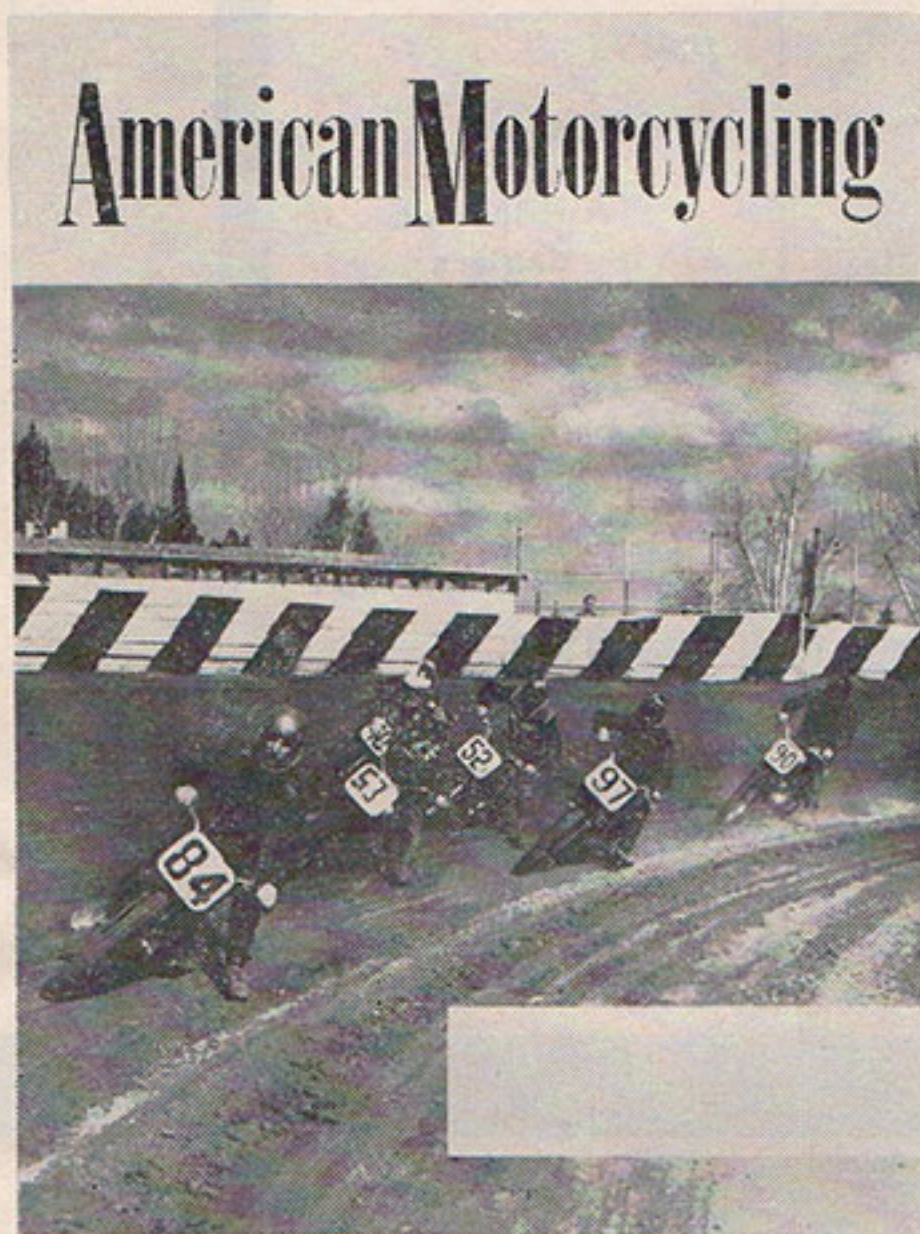

Class "A" Short Track Action At Fresno, Calif.

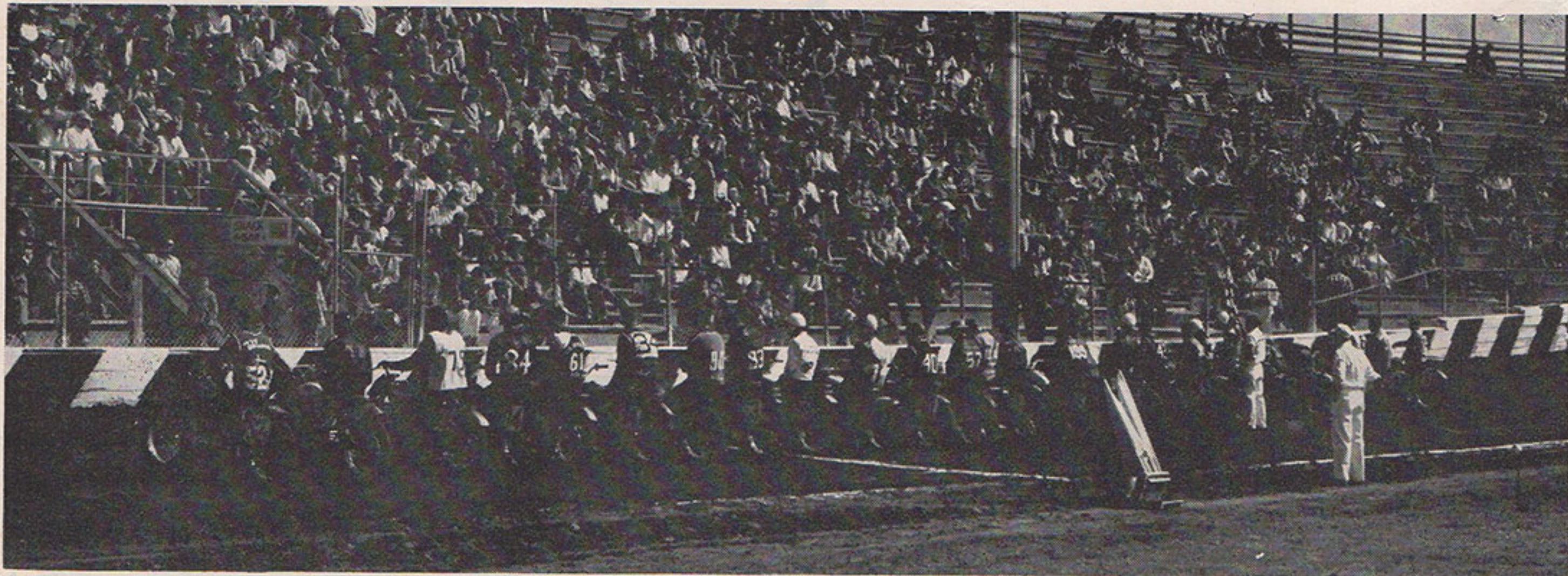

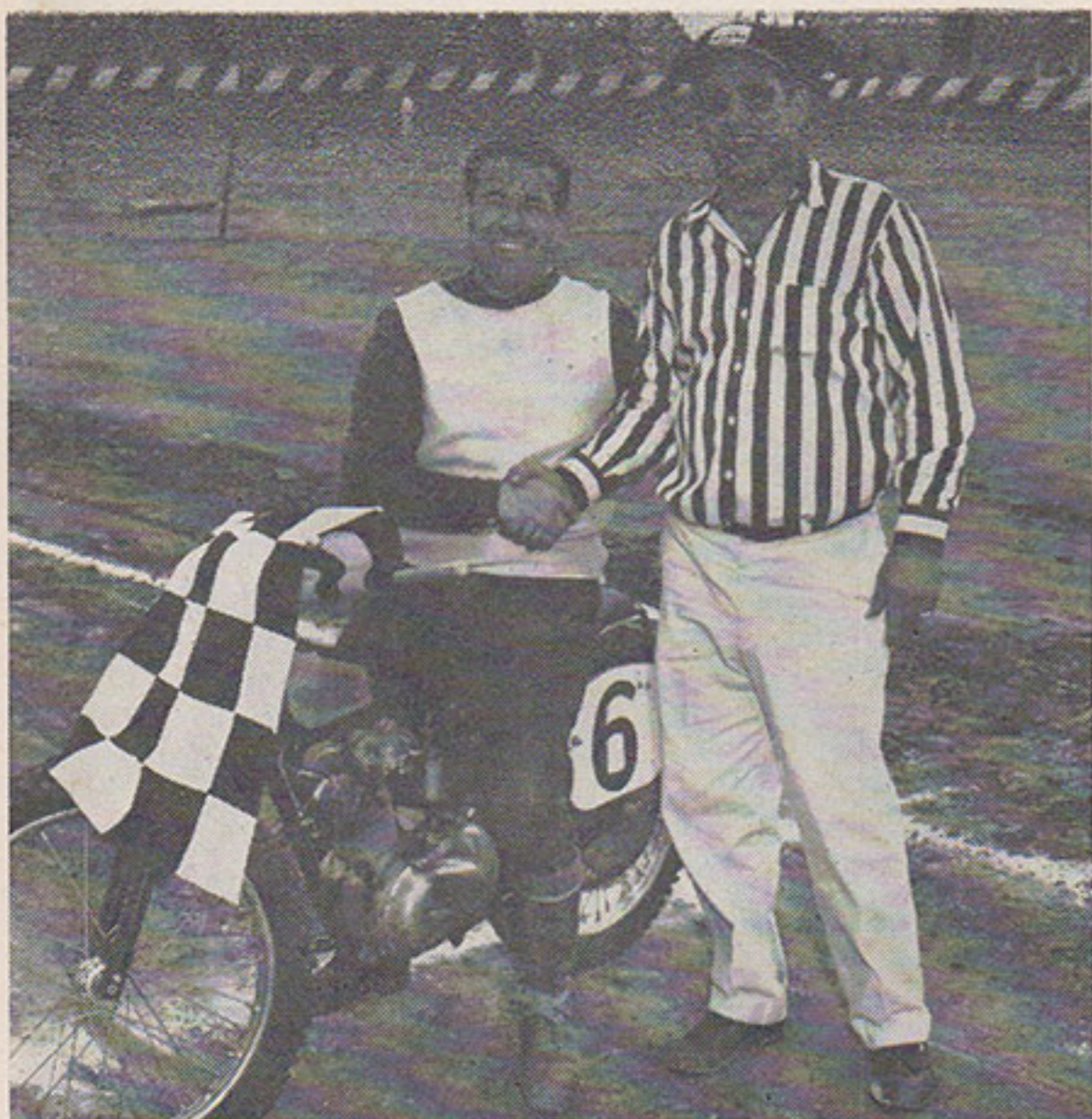
Many of the California top "Hot-Shoes" are now riding these events and have put on some great shows. Size and weight

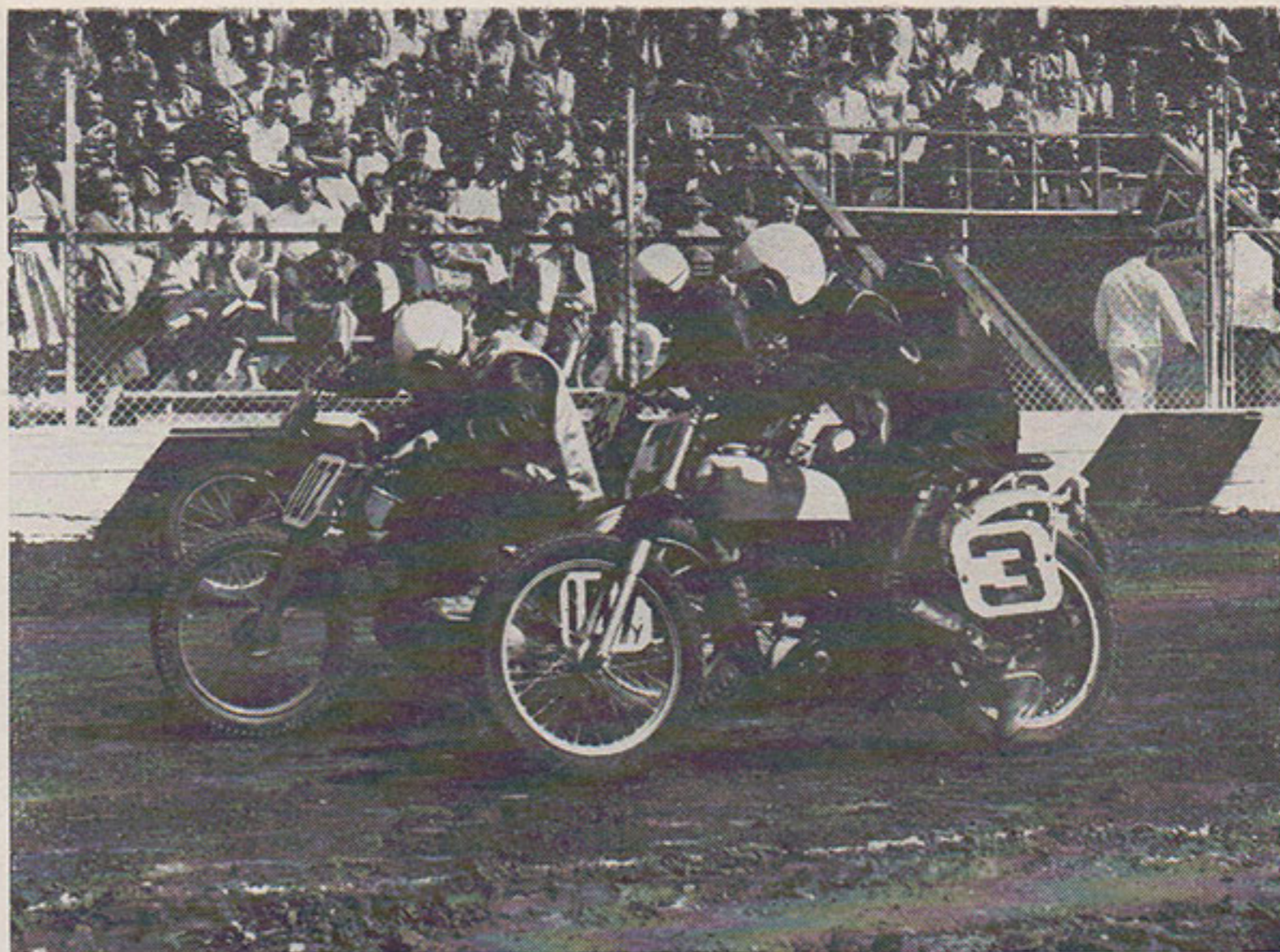

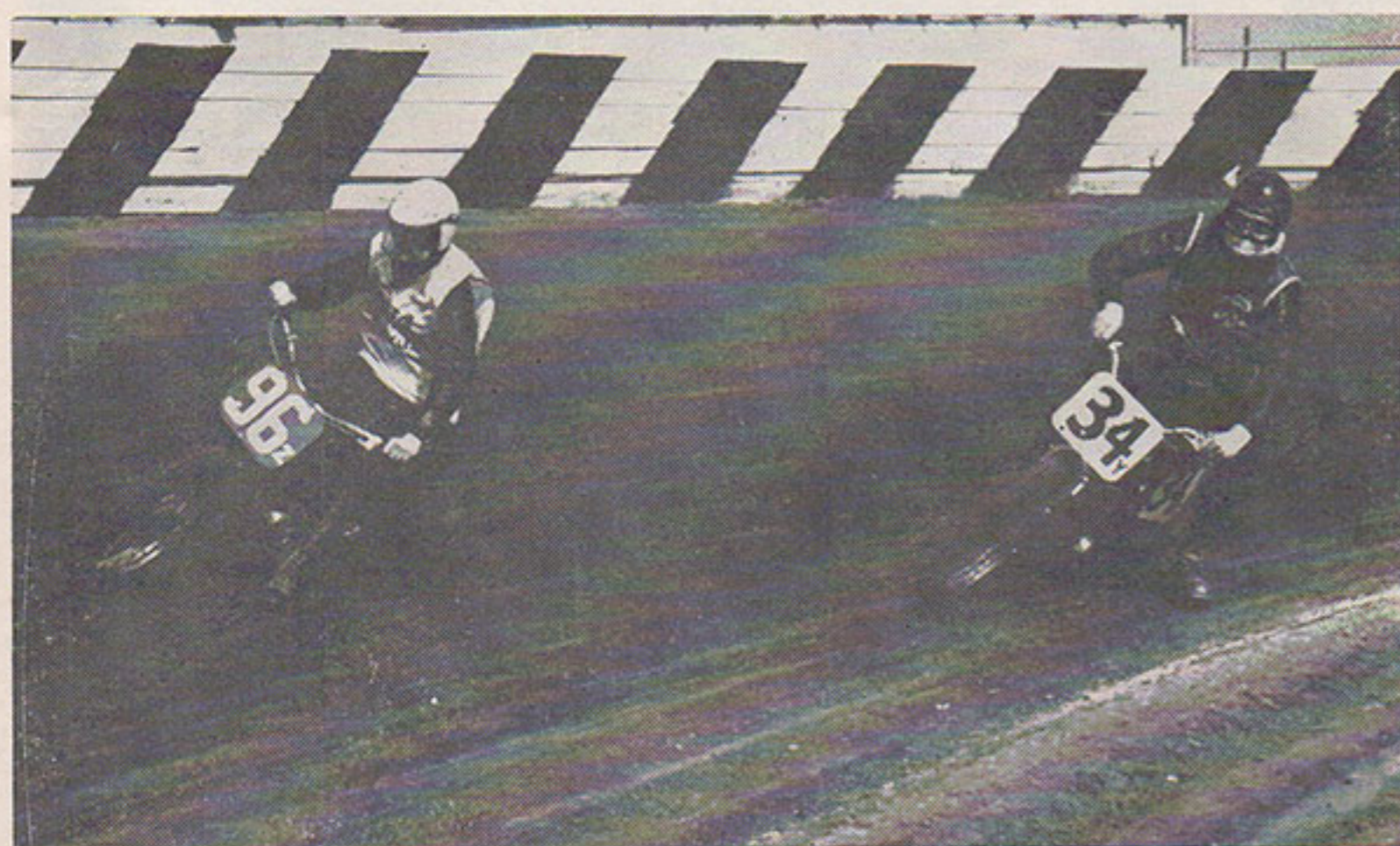
Lined up before the grandstand, each rider is introduced.

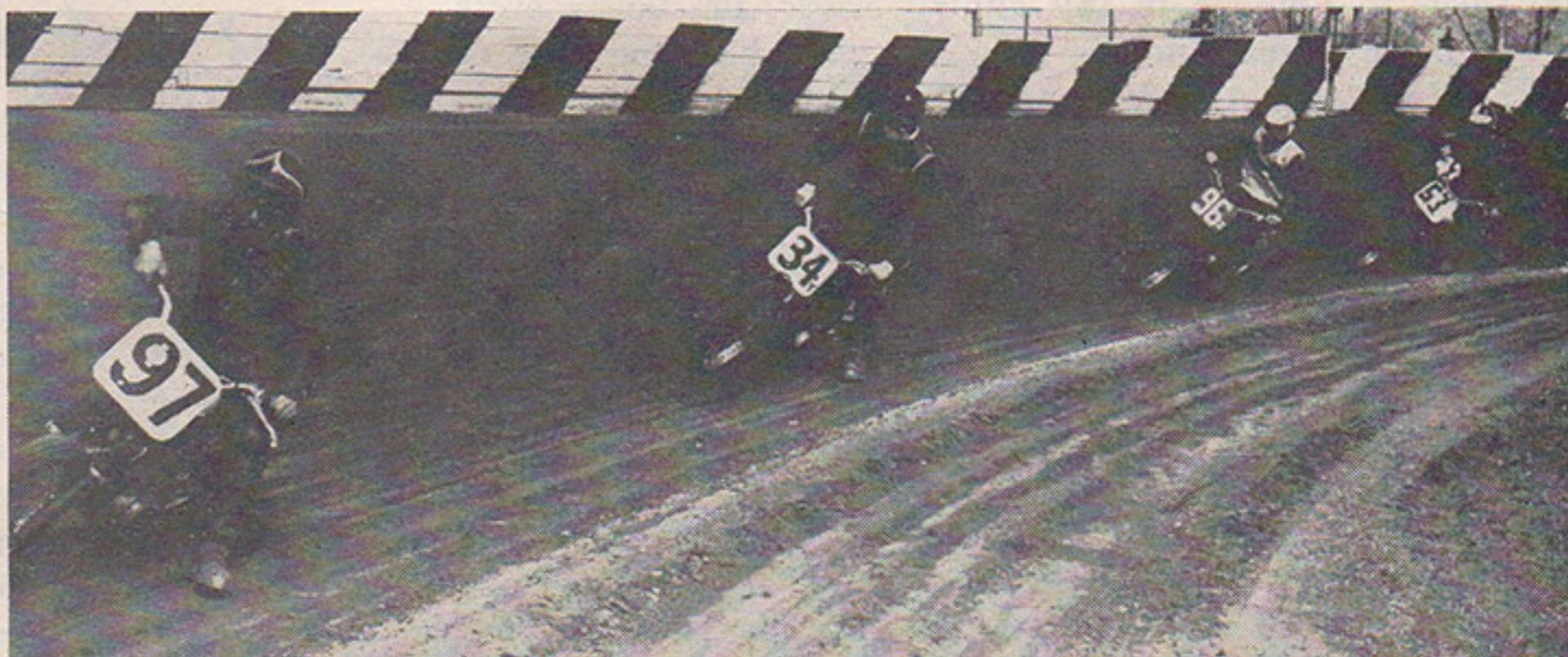

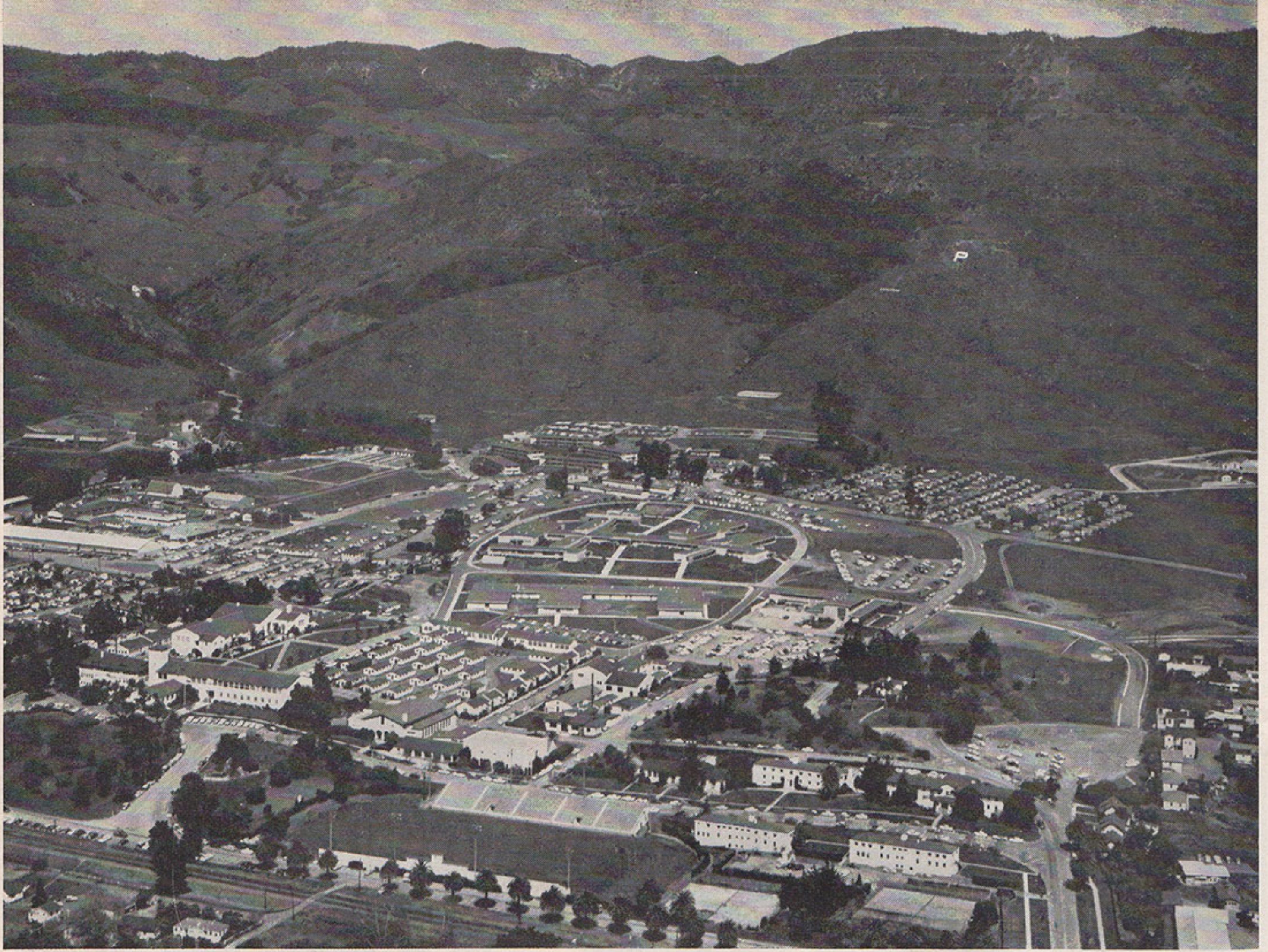

The Cal Poly Penguins

AMA Motorcycle Club On A College Campus

RAIN and mud, rocks, sand, rough fire-trails—a genuine test of man and machine! Add to all this a tight time schedule, and you have the Hi Mountain enduro—only run of its kind sponsored and organized by a college approved AMA motorcycle club.

From the San Francisco Bay area south to San Diego and eastward from California's great interior valleys come 60 to 100 riders to compete in this annual classic. Practically every known make of machine has been represented at one time or another in Classes A and B and lightweight.

Winners in the February, 1959, run were: Class A, Bud Hicks, Fresno, Matchless; Class B, Jack Cooper, Oakland, AJS; Lightweight, Chuck Seaton, Pacific Grove, Maico; Sweepstakes, E. Glenn Poole, Fresno, AJS.

The story behind this enduro is a fascinating one—one that could well be repeated in other colleges where an interest in the sport of motorcycling prevails and where the cost of transportation is always a problem.

It originated at the close of World War II when Cal Poly and other colleges began to feel the influx of ex-service men returning to school aided by the GI bill. Along with the rush of returnees there developed acute housing and transportation problems which forced many men to live off the campus, and

required them to furnish their own means of commuting to and from classes.

The motorcycle and scooter proved to be adequate answers; for, the economical operation and ease of handling of these machines were just what the doctor ordered.

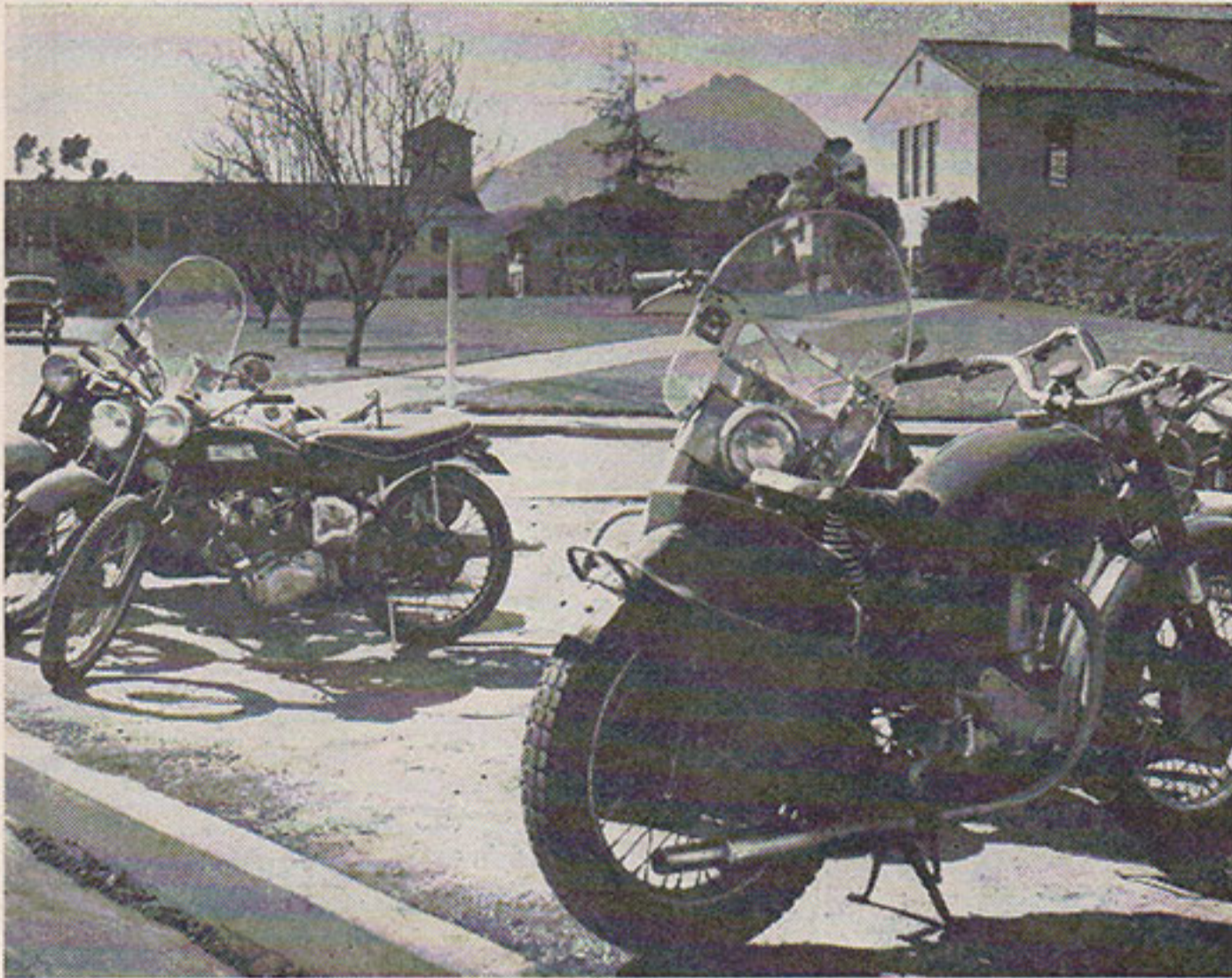
It was nothing more than natural, then, for a few enthusiasts to separate themselves from the crowd by banding together into a club where motorcycle activities could be used as projects.

The Cal Poly Penguins came into existence on October 17, 1947. Election of officers was held, and plans were placed into operation for their first activity. Due to the recent war years new motorcycles were as hard to come by as were automobiles, and, consequently, many were the rare and exotic combinations of wheels, tanks, engines and frames to leave the college welding and machine shops and appear on and off the campus.

The Hi Mountain enduro has been held annually since 1951, and, despite some discouragements at first, has developed into a recognized event worthy of the participation of many well-known riders. It became known by its present name in 1953 because of a section of the course passing near a forest service lookout by that name. It covers from 120 to 150 miles of rough terrain. This year 57 per cent of the starters finished; last year 42 per cent completed the run.

The penguins maintain the status of an authorized club of the college, and receive full coverage sponsorship including the

assignment of a faculty advisor. Its meetings are held on the campus.

Cal Poly itself, a typical "all men" polytechnic school until a few years ago, now enrolls 3650 men and 350 women. Initially an agricultural college it presently includes large engineering departments as well as home economics, education and others.

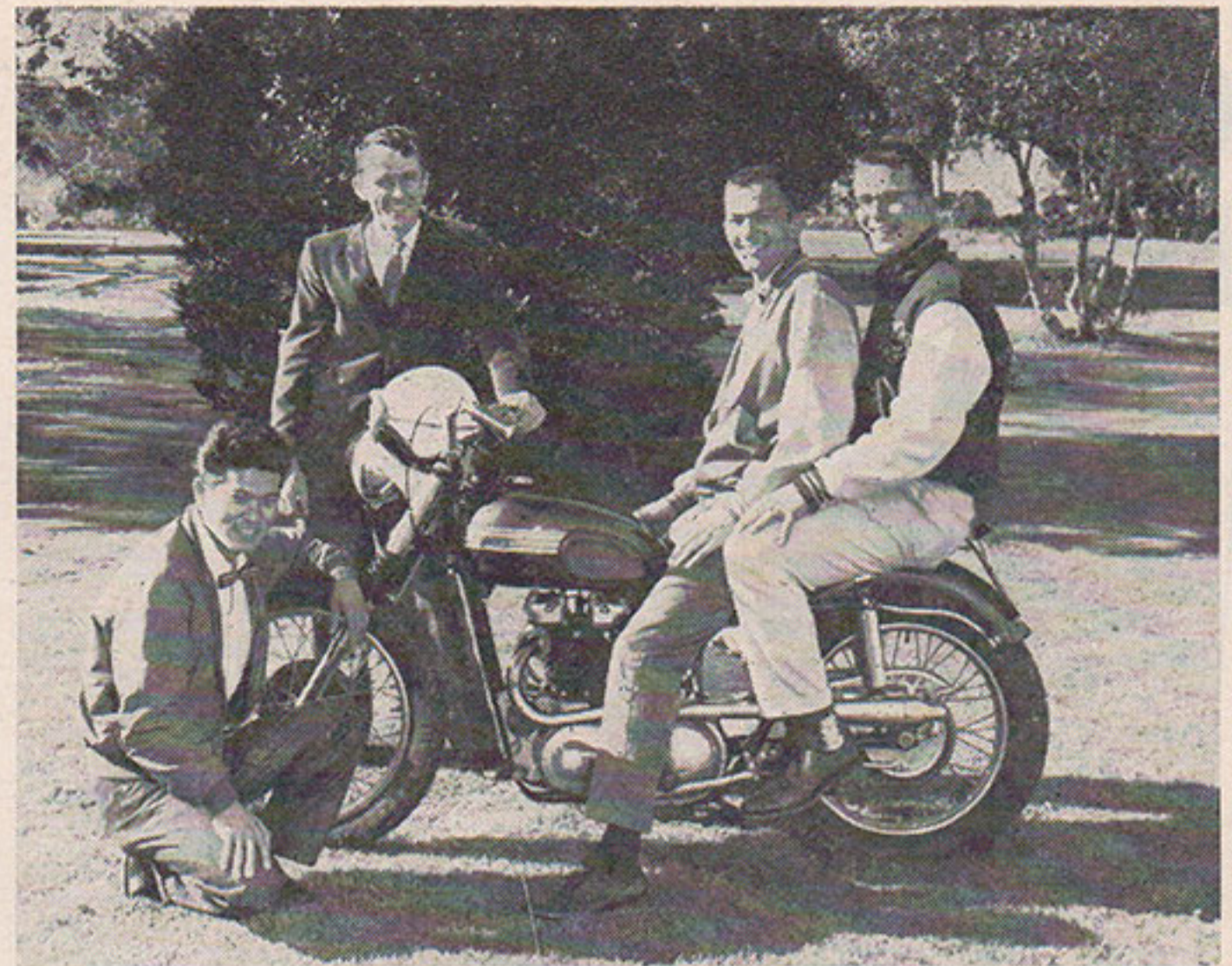
Nestled in the foothills of the Santa Lucia range on the outskirts of picturesque San Luis Obispo, and located within a few miles of the Pacific Ocean it is an ideal spot from which to launch its annual Hi Mountain enduro. Sandy beaches on the coast are utilized in some motorcycle contests as well as mountain trails.

The Penguins Club consists of sixteen members at present with the usual cabinet of elected officers. Membership changes from year to year, of course, as graduation and summer vacations takes their toll. Then, too, club officers state that a large and active participating membership is difficult to maintain because of the limited time allowable for extra-curricular activities. All members own motorcycles at one time or another, and most of them ride to classes. It is estimated that between 75 and 100 motorcycles and scooters make their appearance on the campus, daily, ridden by members and non-members.

Aside from its annual enduro the club sponsors an English Trials, and, when possible, a scrambles. This year some of the members helped in the organization and operation of an economy run, although motorcycles were not used. They also serve as auxiliary traffic directors at some school events, and encourage safe driving through taking part in other school activities and in setting examples of proper road conduct.

Motorcycle riders from coast to coast who have experienced adverse and unjust criticism of their sport will appreciate the progress in public relations made by this club. Riders, spectators and the immediate public regard it and its activities as an accepted part of the college community.

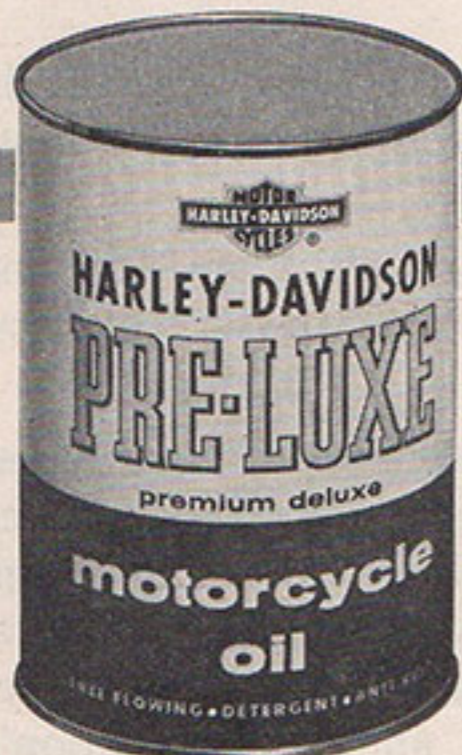

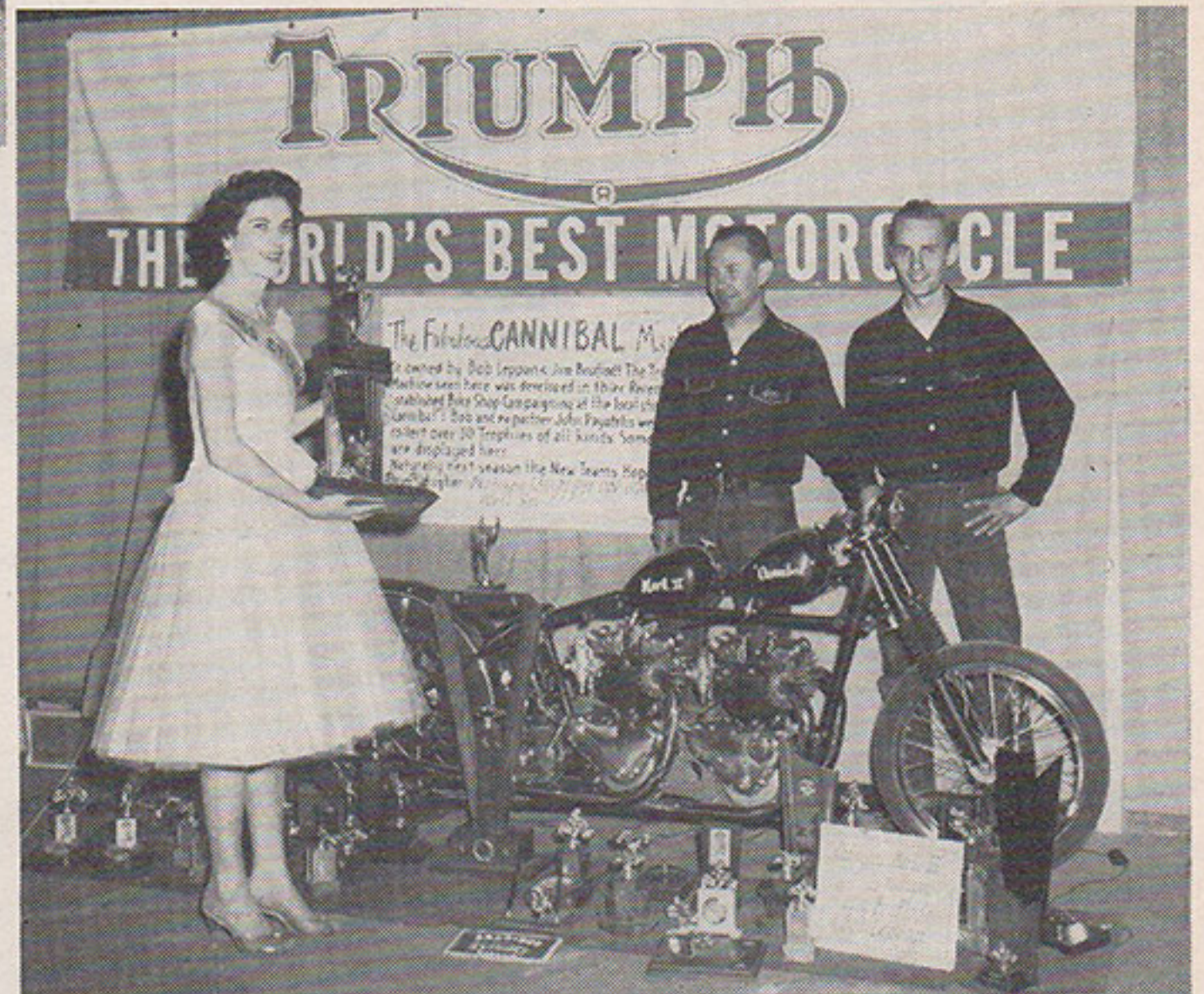


Detroit's Cyclorama attracted spectators as early as 10 A.M. on Sunday morning, the first day of the show.

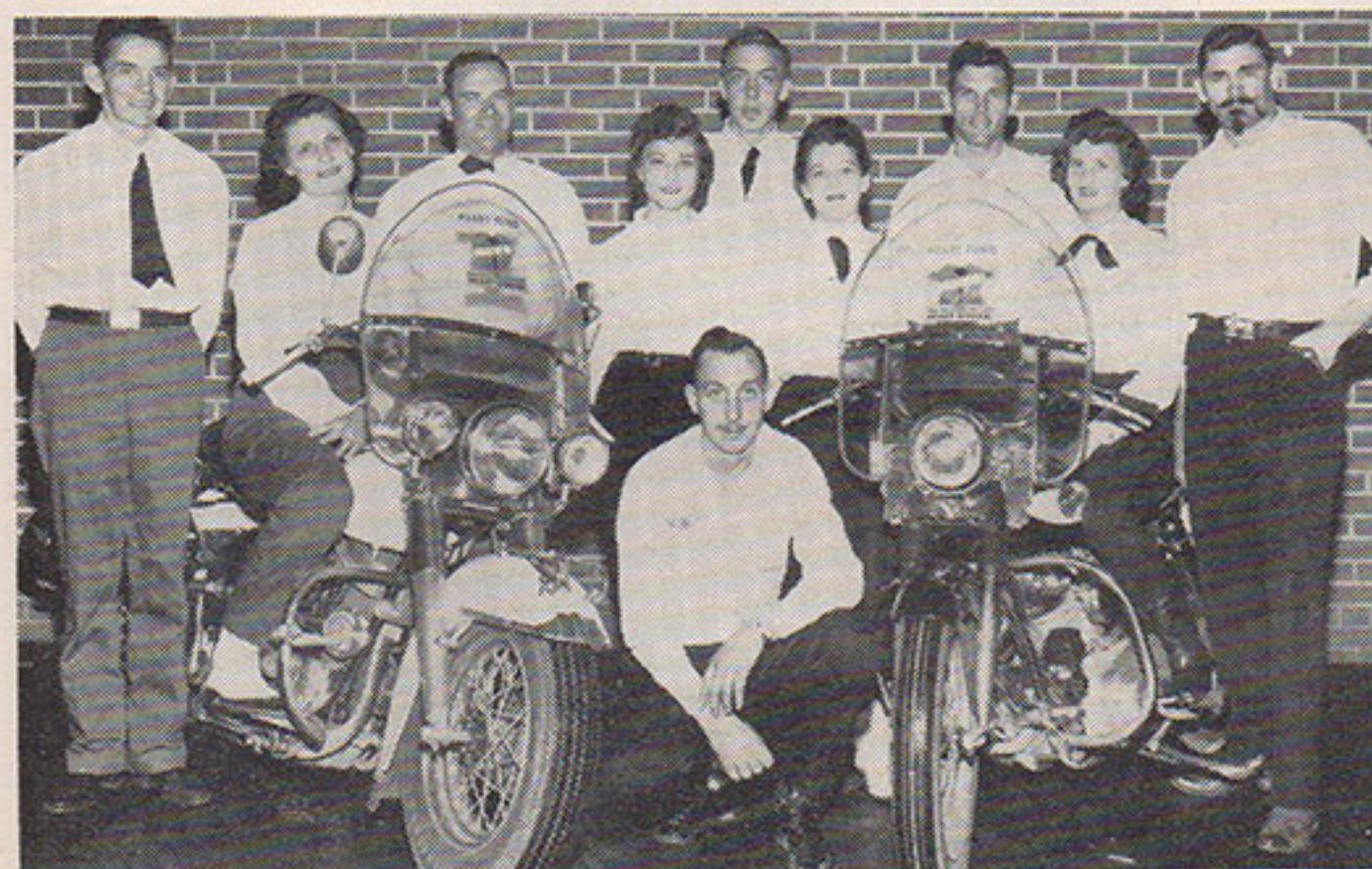

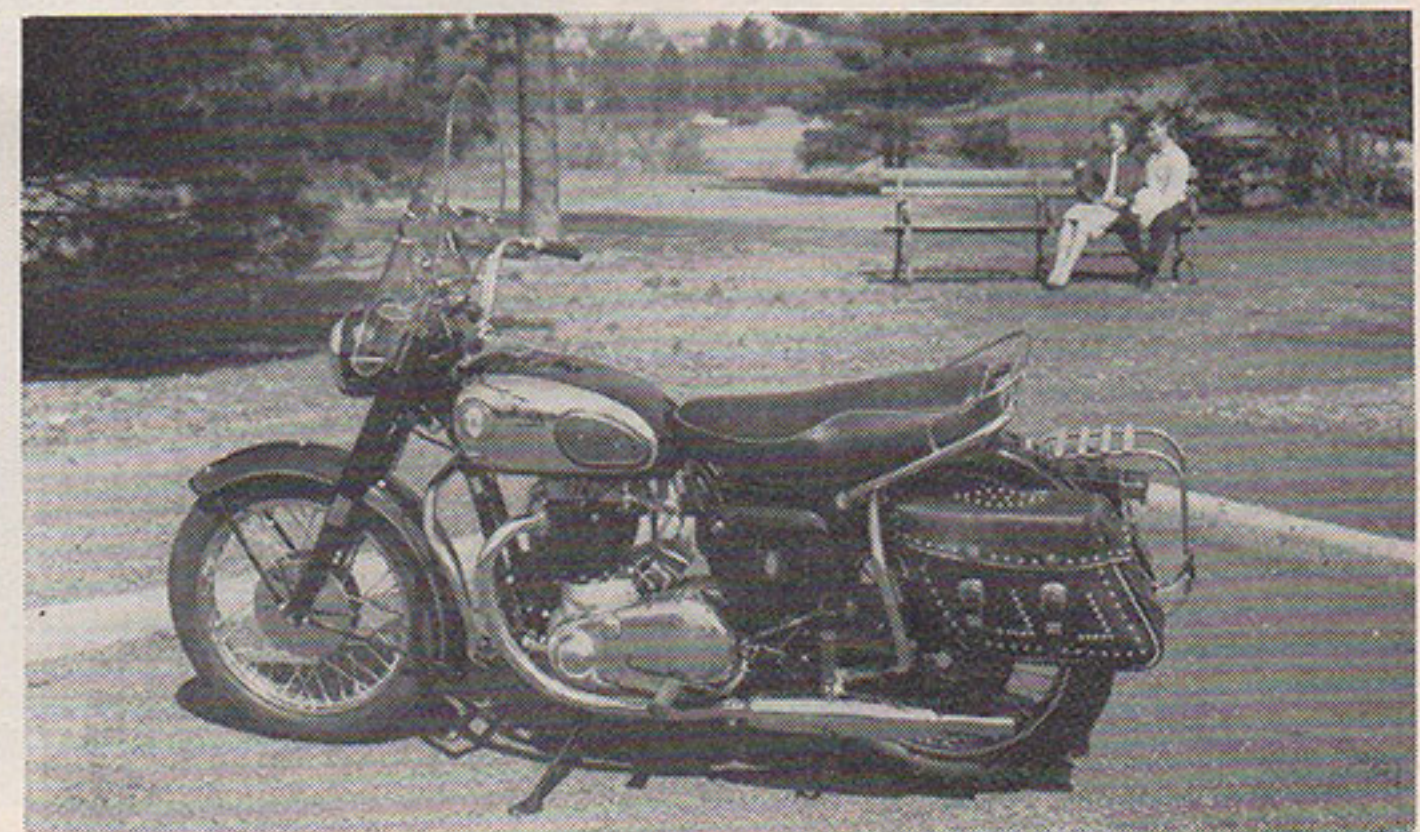

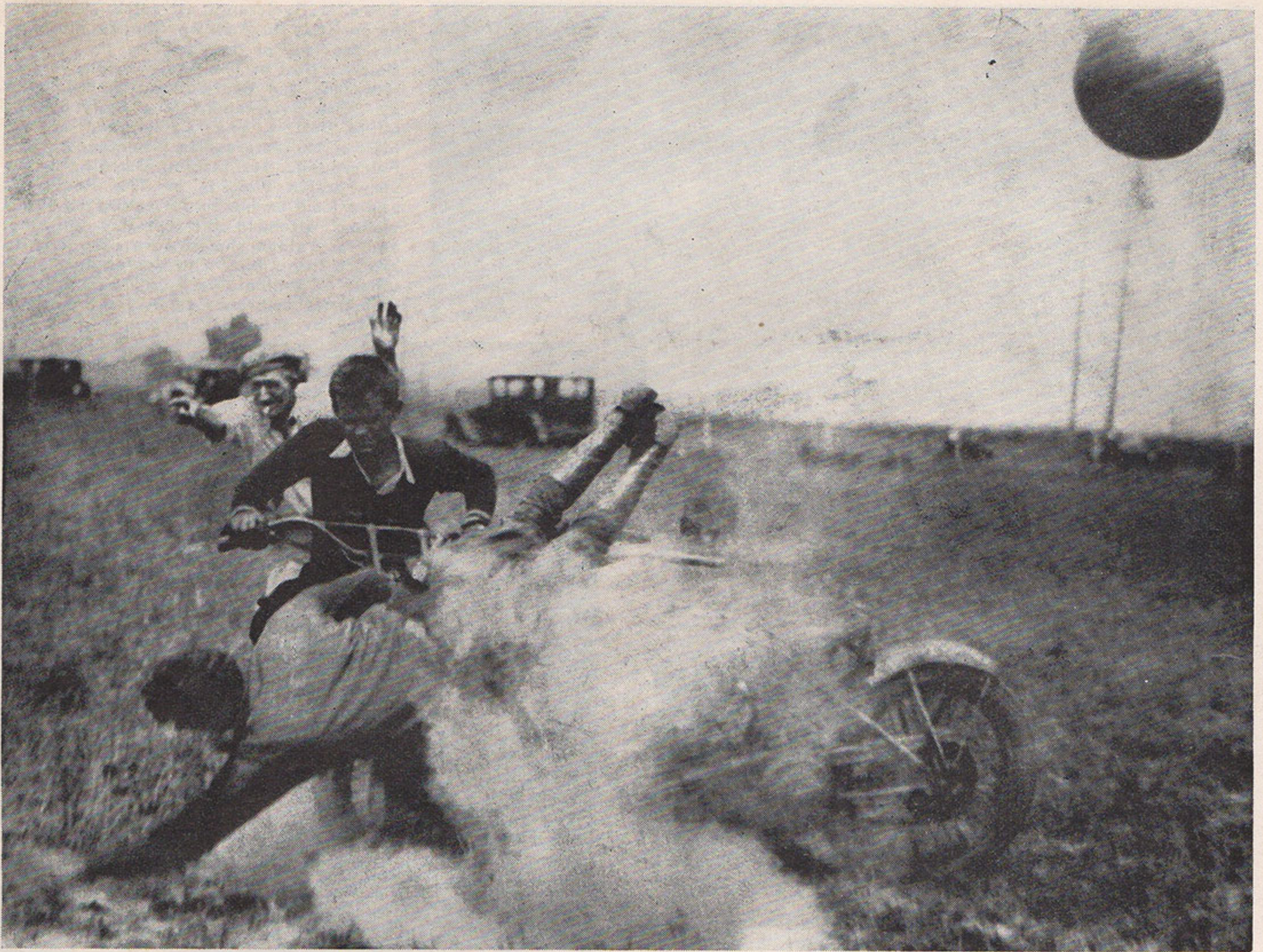

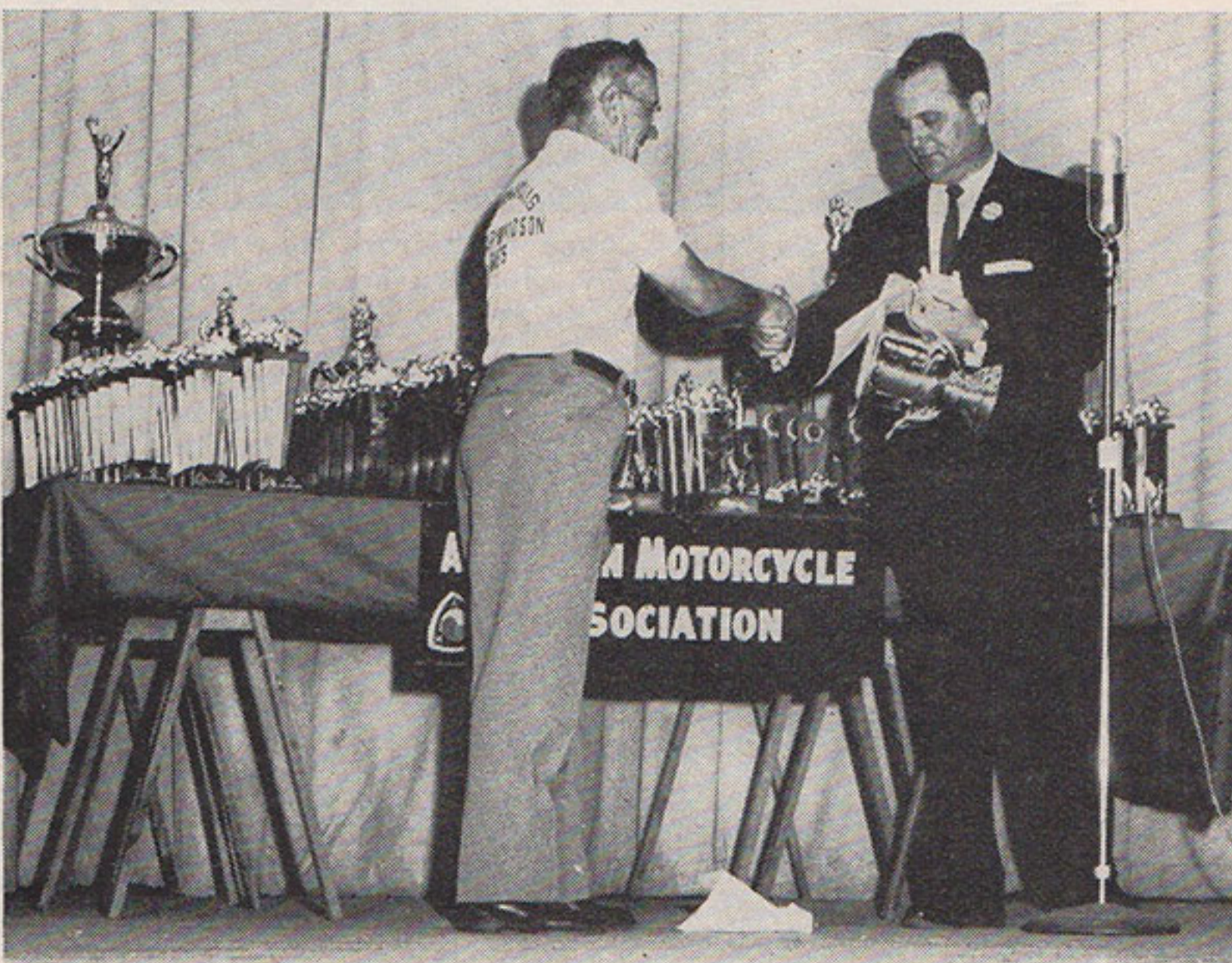

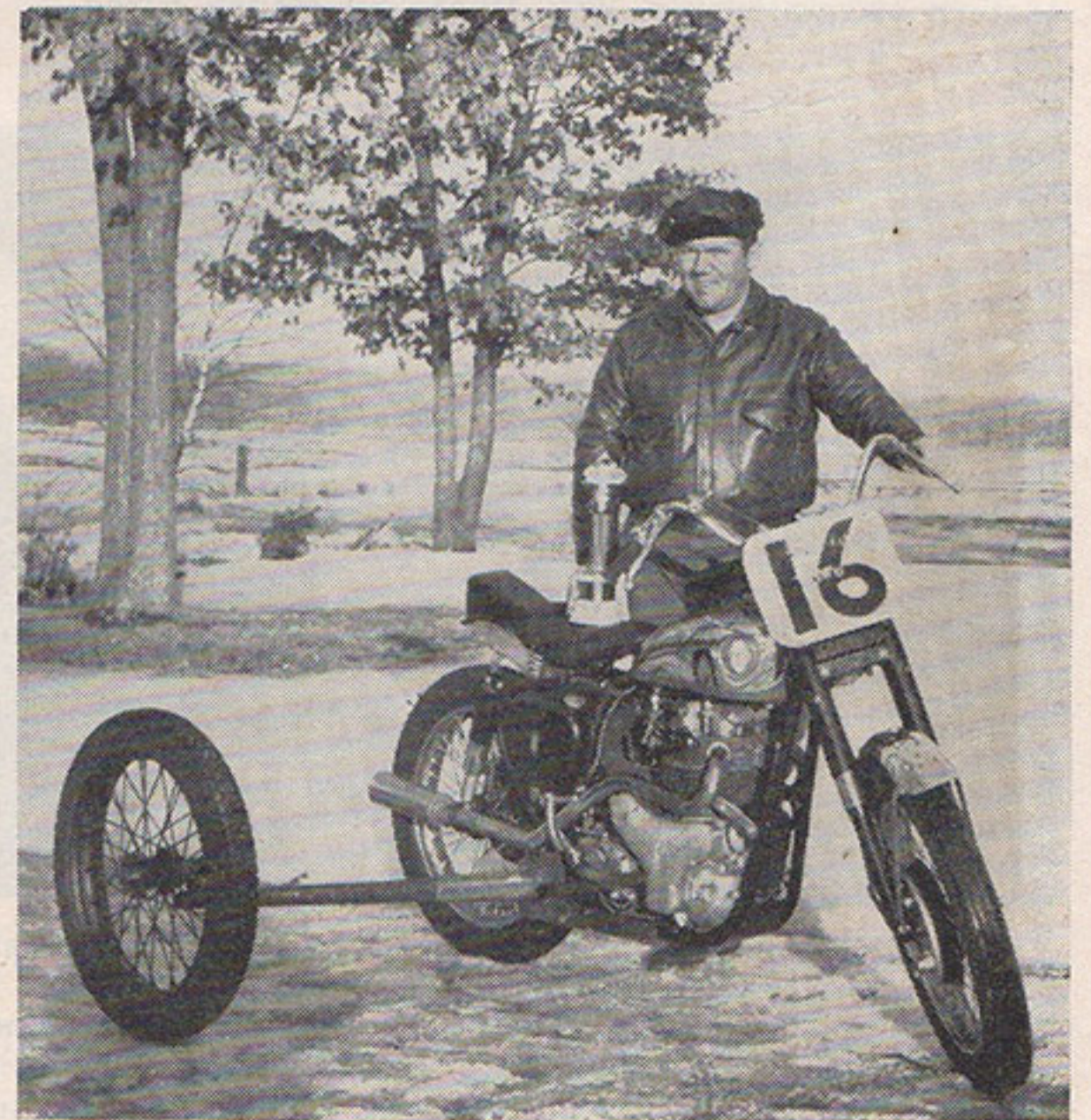

TIPS ON TRAVEL

Going to Travel? I thought perhaps readers of this magazine and this column might be interested in some travel tips compiled by several travelling Motor Maids.

If you are not one of the lucky people having a new motorcycle this year, we suggest that before you start on your trip you:

1. Check both chains. Don't get them too tight. Replace worn ones.
2. Go over your motorcycle personally and tighten all nuts. Even the one on the seat!
3. Check your tires for wear. DO replace bald ones.
4. Have some competent person check the forks, fluid, cones and bearings.
5. How about the battery? It will only last so long, even with the best of care.
6. Check generator, magneto or distributor, and install new plugs. Take a couple of extra plugs and a plug wrench with you. You may not need them, but you can bet someone will.
7. Check your luggage rack and saddle bags. Repairs may be needed.
8. Take a look in the tool box. Besides your regular tools, is there a pair of pliers, crescent wrench and screw driver?

9. Are all the lights working properly? Your motorcycle should be ready . . . now for a few suggestions as to what to take with you on proposed trip:

1. Plan to travel as light as possible. You'll find the more you do travel, the less clothing you will take with you each trip.
2. A rain suit and either plastic or rubber covers for your boots are a MUST.
3. A folding travel iron will prove invaluable when you reach your destination. (Yes, for fellows, too.)
4. A travel alarm clock is a big help if you're the type who just hates to get up with the birds.
5. Choose clothing in nylon or dacron whenever possible. These are preferred because of their easy laundry, quick dry, wrinkle-free qualities.
6. You may scoff at the idea of "Long Johns" in July or August, but most seasoned travelers will tell you they never leave home without a pair.
7. If yours is the type skin which is sensitive to the elements, protect your face with a good wind and weather or sun lotion BEFORE exposure. Keep bottle handy for frequent applications. Pancake make-up is good, also. As a last resort, cover your face with a handkerchief while riding.

HOW TO PACK YOUR LUGGAGE

1. A suitcase on a luggage rack is the ideal method of carrying your luggage. Eliminates all those packages which somehow always seem to spill their contents in the center of the hotel lobby. The next time you're at a gathering of Motor Maids, notice the ingenious methods some of the gals have for securing their suitcases to the rack without the use of bothersome straps.
2. Zippered Luggage covers are available at most of the department stores. A sheet of plastic or plastic pillow covers will completely water proof contents of suitcases and saddle bags. Put plas-

tic inside, not outside, suitcase and bags.

3. If possible, pack things needed enroute separately where they are easily accessible without disturbing rest of luggage.
4. Some prefer to roll clothing instead of the usual fold method. This is said to eliminate wrinkles.

WHAT TO WEAR WHILE TRAVELING

1. Leather is the most practical and comfortable garment to wear. If you should have the misfortune to fall down, your leather pants and jacket will help immensely to discourage "Gravel Rash."
2. Please wear safety helmets. The reason is quite obvious. There are any number of good ones on the market, and the added protection in the case of just one spill may prove worth much more than the helmet's cost. After all, you have two arms, hands, legs, and feet, but only ONE head! Protect it!
3. Always wear boots, leather gloves, glasses or goggles while riding.

WHEN YOU REACH YOUR DESTINATION

1. Unpack immediately upon arrival and get all clothes in wearing order. Do your pressing, boot polishing, etc. at once.
2. If no ironing board is available, an inverted dresser drawer, covered with a bath towel, or even a suitcase, is a wonderful substitute, and you won't run the risk of damaging varnished surfaces.

Obey all traffic rules and state speed laws. Let's give motorcycling the GOOD name it deserves. Do not ride side by side, if more than one motorcycle is travelling. Staggered formation is the safest and most approved method of motorcycle highway riding.

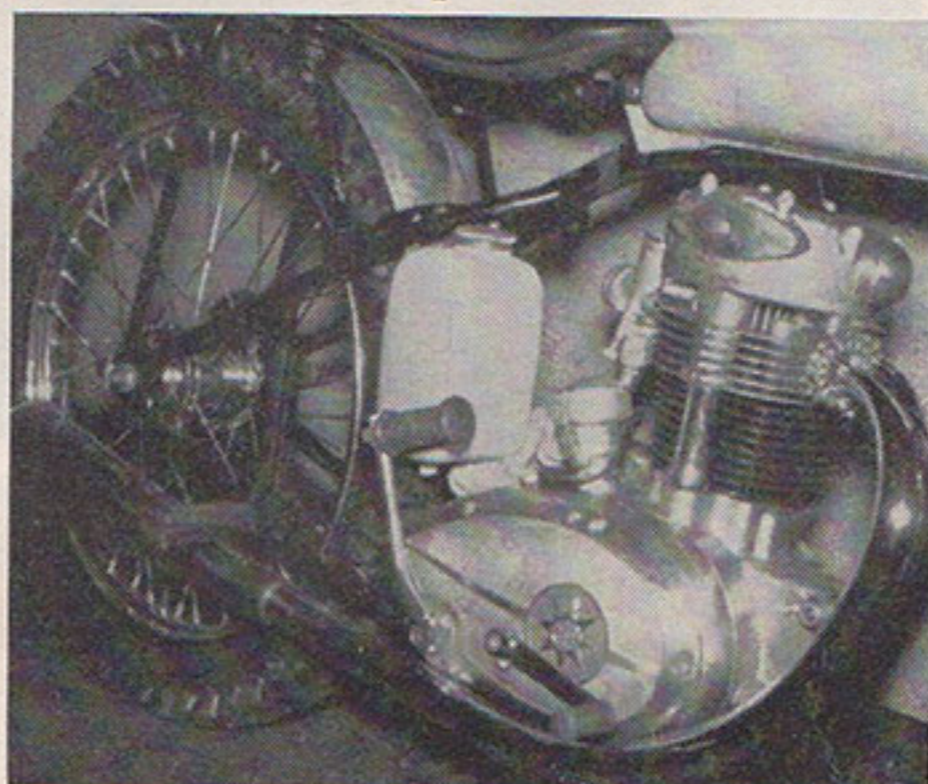

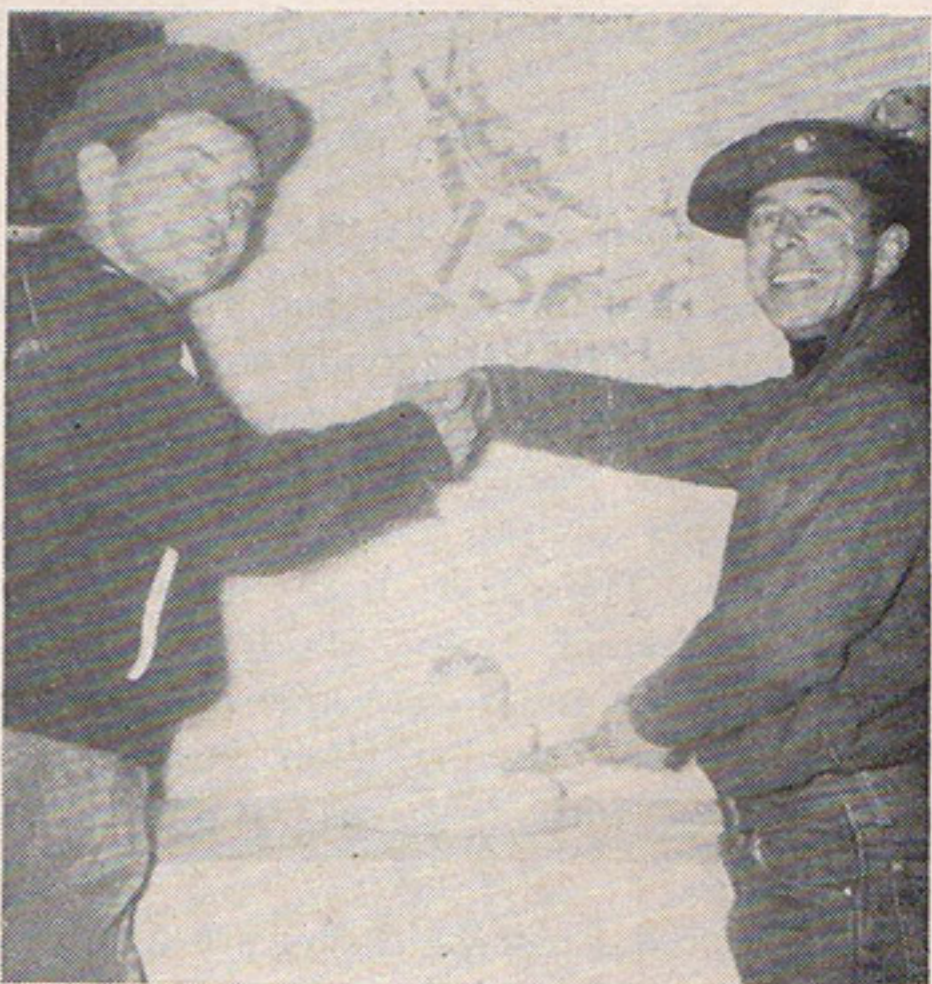

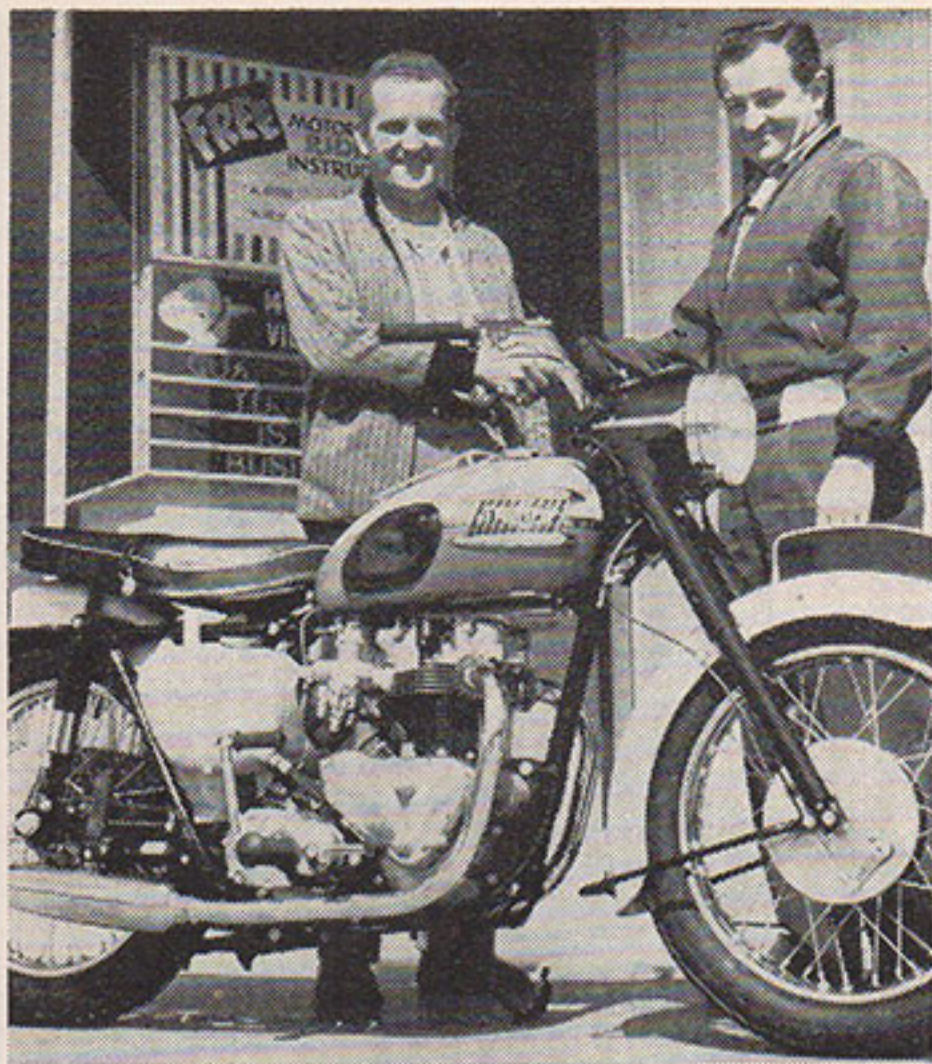

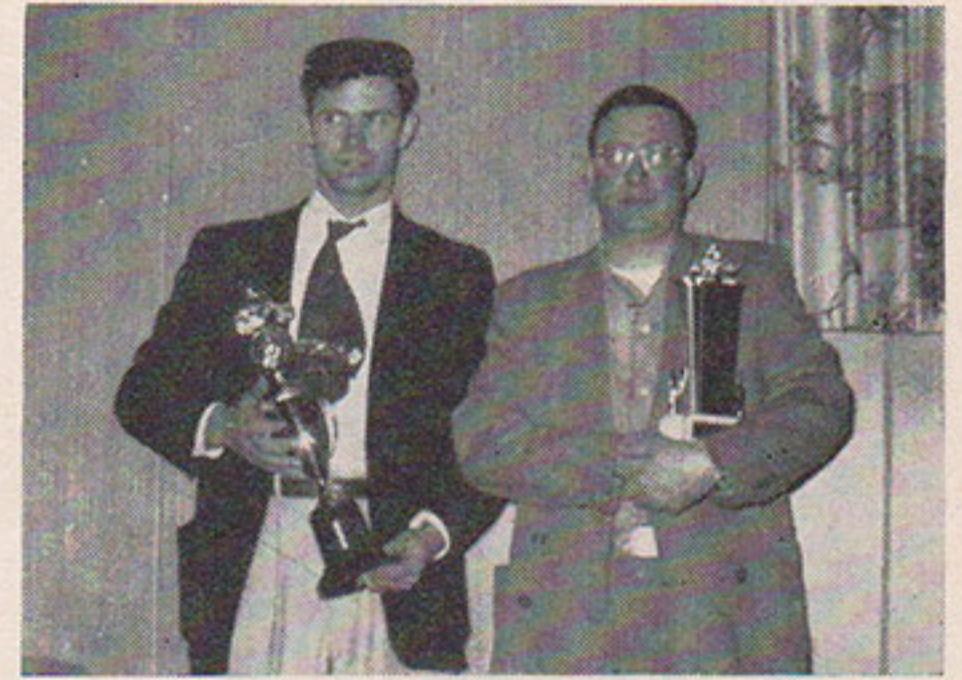

● The McHal "Speedway" safety helmet, manufactured and distributed by McHal Enterprises of Hawthorne, Calif., has been examined, tested and approved by the AMA Safety Committee for use in AMA competition and been placed in Group #1.

● The Stadium "Clipper" safety helmet, distributed by Beck Distributing Corp. of New York, N. Y. has also been approved by the Safety committee and been placed in Group #2.

● The Gentex #70 safety helmet has never been submitted to AMA for approval, therefore CANNOT be used in AMA competition.

● In 1958, 104 enduro riders were advanced to Class "A." These riders have been notified by the AMA and also been listed in AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING.

● A sample entry blank MUST be included with every purse paying event mailed to the AMA by the referee in charge. Good, fair or poor means nothing to this office; attendance figures MUST be shown on each report. Be sure to list on each report, in the lower left hand side, the number of expert, amateur, novice and probationary novice riders present or signed up at each meet.

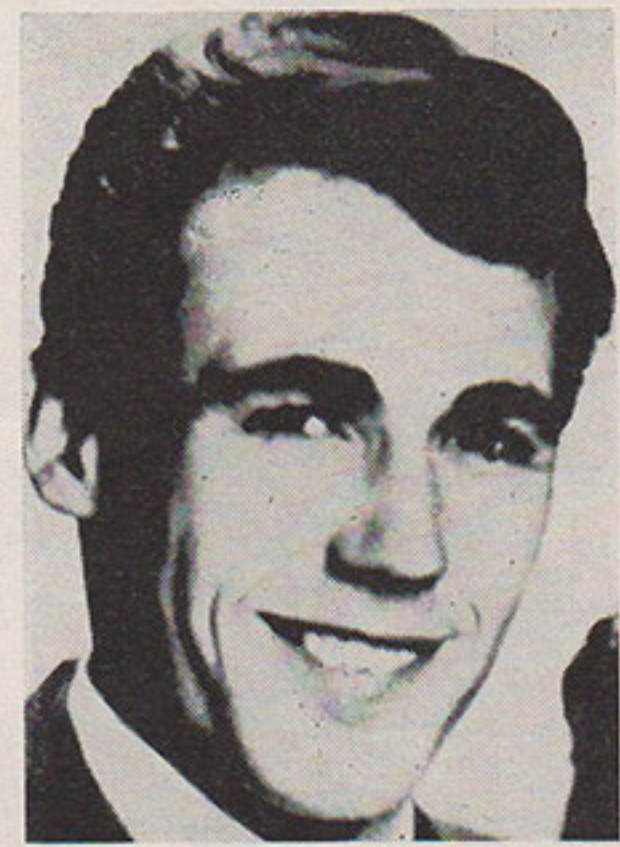
● Jimmy Reeve of Corpus Christi, Texas, has been reinstated into the AMA, effective Feb. 19, 1959.

● There was no March bulletin published or mailed out; too much work and not enough hours or days in the week. We do not intend to make this a pattern in the future.

● Incidentally there were 1140 entries in the Daytona Beach events during the week of activity. There were NO serious accidents. Riders were very cooperative. Entries were closed and some of our riders did not get to ride, simply because they failed to read the American Motorcycle Assn. publication releases. There were no exceptions, there were no post entries. And there will be a Daytona in 1960.

● Remember, the rules are worthless if referees fail to enforce them; a good referee will be respected if he is firm but fair; no whip or brass knuckles are required; use some good common sense with the rule book; just be sure YOU run the show.
