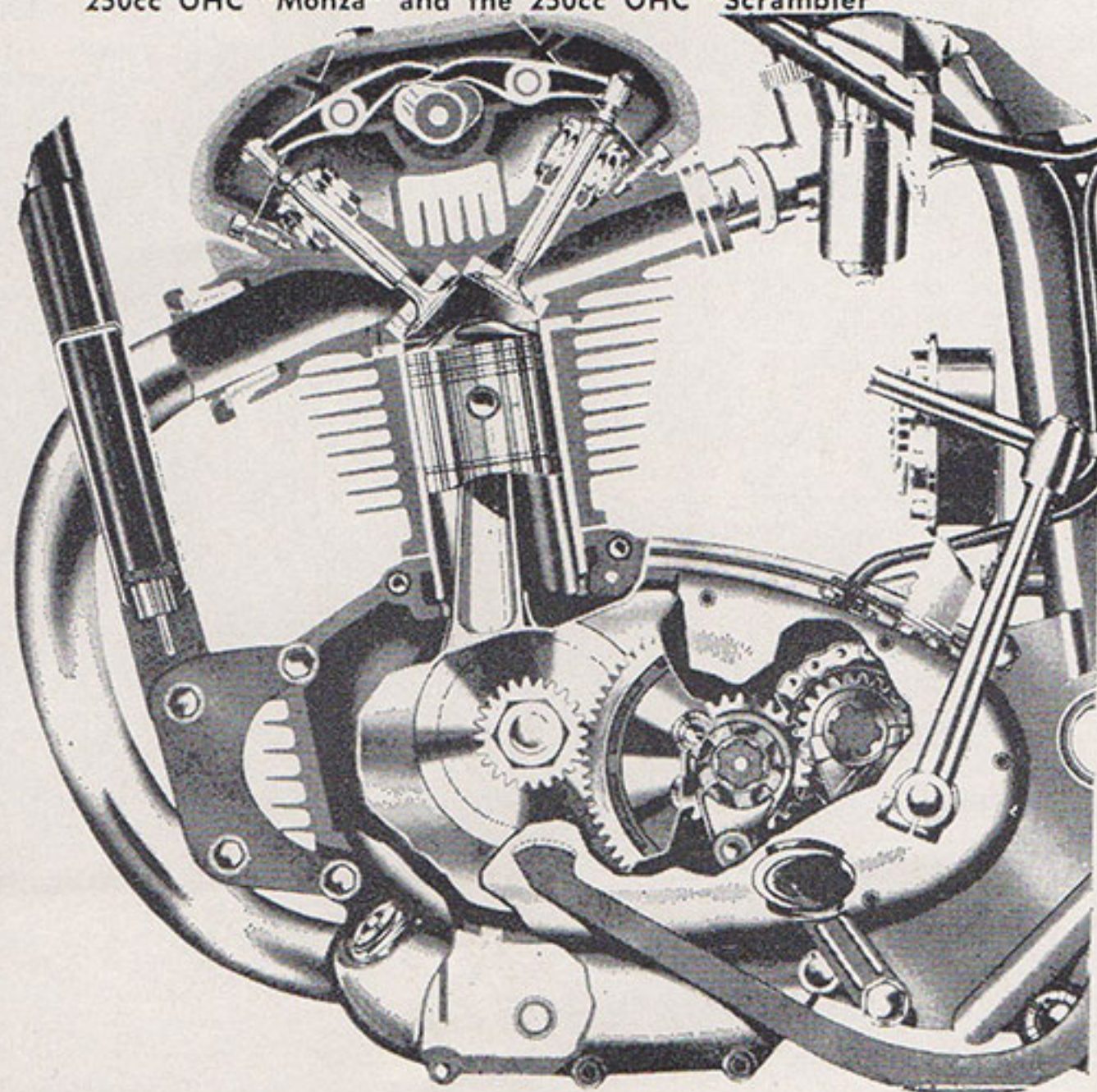

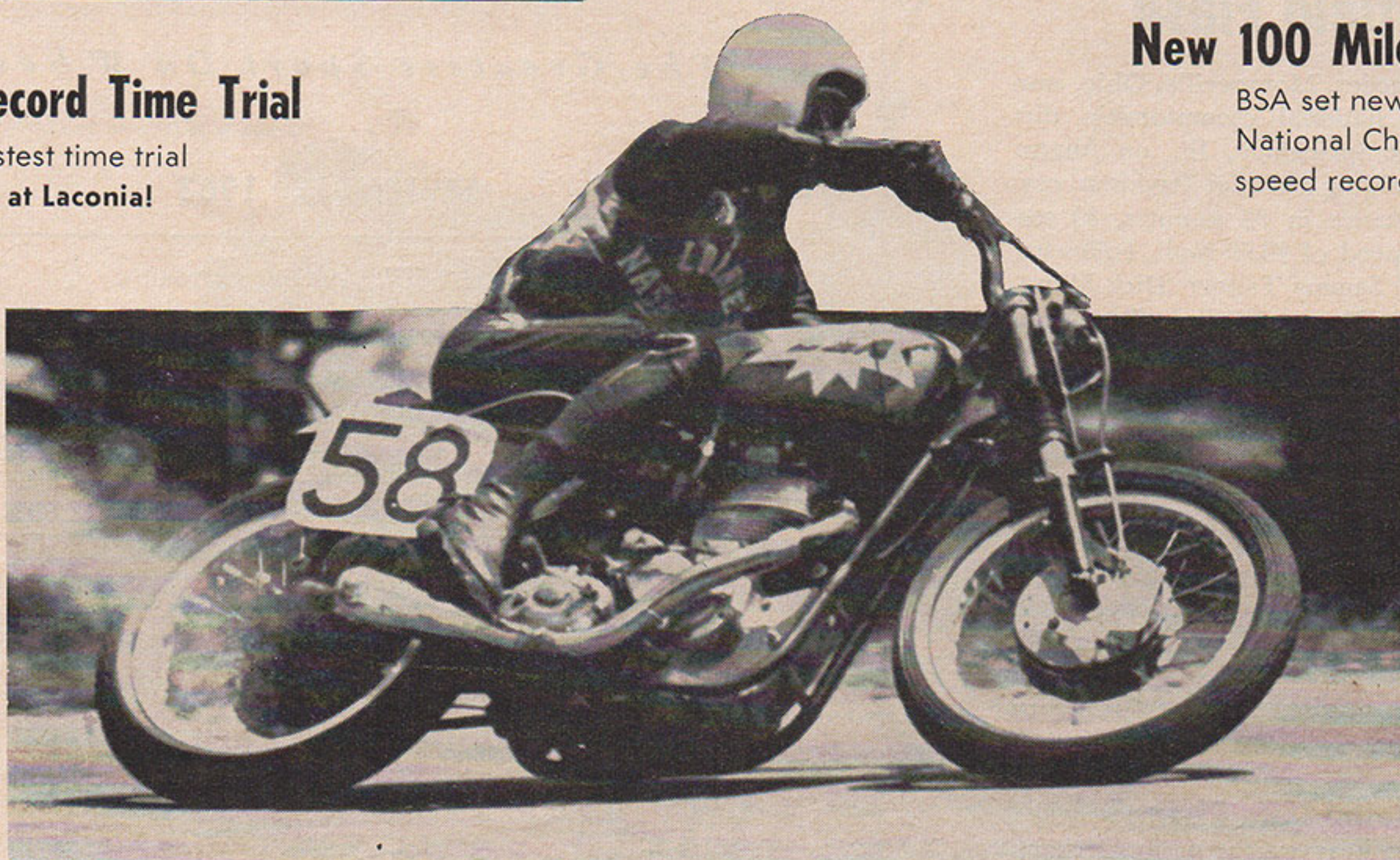

Springfield Flash

George Roeder, Monroeville, Ohio, won the 50-mile national championship dirt track race at Springfield, Ill., on August 18. Roeder, riding a Harley-Davidson, covered the distance in 33 minutes, 39 seconds for a speed of 89.59 mph. Following Roeder were Sammy Tanner, Dick Mann, Joe Leonard, Duane Shadley, Gary Nixon, Ralph White, Mike Powell, Sam Satterly, and Dave Estep. At the end of the second lap Bart Markel, Dick Hammer and Darrel Dovel all went down. Markel was the only one able to continue, Hammer and Dovel went into the pits.

Bob Bailey, Torrance, Calif., riding a Triumph was the amateur winner when the race was called at the end of lap five due to rain. Ted Heil, Bob Hinkle, and Tom Scharlow followed Bailey home in that order.

Note National Date Change

The 50-lap heavyweight national championship TT race that was scheduled for Friday, September 20 has been changed with the event now running on Saturday, September 21. The location — Ascot TT course, Los Angeles — remains the same.

Another TV Event

The national championship scrambles, sponsored by District 37 Sports Committee of southern California, held on August 24-25, was to be taped by ABC-TV for showing on their "Wide World of Sports" program. Time and dates of the telecast will be announced later.

The New England Motorcycle Dealers' Association, Inc., regrets that difficult circumstances forces them to cancel the September 8, 1963, annual Fall Roundup races which would have been held at Laconia, New Hampshire.

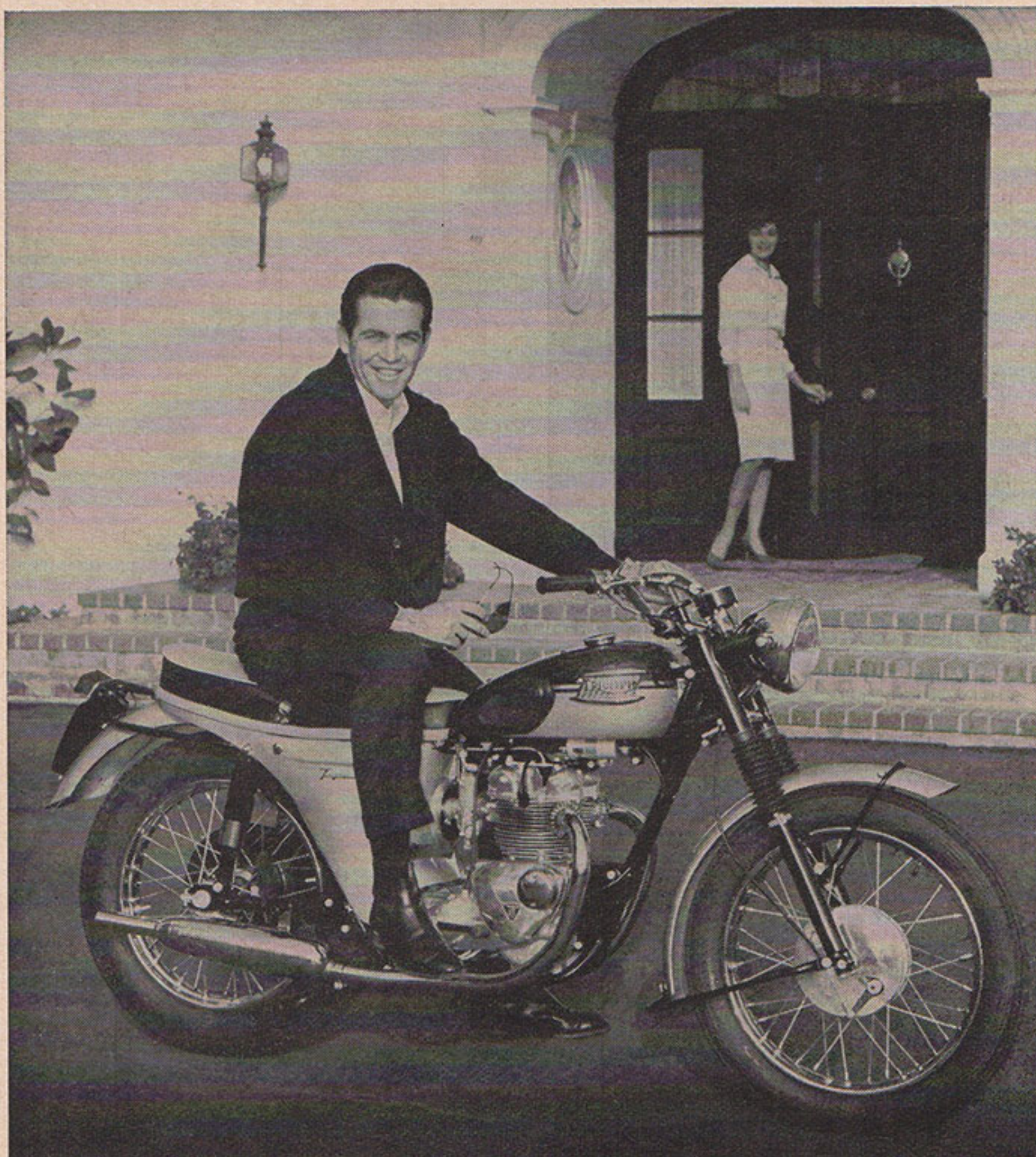

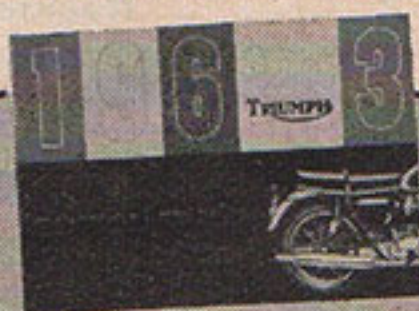




Jim Hayes Wins Southern 500 Race

Jim Hayes, Jr., from Johnson City, Tenn., averaged 62.38 miles per hour on his Norton "Atlas" twin to win the fourth annual "Southern 500" motorcycle race held at the Fayetteville Speedway, on Sunday, July 14th.

Kenneth Hayes, the winner's younger brother, "Red" Nabors, Fayetteville Norton dealer and "Jimmy" Nicks, from Jacksonville, Fla., all Norton mounted, were right up in front of the 40 racing cyclists, but forced to the pits about the 250th lap when beset with minor difficulties. Jimmy Nicks suffered a flat tire, Kenny Hayes broke a primary chain, and Red Nabors went down trying to avoid hitting a fallen rider. The time lost by these riders while in the pits made it impossible to gain due to the treacherous downpour which stopped the event on the 281st lap.

Winner, Jim Hayes, finished well ahead of second place man, Ray Durham of Greenville, S.C., on a Triumph, and collected 2,000 silver dollars, a collection, which in addition to their face value, is reputed to be quite valuable from a coin collector's point of view.

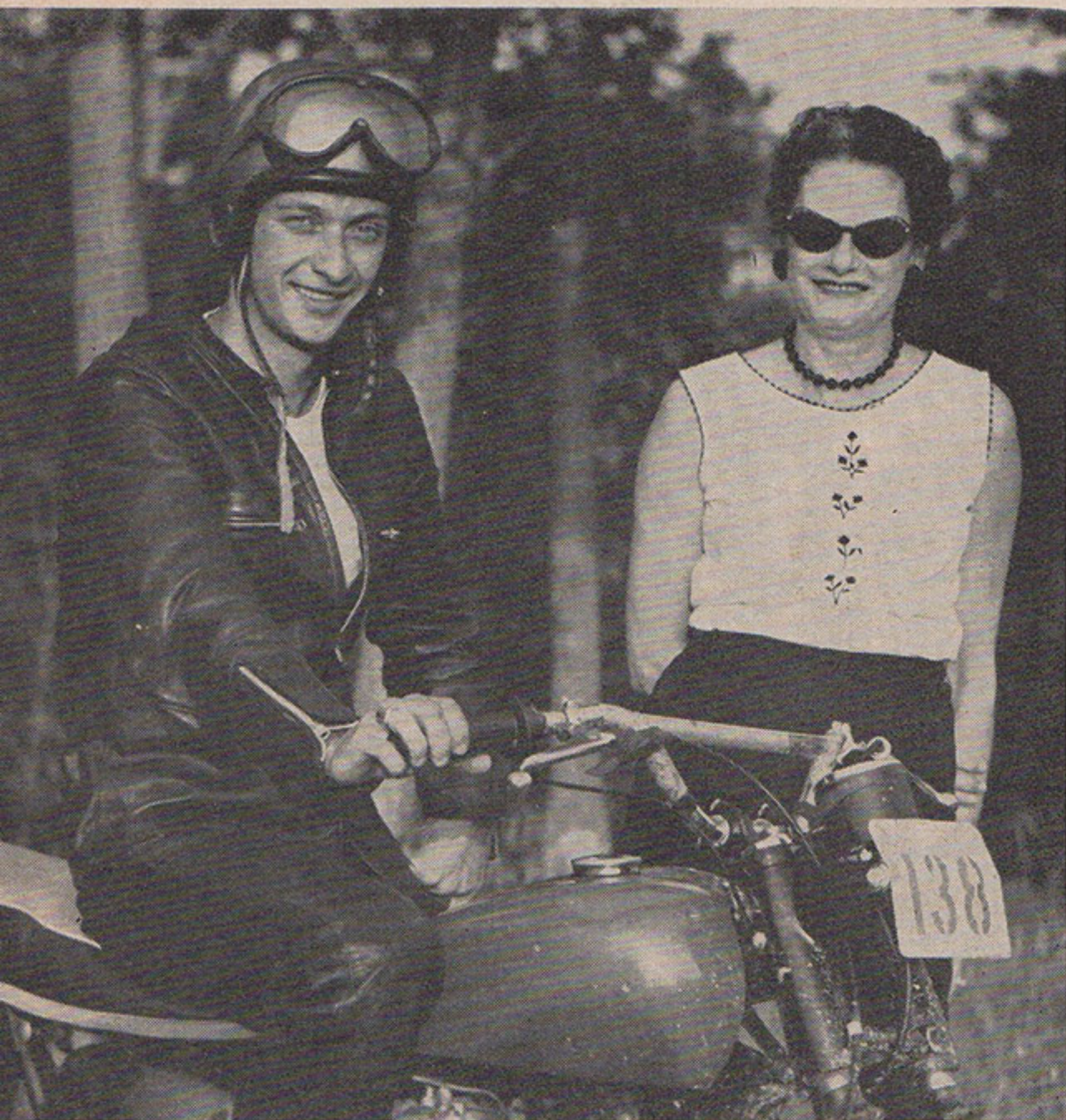

Gears And Jeers

A Mother's Point Of View

ONE leg protruding from a pile of tangled motorcycles and assorted riders just had to belong to my teenage son, Paul. It did.

When it finally emerged, together with the rest of his body, I breathed a sigh of relief. His face was smeared with dust and oil under his safety helmet, but there was no mistaking his lanky figure.

The jumbled heap of downed riders sorted itself out and five other competition riders also checked their machines carefully. Threatening to break the sound barrier, they revved up their 250cc's and lined up again for a second start. This was one of the many AMA sanctioned races.

The flag fluttered then descended with a flourish as the starter jumped back. The six riders let out their clutches and were off to the harsh sound of shifting gears.

Fascinating Sport

Going into the first turn off the straightaway, my "daredevil" took the fourth position. Hunched over the handlebars with his left foot dragging to steady his machine, he was competing in one of America's most fascinating sports, motorcycle scrambles. And I was rooting for him.

As he disappeared from view in a wooded section, my mind made a quick review.

All winter he had been tinkering with his motorcycle, getting it in shape for the summer's competition. When spring arrived he managed to lug it out of the basement — with help — and took it out for a trial run.

My neighbors have chosen to regard him as less than a model son even though he's one of the few kids in the neighborhood who hasn't been in trouble with the law.

After all, they reason, he rides a motorcycle and wears a helmet and black leather pants and jacket. They do not realize the clothing is racing gear, or leathers. To them it is a definite sign that he is a wild one and should be curbed.

And to prove their utter dislike for motorcyclists, they glare at me ferociously — just before they call the police.

At the foot of our street is a huge parking lot, privately owned, used by many persons in the neighborhood to park their cars. Truck drivers also park their rigs there.

Little Traffic

On a few occasions Paul has practiced there because it has a few jumps and there is little moving traffic. And in spite of the fact it is located a short distance from an ore dock where cranes are running day and night and cars are being

loaded, the sound of his motorcycle (which can barely be heard above the other noises), sends the neighbors into a frenzy.

It's just too bad I can't hog tie the whole group and force them into witnessing a sport which is not only exciting and stimulating, but attracts thousands of spectators who certainly can't be classified as degenerates because they like keen competition. Maybe then they wouldn't be quite so critical of something they know nothing about.

Good sportsmanship is always on parade at these events and whether a person likes to ride motorcycles or not, he or she is guaranteed an afternoon of thrills at any of the scrambles.

My thoughts quickly returned to the present as the six riders negotiated another turn before leaving the woods.

Paul had moved up one position and was pushing the rider ahead of him for second place. They were all in tight formation and bearing down on the first jump, their bikes throttled down.

But not Paul's. Excited and still a novice, he took the high jump wide open. He went up all right but he also went down. Hitting the crest of the hill on his rear wheel, he was unable to force the

Ohio State Championship Sept. 8

On Sunday, September 8, the finest motorcycle riders in the country, will converge upon the Ohio State Fairgrounds, in Columbus, Ohio, to compete in the Ohio state championship five-mile race, on the half-mile flat track. A rain-date of Saturday, Sept. 21, is scheduled.

This year, the seven-star program that carries \$2200 in prize purses, is being put on by the Golden Arrow Motorcycle Club, of Columbus, in cooperation with the Central Ohio Heart Association "Heart Fund."

The 10-lap Ohio state championship is open to Ohio Expert AMA licensed competition riders only, while the balance of the program is open to all AMA licensed competition riders.

Sanctioned by the American Motorcycle Association, the program will have two three-mile heats, plus a five-mile final event, in the expert, amateur and novice classes, as well as the state championship feature, for experts.

Trophies will be awarded for the five-mile final event for all three classes, plus the Ohio state championship "rotating" trophy. In addition, trophies will be presented for the largest club attending, the best dressed rider, the club parade and for the fastest time trial.

Entry blanks have been printed and all riders, who have not received one, are requested to mail their application for an entry, to: Golden Arrow Motorcycle Club, Inc., P.O. Box 414, Columbus, Ohio - 43216. The deadline for submitting entries is midnight, September 1, 1963.

Time trials will be held at 10 a.m., Sunday, September 8 and the races will get underway at 2 p.m.

The price of general admission tickets, available at the gate, is \$1.50, while an extra \$1.00 will admit you to the grandstand. Children, under 12 years of age, will be admitted free at the outside gate for general admission, but they will be charged \$1.00 for a grandstand seat.

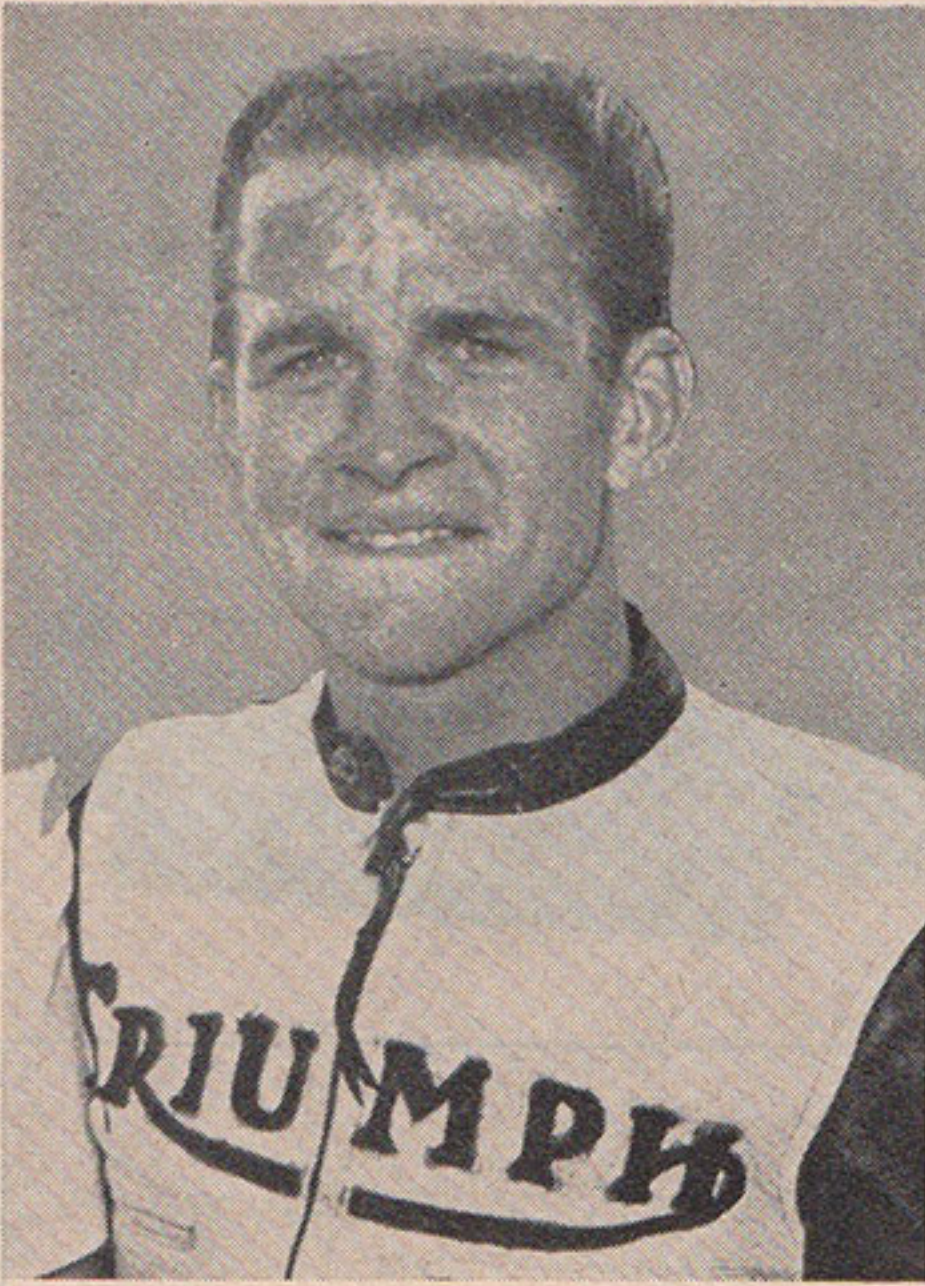

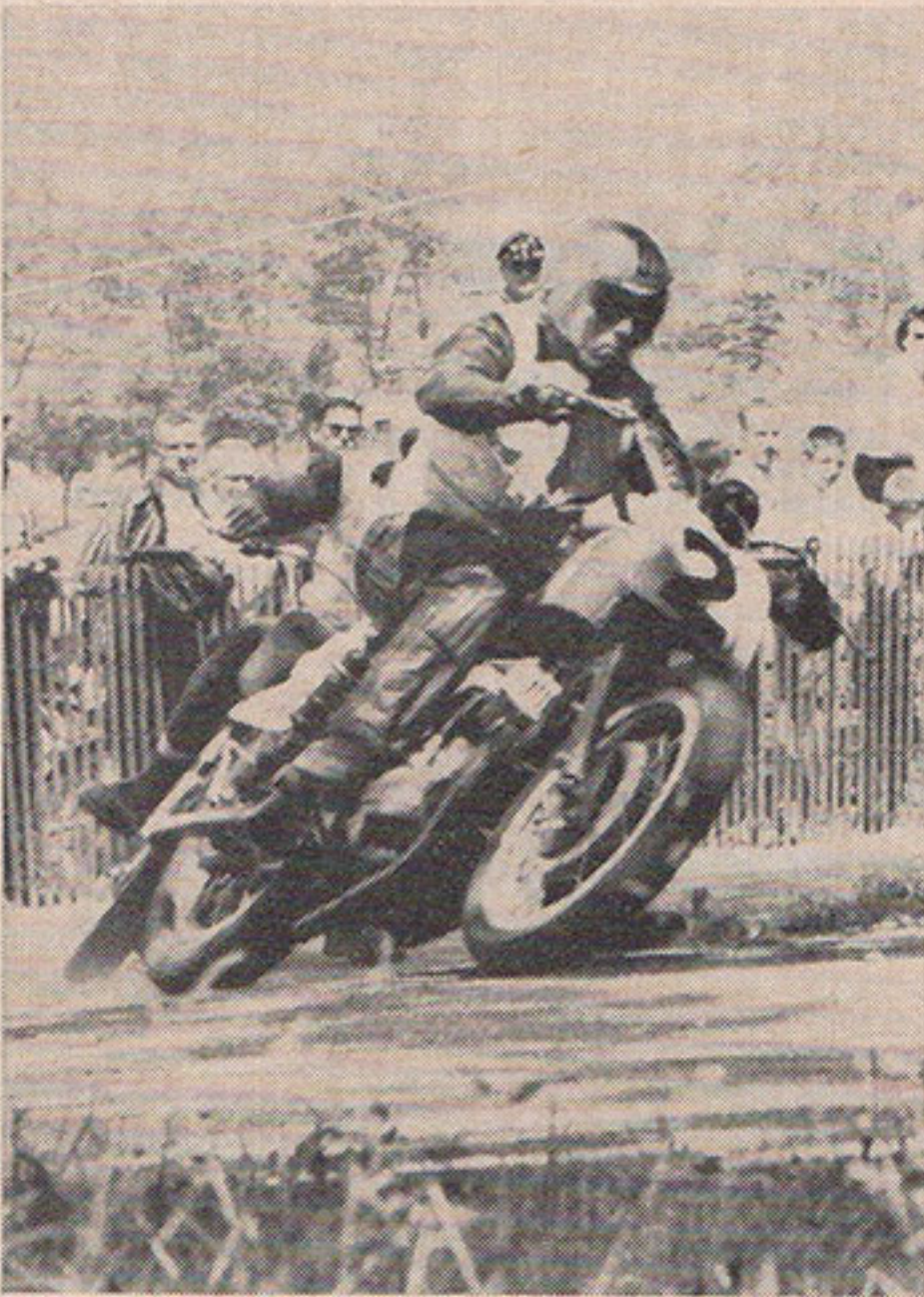

Gary Nixon Wins Windber

It was a memorable weekend at Windber, Pa., Aug. 4, for the thousands of motorcycle fans who enjoyed the three-day show organized by the Western Pennsylvania Motorcycle Dealers for the benefit of The Windber Fire Company. The field meet, the lightweight road races on Saturday, the Class A short track, Saturday night, and the amateur and expert road races put on Sunday were all packed with thrills and spills, as the advance ballyhoo always promises, but this time the fans got more than they hoped for, including a whiz-bang lightning display and freak wind and rain storm which broke just as Red Moser threw the checkered flag at Markel, Rall, Roeder and Nixon, as they scrapped under the lights at Windber's Memorial Stadium. Lightning bounced around the camping area, up on the top of the hill where the road race course is located.

The big 50 was full of surprises, bad breaks and lucky squeezes. Ralph White washed his job out late in Saturday's practice, but an injured hand would have prevented him running the following day even if his bent-up model could have been repaired in time. George Roeder, a familiar name in all kinds of cycle competition for years—and knocking at the national winner's door so often his knuckles are calloused—was within a few hundred yards of Gary Nixon's flying Triumph almost to the end, when a rider fell down in front of George and Old #94 took off into the trees, leaving George in one place, most of his Harley in another, and the forks cut off as clean as if they had been guillotined. Neither rider hurt.

But Markel, still having his troubles, was out with motor trouble early in the 50-miler. Roger Reiman, after setting a new record in the time trial, seized the reins early in the race, closely paced by the eventual winner, Nixon. Gary studied the Kewanee Ace's mastery of the treacherous course, then, proving an apt pupil, sneaked by Reiman and took off, never to be caught! Roger kept Gary in sight, and was in for a positive second spot right up to the last lap; then, his chain broke! He still got fourth.

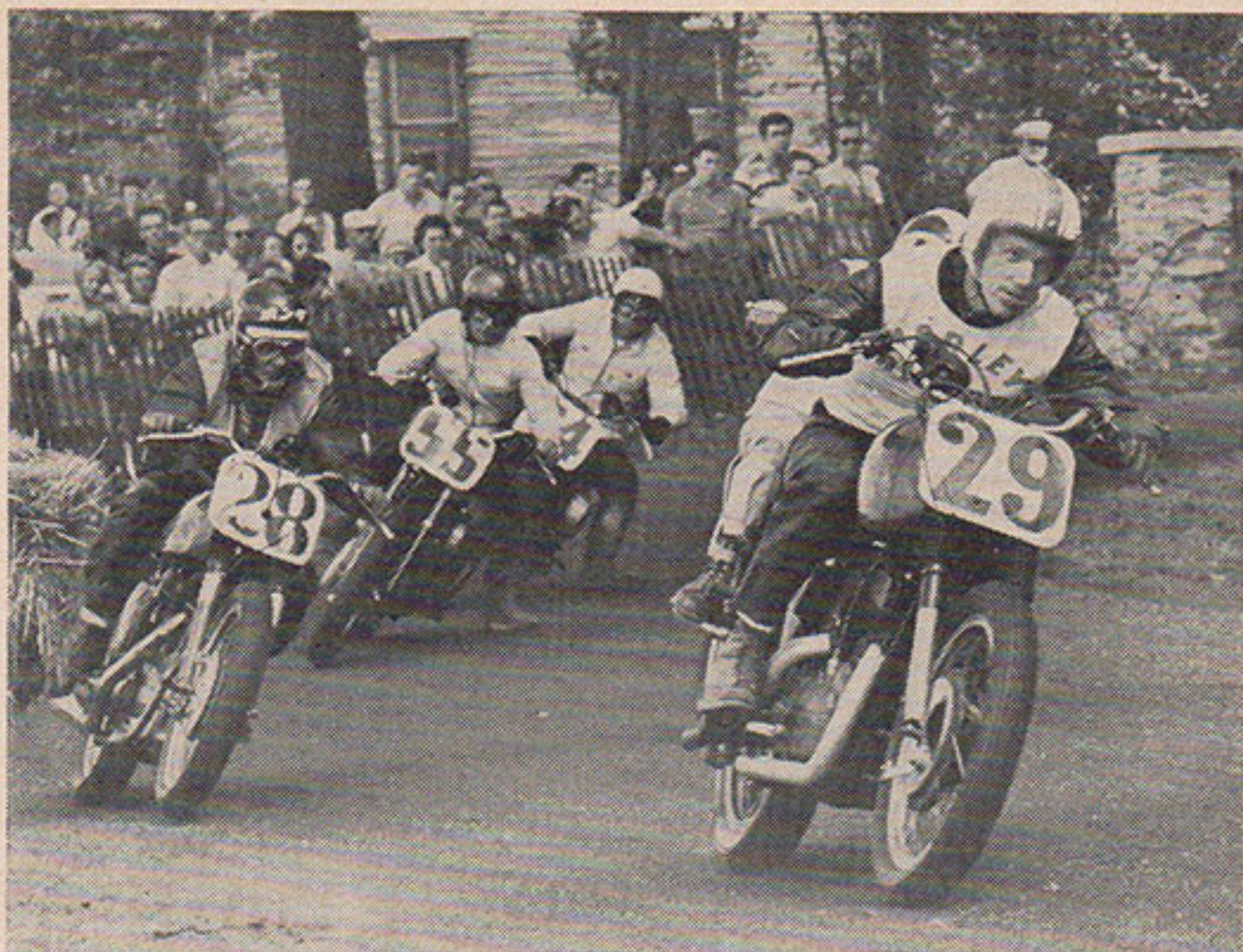
Nixon, originally from treeless Oklahoma, but now working as a window caulker in Washington, D.C., flew through the snaky course like a true woodsman, paying no heed to the thousands of oaks within brushing distance of his handlebars. "Everything went right; I just knew this was my day," he said later as he shared the glory with his mechanic, Cliff Guild.

The short track races went off on a beautiful schedule and almost every heat was a mixture of little separate races. As the champs lined up for the 10-lap final. Farmer Rall took a practiced look at the flashes of lightning and waved his pals to hurry to the line to get the final race finished. Within minutes of its ending, the heavens opened and everyone got soaked.

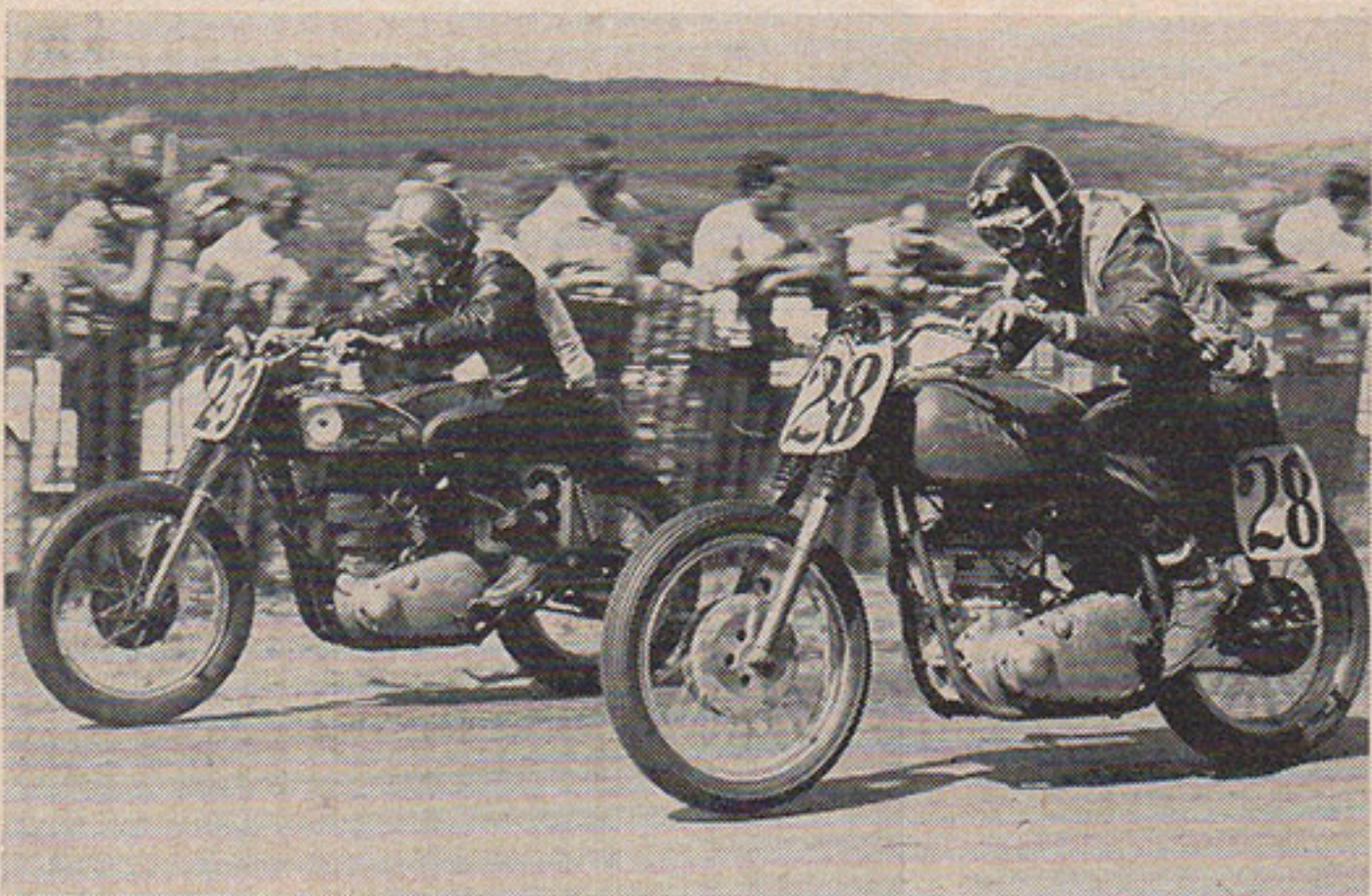
The lightweight races looked like a rerun of Laconia with many of the same guys and same machines doing just about the same thing as at Belknap. The amateur 25-miler was marred by an opening crash that took two riders out of the scrap before they even got the feel of the course. Buddy Stubbs proved that his win at Daytona had been no freak, and he led from start to finish with two hopeful Dutchmen, Dick Reinhard and Bill Werner, all on Harlies, trying to catch the little Illinois flyer.

It has been some years since Windber has been run, but we are sure that this was the smoothest-conducted program on record. All who made it possible are to be congratulated for having done such a great job for the sport of motorcycling. 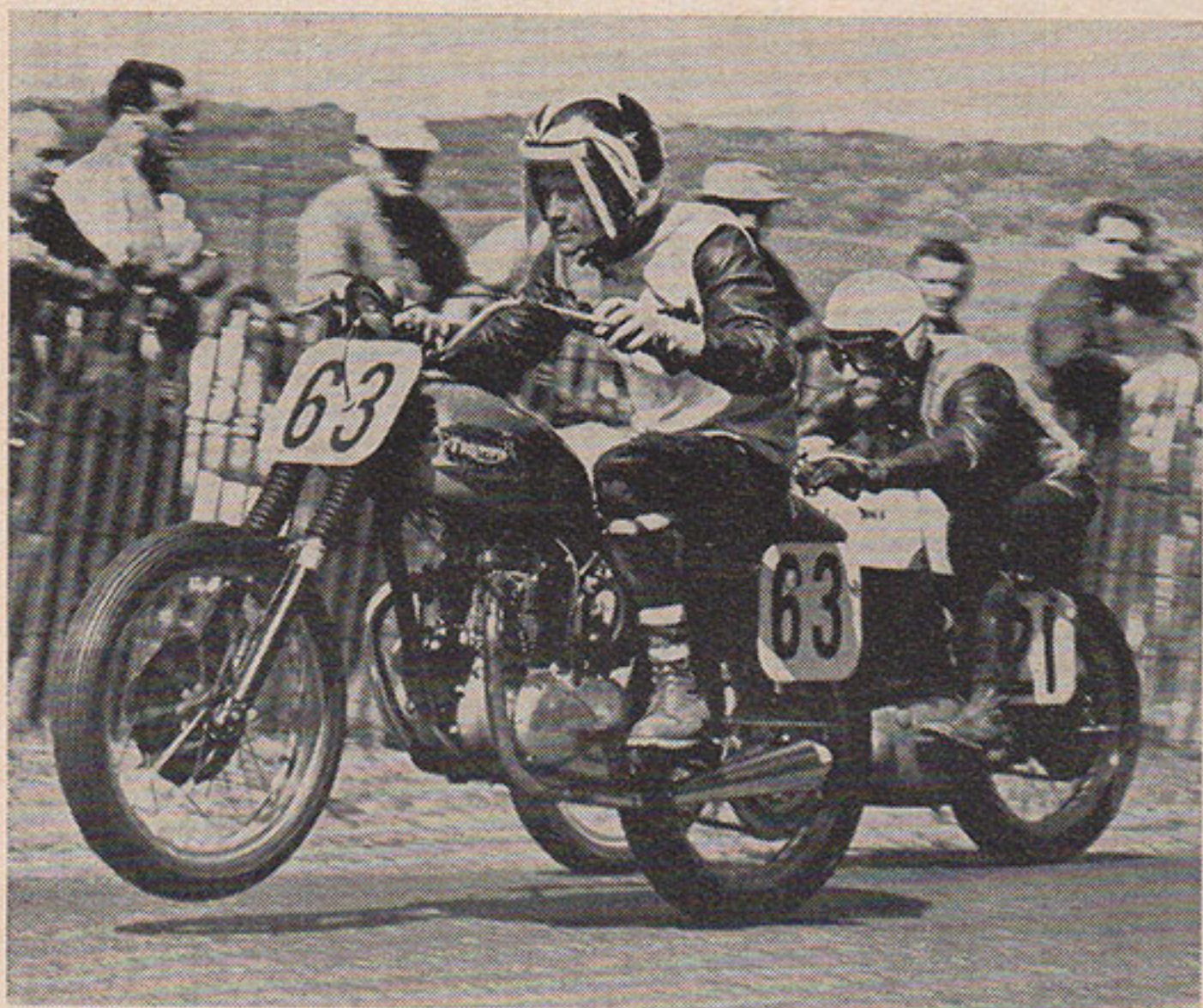

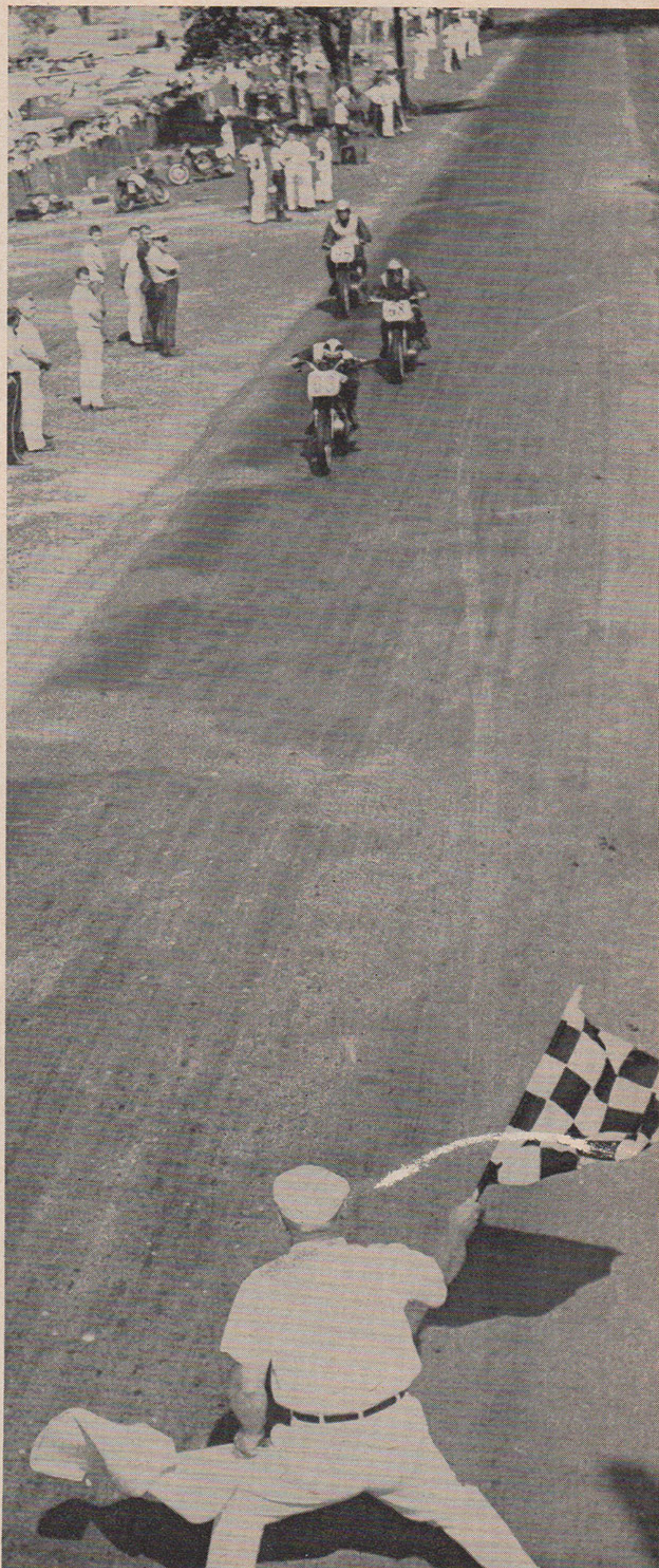

Kyle And Petrick "A" Climb Champs

MOTORCYCLISTS had to turn rough riders at the national championship hill-climb held in Muskegon, Mich., August 4 with Phil Petrick of Allentown, Pa., successfully defending his 45 cubic inch amateur title and Glen Kyle of Goshen, Ind., capturing the 74 cubic inch professional title over the cream of North American hillclimbers.

The 300-foot, 40-degree course up rugged Mt. Garfield hasn't been so rough in years and the champions really earned their titles.

A crowd estimated at 12,000 by President Dan Raymond of the sponsoring Muskegon Motorcycle Club was treated to a number of thrills and spills, two minor injuries to riders and four flaming motorcycles.

Petrick, who got the first ride of the day up the hill due to his top standing in accumulated points, wrapped up the amateur title before much of the crowd had settled down for the four-hour program.

He negotiated the hill in eight seconds, one of the fastest times ever recorded here for a 45 cubic inch bike—a Harley-Davidson, incidentally.

Phil Franz of Cleveland, Ohio, also on an H-D, was second in 8.40 seconds while Tom Reiser of Columbus, Ohio, another Harley-Davidson rider, was third in 8.97 seconds.

Oddly enough, the two riders who appeared to be making the most serious

tries at Petrick's winning mark never crossed the finish line.

John Williams of Markham, Ont., Canada, spilled just a few feet from the tape with his cycle sliding under it on his first run. Only an estimated six seconds had elapsed on the timer before the fall.

Lowell Yoder of Goshen, Ind., then fell just 14 feet from the tape on his third try with an elapsed seven seconds on the timer.

Beese Wendt of York, Pa., was slightly injured on this first run when he lost control of his bike in midair and slammed into the shack at the top of the course. He suffered a painful leg injury but continued in the competition to earn fifth place behind Dick Stone of York, Pa.

Stone also might have made a serious challenge after a first run of 8.99 but had to scratch his other two attempts because of an equipment failure.

Kyle took the lead on the first run in the professional class with a timing of 8:13 seconds and it held up until Gordon Mitzel and Paul Mayer, both of York, Pa., took their third tries.

Mitzel jumped up the hill in 7:86 seconds while Mayer did it in 7.76 on the very next ride.

Kyle then got on his Vincent for his second try and spurted up the hill in his winning time of 7.42.

Second placer Mayer and third place Mitzel each piloted Indians.

Former champion Charles Jacobs, of Bangor, Pa., was fourth in 8.13 seconds and another former winner, R. J. Nealen of Bedford Heights, Ohio, was fifth in 8.70.

Other former champions finished far down the list. Willard Bryan of Groveport, Ohio, was eighth, defending champion Joe Hemmis of Cumberland, Md., was tenth, Howard Mitzel of York, Pa., the winner 11 times, was 12th, Duane Nealen of Warrensville, Ohio, was 14th.

Harold Werner of Easton, Pa., was carried from the hill on a stretcher after a bad spill late in the program. He was run over by his Harley-Davidson when the throttle didn't cut out.

He suffered a shoulder injury but refused a trip to a local hospital for treatment.

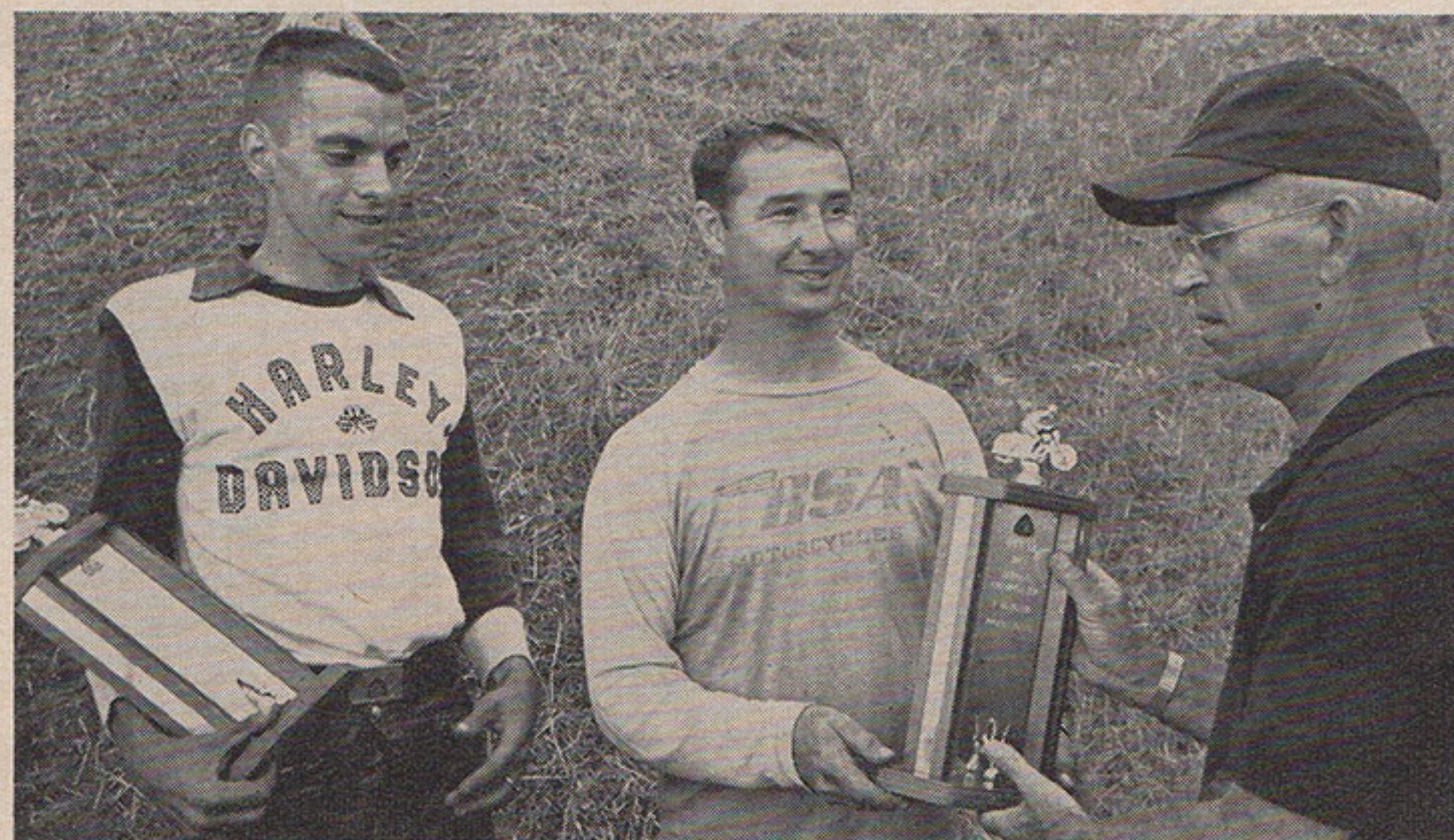
The event drew one of its biggest crowds in recent years under a brilliant sun on the shores of Lake Michigan.

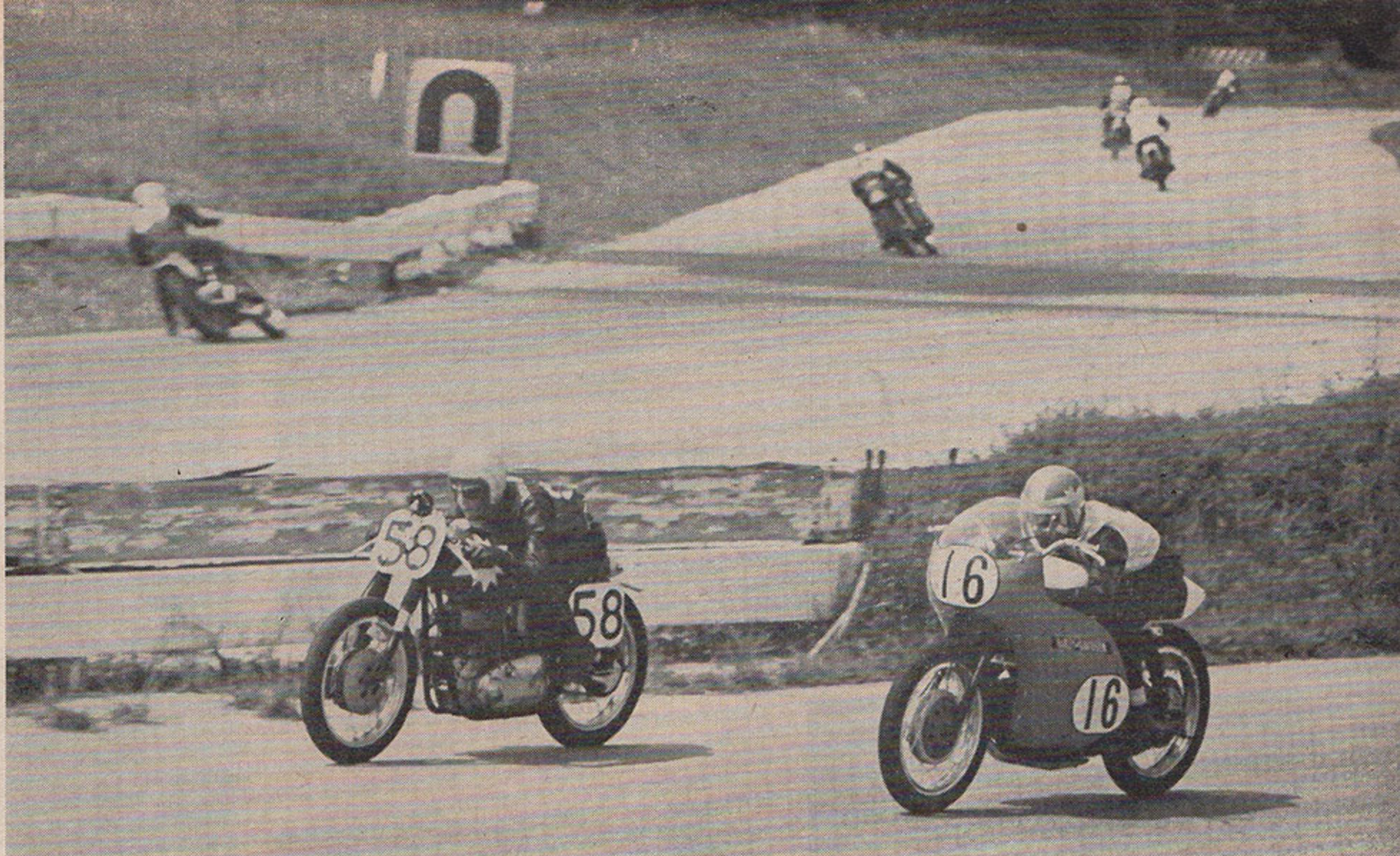

Nicholas Wins 150-Mile And 250cc

A GAS stop, one flat tire, and a defective throttle were the three most important items in the first AMA road racing championship at Meadowdale Raceway at Carpentersville, Ill., on August 11th.

The race for the 150-mile title was outstanding from start to finish and from all indications Meadowdale and the 150 promise to be one of the brighter spots on the national trail in coming seasons.

From start to finish it was a two-man race for the win between Jody Nicholas and Dick Hammer. These two champions shot to the front from the very beginning and soon left the balance of the field far behind. Jody led the first lap, Hammer led the second, it was Nicholas back in front on the third with Hammer the front runner the next four times around the fast two and a quarter mile course.

Nicholas regained the lead at the end of lap nine, but it was Hammer again on lap 10. The Nashville speedster again took over on lap 11 and led all the way through lap 48. Hammer was never further back than ten lengths and the majority of the time the margin was closer to five.

Nicholas, the 1963 Laconia 100-mile winner, came in for gas on lap 49 with Hammer blasting on by to again regain the lead and build up a 26 second cushion.

Nicholas made a very fast nine second stop, but the total time in and out of the pits gave Hammer a lead that was believed to be more than sufficient. However, Jody was still running a solid second place. Lap-after-lap he continued to chop a few seconds off the time gap on the front running Hammer until, at one point, the difference was down to 13 seconds.

Hammer's pit crew then flashed the go with the result that the margin was taken back up to 17 seconds.

This is the way the two riders were running until two laps from the finish when Hammer suddenly ran off the track for no apparent reason. Dick twisted and turned and was back on the track with a flat rear tire. He kept going until he reached the pit area where he was given the signal to keep going—more sideways than straight ahead.

Nicholas soon closed the gap and regained the lead on lap 65 to go on for the checkered flag at the end of sixty seven laps.

There was still more suspense to come after Nicholas again took the lead. On lap one Roeder came up with a defective throttle and had to pit on the first round. The Ohio ace then was back in the show, running well over a lap behind the two

leaders.

Roeder at full throttle turned in his finest road race since turning to two-wheel racing back in 1954.

By the halfway mark Roeder had worked his way up to fifth and was still closing. His main competition was the torrid two rider duel for third between Dick Mann and Gary Nixon. From the start these two were riding as one with third place changing riders on every lap.

Part of Roeder's problem was solved on lap 35 when Nixon failed to cross the line. It was later learned that he was out of the race with a dead engine.

The Ohio farmer then caught up and passed Mann on the 47th lap to move into third position. Late in the race George unlapped himself from Nicholas but was still over 12 seconds back of Hammer.

When Hammer came up with the flat tire the race was then on for second to see if Hammer could keep going fast enough to get the flag ahead of Roeder.

The final lap found Roeder moving by to take second money, dropping Hammer to third.

Added suspense was also present when Mann went out with a dead engine just five laps from the finish—with fourth place all wrapped up.

There were no serious spills on the

tight, tricky nine turn course. The only rider hospitalized was Joe Haas, Fountaintown, Ind., who spilled coming off the "Monza Wall" in time trials. Haas suffered a skinned arm and minor injuries.

Amateur 50 Mile Event

Tony Woodman, Far Hills, N. J., ran a flawless race to run a repeat of his Laconia win last June.

Two-time road race winner, Bud Stubbs, Bellflower, Calif., led the first lap, but from then on it was all Woodman by a wide margin.

Stubbs developed engine troubles shortly after the second lap and dropped to third, giving way to Al Gaskill, Warren, Mich. The third lap found Gaskill falling off, but remounting shortly afterwards.

The remainder of the race centered around second place between Walt Thompson, Alton, Ill., Tom Rose, Peoria, Ill., and Bill Lloyd, Langley Park, Md.

Thompson was in command the majority of the way with Rose right behind. Lloyd came from way back and closed the distance until he moved by Rose and took third spot on lap 14. Bill Jasper, Centralia, Ill., was right behind and also passed Rose to take over fourth.

Lloyd and Jasper then took aim on Thompson in second and a three-way battle developed right down to the checkered flag.

Lloyd moved into second with three laps to go but Thompson came right back with two laps remaining.

One lap from the finish Lloyd grabbed off second for the last time. Thompson managed to hold off Jasper for third as all three came out of the final turn under the proverbial blanket.

250cc Lightweights

Jody Nicholas warmed up for his 150-mile attempt by scoring his first 250cc win of the year on Saturday.

Nicholas developed engine trouble shortly before time trials and was forced to start in the back row. In less time than it takes to tell about it he had throttled his way through the entire pack and was off and running away out in front.

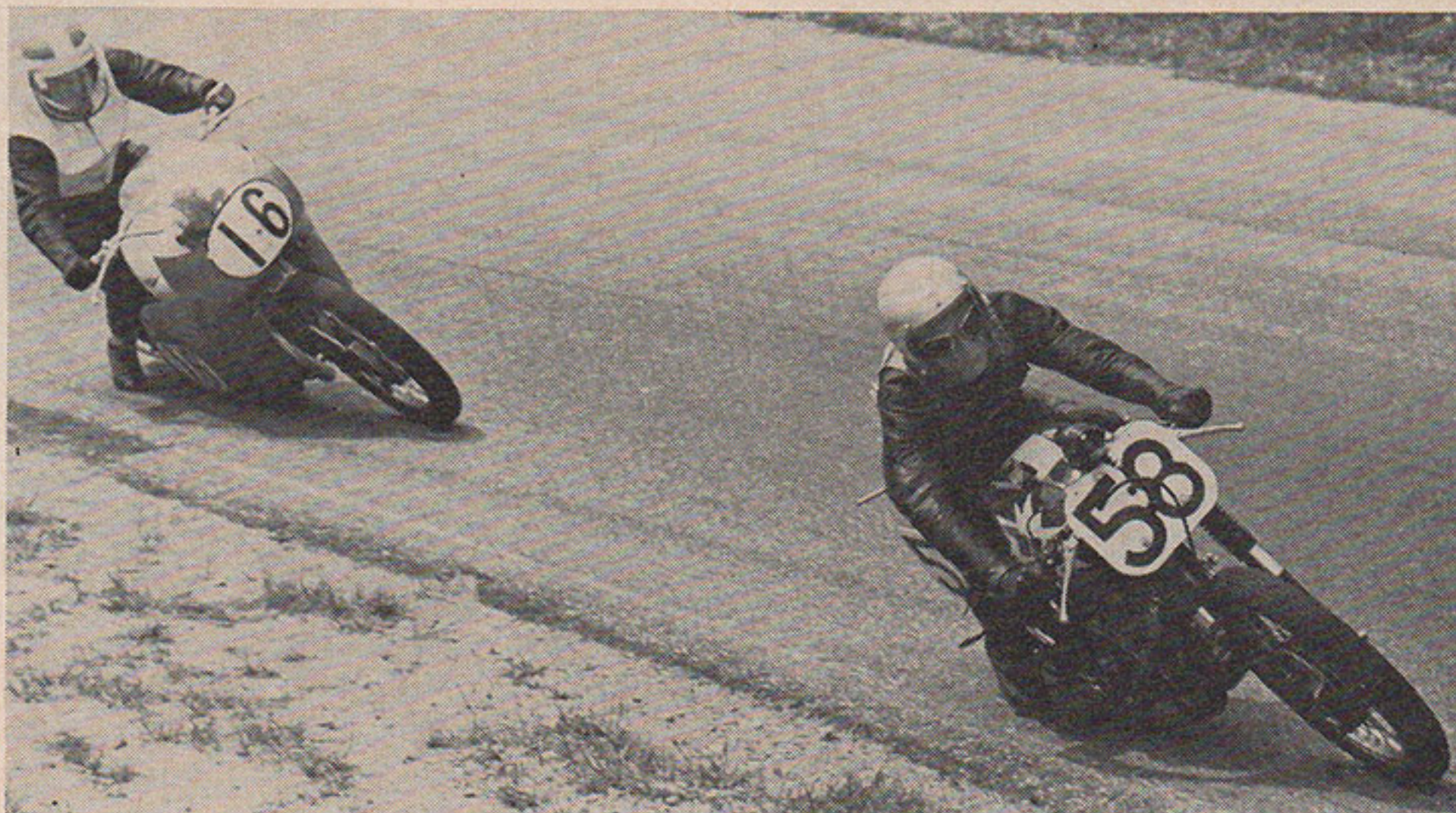
Gary Nixon and Jess Thomas battled for second early in the race, but Nixon found himself all alone the last half when Thomas was forced to retire to the pits.

George Roeder finished third with Jim Varnes in fourth. Novice, Ray Hempstead rode a steady race to take fifth.

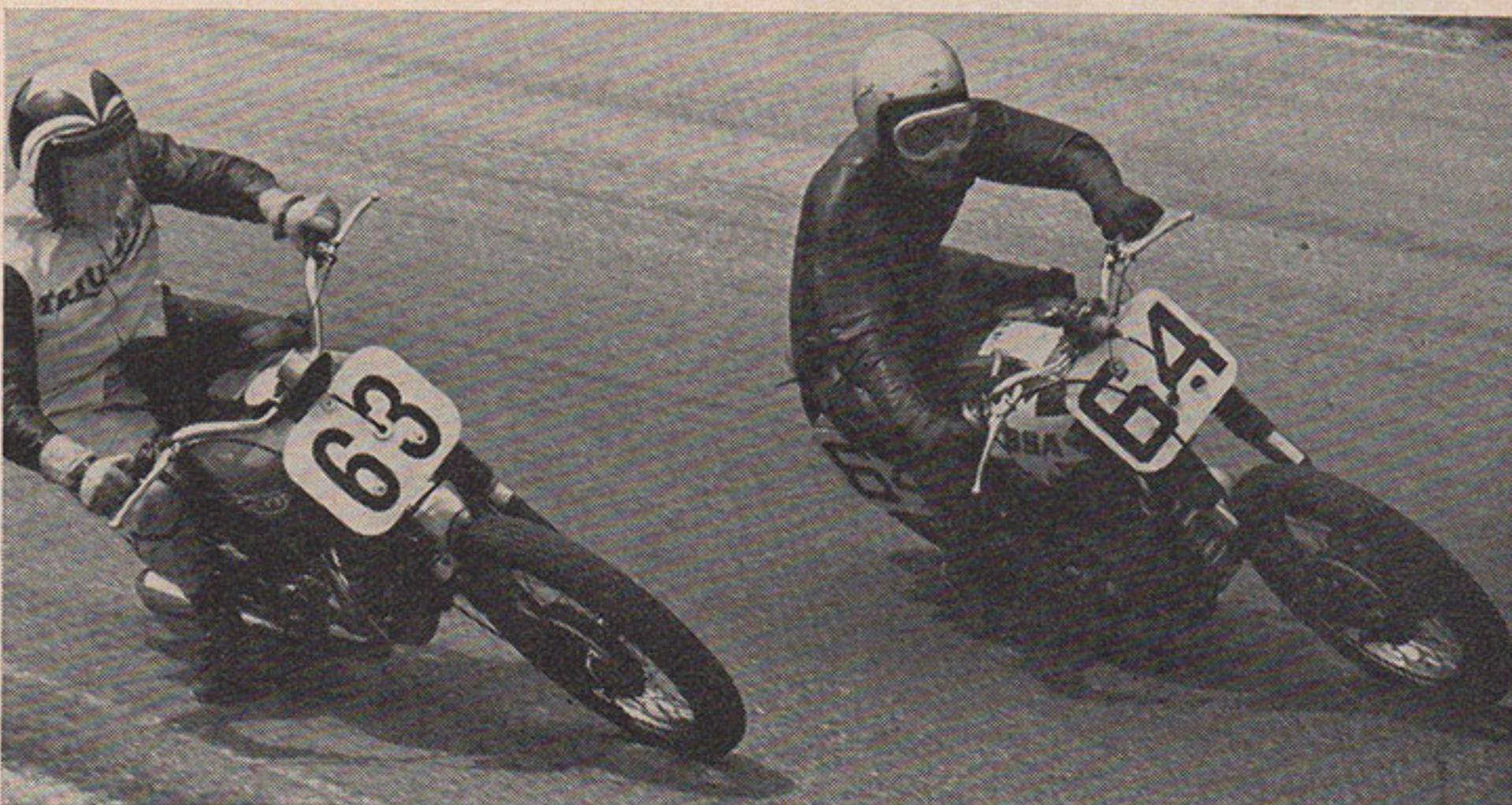

Top three in the 150 were Jody Nicholas, winner, Dick Hammer, third; and George Roeder, second

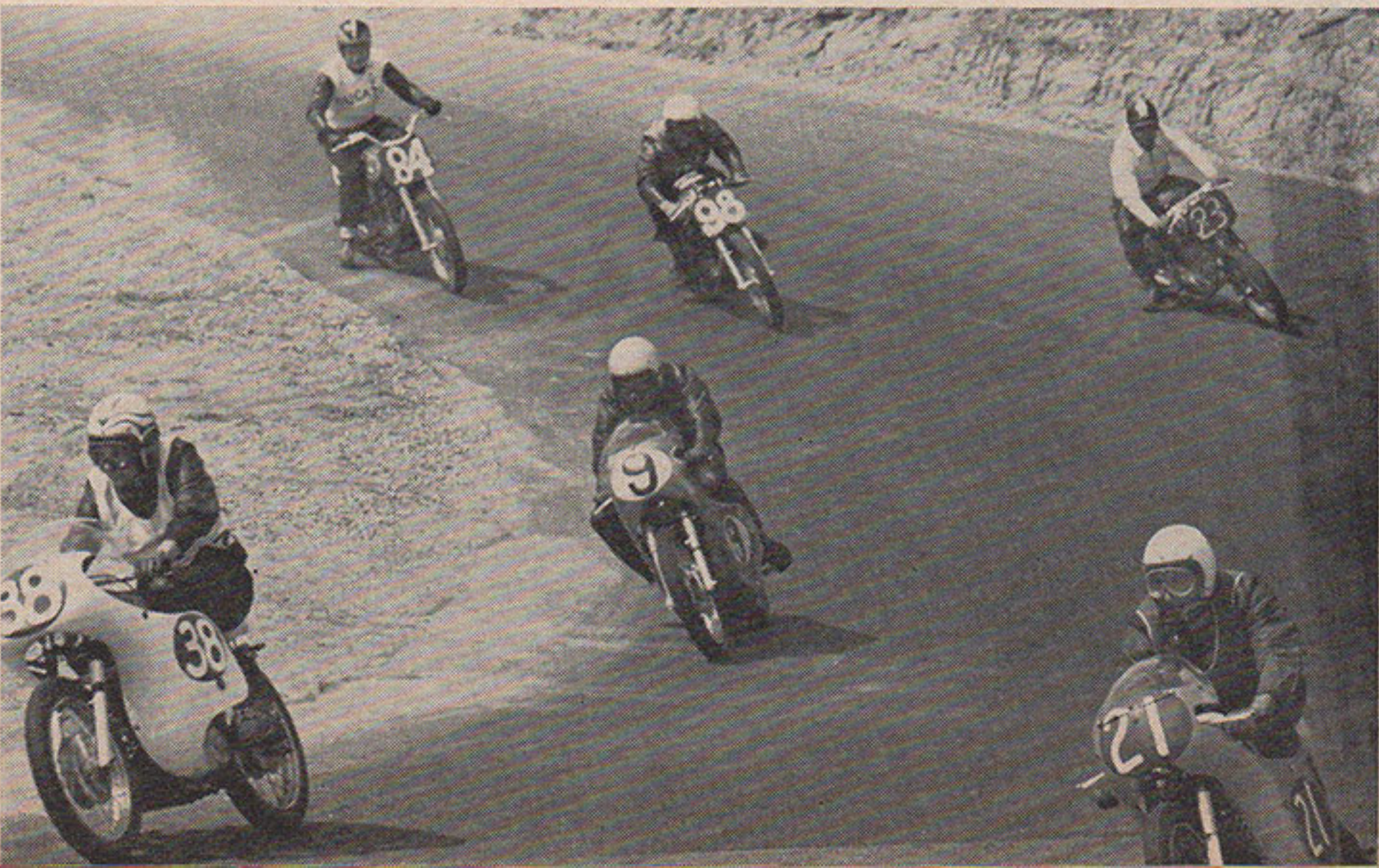


Story of the race—Nicholas and Hammer or Hammer and Nicholas—until Jody made his pit stop.



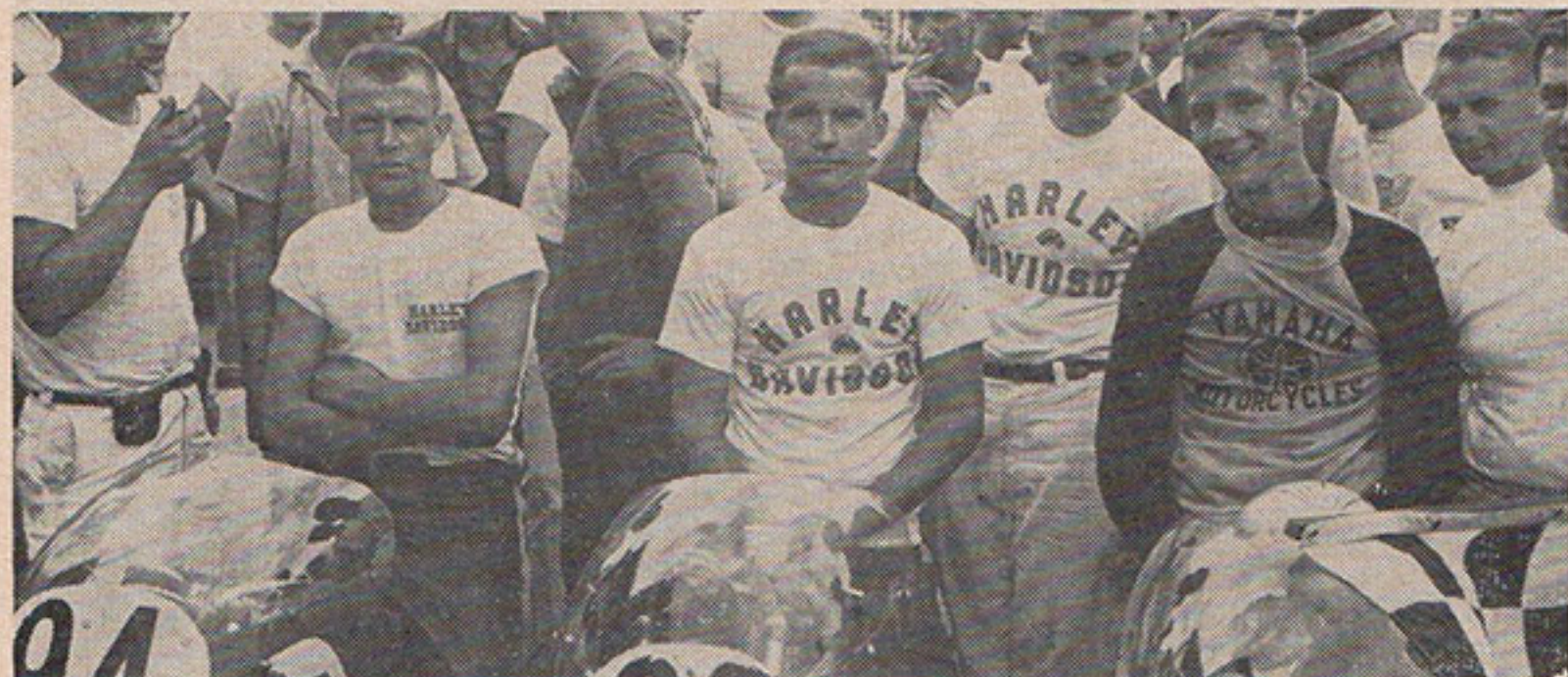
Gary Nixon and Dick Mann put on a terrific show as they battled for third early in the race.

Below—Action in the hairpin turn during the 250cc combined event.





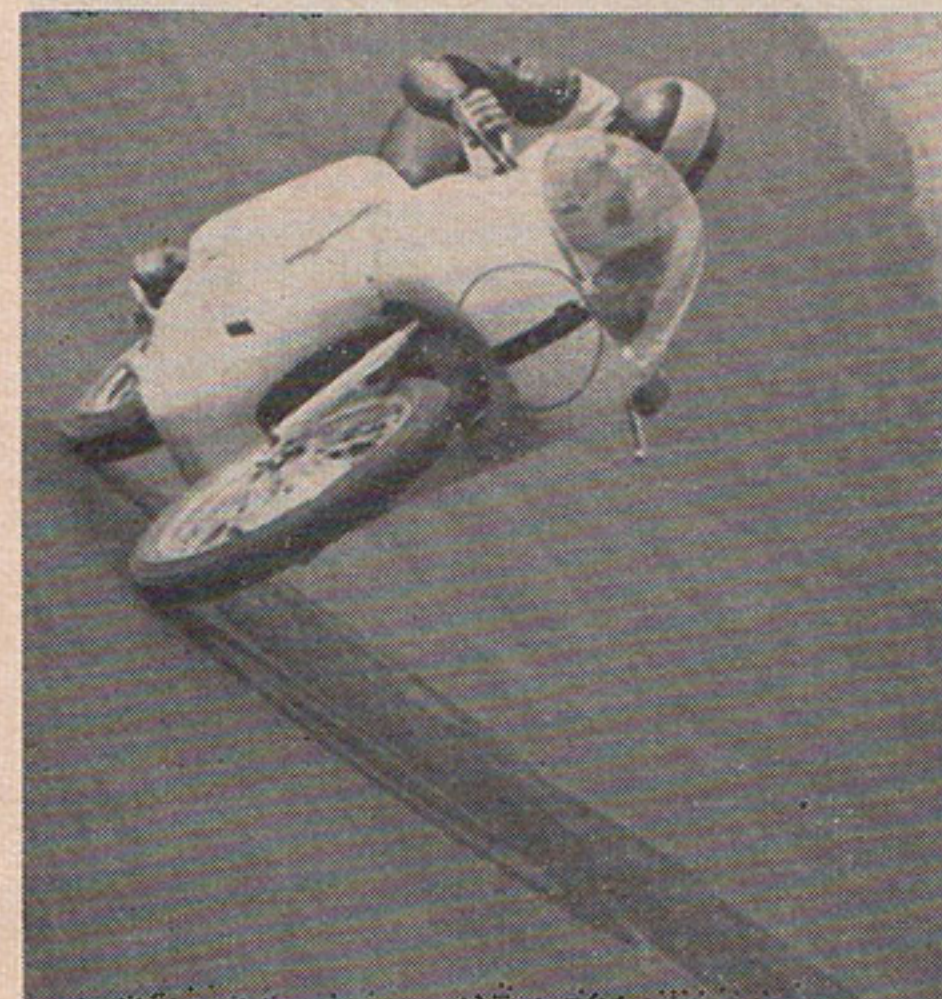
Amateur finalists from right are Tony Woodman, winner; Bill Lloyd, second and Walt Thompson, third.



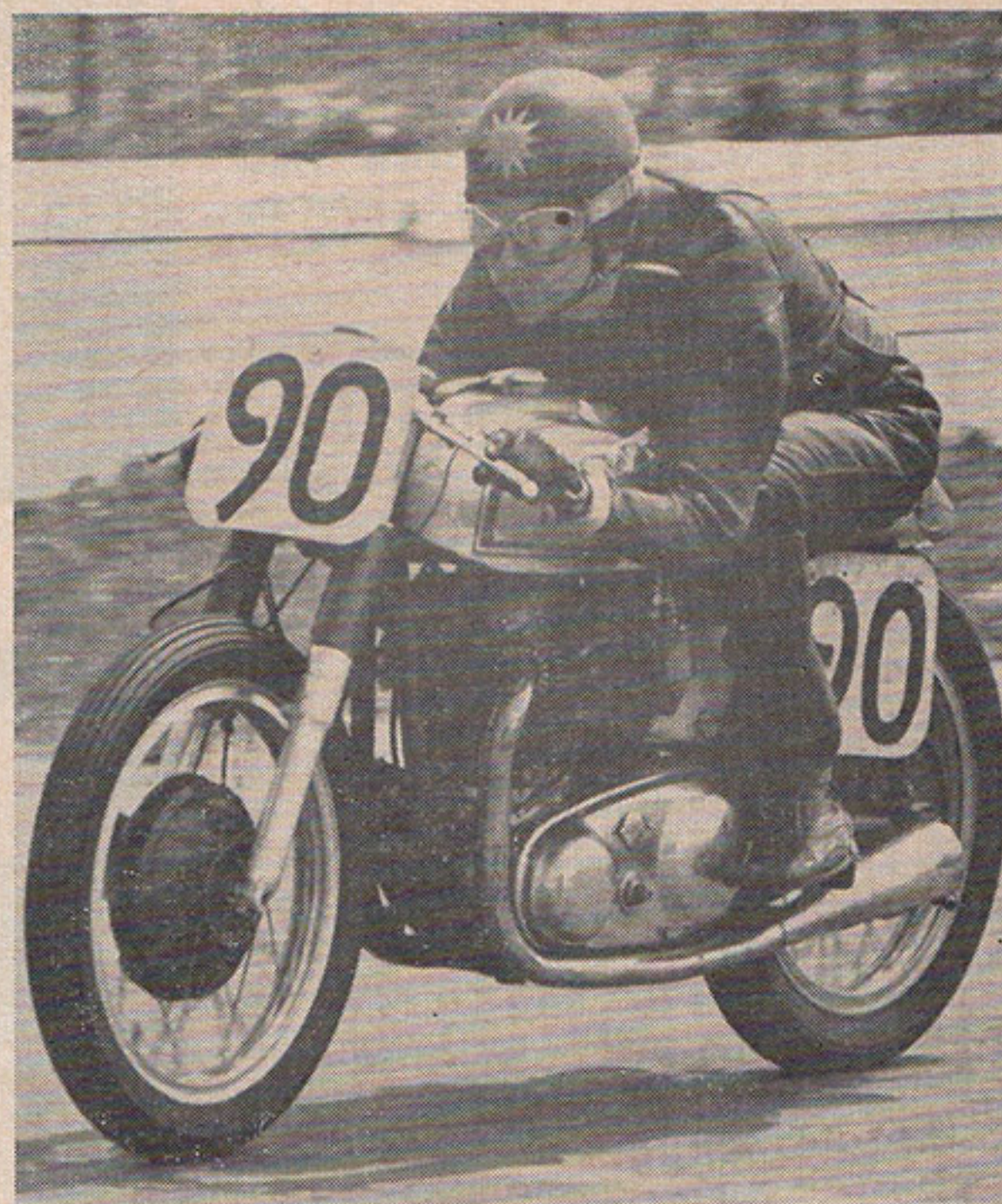
Lined up in reverse order in the 250cc winner's circle are George Roeder, third; Gary Nixon, second; and winner Jody Nicholas.

15th Annual Typical Girl Rider Contest Announced

Pictures should be clear and sharp as they will be published in AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING, at which time ballots will be mailed to clubs. It is from these published pictures the AMA clubs will select the girls for whom their ballots will be cast.

Entry deadline is midnight October 30, 1963.

Be sure to read carefully the official rules which follow. Rules one through six apply to entries. The remaining rules apply to voting which will take place after the entries are published.

REMEMBER entry deadline, midnight October 30, 1963.

Official Rules

1. Each AMA club may sponsor as many contestants as they wish.
2. It is not necessary that a contestant be sponsored by more than one club.
3. Each contestant must be an AMA member in good standing and must be able to ride and operate a motorcycle.

6. Entries must be postmarked before midnight, October 30, 1963. Any entries dated after this deadline cannot be accepted.
7. Each AMA club has 100 points for voting—First choice, 50 points; second choice, 30 points; third choice, 20 points. Members shall collectively agree on their first, second and third choices and shall list them on the official ballot, or they may list only one contestant and give her the entire club's 100 points.
8. Votes received on any form other than an

official ballot will not be accepted. All ballots must be signed by both the club president and secretary.

9. Any votes received after the voting deadline or for girls other than those officially entered will be automatically voided.

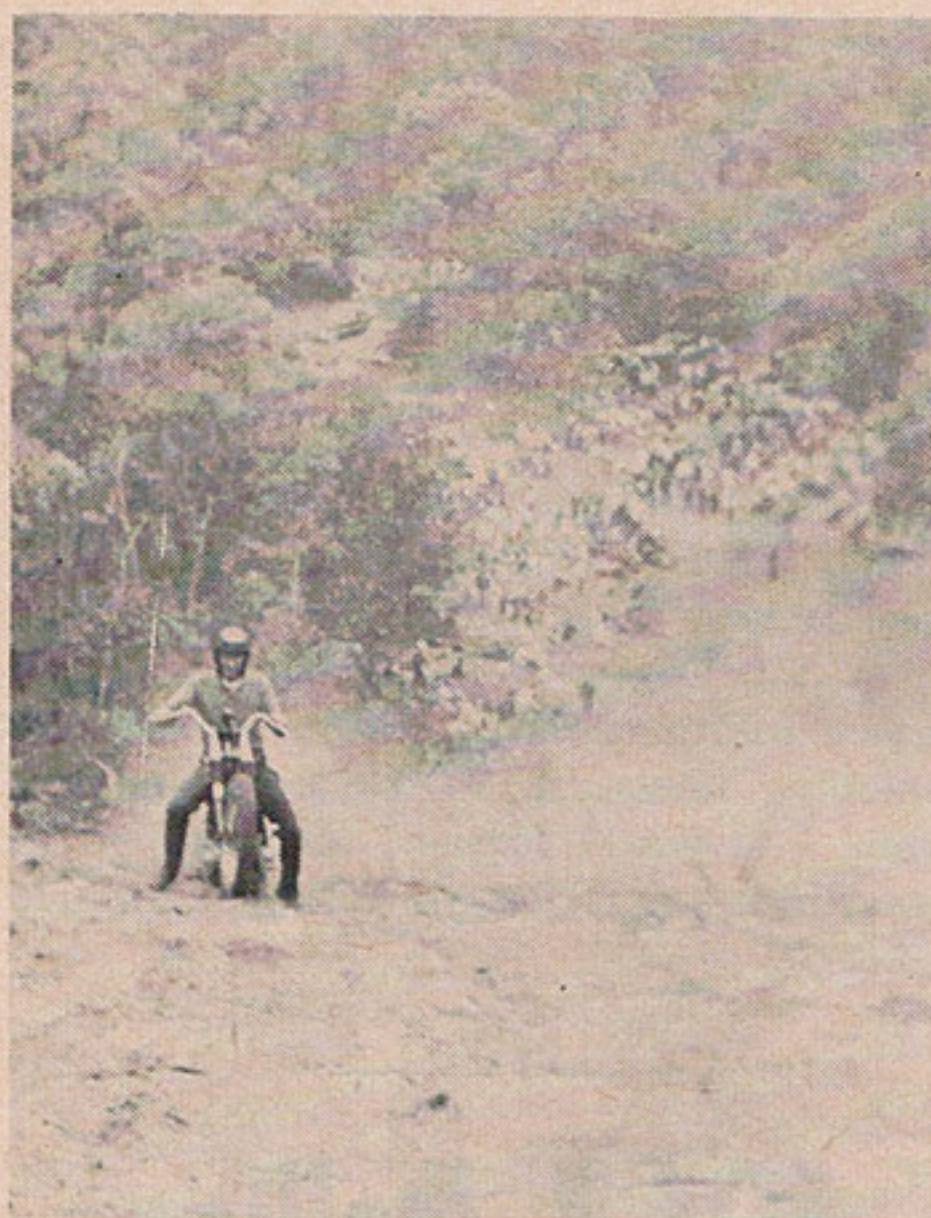

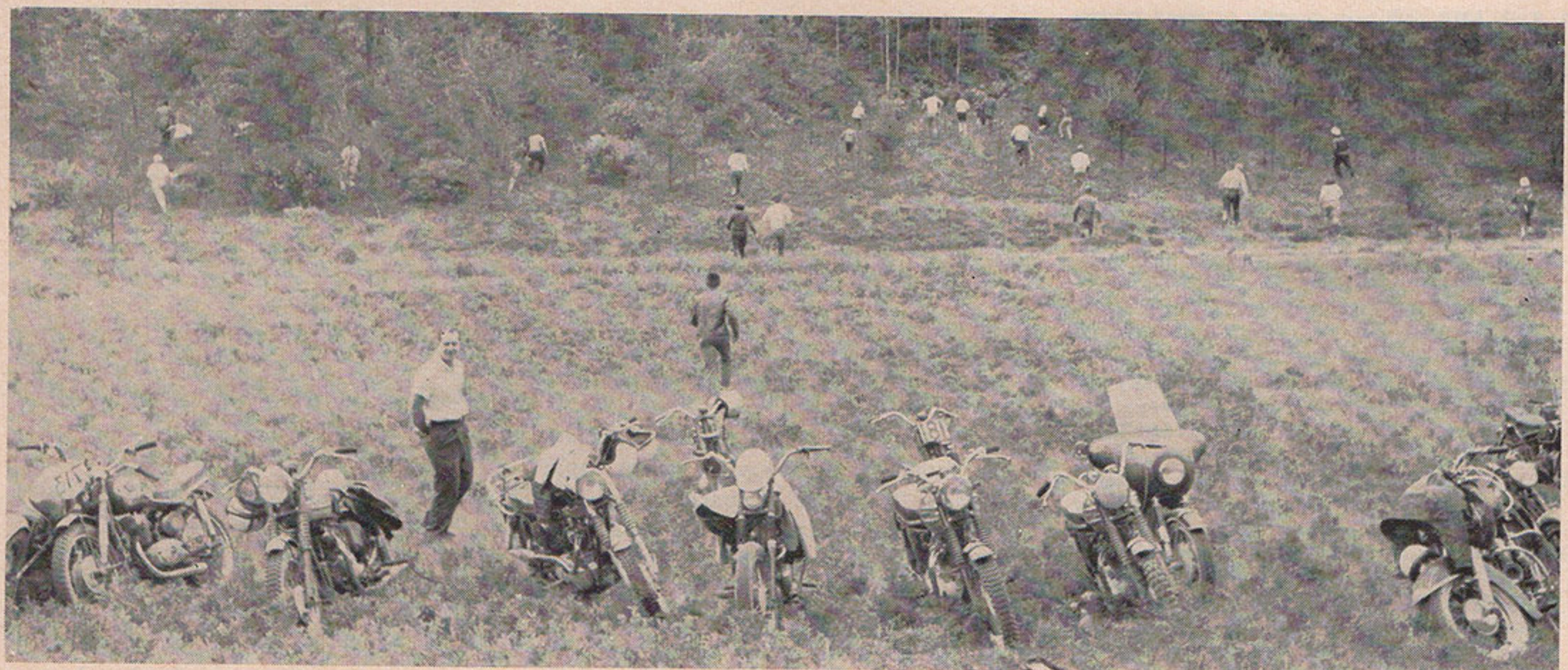

... and once again, roundup time is over.

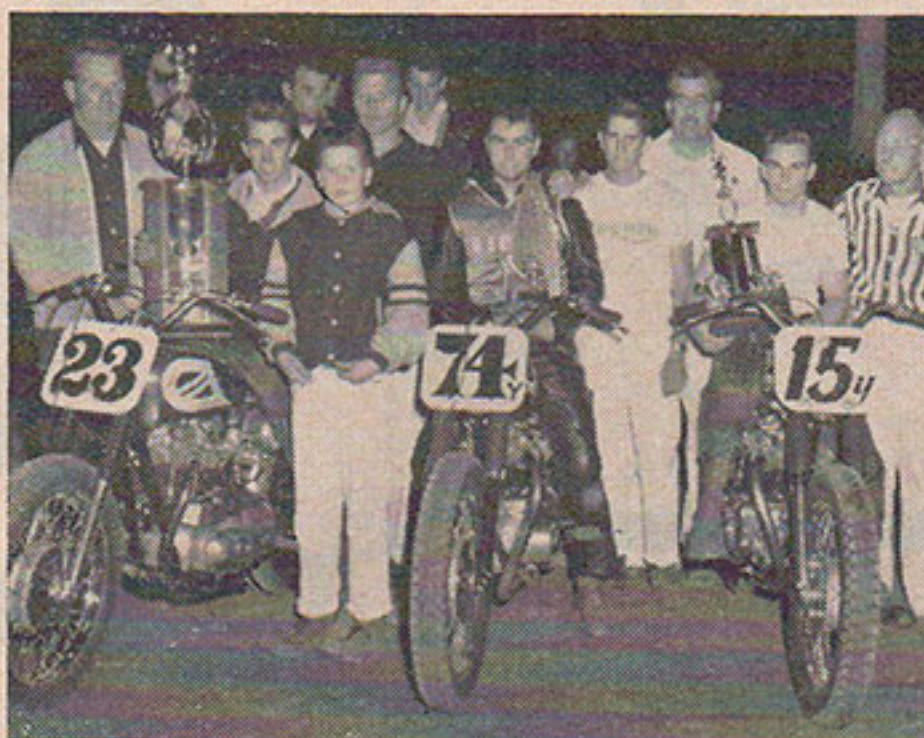
Hayward Completes 1963 Season

The next day in the big show he was running in the first ten with 10 miles to go when the engine quit.

The two class C events will carry a \$1000.00 purse each with the scrambles packing some huge trophies to all of the top finishers. The entire meet is being spark plugged by Steve Lamkin.

It was my pleasure, just before leaving for the East, to be invited up to Red Bluff to give a talk on cycling at the Lion's meeting. Most are new to cycles and racing, but want to go all out to make the 1964 Red Bluff rally the biggest event for both road riders and racers on the West Coast.



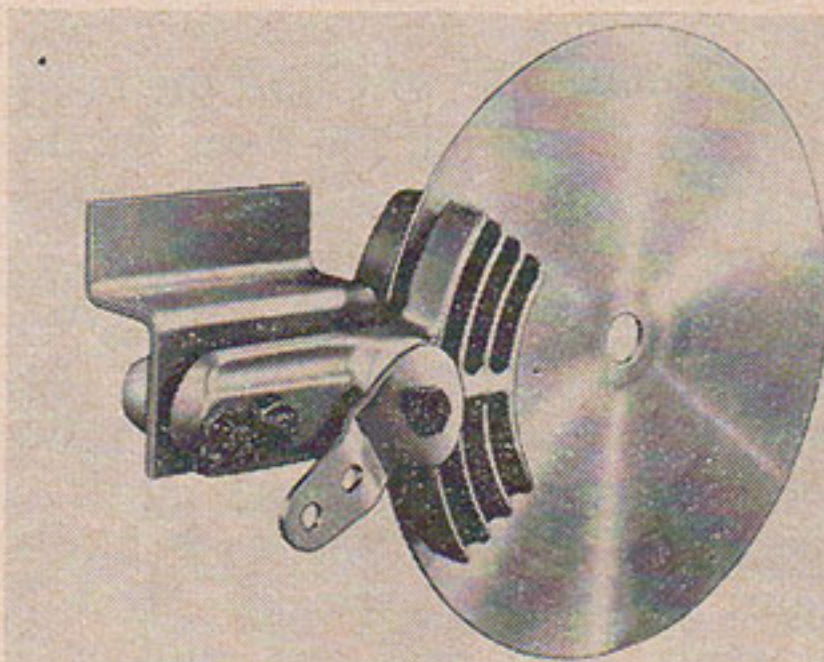

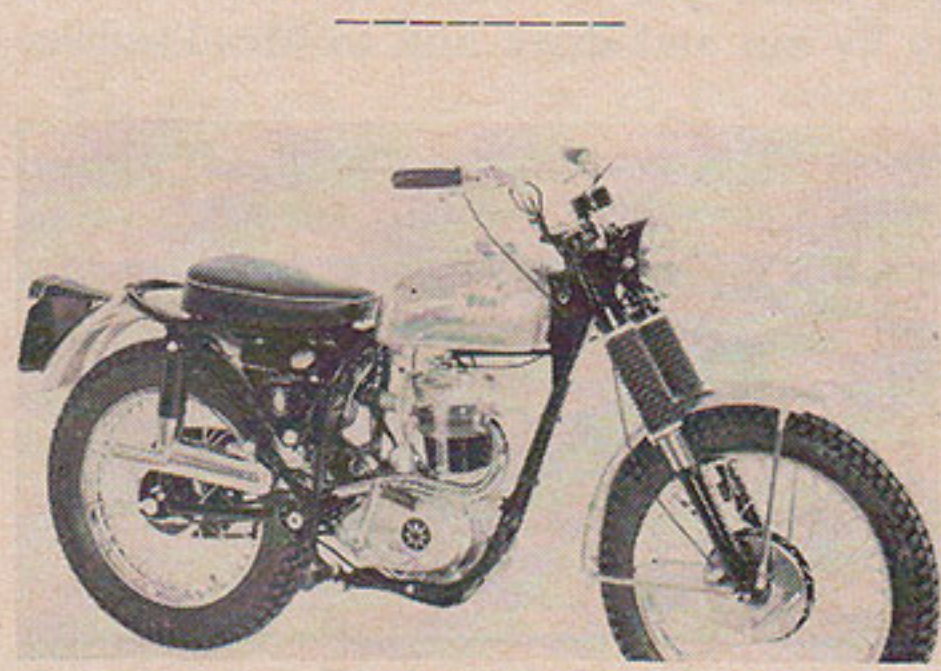
AMC Receives Large Export Order

Associated Motor Cycles has announced another big U.S. export order — worth well over one million dollars. It was placed by Joseph Berliner, president of the Berliner Motor Corporation of America.

The initial order calls for several thousand machines, mainly the 750cc Norton Atlas, plus spares. Deliveries are due to start soon and be completed by early January 1964.

In addition to the one million dollar-plus deal, Mr. Berliner has put in a substantial order for a 750cc Scrambler model, of a promising new specification — for delivery "as early as possible."

At the same time, he has had talks with AMC chiefs at the Company's headquarters at Woolwich, London, on ways and means of stepping up supplies of all the AMC products he distributes in the States. These include the Electra 400, the revolutionary new motor cycle with a car-type electric starter originally designed specially for the U.S. market. Six months ago, Mr. Berliner gave AMC an order worth \$1,400,000.00 for this machine.



New BSA Starfire Available

Now available through BSA dealers throughout the U.S.A. is the Starfire-Enduro-Trials model. It is equipped with an entirely new frame, new front end, new centrally mounted oil tank, alloy gas tank, alloy fenders, and complete direct lighting set. As an enduro and trials machine, it has a modified compression engine, a wide ratio gearbox, special trials-type cams and Trials Universal tires. With a quick sprocket change it can be converted to road trim.

In addition BSA also supplies a Starfire Roadster model similar in appearance, but with high-compression engine, larger carburetor, competition-type camshaft and scrambles gearing. This model is equipped with Trials Universal-type tires, sports muffler and complete direct lighting set, for the man who wishes a high performance on-an-off-the-road model.

The "Senior" has a wheelbase of 51",



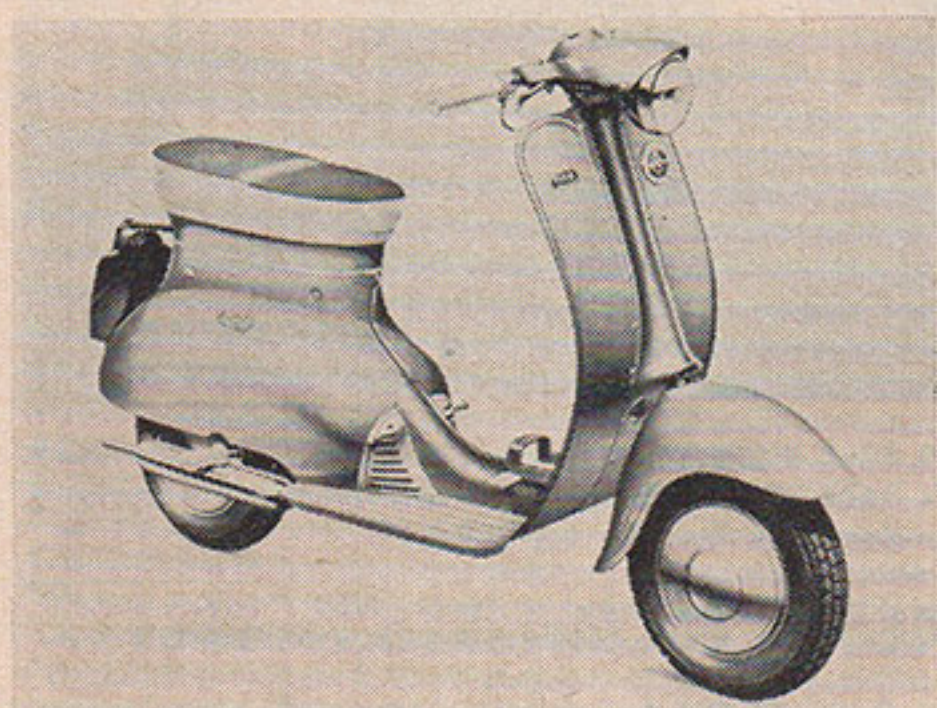
frame clearance of 7" and large 20" wheels.

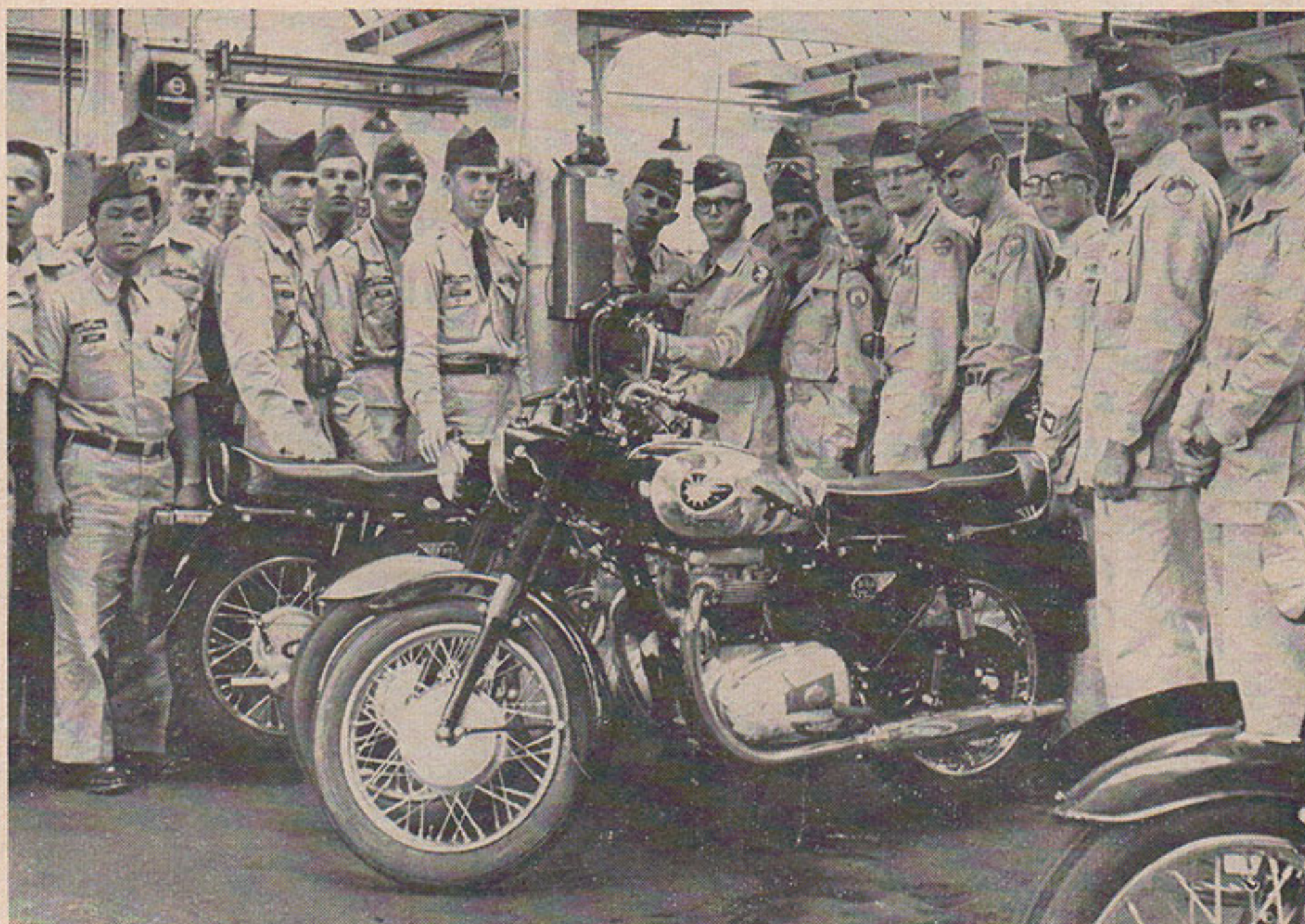

front wheel back onto terra firma.

After trying desperately to control his bike he wound up under it with a twisted leg. Damage to his equipment was negligible and he was able to ride in the next scrambles event at a later date.

The point is that under that helmet is a youthful mind which doesn't surrender easily to defeat, and under those leathers is a youthful heart which beats with enthusiasm as he eyes his competition on the starting line.

Who Hates Airlines

I'll be the first to admit my heart sinks clear down to my shoes when I see my son take a spill, but statistics prove that there are very few serious injuries to riders who participate on the tracks which are built especially for this type of sport.

As for the people who classify motorcyclists as one of the lowest forms of animal life, I have little patience. I don't like to travel by air either, but I don't think pilots are a breed of people who should be exterminated because I'm afraid of an airplane.

These youthful competition riders are spending their spare time keeping their equipment mechanically perfect in anticipation of the thrill of winning a trophy at a sanctioned race.

This is in direct contrast to the youths who seek their thrills in high powered cars on public highways where they jeopardize the lives of others.

There is a difference!
