The Finish Line



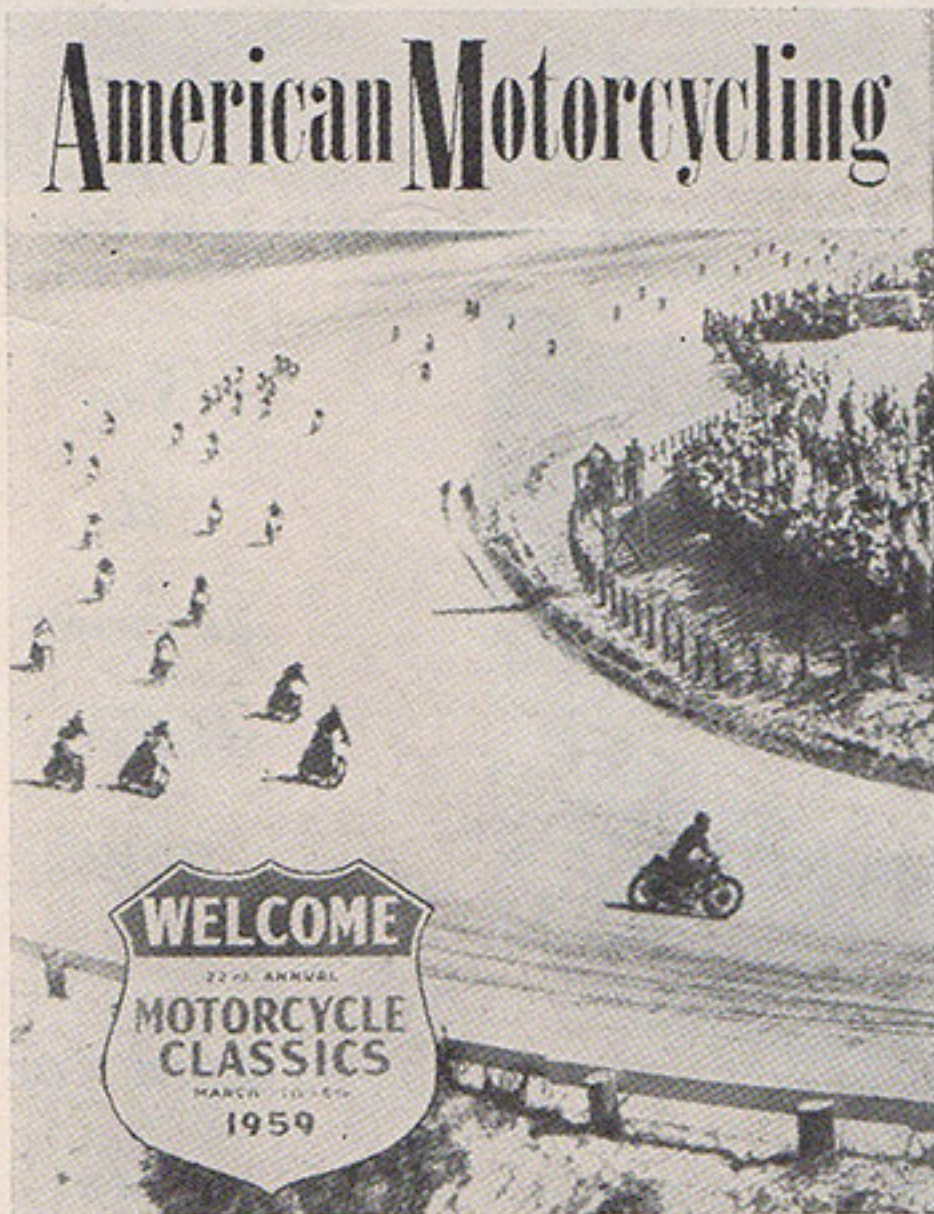

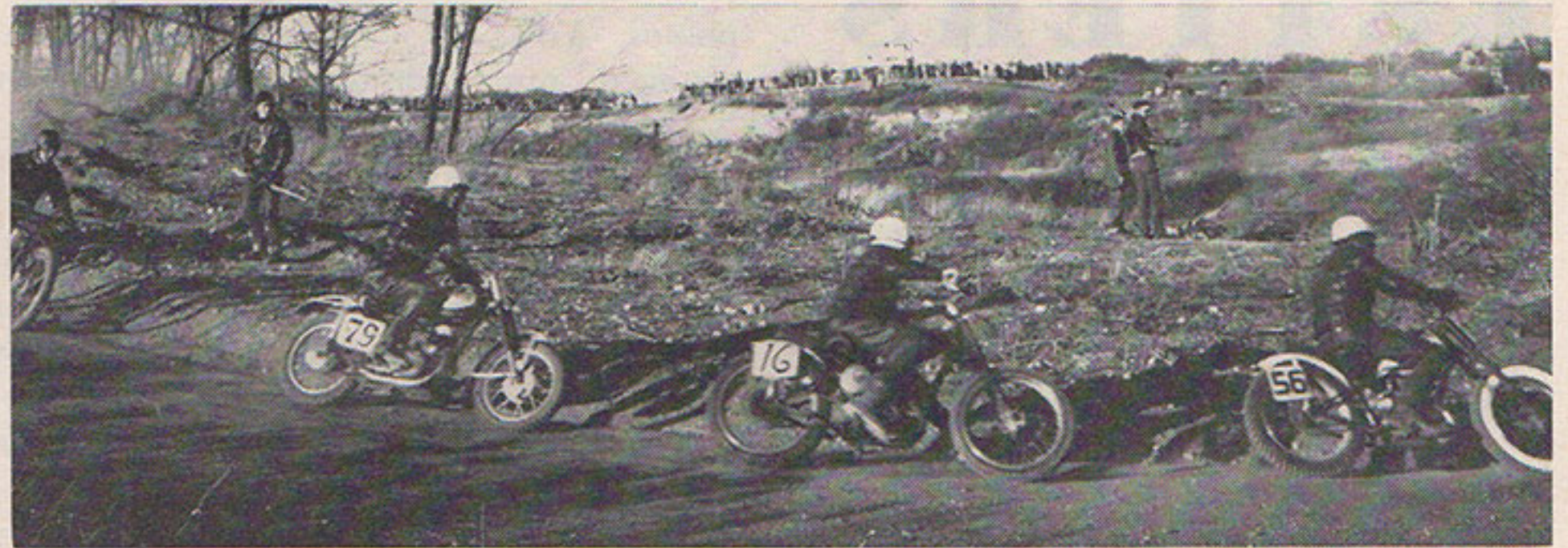
20 Above TT Racing Proves Hot

Action was close in the 165 final and here, in lap two, the pack is still jammed together. Between heats, the flagmen huddled around their log fires.

In Baltimore, Md., November 30, proof of the growing popularity of TT racing, especially for lightweight machines, was shown on this cold and blustery Sunday, when half a hundred enthusiastic riders from Maryland, Washington, Virginia, Pennsylvania and New Jersey, came to the Red Wings' closing race of the season.

The thermometer hung at the 20 above mark, so everybody had to keep moving or freeze to death. The course—a real up and down combination—is loaned, rent free, to the cycle club by a cooperative builder, and it is located just three miles from the heart of America's sixth largest city. The track was bull-dozed by the club members, and a good refreshment stand was erected with a strong platform on the roof, from which announcer "Red" Perrault held forth with a powerful amplifying system that could be heard almost over to Memorial Stadium where the Colts were taking a close one from the San Francisco 49'ers, to give Baltimore its first professional football championship. However, the spectators who came to shiver at our cycle TT race had no interest in pro football,

warm homes, or other softening influences of our modern civilization!

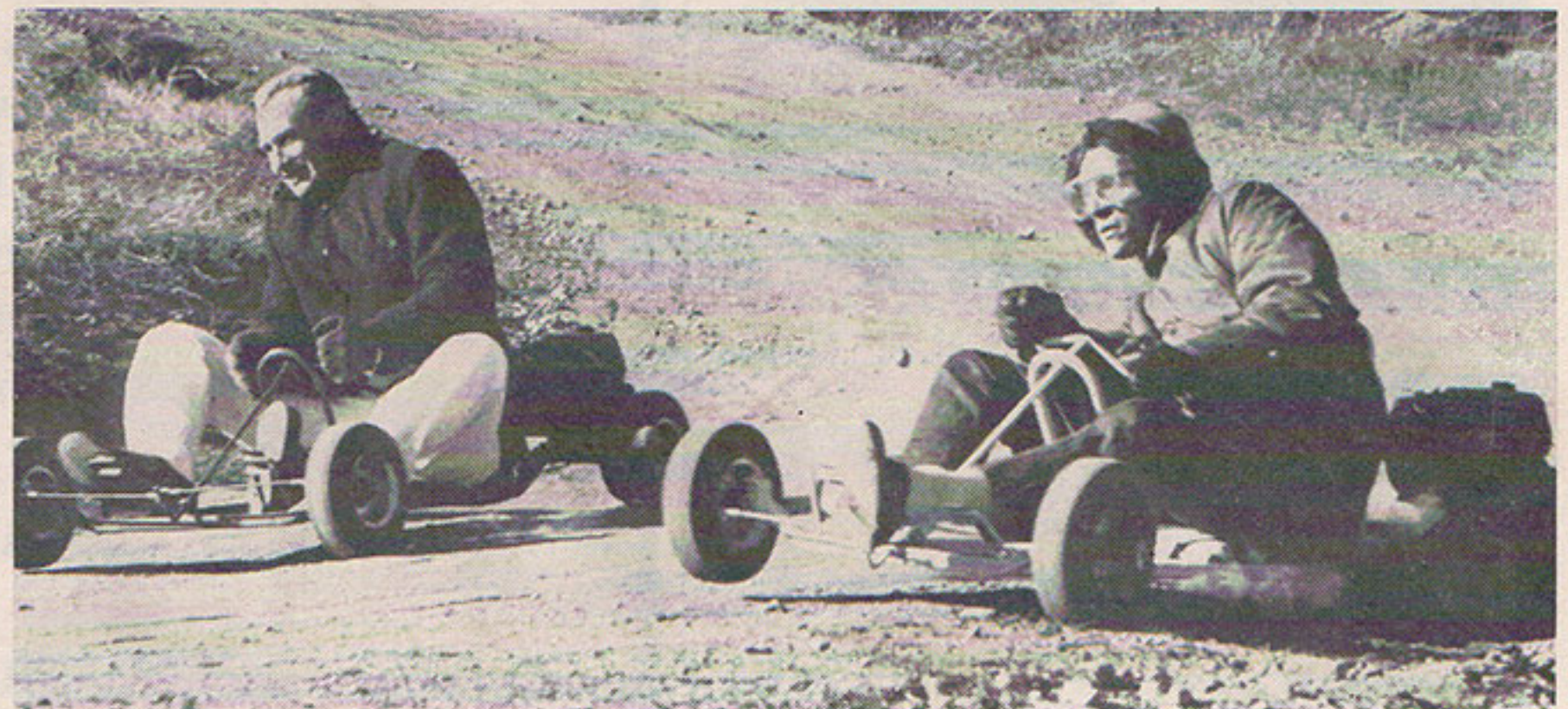
Excitement started with the first wave of flagman Bob Boutwell's piece of checkered cotton, and continued at a sustained high pitch until almost dusk. It seemed as if the riders in each heat were trying to close the racing season with an all-out effort, and even in the consolation heats — with just one cup on the line — everybody kept the taps open — nobody wanted to be last! The results show a good healthy variety of mixed machinery in the winner's circle.

Daytona Schedule

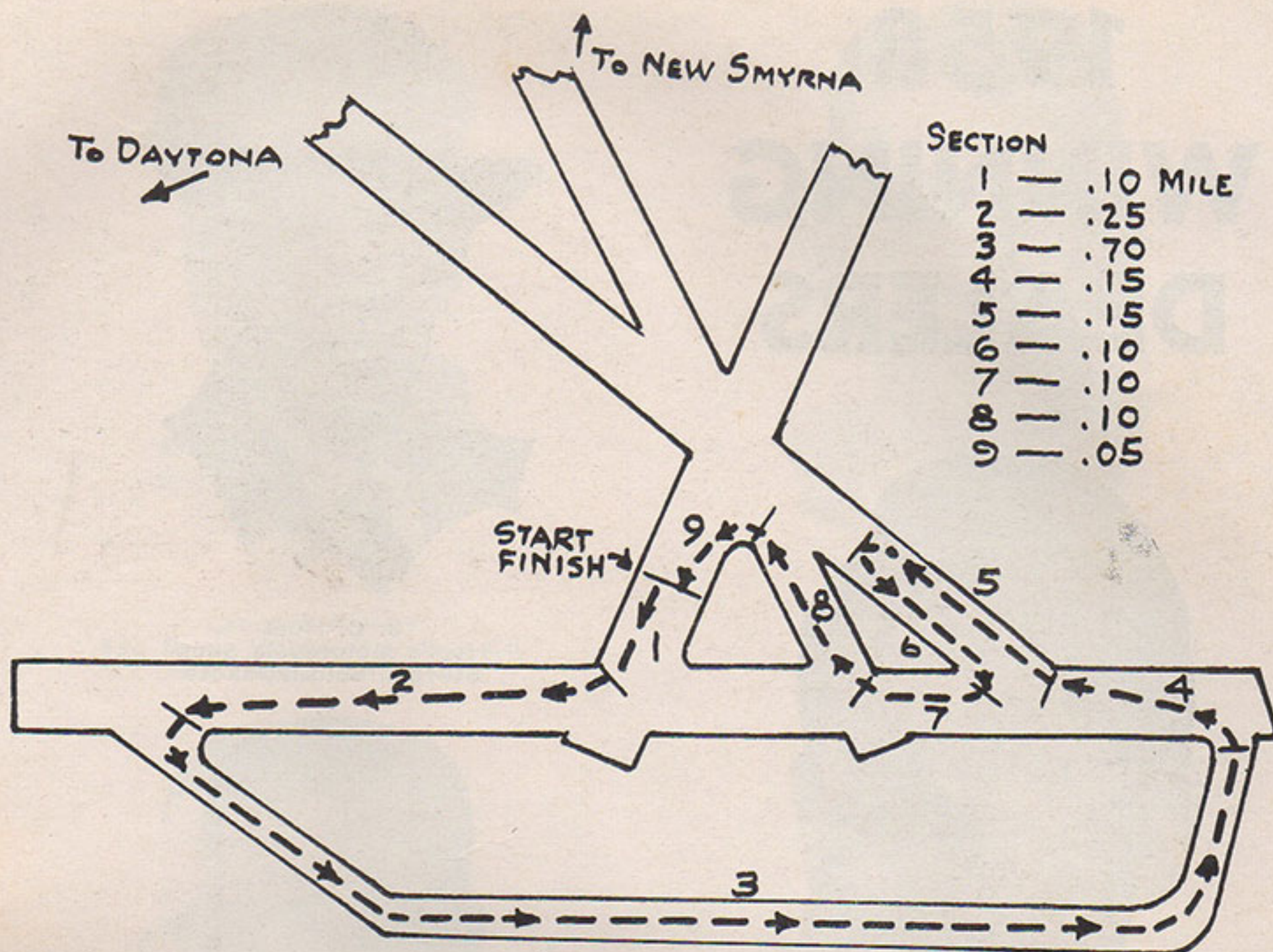
FOR the first time in the 20 year history of motorcycle racing in Daytona Beach an effort will be made to secure an accurate count of the number of cyclists who attend. To accomplish this purpose, a 24-hour-a-day registration center will be set up at race headquarters.

Each person who registers will receive a button to wear while in Daytona Beach and a valuable prize will be given away to some lucky button wearer on Saturday night at the Armory Show.

Every effort will be made to keep a complete list of all visitors who are in for the races. If you want to find out where your friends or buddies are, just check at headquarters.

Another service for the cyclists will be the listing of all cooperating accommodations in the area. Don't make reservations without checking headquarters. For advance reservations drop a line or just stop at headquarters when you arrive.

While in Daytona Beach look for the welcome shield. This emblem, which you will see displayed at motels, hotels, restaurants and other business places, is not only a sincere sign of "welcome" but also an indication that you will be patronizing

Headquarters is already set up on a 7-day basis at the Museum of Speed located on No. 1 Highway in South Daytona.

This year's Daytona race program which will be held from March 1st through March 8th is sponsored for the first time

by a non-profit civic group. Any profits from the races will be placed in a fund to be used for the 1960 events.

Bill Tuthill, director of events, has laid out the most comprehensive program in the 22-year Daytona history. A complete schedule is attached.

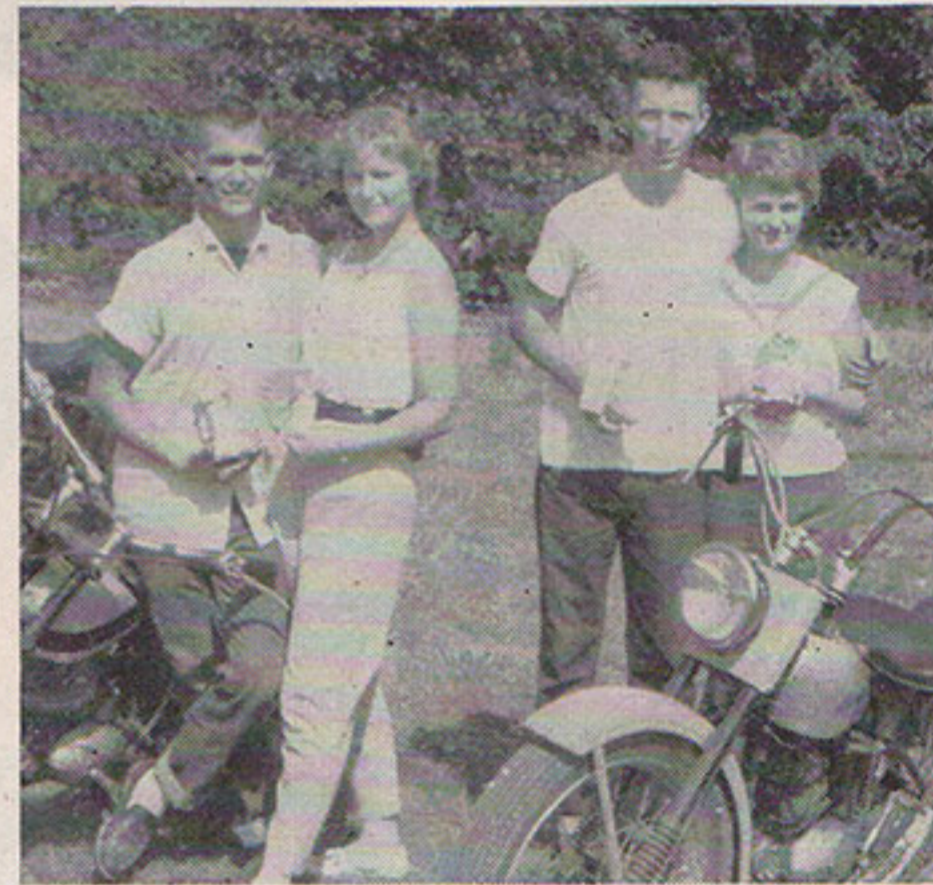
Under ideal weather, riders came early on Saturday to get a choice camping spot on the beautiful Peoria MC's club grounds that saw the biggest turnout ever.

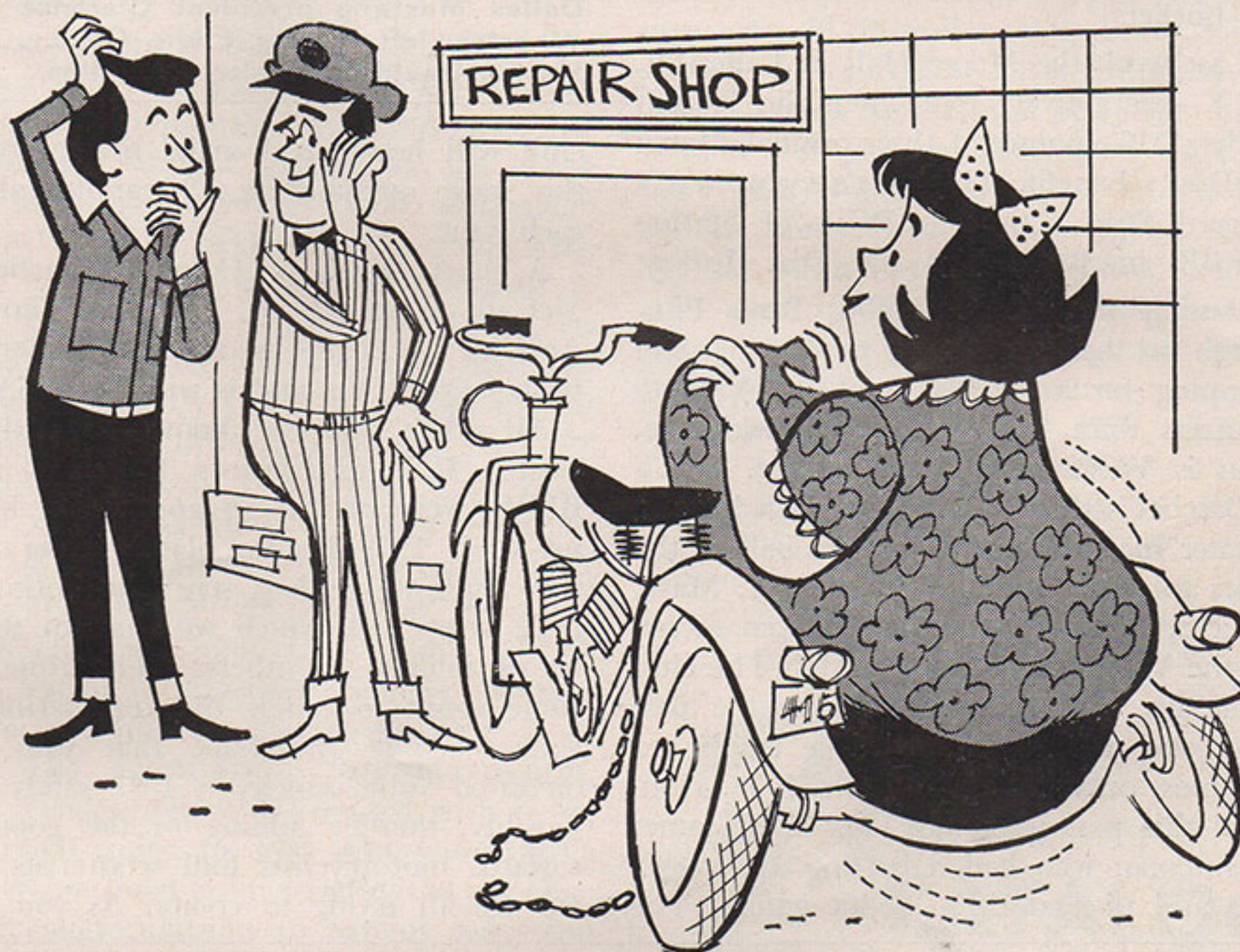

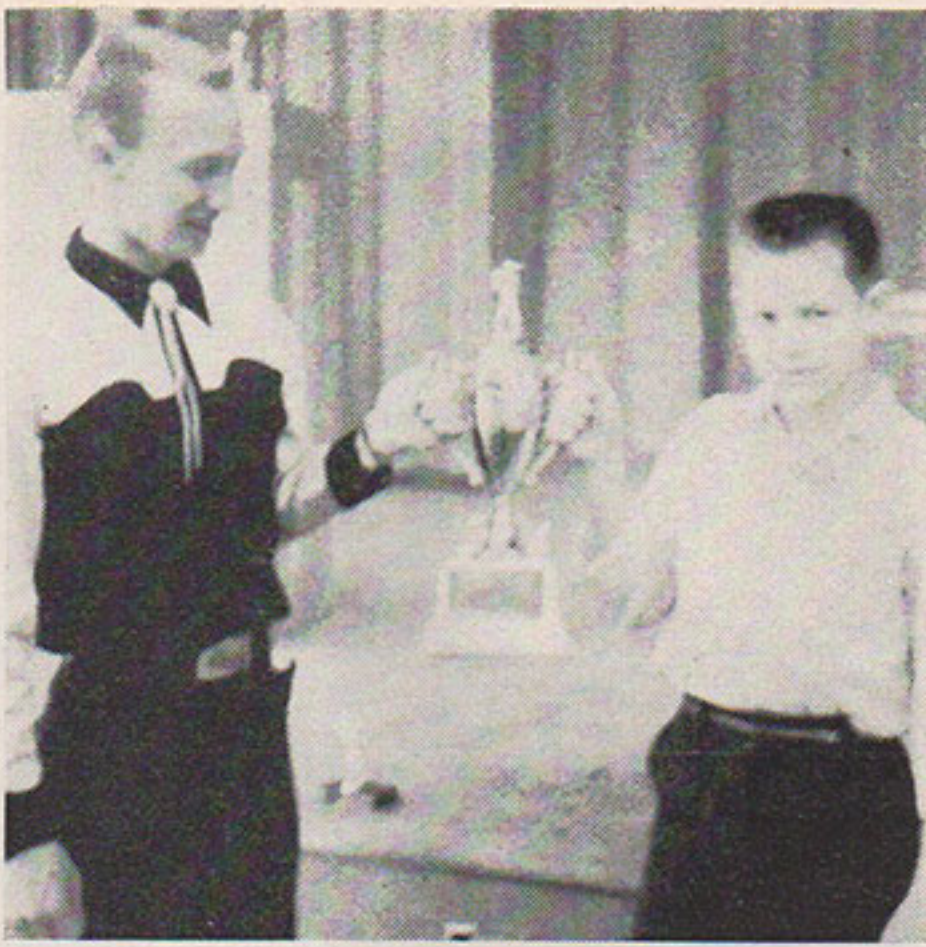

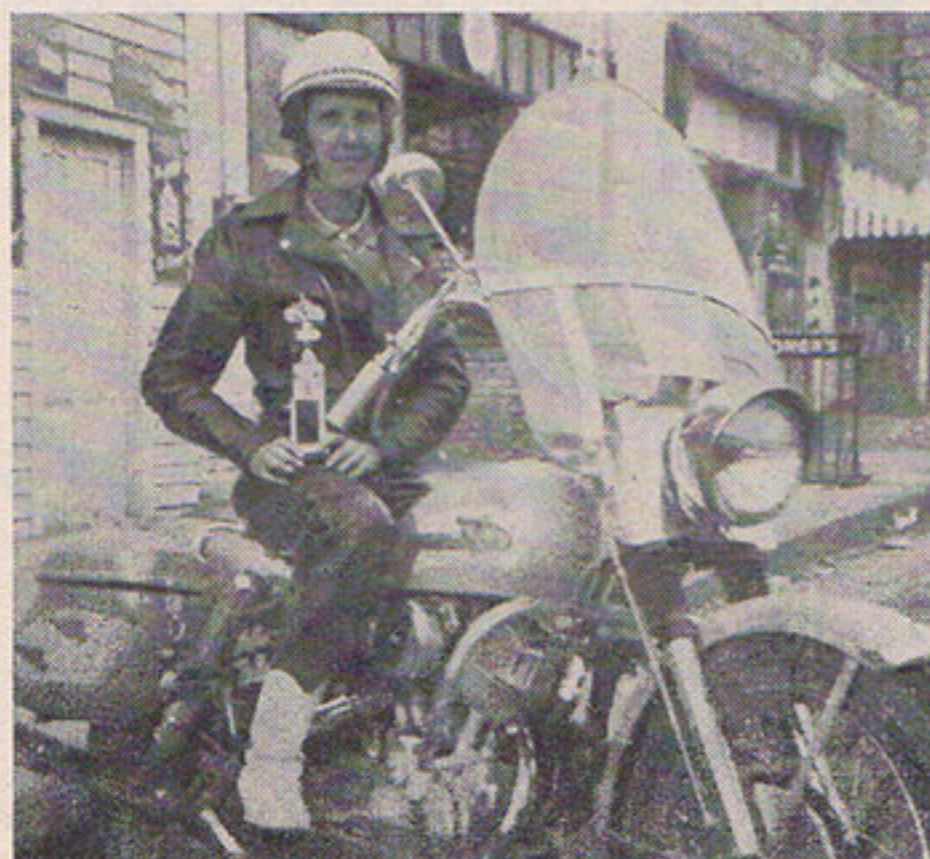

The Kansas District held a banquet at the close of their activity contest with a couple of distinguished motorcyclists as guests.

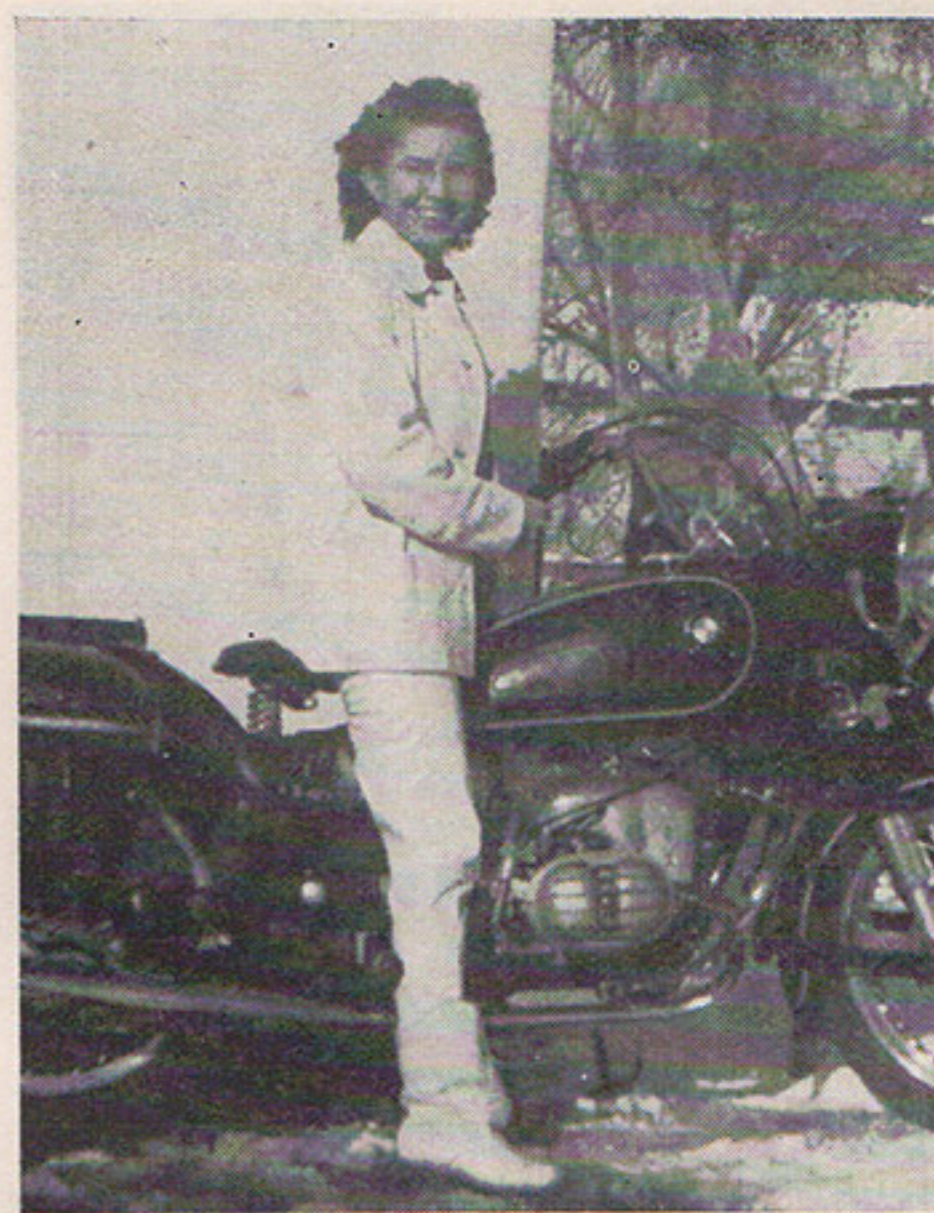

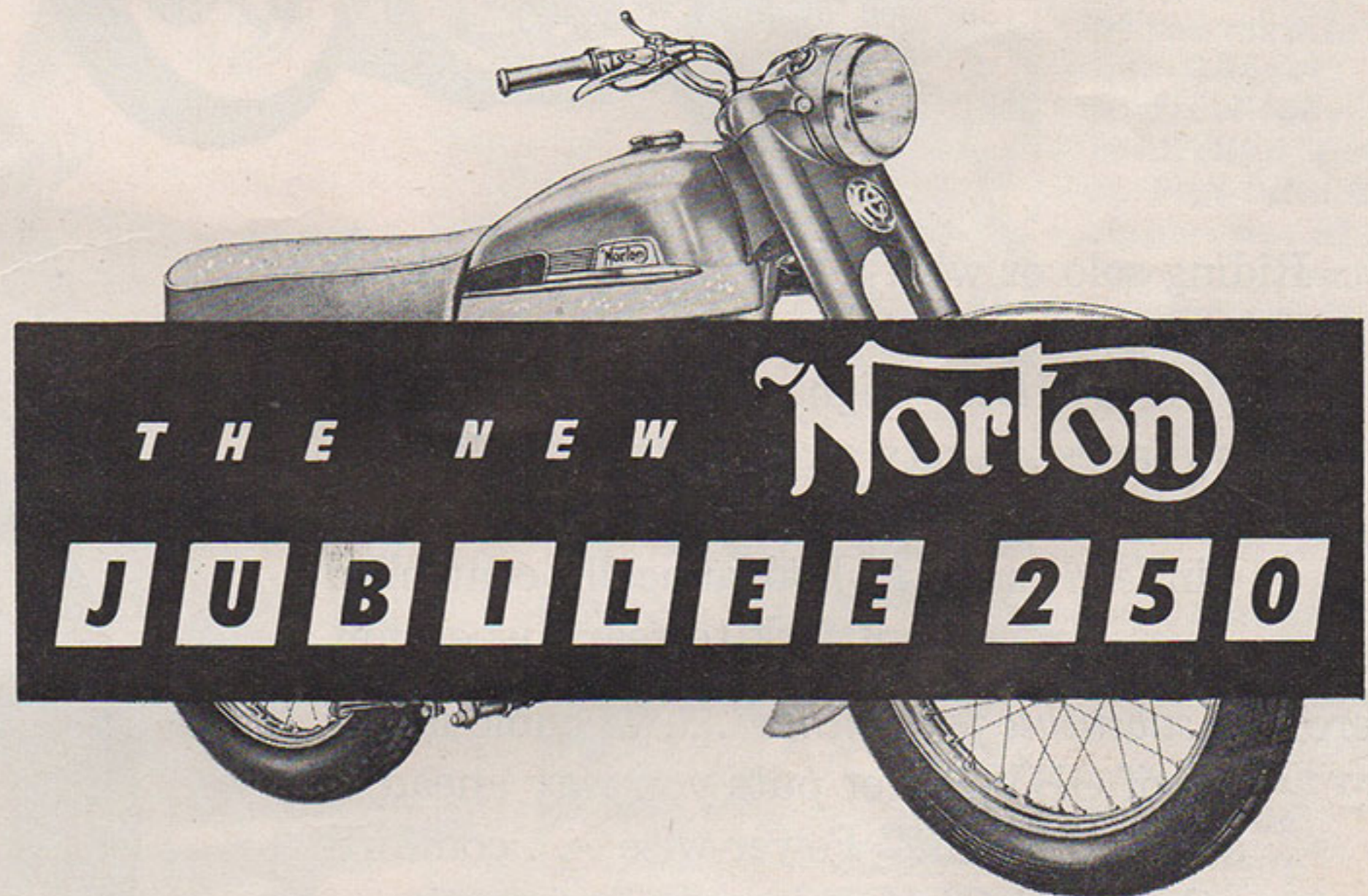
geant-at-Arms Mary Ann Prewitt. Reporter, Marie Howell.

District Referees' Official Bulletin

● The Cromwell-Seagrave model FB-644 safety helmet has been examined, tested and approved by the National Safety Committee for use in AMA competition and placed in Group #2. This helmet is distributed by the Beck Distributing Corp., New York, N. Y.

● The 1959 competition license card will be light blue. In 1959 when a rider appears at any purse paying event, only the competition license and ownership papers should be picked up by the referee since all competition riders will be paid up AMA members for 1959. This is required by the AMA when rider makes application for license.

● All riders who were advanced to amateur or expert, or were assigned new 1959 riding numbers have been notified by postcard. Cards were mailed out by AMA on December 17th.

● Applications for 1959 competition licenses are now available from the AMA office. All riders must again take a physical. Riders 18 and 21 must also furnish a notarized letter of permission from their parents or legal guardian. These riders must also furnish a copy of their birth certificate.

● Expert riders who have been assigned national numbers for 1959 have been requested by AMA to furnish an 8 x 10 picture of the rider and his equipment displaying his new number. This must be done before his 1959 competition license will be issued. Those national number holders who have changed machines since furnishing their pictures, will also be expected to supply new pictures.

● A new and simplified sanction application is now available from the AMA office. Purse paying events will be filled out on a blue sanction application. All other types of events will be filled out on white applications. The sanction fees are all listed on these applications. No more "digging" through the rule book for sanction fees. Phone numbers of a responsible person or official of the promoting group "MUST" be listed on all sanction applications. These phone numbers will be listed in AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING's sanction schedule. This should help all contestants before starting on any long trip to an event.

● The closing date for the Daytona 100 and 200 milers is February 15th; the closing date for the endurance run, Sportsmen road races, Sportsmen hillclimb, scrambles and drags is February 10th. Remember these dates — There will be no post entries. Entry blanks for all the above are available from the AMA office.

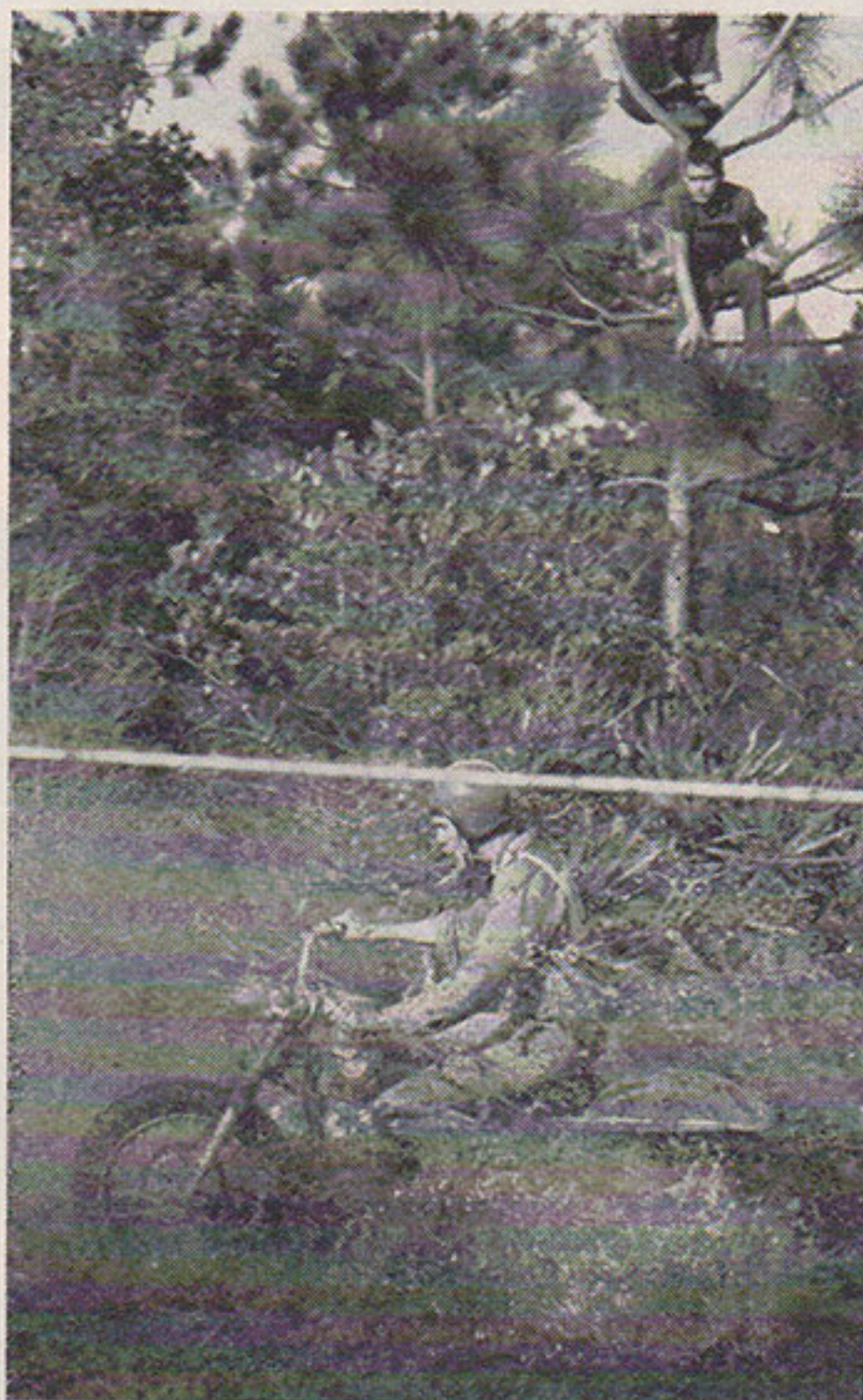
Northwest Florida — Southern Alabama Rally

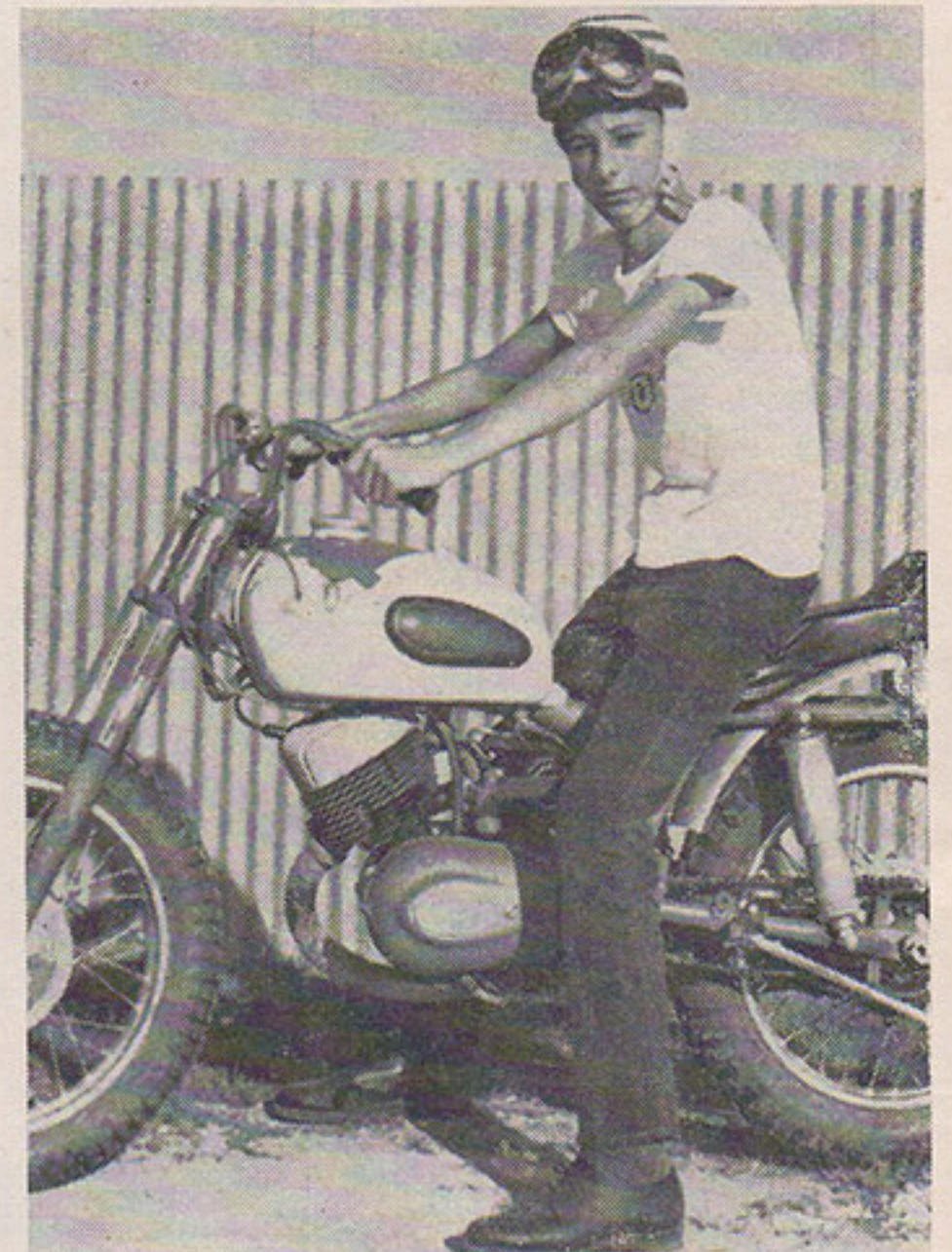

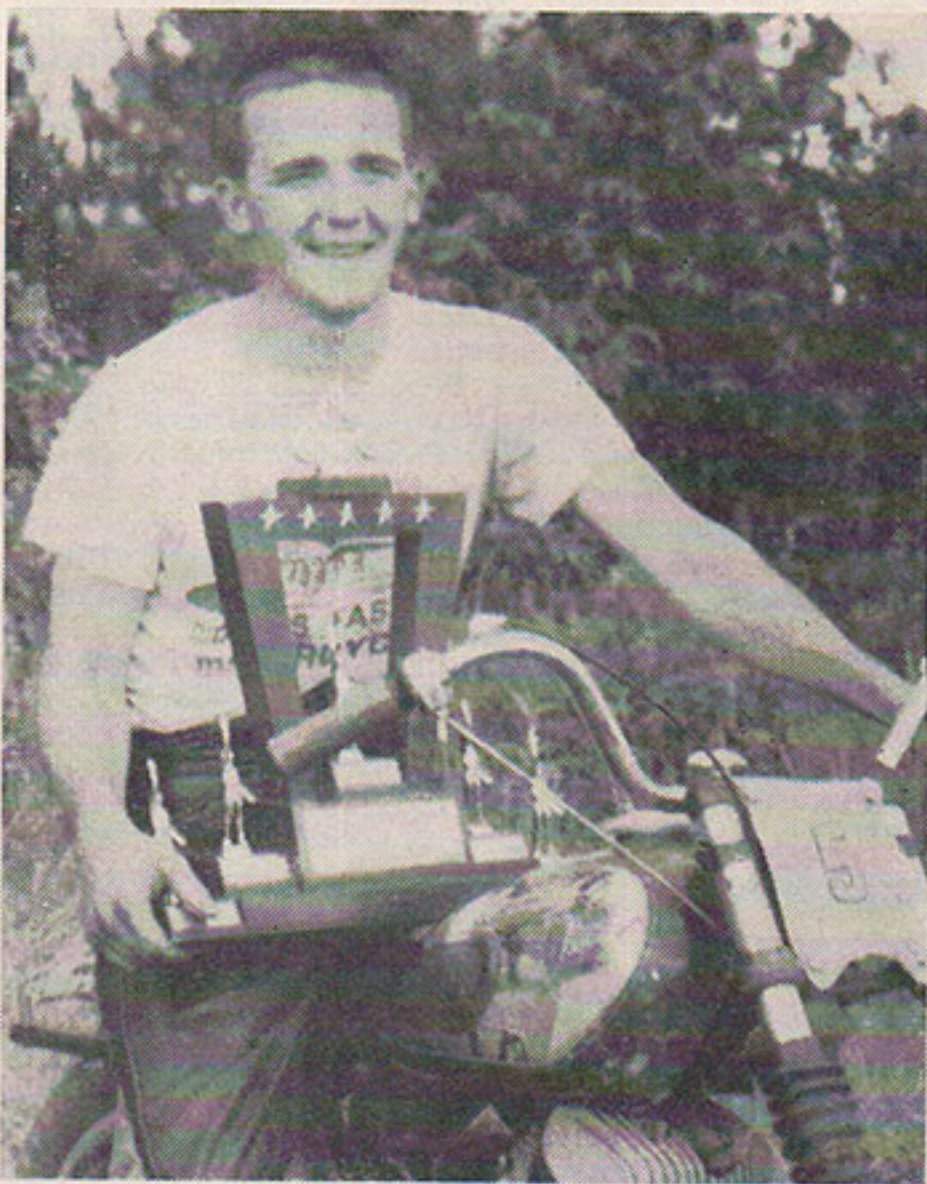

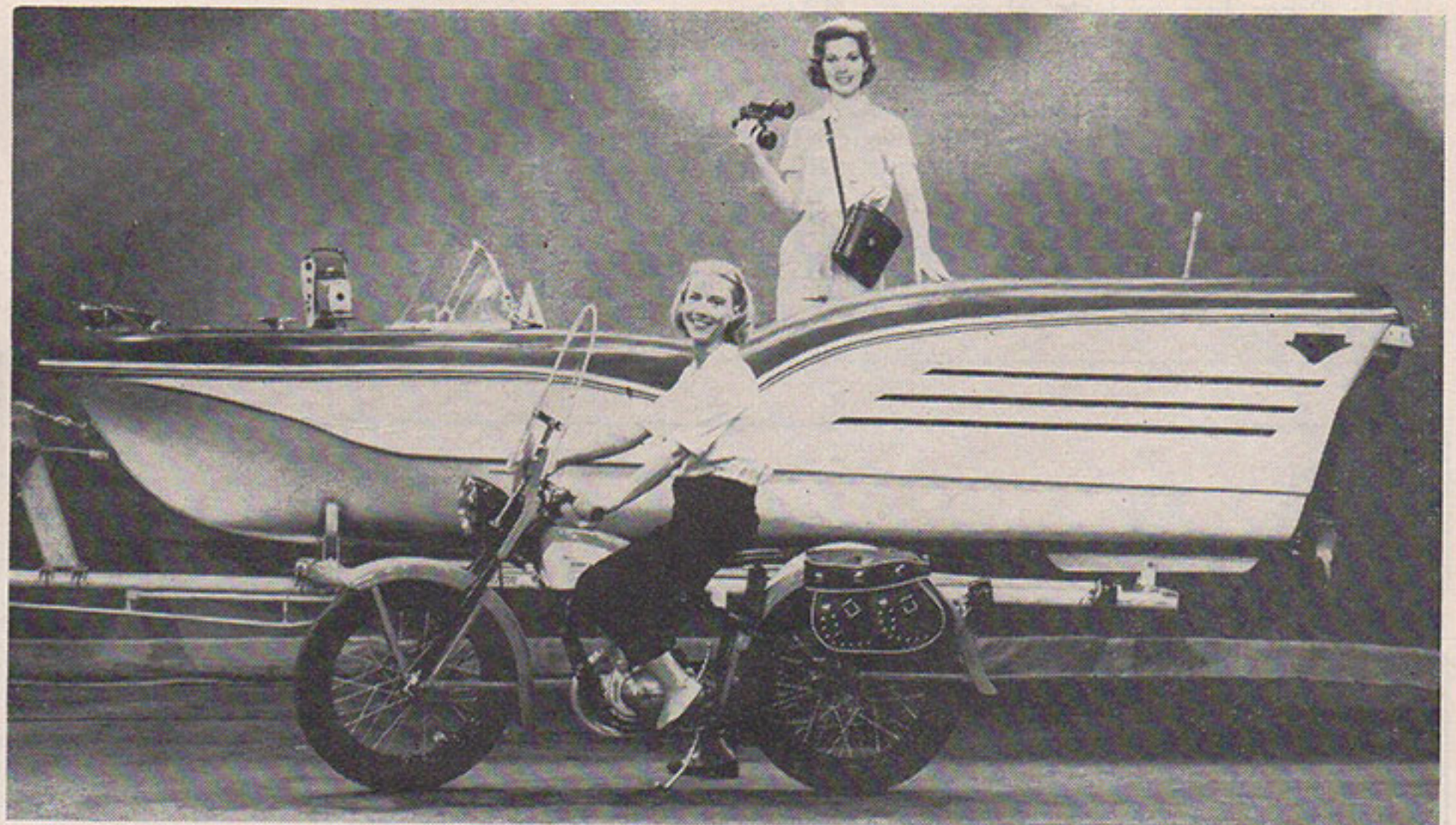
Many start out young in the motorcycle field, but few can point to an imposing string of victories like that of 13-year-old Ronnie Holland of Phenix City, Alabama. When 12 years old Ronnie entered his first event in June, 1957. He had little hope of victory, but managed to place first in a drag race on a 1/4-mile track in the 250cc class. I think what has amazed me most about active cycling is how easy it is to win new friends for cycling. I've found only a very few people who are stubbornly antagonistic to our sport. The majority are just apathetic, and it's so easy to convert skepticism or apathy into interest and enthusiasm, just by friendly behavior and conversation, or obliging requests for rides, or in giving beginning instruction to those who sincerely would like to learn to ride. A large part of our struggle for public approbation can be won with just a little extra effort on the part of riders. Every AMA member should consciously strive to be an ambassador of good will by thus encouraging new interest. The startling result is not the converts gained, but that the rider/member becomes a better, safer participant in "The Greatest Sport in the World". With best greetings
