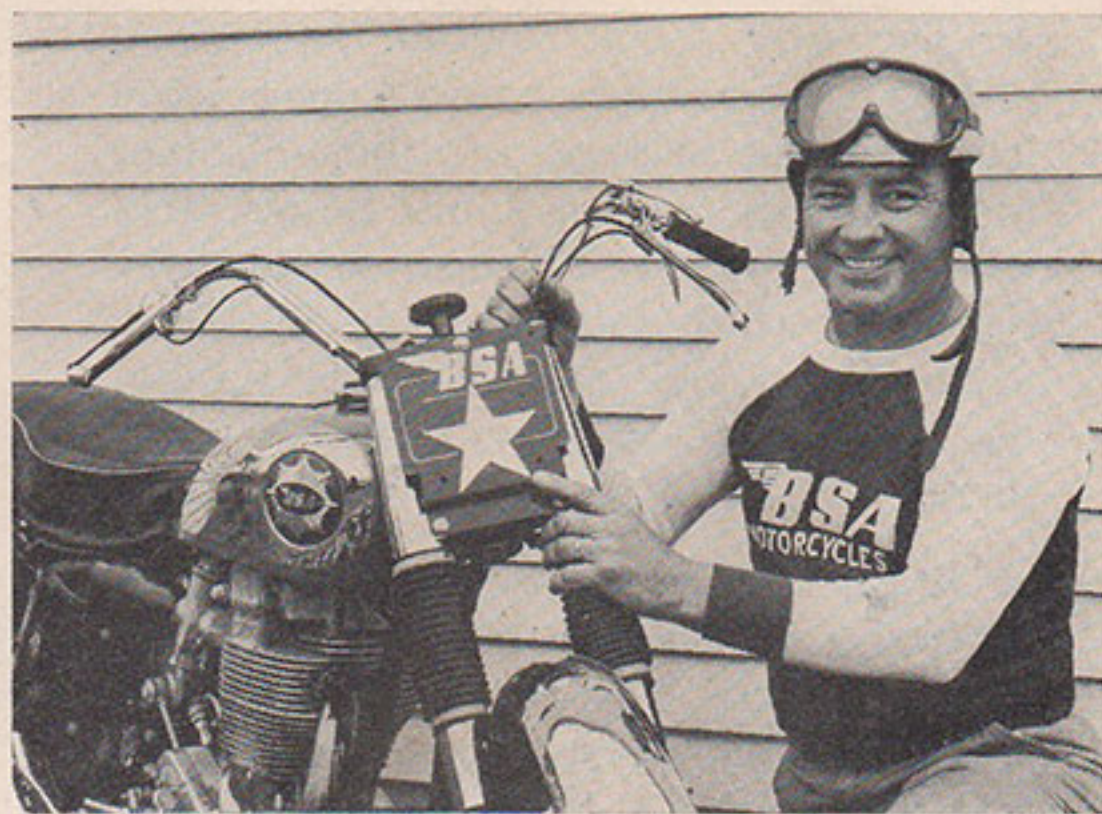

In view of this rule change and the small number of amateur entries at the Peoria TT national championship races, the promoters of the Peoria national championship TT event have limited entries for the 1959 Peoria TT national championship events to expert riders only.

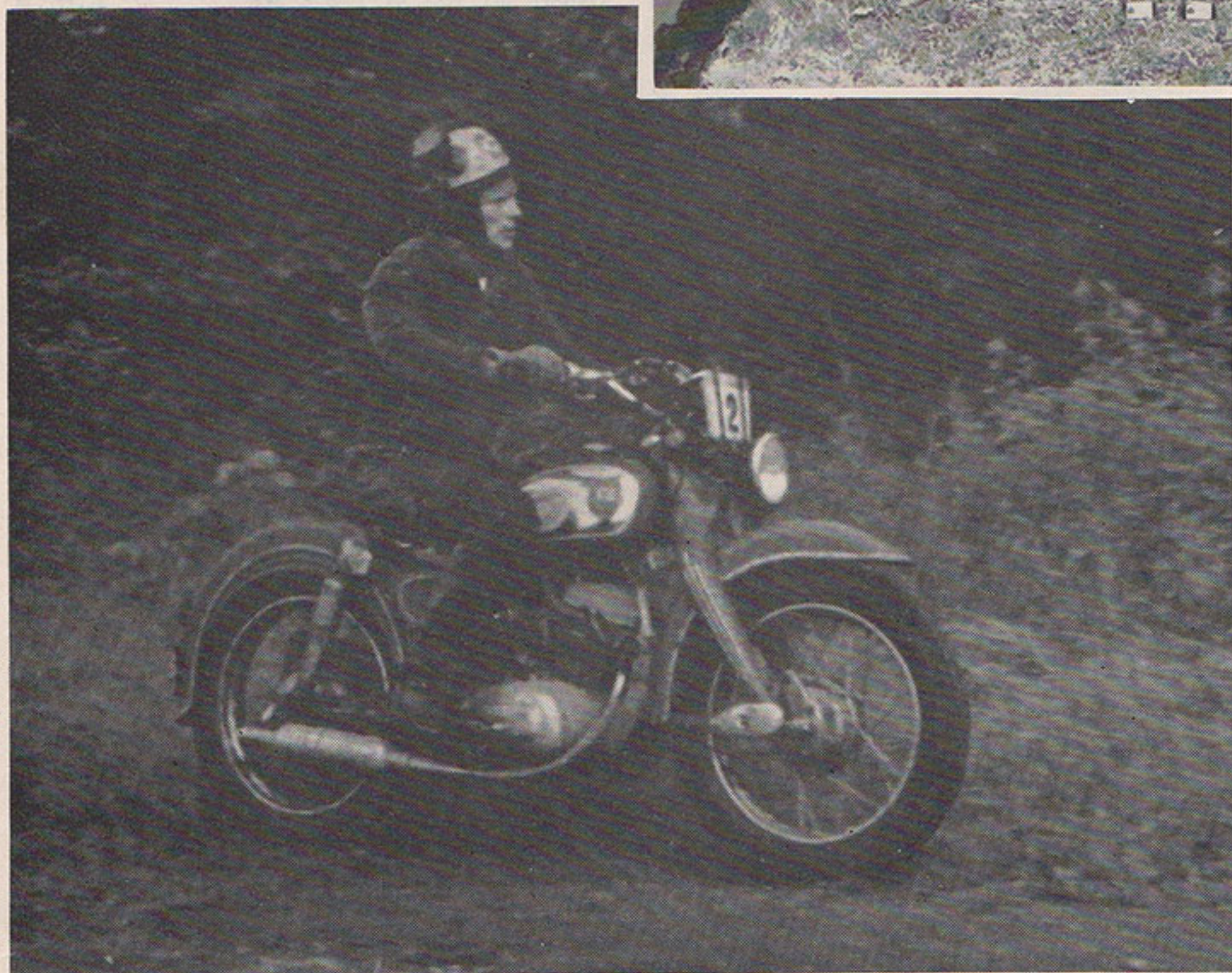

John Penton Wins Second 250 Mile Championship Enduro

JOHN PENTON is in a Championship rut. It started last spring when he won on the Little Burr run for the first time. This year he did it again. Once again Leroy Winters gave him a run for his money. Penton's score this year was 833 on a 175 NSU just 12 points better than Leroy's.

There was a shower Friday evening before the run. Saturday morning dawned hot, humid and muddy for the Pathfinders: Duncan, Parrill, Geigle and Allen. But they were off at daylight.

Again, Lin Kuchler, AMA executive secretary and Jack Pflug, veteran hack driver, were official starters.

Number 1 rider, Willis Thompson, and 101, Bob Schulteti were off at 6:01 a.m. An hour and 38 minutes later George Stemen and Paul Phipps brought up the rear.

After an hour of highway riding, the Little Burr racers were in Bill Carpenter's territory below Lancaster. They were right on the beam at the Sell's family No. 1 check. On the way to Revenge the trails were slippery and muddy which caused a few to slow down. The run continued into Hocking County, through Logan and on to Athens County.

When they reached the control at Mechanicsburg, they were met by their followers. After eating, they were off again into the rugged enduro territory. The twenty mile wood trail took its toll, but at

last they hit dry ground, where the roads and trails were dusty.

They were still quite a way from home when they reached the gas stop at Starr, off again, and then the spectator spot on Rt. 75. At 4:30 p.m. they made the second gas stop at Jimtown. They hit a short stretch of log slide and were off for the finish line.

We again had the services of MARS Radio Controlled checks. With the help of Mr. and Mrs. Lincoln Baird, Mrs. Clarence Wise and Carl Bagford, they worked through the night to find the winner of the respective classes. At 10 a.m. Sunday the winners were announced.

Karol Kay Noss won the Girl's Division, with Bessie Allen, second.

Bob Anthony and his passenger, Ron Youst, blasted for top honors in the sidecar class. They were followed by last year's champ, Miles McLoda.

Leroy Winters, Arkansas' Ambassador of Good Will, ran off with the bantam-weight honors again this year. Lightweight champion, David Barnes, upheld the honor of New York. New England's Pappy Schumitz took the medium-weight championship honors. John Comer took the light heavyweight championship and Charles Stahl of Toledo, showed them how in the big iron class by winning the heavyweight championship.



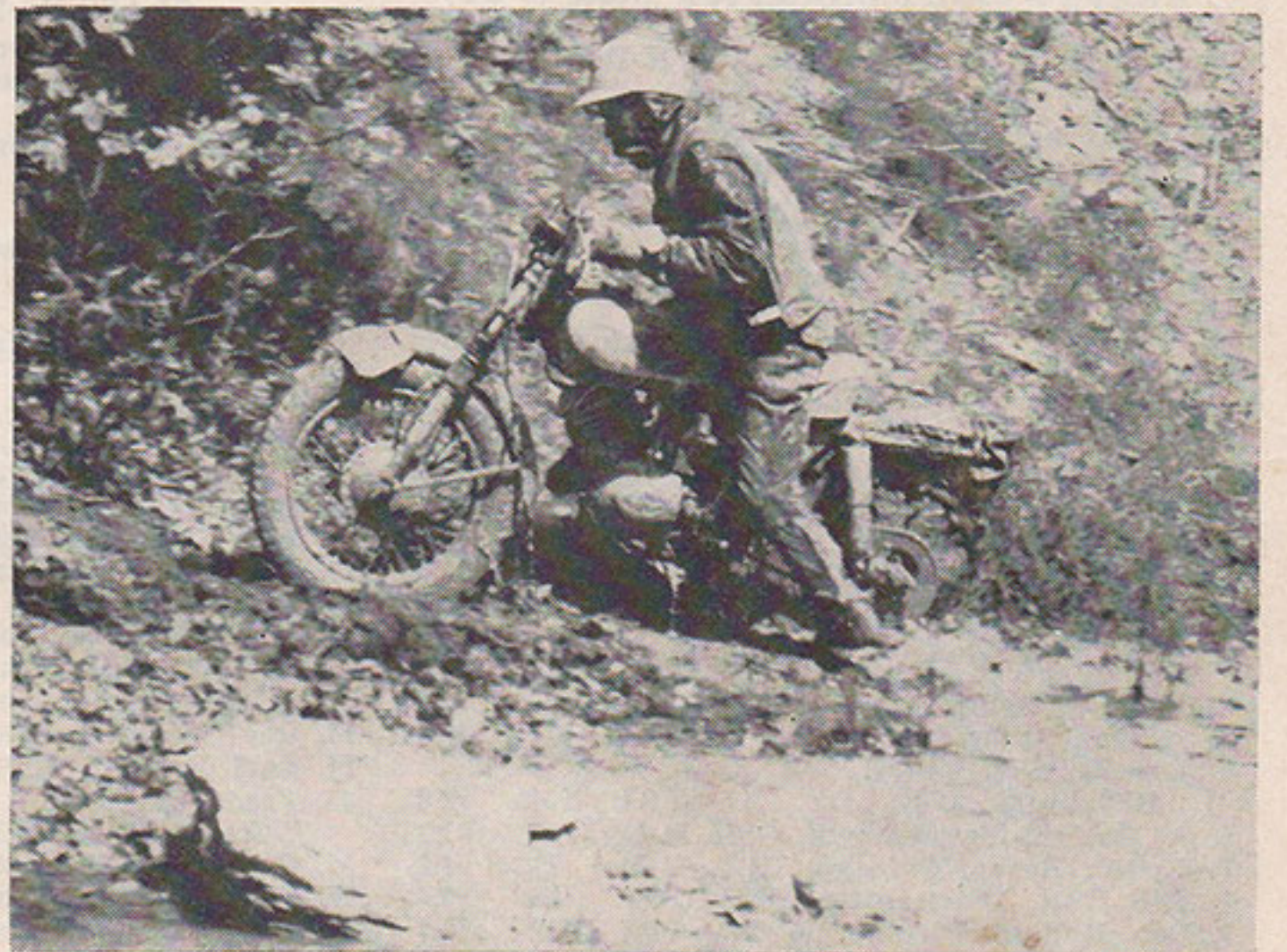

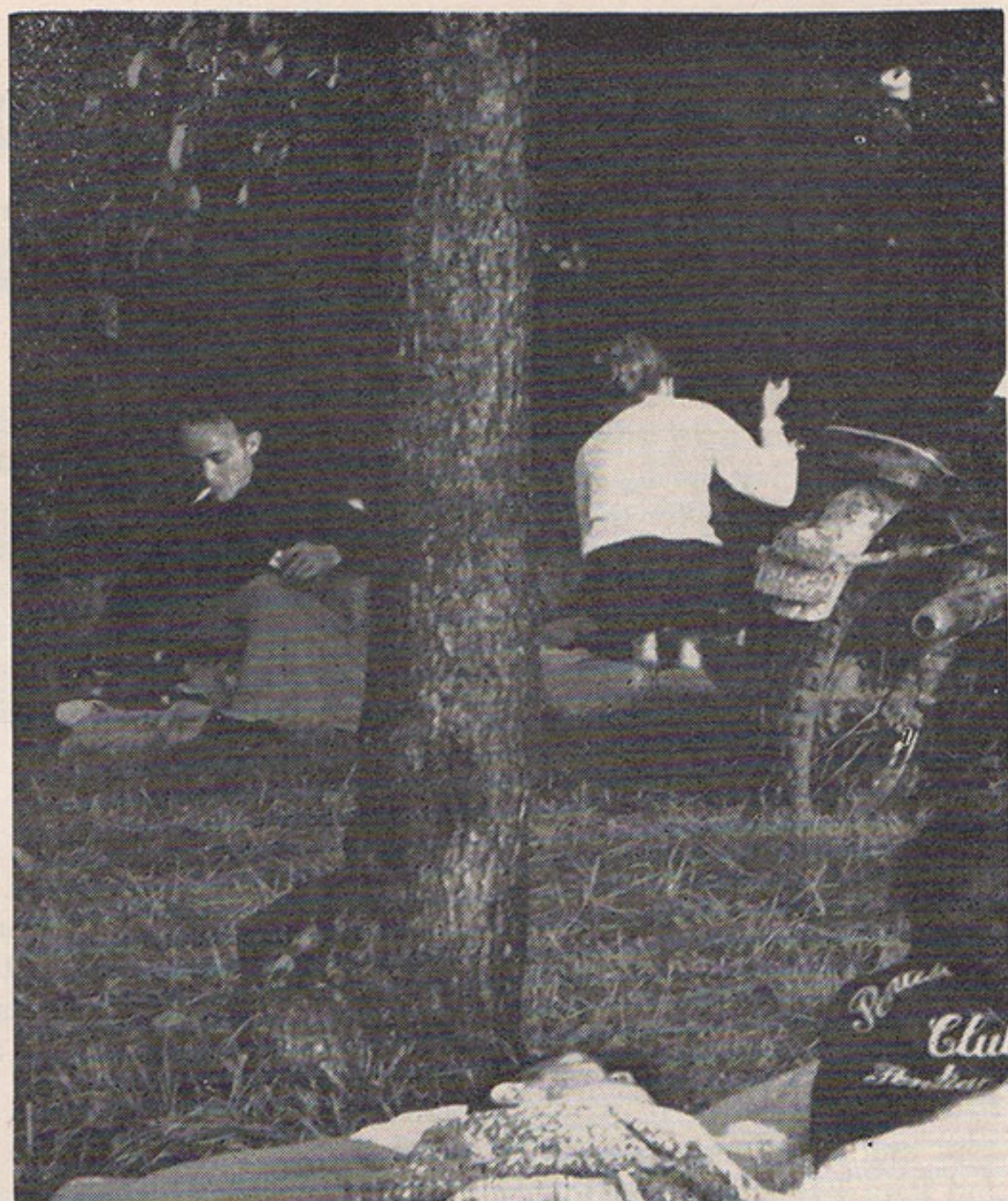

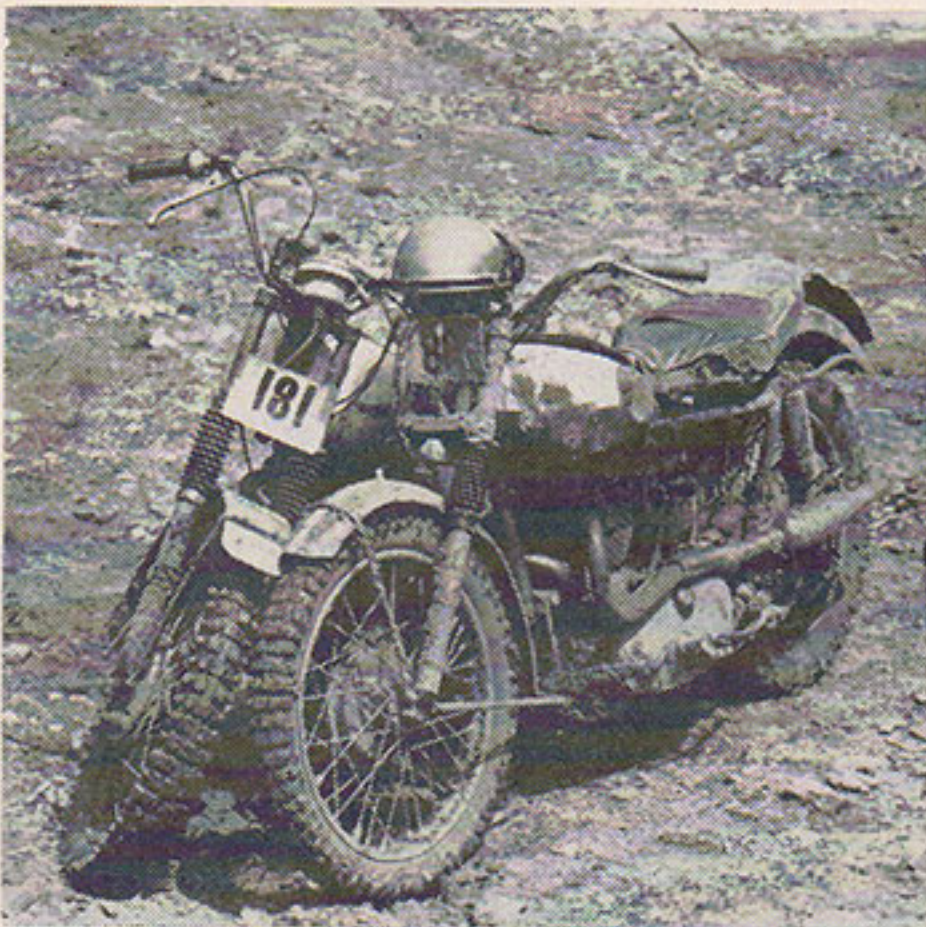

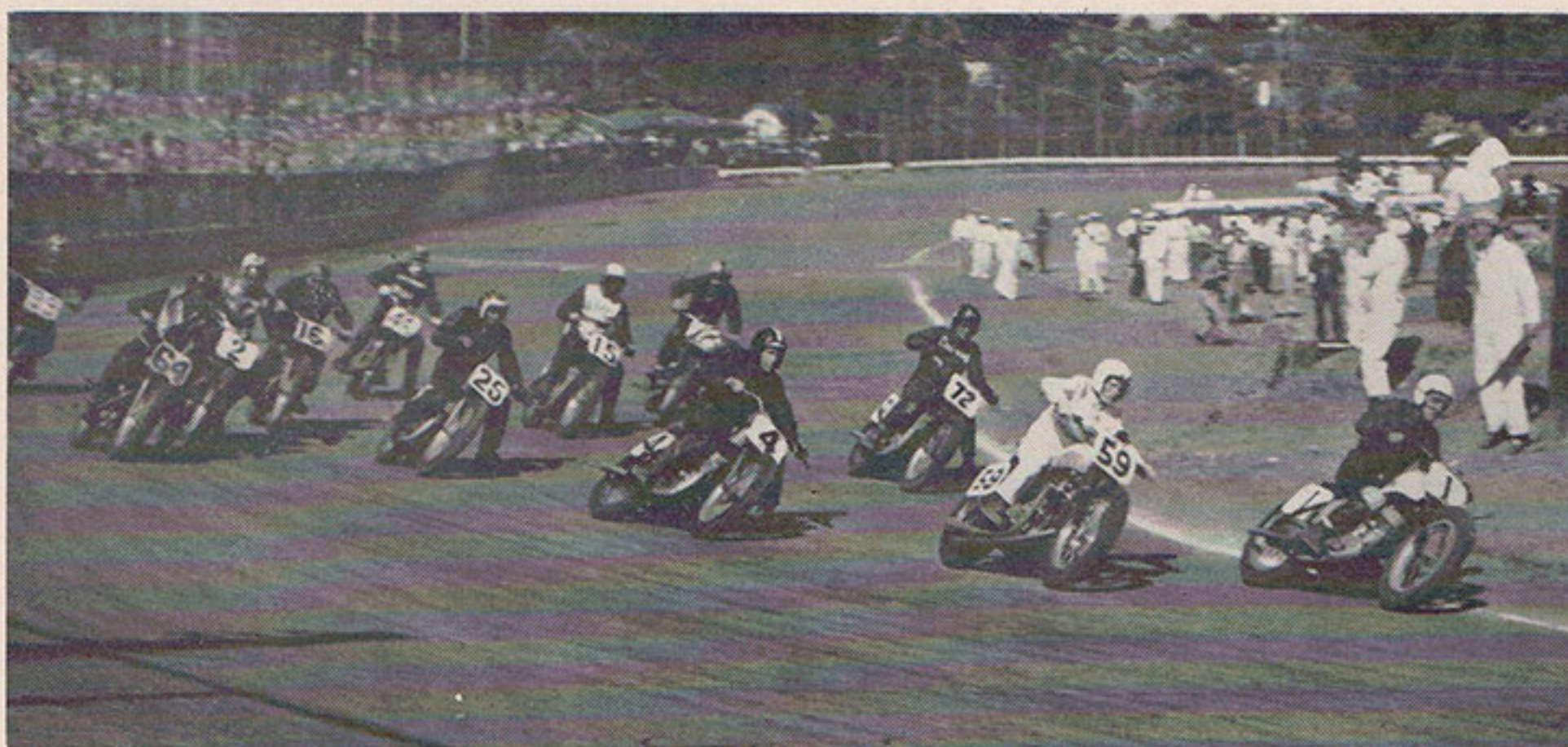

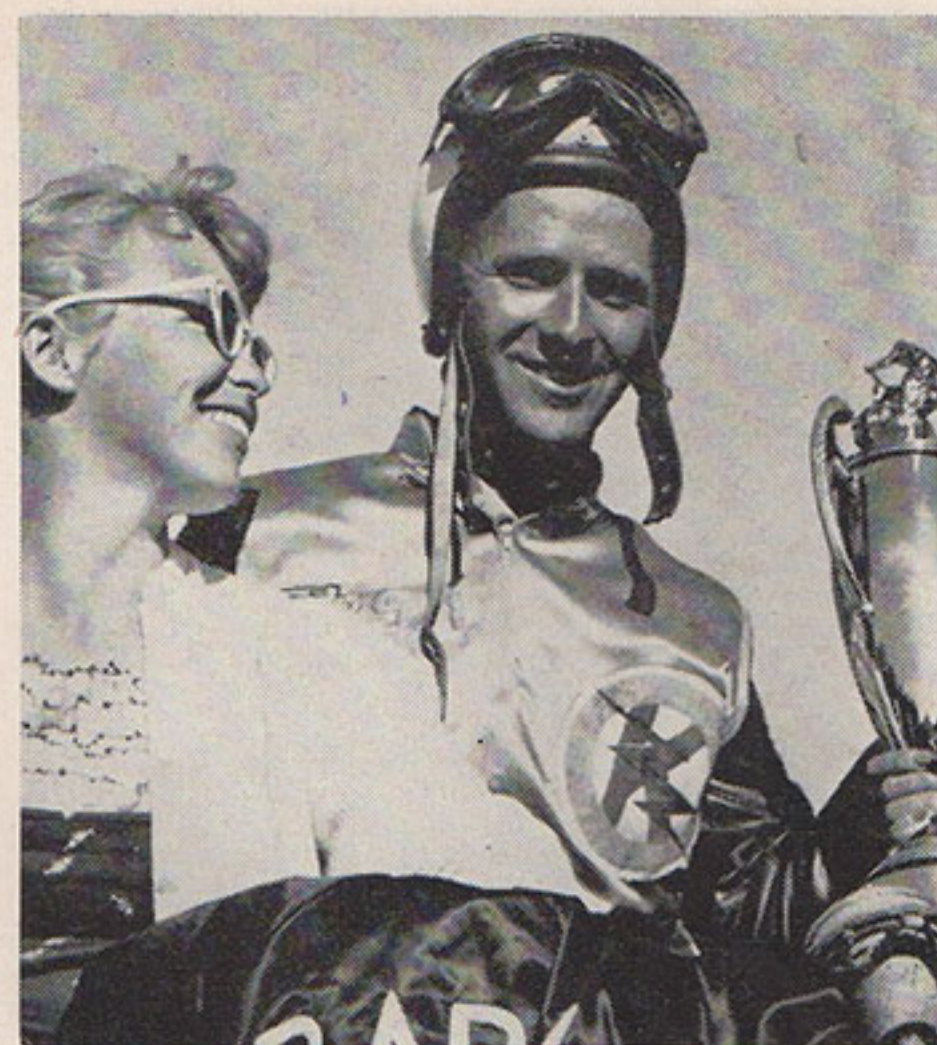

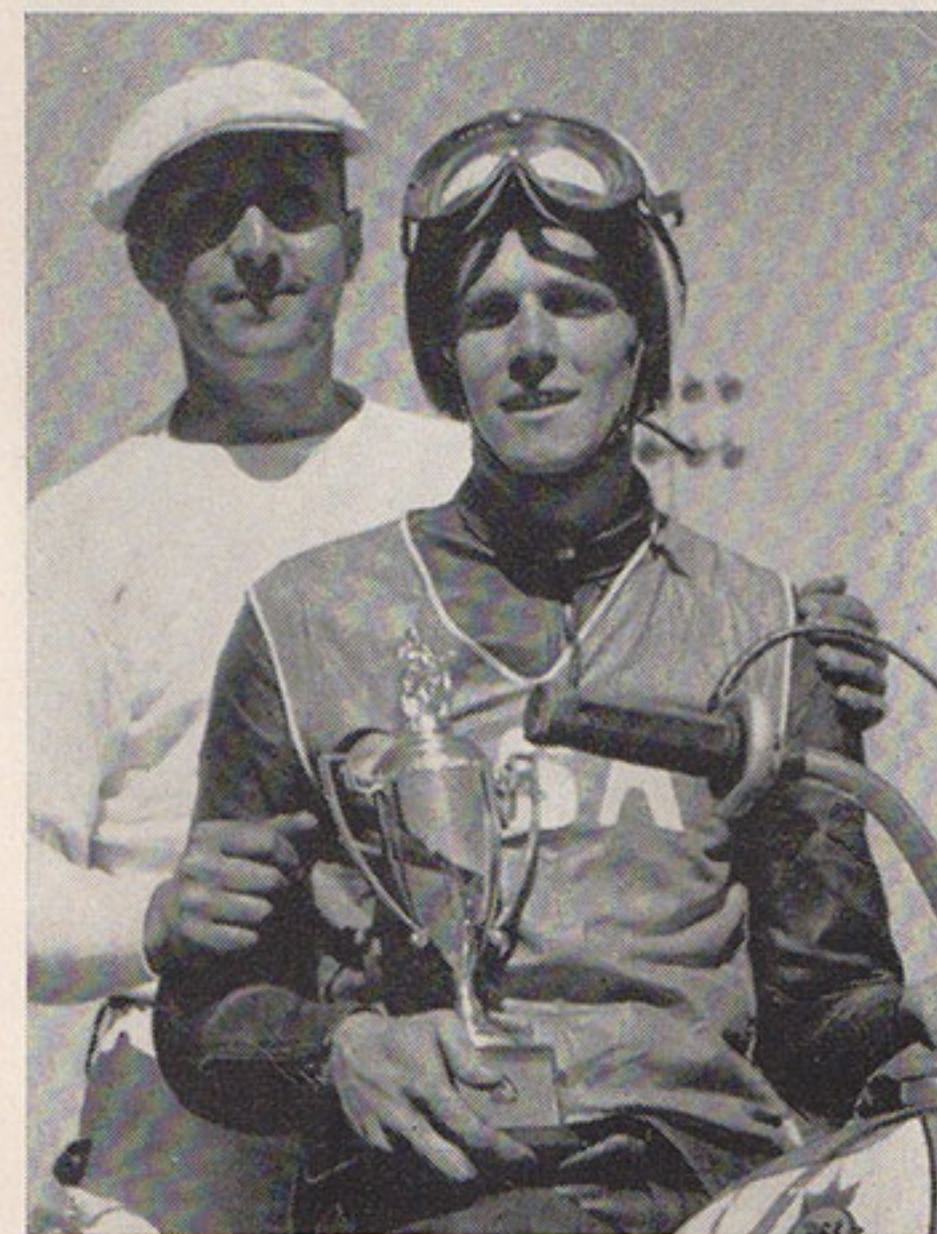
At that time, little Sammy Tanner was leading the race, but Klamfoth got by him a few laps later and so did Resweber. Bart

Markel, Flint, Mich., who was running fourth at the time, slid out and went down, but was uninjured.

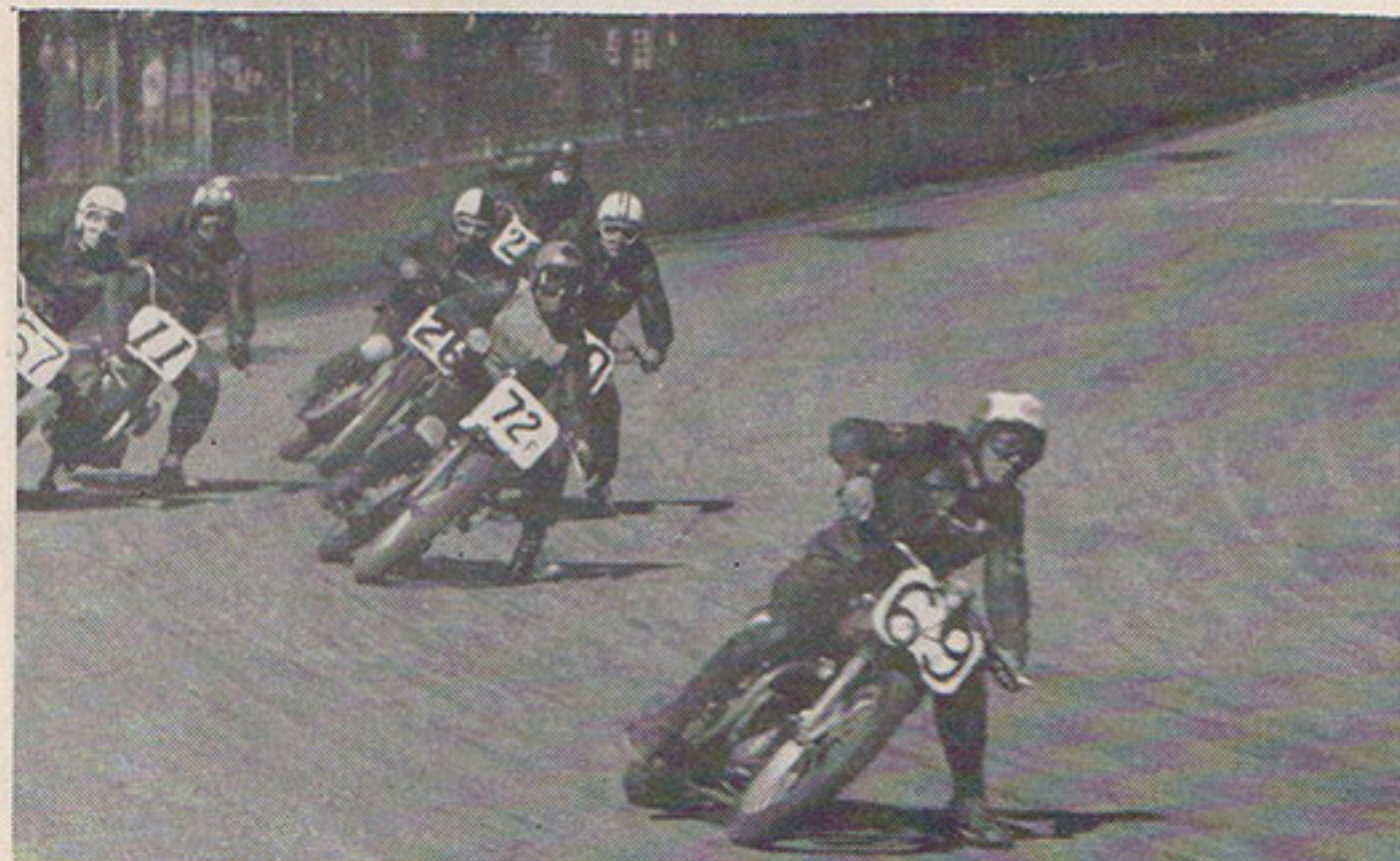

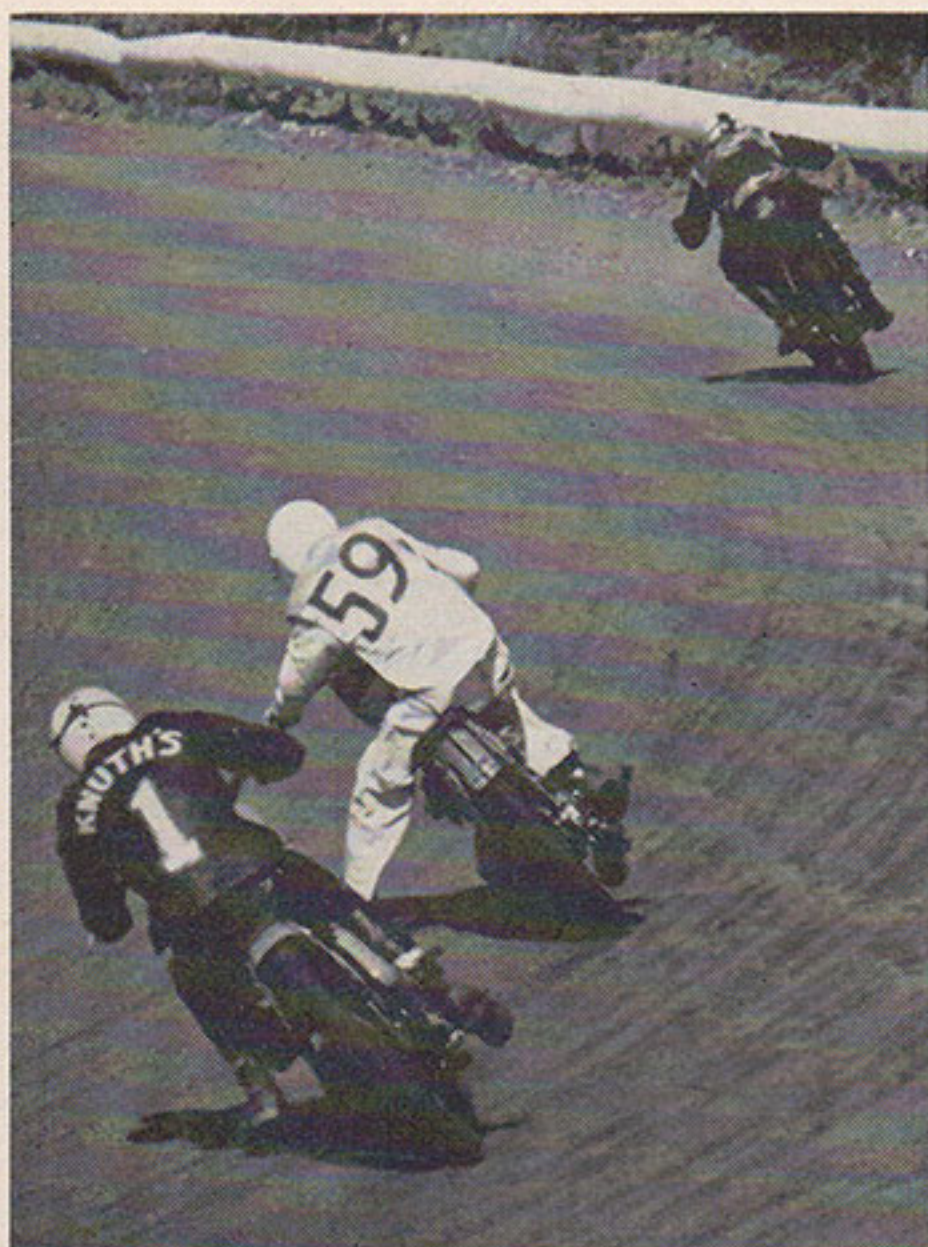

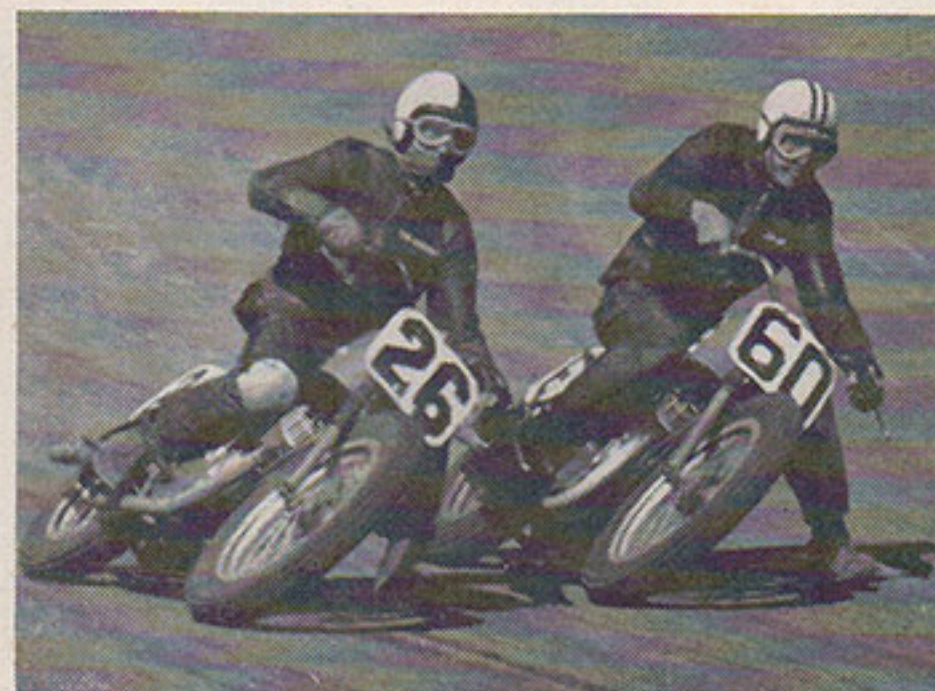

● The BSA five gallon alloy gas tank has been catalogued by BSA for the last five years under part number 42-8090, therefore can be used in Class "C" competition.

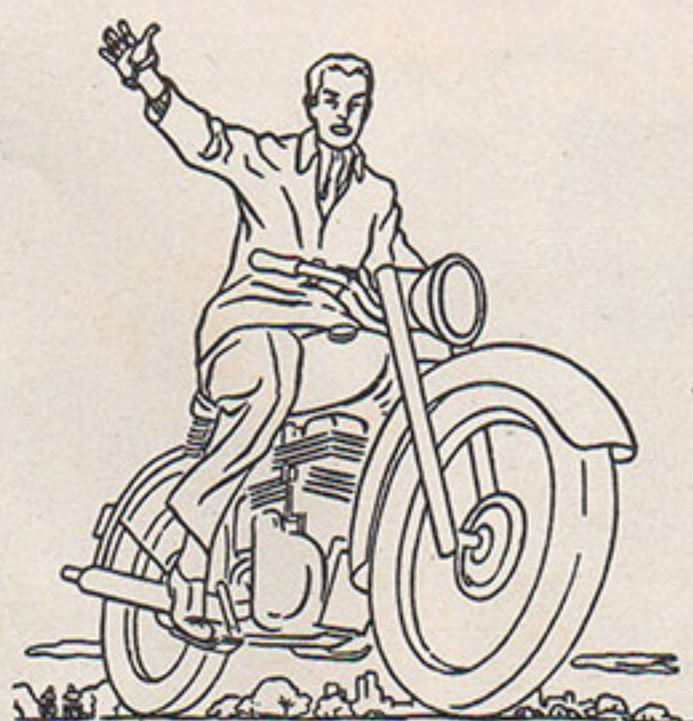
● The first AMA requested motor measurement was held on May 10th at Bellingham, Wash., by Bob Budschat. Winning motors were measured for bore, stroke and compression. All motors were found legal.

● Under 1959 hillclimb rules, both A and C, the star indicates the prize money only; the first four place winners in each class receive 5, 3, 2 and 1 points regardless of the number of stars.

● Whistles used by many referees at events have become very handy items; they sure save yelling, waving and gesturing. Suggest that all referees at least try this idea.

● As of June 1st, all short track, half-mile and one-mile tracks must be measured by the referee. Measurement shall be made 18" from the inside guard rail or pole. Also the width of the track, from the inside pole to the outside rail, in feet. These measurements will be kept in AMA files.

● There shall be no mixed practice by riders. Novice, amateurs and experts will each practice with their own group.

Resweber Wins York Fair Half Mile

THE first annual half mile race was held at York, Pa., on Memorial Day, before a large, enthusiastic crowd on a beautiful sunny day.

Conditions were perfect. The track was fast, the surroundings looked like a country estate.

Best of all, however, was the field of well over 100 riders from practically every state east of the Mississippi. It looked like a national, too, with the host of top experts riding.

Referee Al Walters got things started with a quiet riders' meeting—an orderly start to a perfectly run meet. Red Mosser did his usual perfect stint of starting and flagging. Announcer Dave Warren filled the crowd in with facts and figures and a fast-paced running commentary on the race. The mayor spoke. And—there was entertainment by some of the local gal dancers on the platform facing the grandstands.

The local club had manicured the track and filled it with calcium. Unfortunately, with a hot day and low humidity, the track got a bit dusty—but they'll be able to control that in a year or so more of working the track.

The results hardly count. No one could have seen that race and gone away thinking of anything but the spectacular riding of Carroll Resweber, the Grand National Champion. Number plate number one, the little fellow riding out of Milwaukee, proved to the thousands of fans that he well deserved his championship.

Resweber was challenged, however. Bart Markel and George Roeder pushed Resweber a bit. And, with them were such stars as Dick Klamfoth—has anyone ever gone around a half-mile faster than Klamfoth did at Heidelberg last year? And there was Bates Molyneux, who had won the Daytona B race a few years back, and

had recently beat Bobby Hill's all-time record at Reading. Tommy Morris, as usual was in the thick of the battle. Dick Young, Vince Monastero, Marvin Twigg, Richard Clark, Glenn Jordan, Tommy and Paul McDermott, Warren Sherwood, and Paul Lassiter were just some of the top riders who were out to beat Resweber—but couldn't.

There have been great races before, and there will be again. But, perhaps, no track has ever had an opening as exciting as did the York Fair. The race, incidentally, was broadcast over the radio, and was a very fine presentation of our sport to the Pennsylvania radio listeners.

York can well be proud of the race they held. The ceremonies were a bit too long, some felt, but everything else was as good as could ever be. The York police did a bang-up job of traffic control in the Fair area; the refreshments were up to the high standards of the well-known Pennsylvania Dutch culinary art; the organization of the entire meet was well through out. The courtesy of those handling the affair was marked as being unusually friendly by those of us who attended.

Best of all, however, were the stars out on the track. Of them all, it was Resweber who shone the brightest that day.

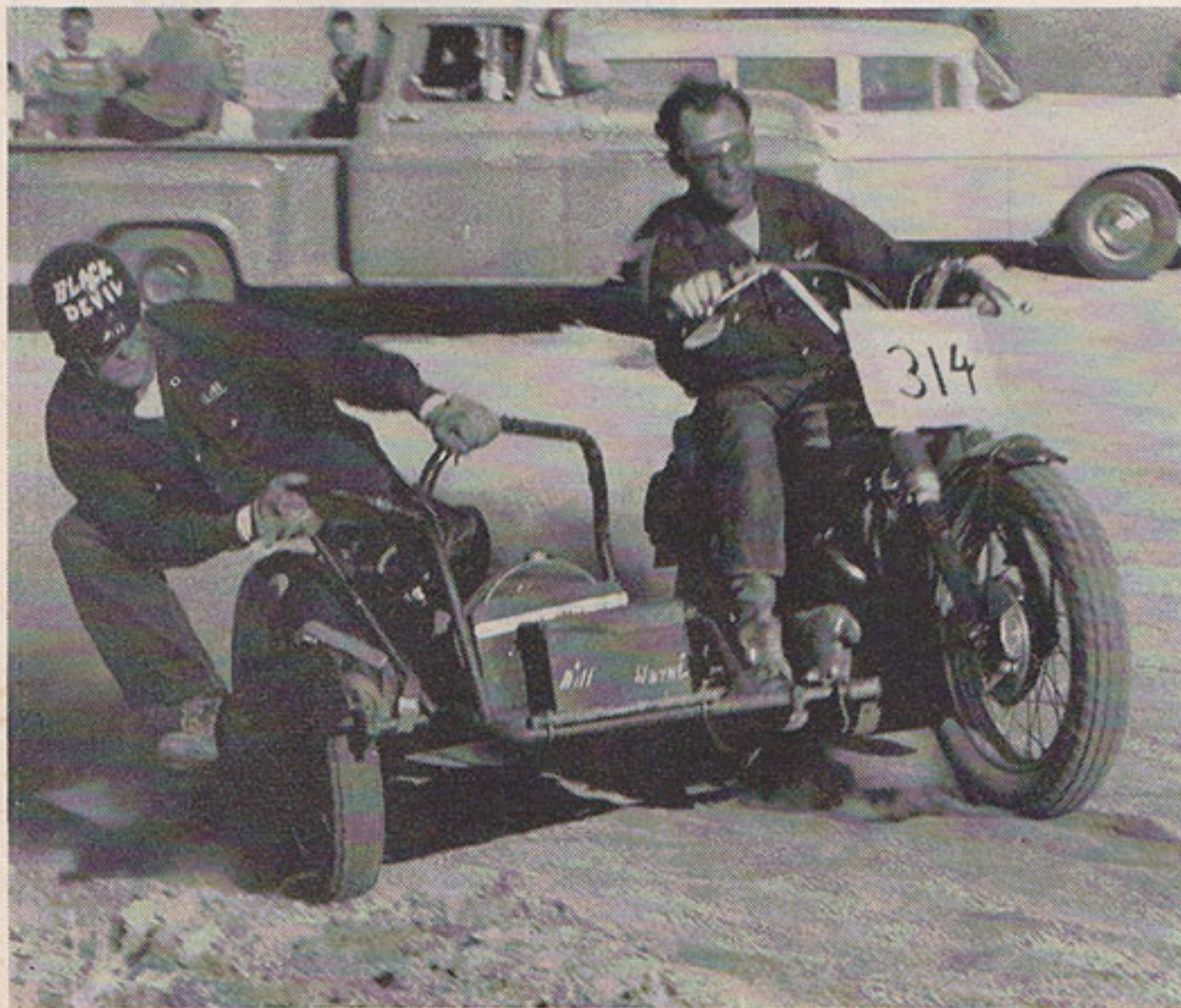

THE Shamrock three-man Triumph team of Bud Dorton, Buck Smith and Charles Curnutt "found the clock" to their liking, and proceeded to capture four of Pasadena MC's Greenhorn trophies to emerge top winners in 1959's 13th annual Greenhorn enduro classic at Pasadena, California on May 30-31.

With just one point separating Bud Dorton and Buck Smith for the grand sweepstakes, Dorton held the edge to defeat Smith and 230 entries for the coveted overall win.

Buck Smith placed "No. 1" for the 40 in. expert class with Charles Curnutt, the third man of the winning Shamrock team, grabbing the 500cc expert.

The enduro riders left Saturday at 6:00 a.m. in one minute intervals from Johnson Motors in Pasadena. The riders, in groups of three and four, headed north through the foothill mountains of famed Angeles Crest. Solo machines, doubles and sidecars groaned unmercifully through the desert sand lands, firetrails, and washed and pine scented forest paths. Their destination . . . Green Mountain.

When the finishers reached the first leg stopover at Green Mountain Saturday evening, they prepared campsites for early retiring. At 6 a.m. Sunday, less than half the riders remained as they started on the return leg back to Pasadena, another 250 miles.

Crisscrossing through the desert to the Angeles Crest mountains, the cyclists began their last few miles.

Bud Dorton, then Smith and Curnutt, tired and dust covered, appeared first. After

that a steady line of finishers limped over the finish line.

Mike Lewis joined the winning column also as he rode his small Harley-Davidson into the finish capturing the 200cc class.

Jake Loveridge, also H-D mounted, made it to complete the grueling circuit intact via his potent 74.

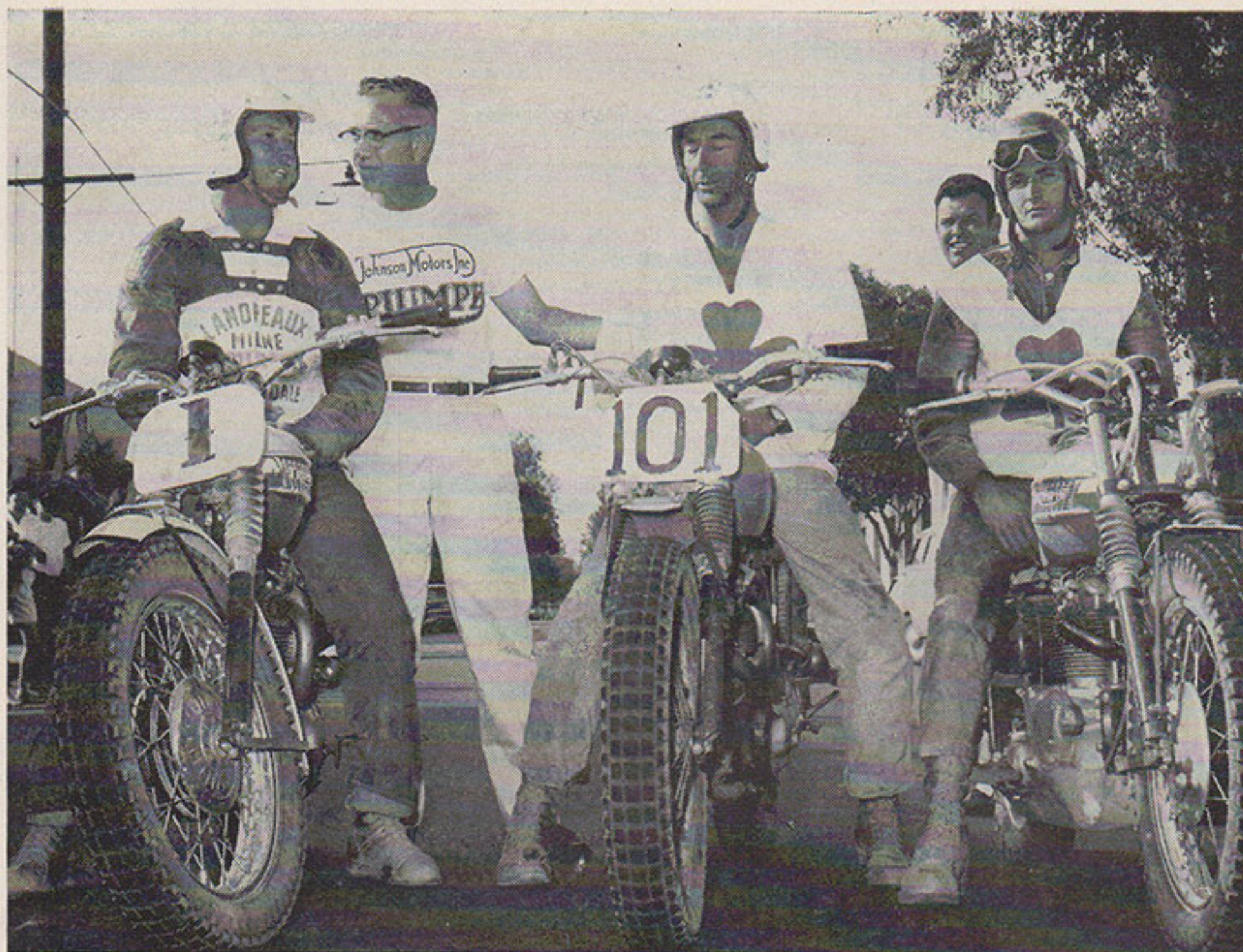
Over 230 entries had tackled the 500 mile 13th annual, the largest "hack" turnout since the early '50's.

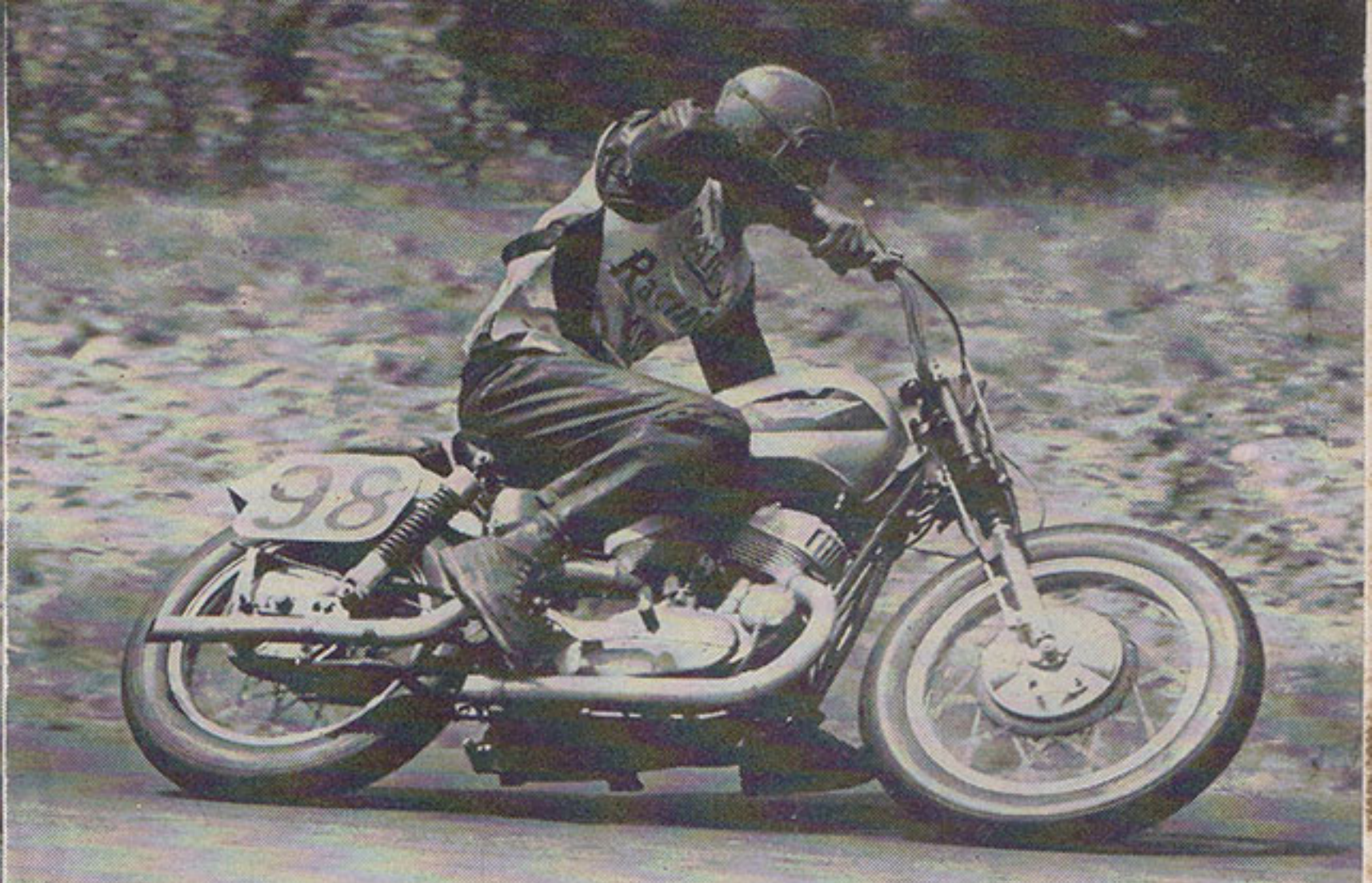
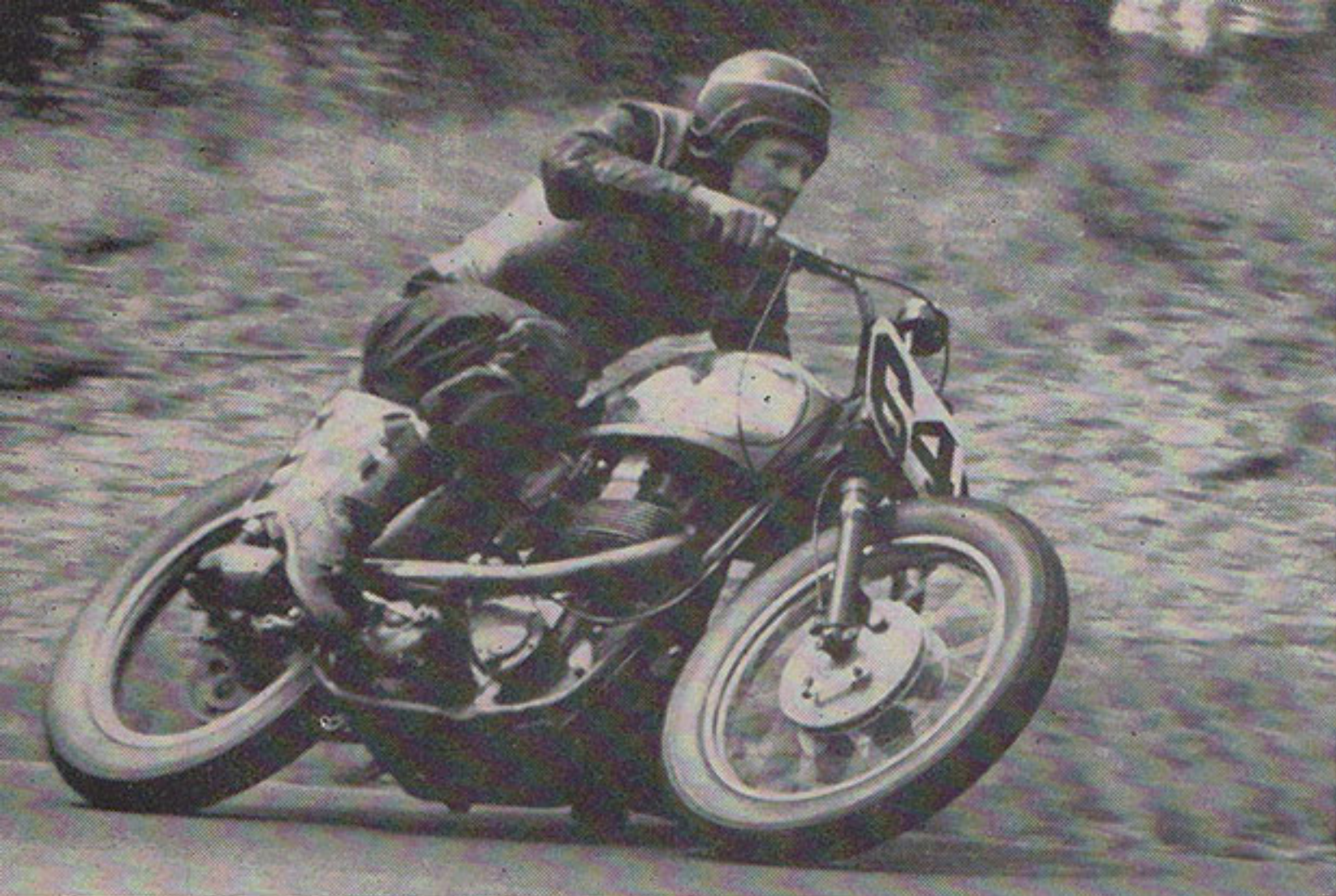

Andres Wins Fourth Laconia 100 Mile Title

by Earl O. Anderson

CALIFORNIA competitors have again demonstrated that they have what it takes to win the "big ones" in motorcycle racing.

For the sixth straight year, this West Coast state has dominated the 100-mile national road race championship event at the Belknap Recreation Area, Laconia-Gilford, N. H.

To Brad Andres, 24-year-old San Diego rider, this year went the great distinction of winning the coveted Belknap crown for the fourth time in five years.

Andres beat a field of 40 top expert riders from all parts of the U. S. In so doing, he clipped nearly six seconds off of his fastest time, heretofore, made in 1956, and over two minutes from his 1958 performance.

The official time for the 1959 100-miler was one hour, 42 minutes, and 59 and 47/100 seconds. Average speed was 58.26

miles per hour. Spurts up to 90 miles an hour or better were attained, however, going up the first hill from the straight-away start.

Runnerup was Joe Leonard of San Jose, Cal., a two-time Belknap champion, 16 seconds behind Andres. They fought a friendly duel with Leonard at times ahead. Both men ride Harley-Davidson machines.

Dame Fortune shook her head at Dick Mann, another Californian, from El Sobrante, as victory was almost within his grasp. Leading the gruelling grind for almost the entire distance, he encountered trouble on the 92nd lap. Ahead by 20 seconds, he wound up in third place, 37 seconds behind Andres.

Mann had to make a gas stop, and then lost more valuable time, when the exhaust pipe on his machine got in the way of the gear shift lever. He lost out for the \$1,200 top money last year by only seven seconds. He was runnerup in the 200-miler at Daytona Beach last winter, also won by Andres.

The "almost" new champion set a new course mark with his BSA, of 51 minutes and 14 seconds for the half-way point. He accepted the rebuff from Dame Fortune philosophically, however.

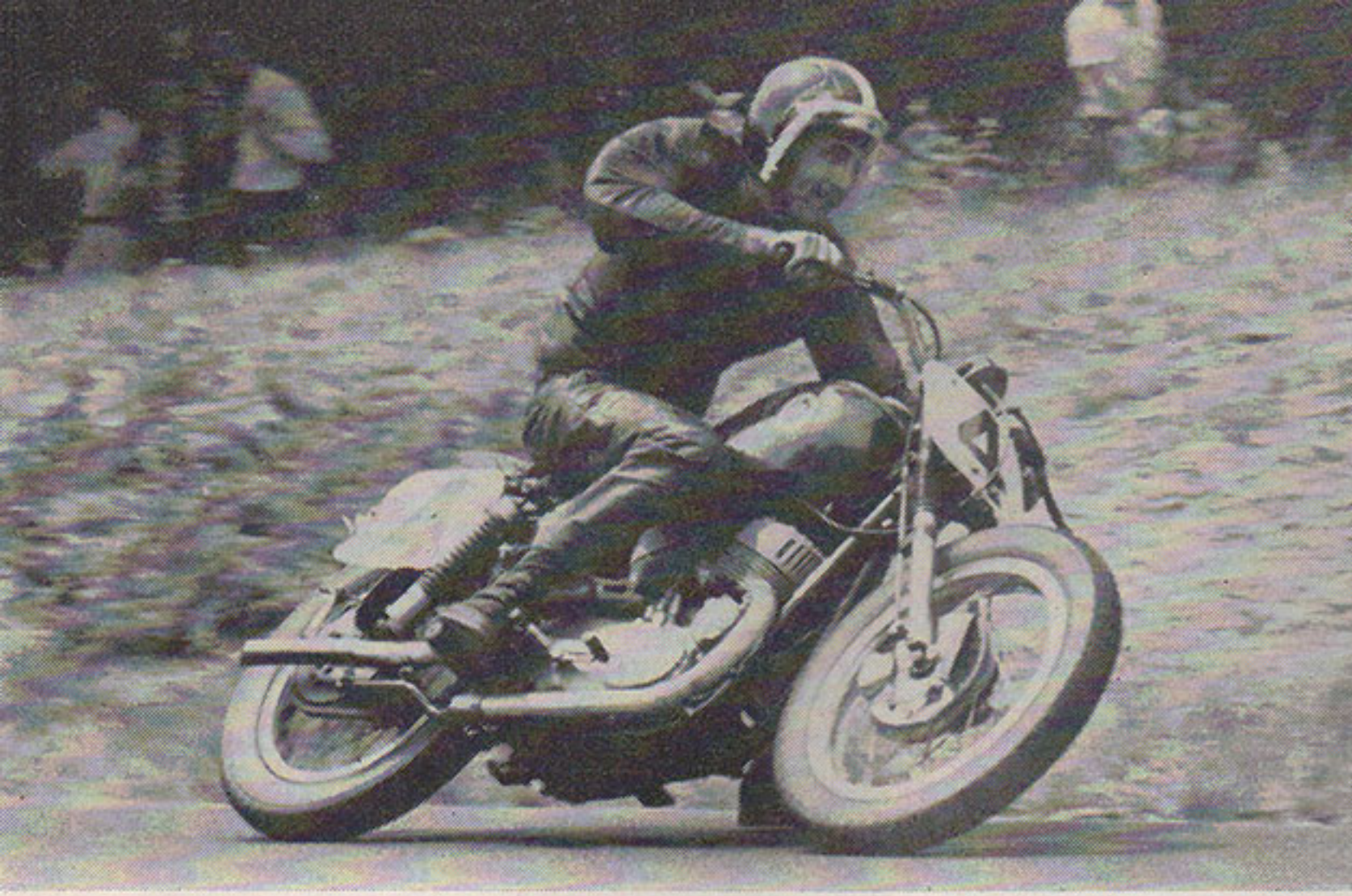
The 50-mile amateur crown was captured by Tommy Clark, 27, of Morristown, Pa., on a BSA. He led for all but the first four laps. Official time was 54 minutes and 19 seconds. Finishing a close second, about six seconds behind, was Bill Scott of Kewanee, Ill., on a Harley.

The 100-miler was advanced from 3 to 1 o'clock because of threatening weather,

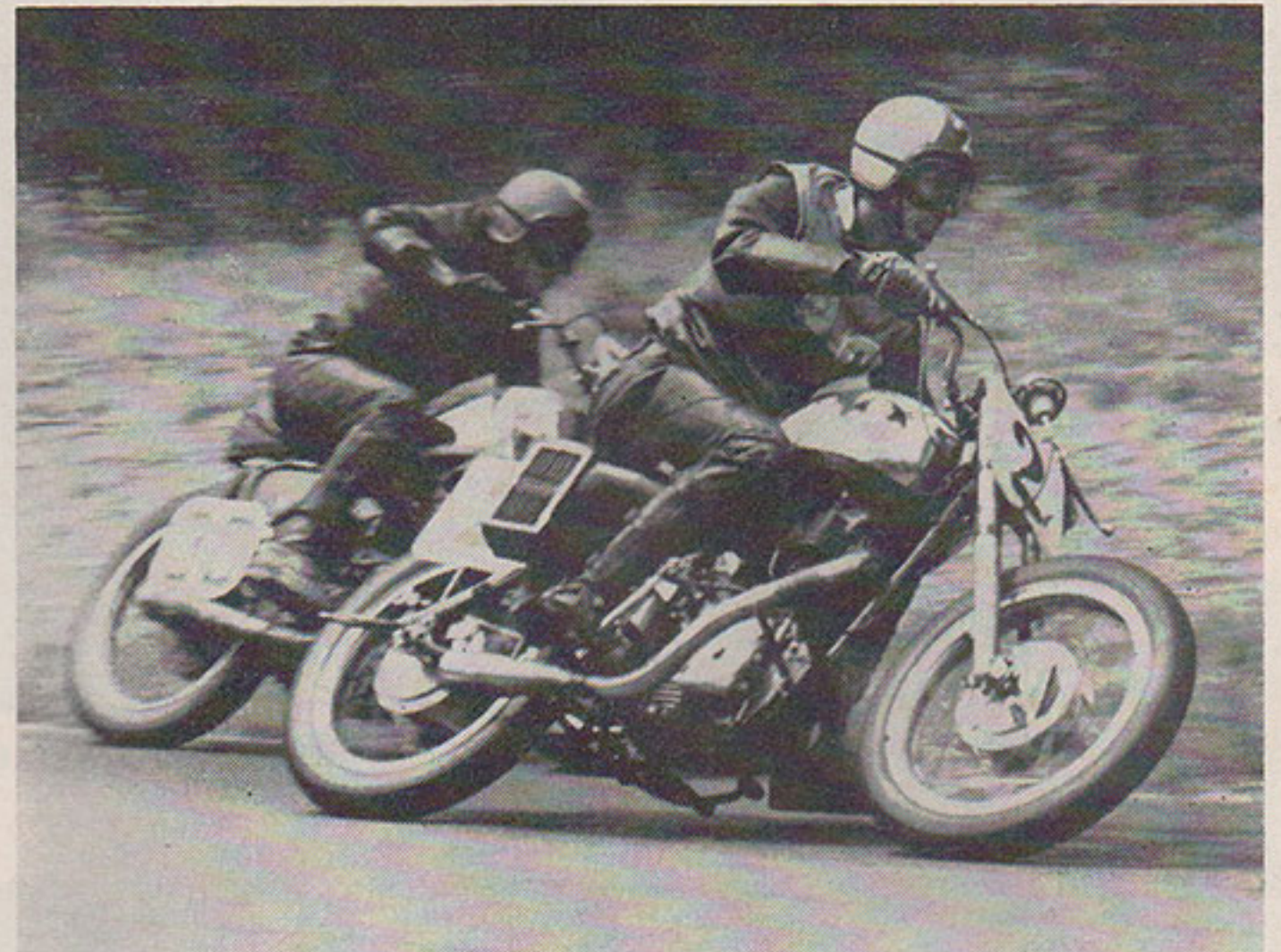


Down the backstretch. This is the fastest point of the Laconia mile, and the dead end left turn calls for plenty of skill and brakes.

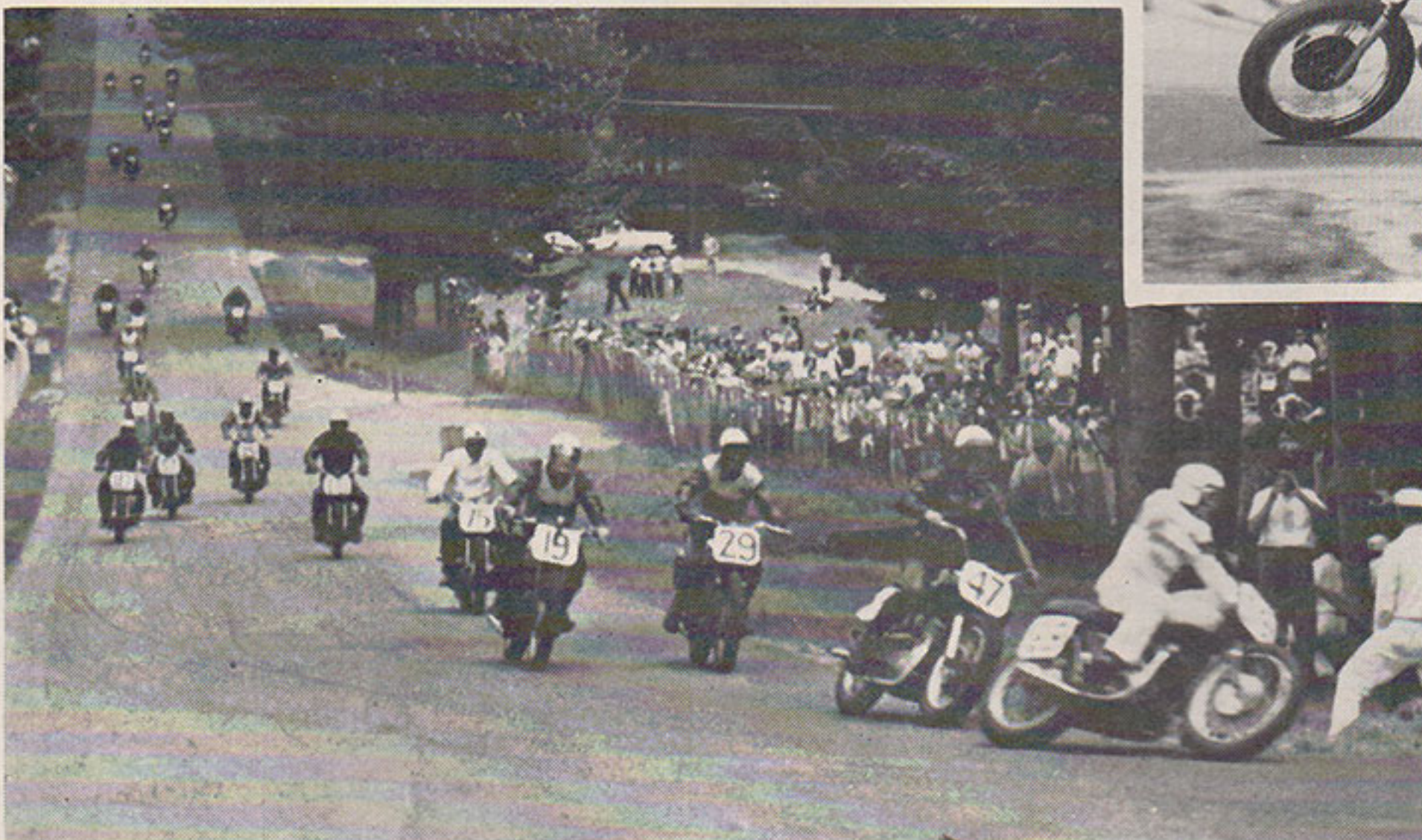

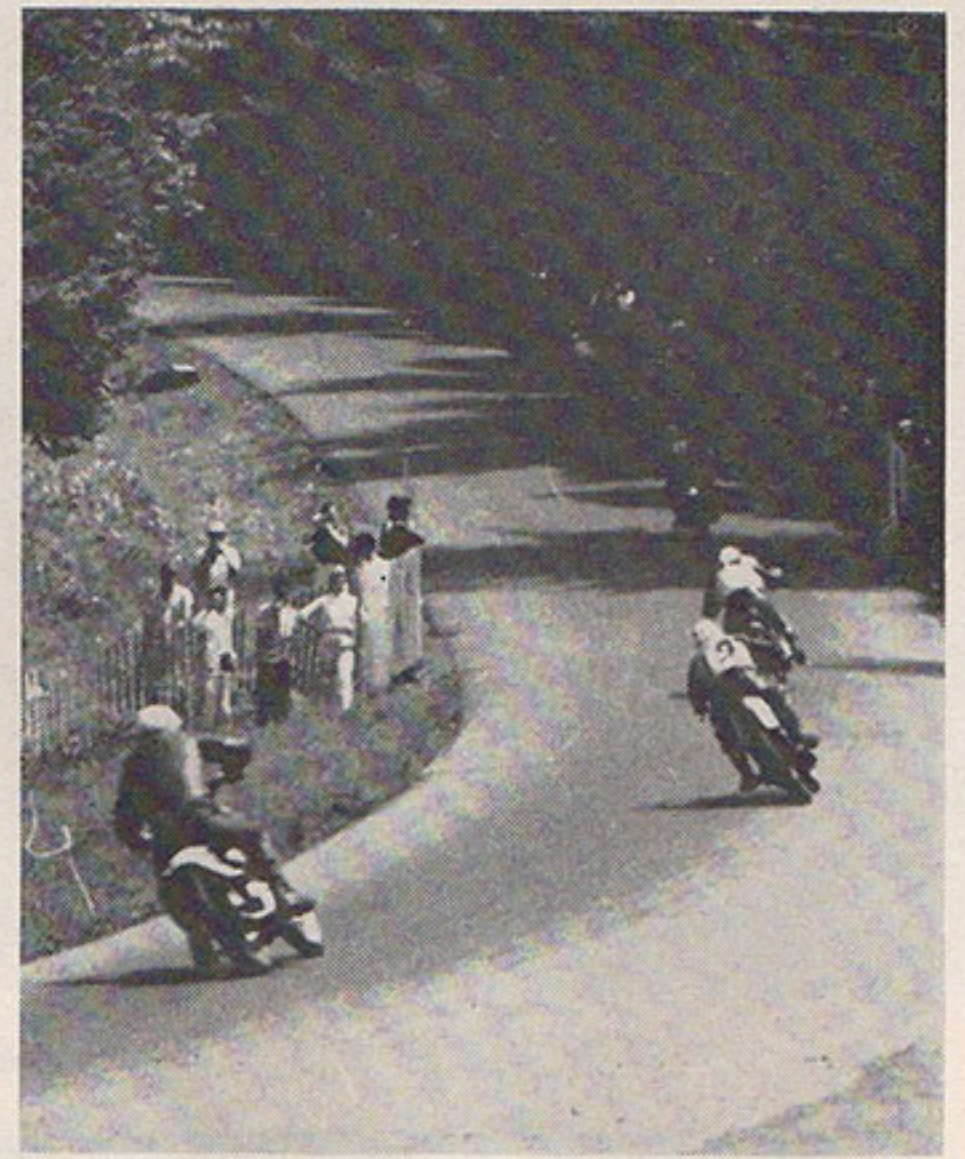

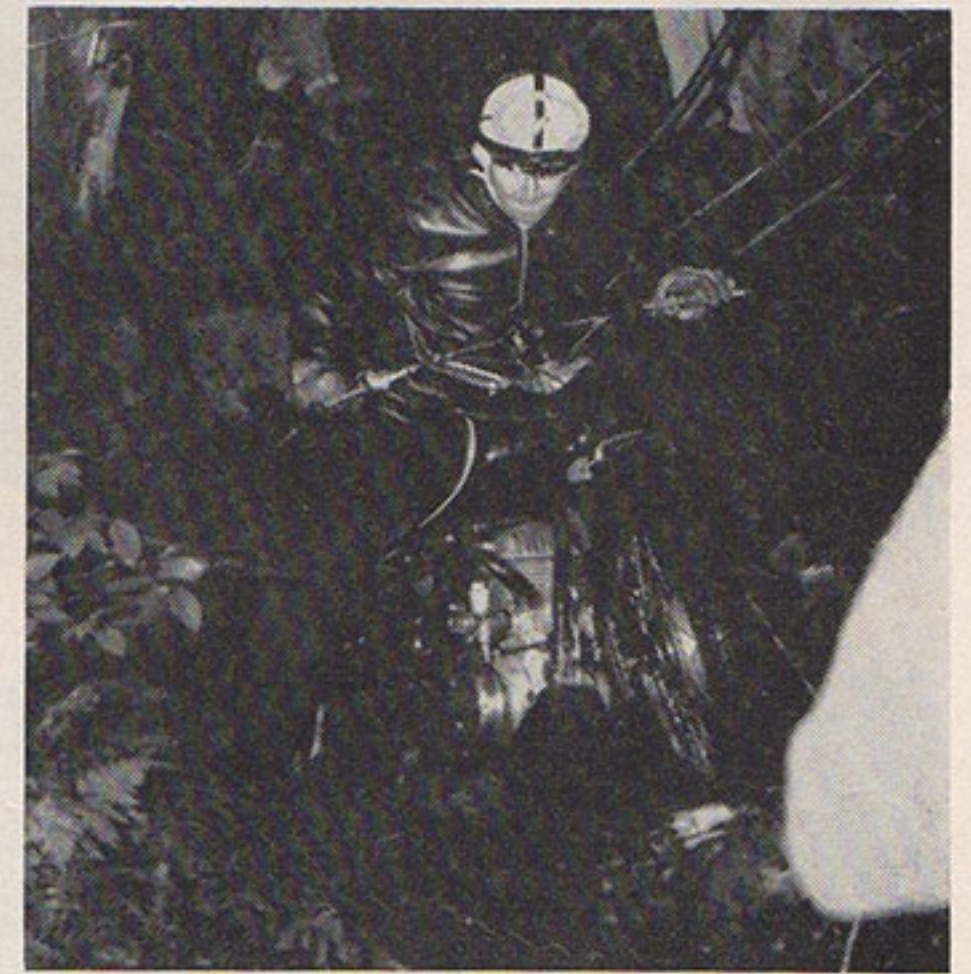

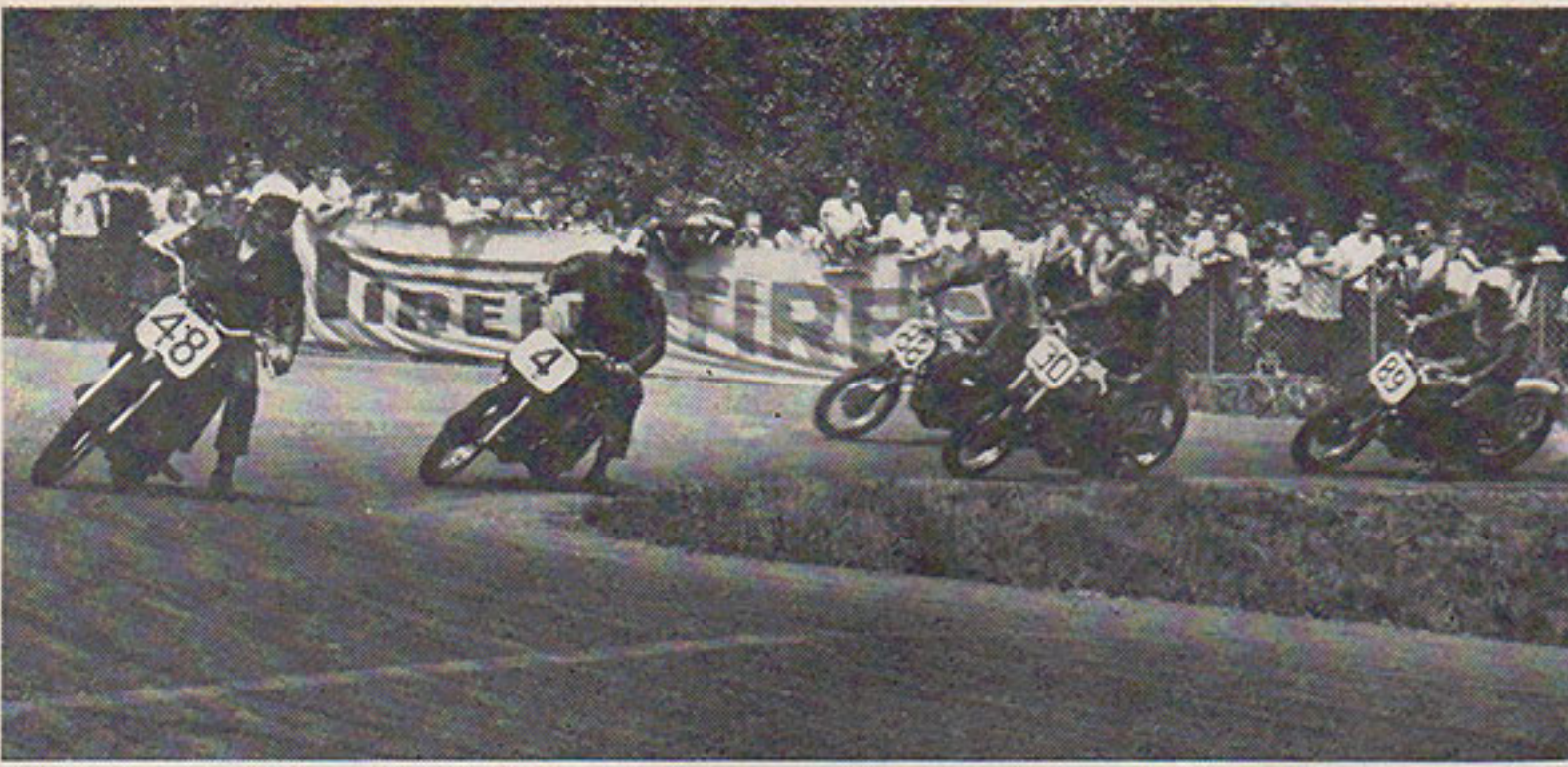

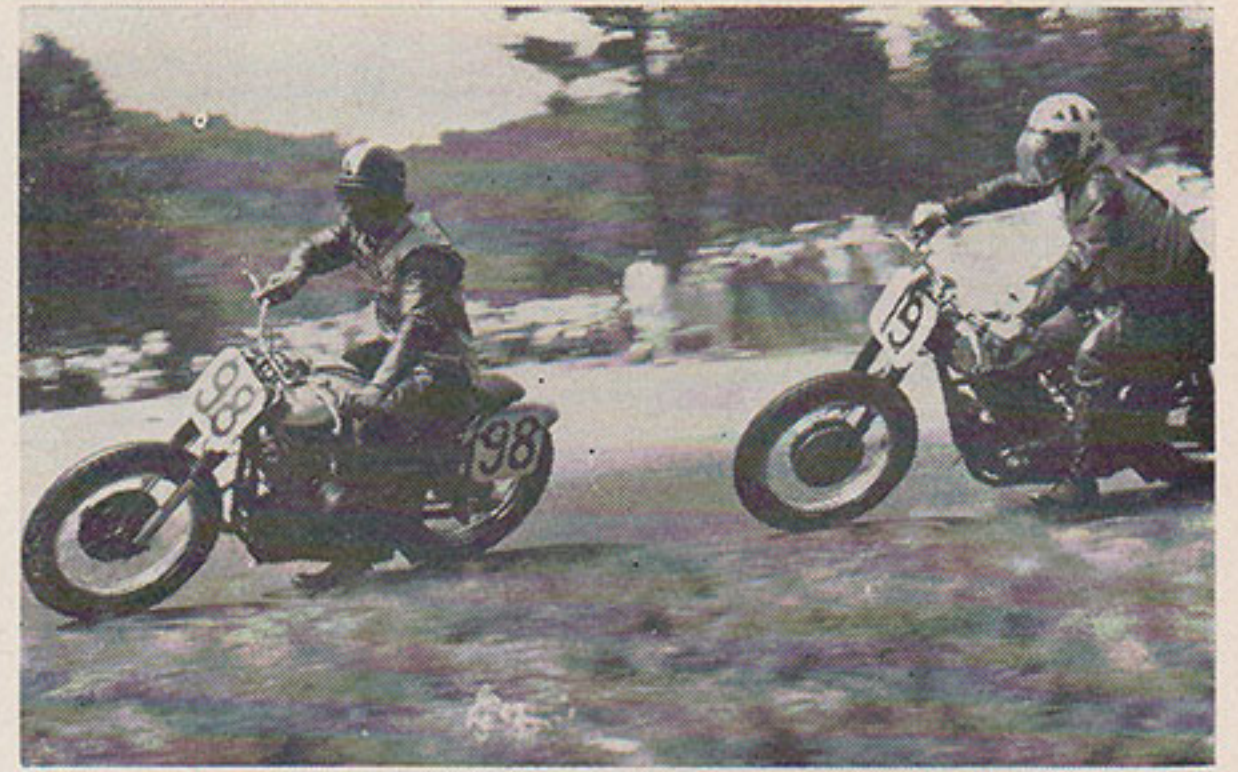

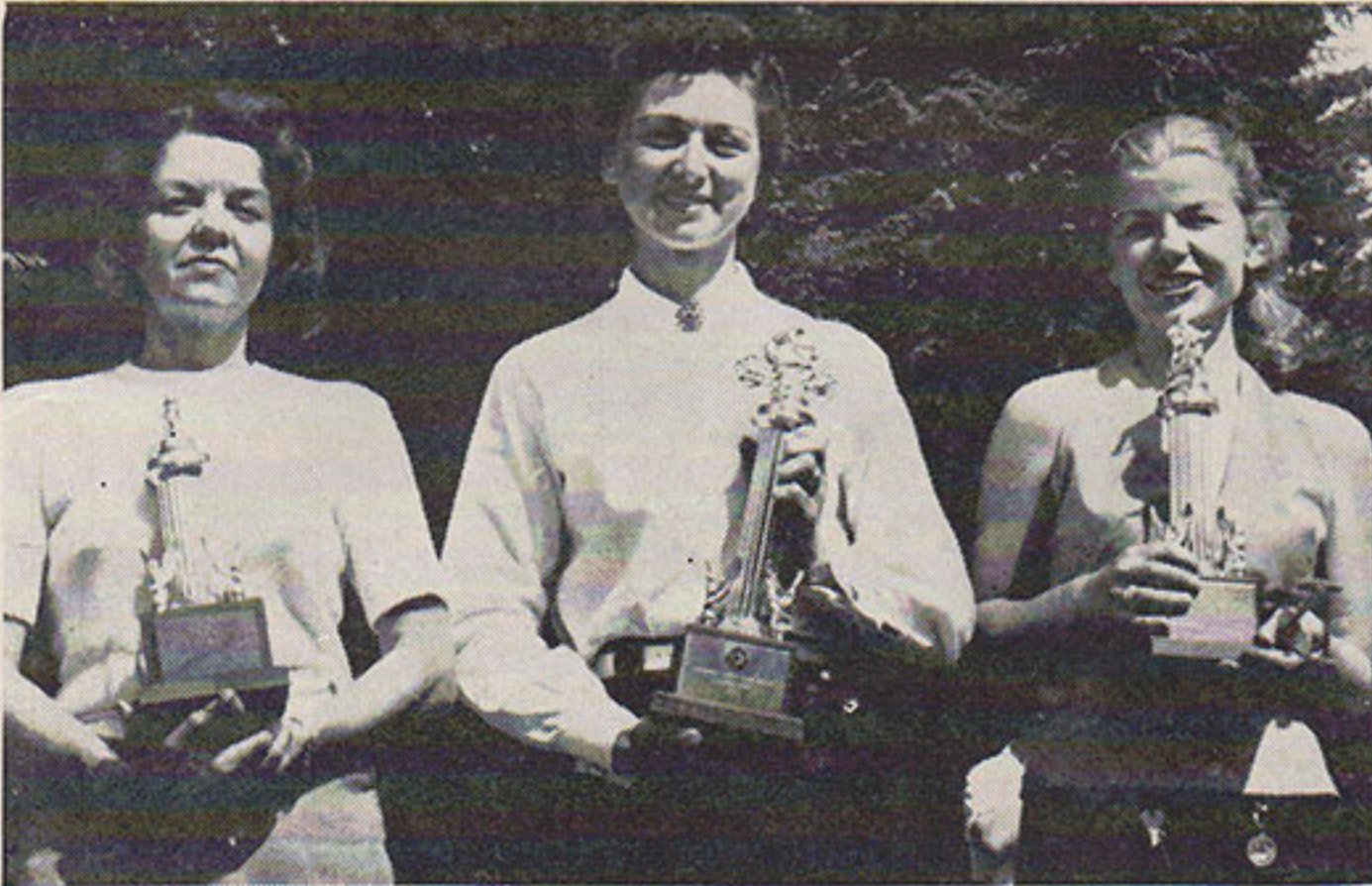

but then the skies cleared, and the full racing program went ahead as scheduled. A crowd estimated at 20,000 persons, witnessed the climaxing program on Sunday, June 21.

Dismal weather earlier in the week cancelled and postponed many of the preliminary events. However, the sportsman's hillclimb took place, in between heavy showers, and some of the amateur lightweight races were worked in after the expert lightweight and novice program on Saturday.

Franco Farne won the expert lightweight class, despite a flip which called the race at the end of the 15th lap of a 20-lap feature. Farne escaped with minor hurts, and is now planning to return to Italy.

Jack Simpson of Dunedin, Fla., won the 20-mile novice feature, on a BSA. Runner-up was George Montgomery of New Rochelle, N. Y. on a Velo.

Accompanying Andres to Belknap was his pretty bride of six months, the former Betty Reagan. Brad's mother, Mrs. Leonard Andres, also made her first trip to the 100-miler. The winner's father, however, has served as "head mechanic" for his son on all of his Belknap missions.

William Schietinger of Bridgeport, Mass., was general chairman of the Motor-

cycle Week program, with William Gregson of Providence, R. I., as co-chairman. Robert Finn of Longmeadow, Mass., was official referee for the sanctioning American Motorcycle Association.

Chosen Miss National Gypsy Tour queen was Betty Meshok of Reading, Pa., a repeat victory of last year; and Miss New England queen, Shelley Marks of Seymour, Conn.

Fritzie Baer, popular Belknap Area manager, and former motorcycle promotion man, was honored by the Indian Motorcycle Co., by whom he was long employed, before assuming the Belknap post about 10 years ago. A trophy was presented Baer by Leonard O. Paul, executive vice president, in recognition of Baer's great work for motorcycling.

A parade from Weirs Beach through downtown Laconia was one of the colorful features. A trophy for the best uniformed club, according to AMA standards, went to the Sky Way Riders of Jersey City, N. Y., and for the club making the best appearance in the procession, according to local judging, the Baltimore, Md., Ramblers.

Mayor J. Oliva Huot of Laconia, who had proclaimed Motorcycle Week, as welcome to the visitors, headed the parade in a motorcycle sidecar.

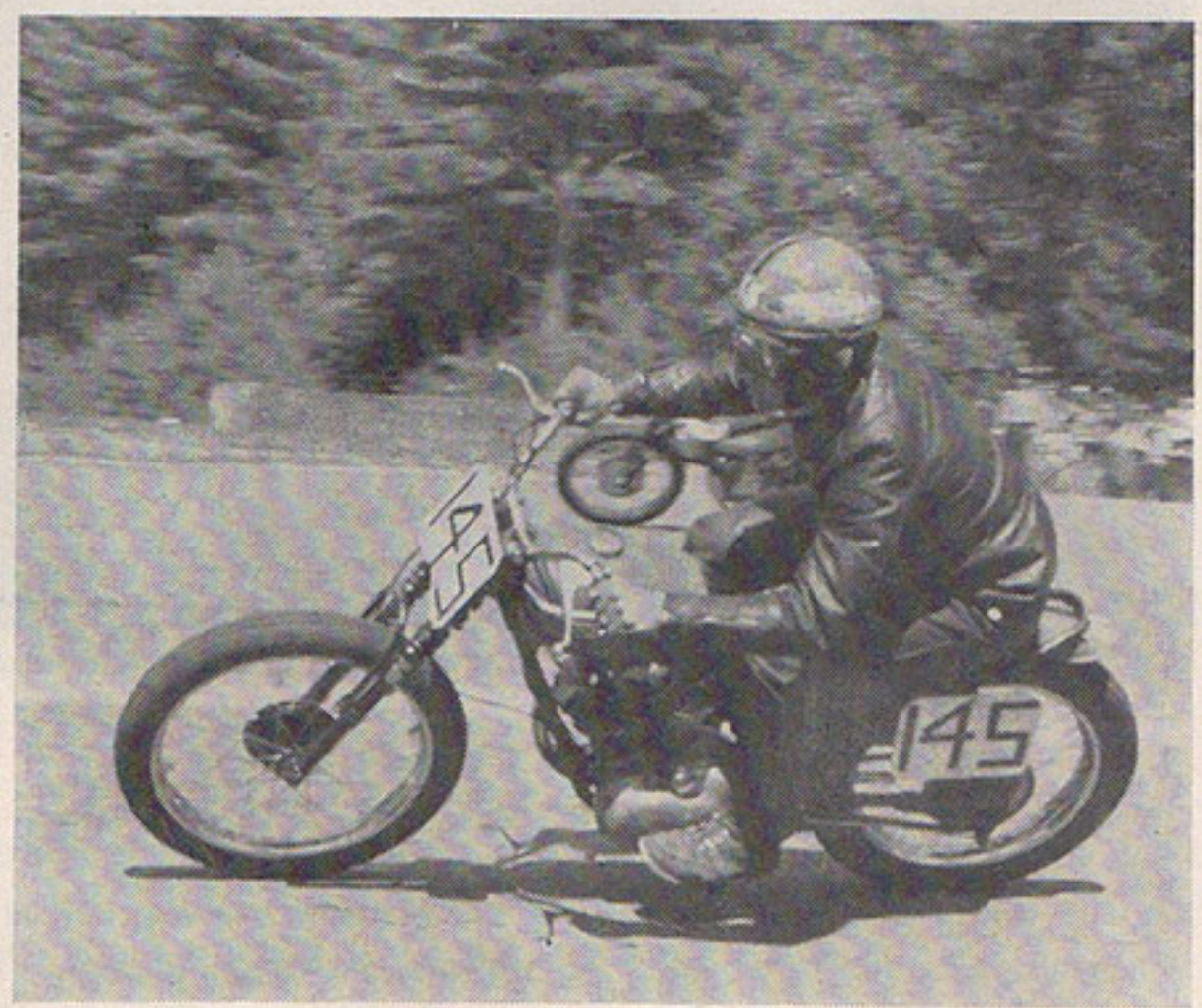

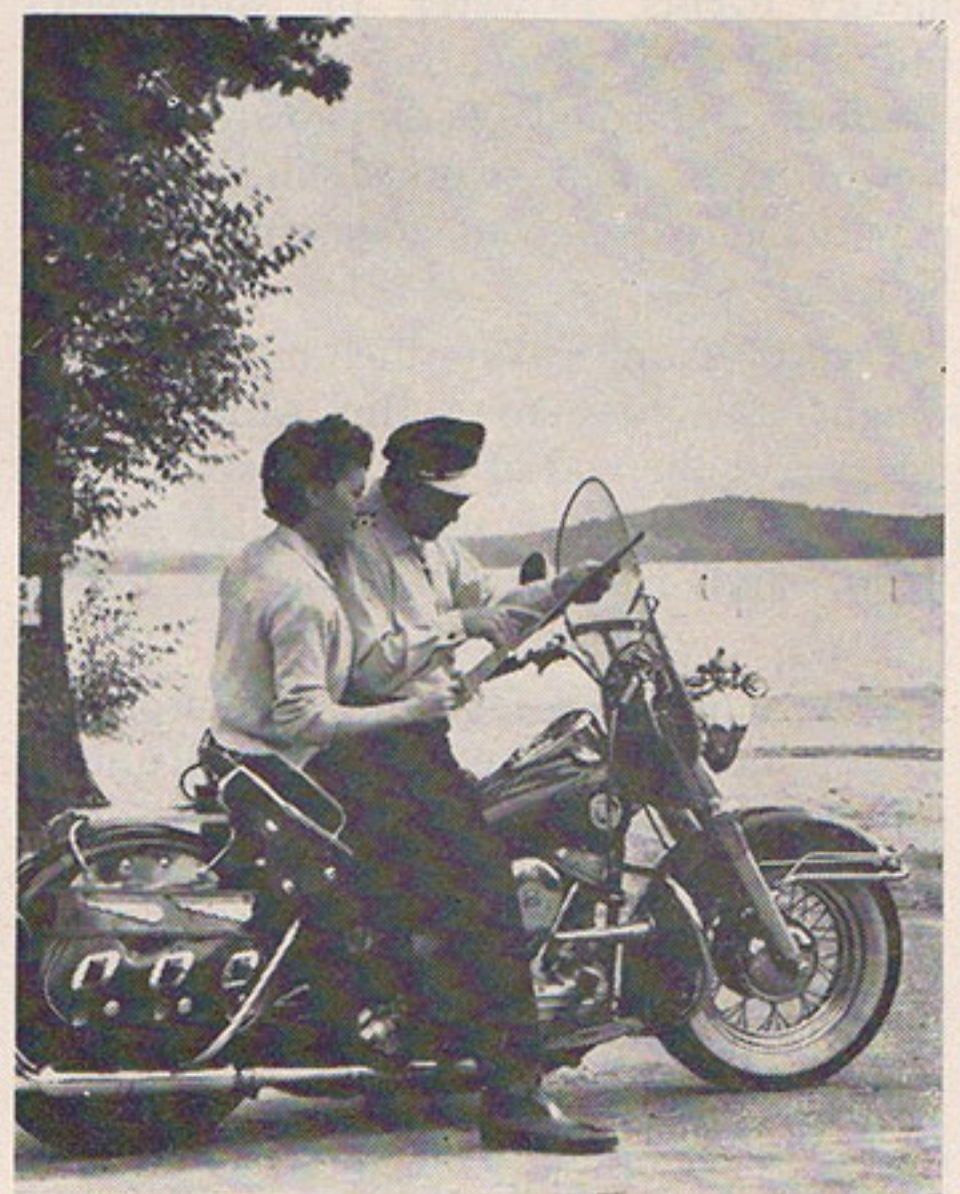

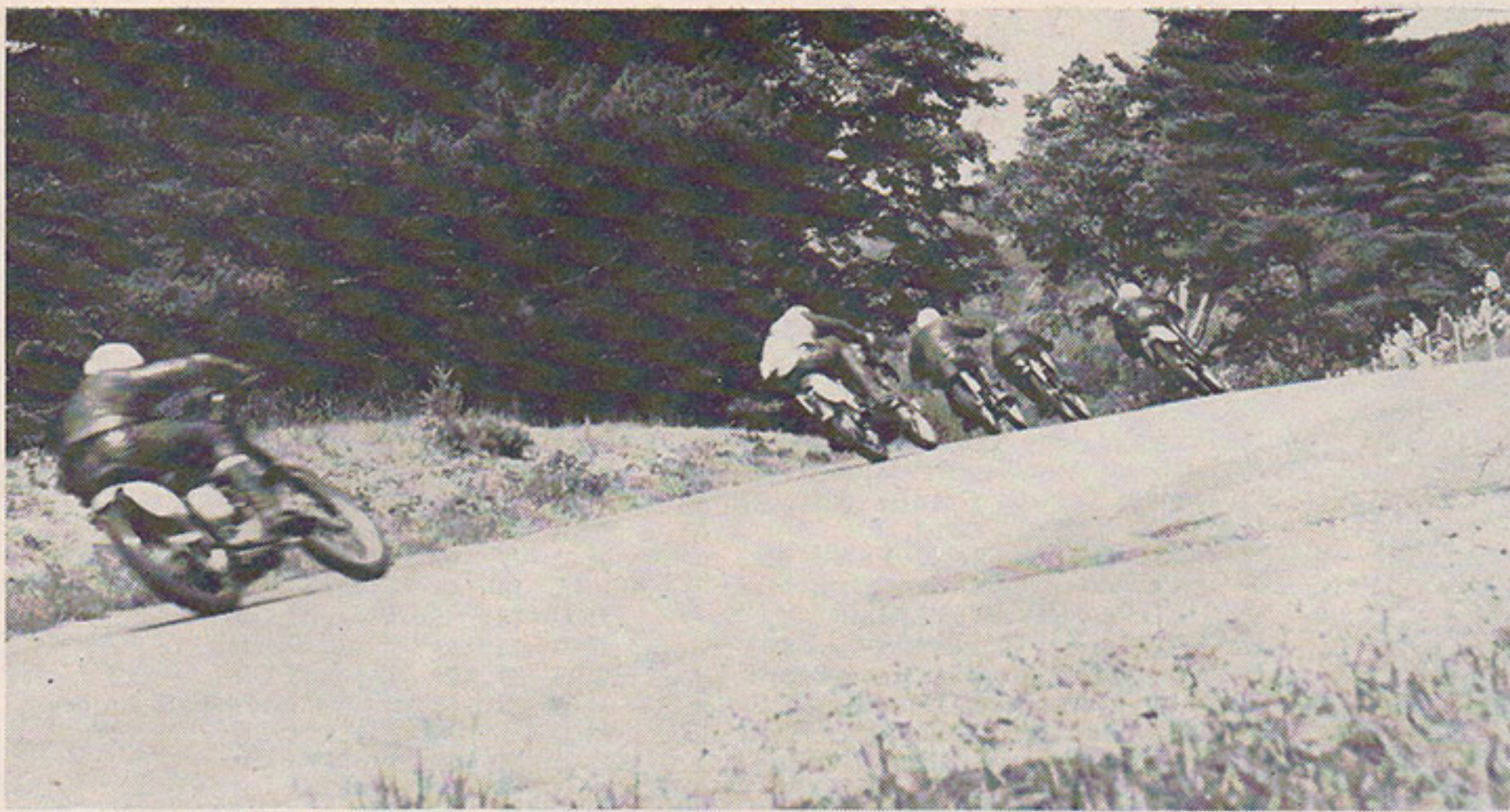

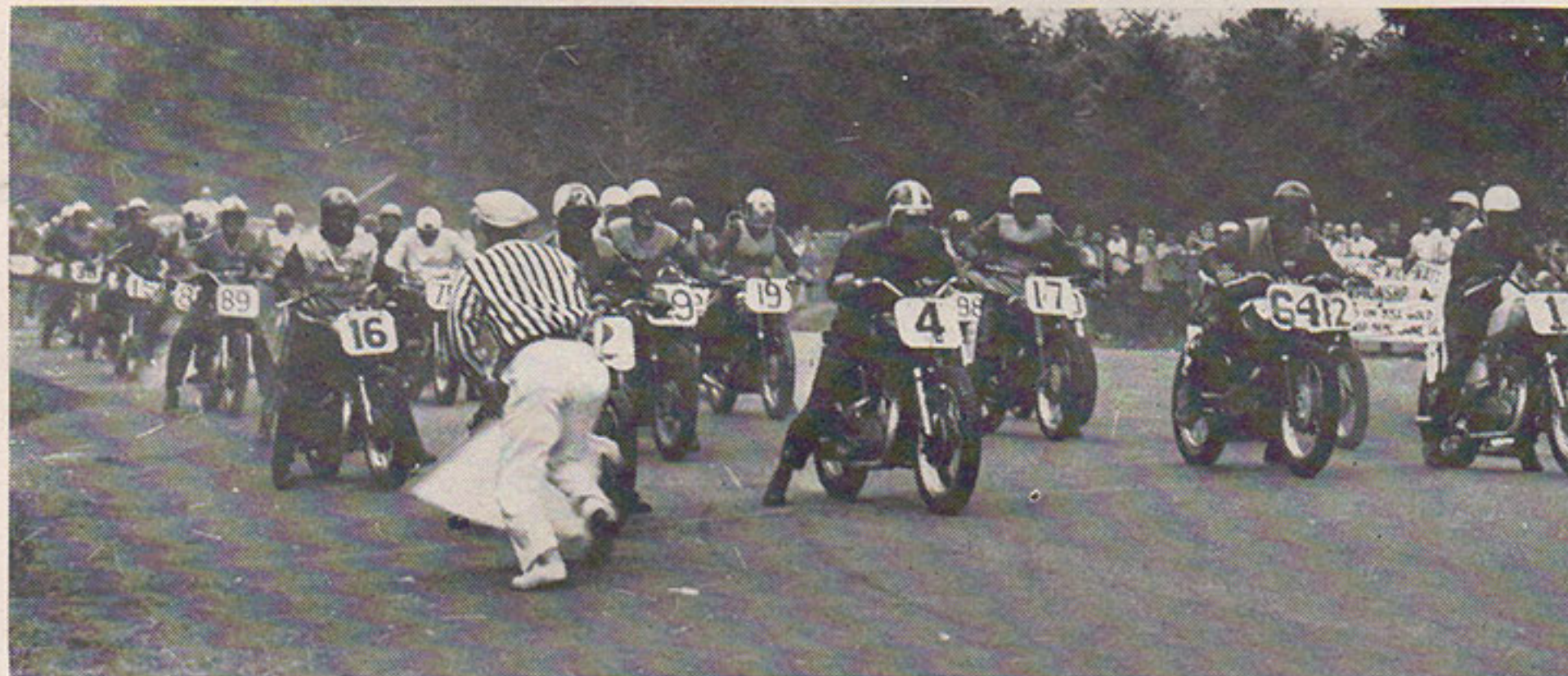

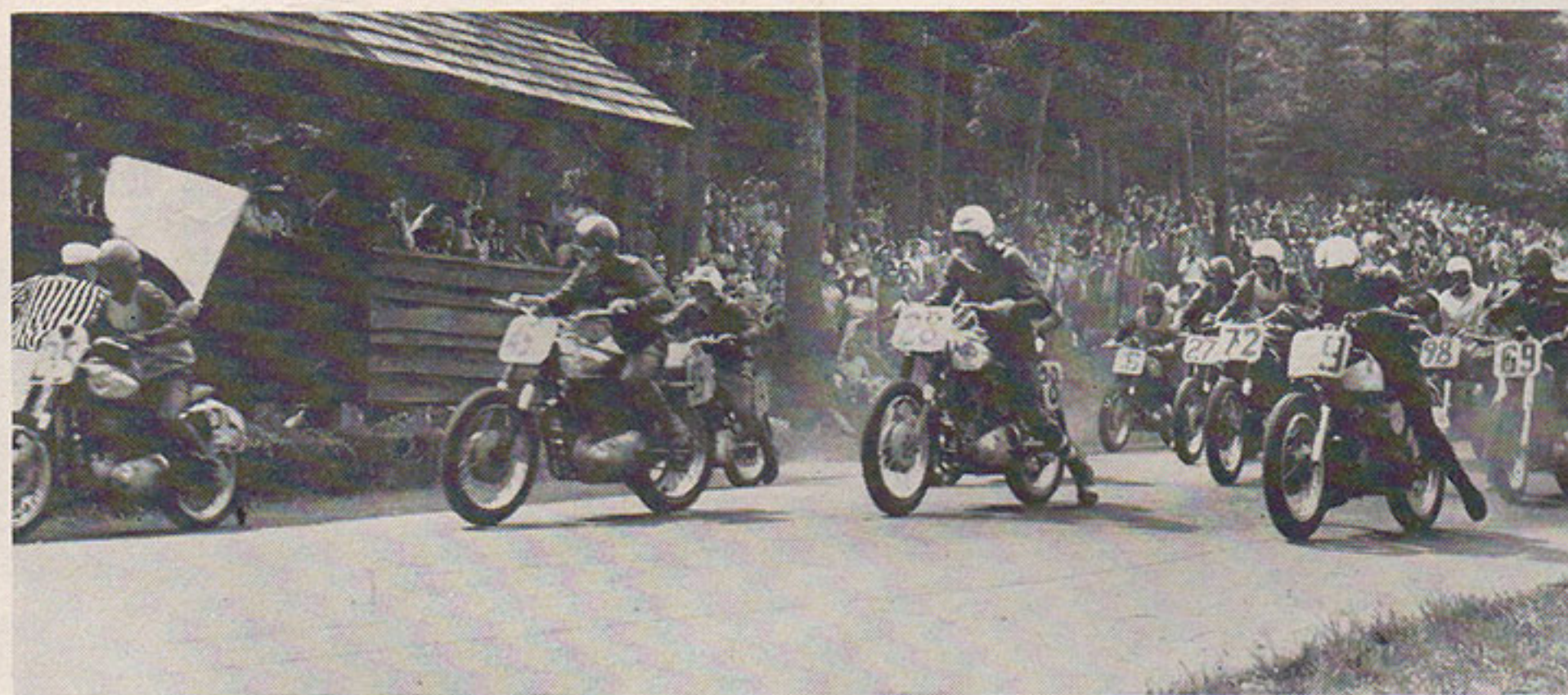

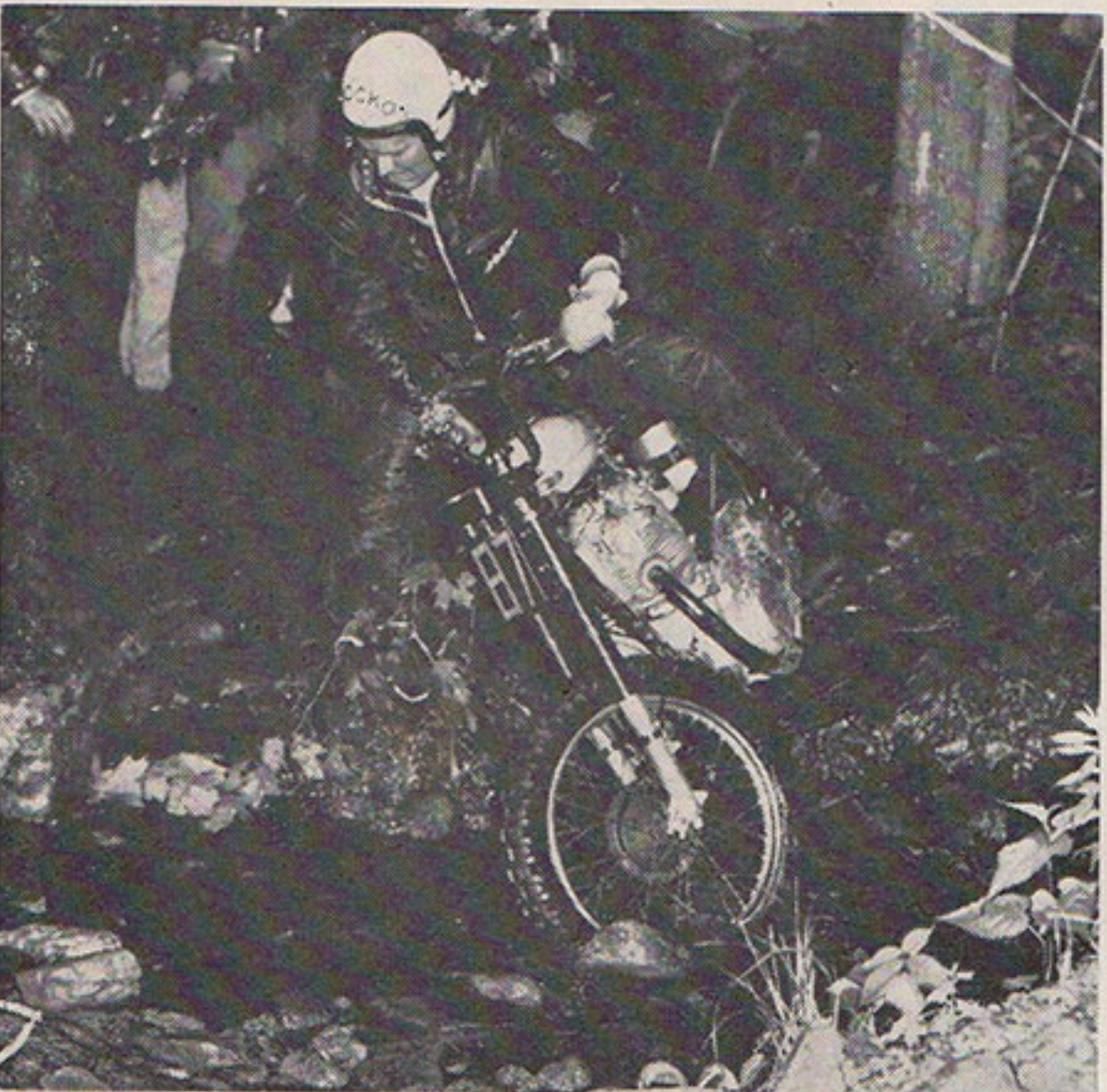

Middle Atlantic Dealers Hold First Race At Vineland

The first running on the new track at Vineland, N.J., proved to be a terrific success with an enthusiastic crowd of over 2000 spectators and 114 entrants. This new 1.7 mile road racing course features an asphalt surface with .6-mile straight-away and a number of curves and "S" turns. The course has a built-in telephone system and the large grandstand enables the spectators to view fully 80 per cent of the race.

The main event of the day was the Class #4 race in which the amateurs were given a 44 second start over the experts.

A thrilling battle ensued when a sticking throttle caused Parilla mounted expert, Anthony Woodman, to drop back to last place among the experts. Woodman then moved up fast into second place behind Ducati mounted Gerald Givens. For several laps, Woodman and Givens "diced it out," passing and re-passing each other many times. Then Woodman moved into first spot and started building up a good lead. Givens unloaded in a turn and damaged his mount, putting him out of the race. Woodman went on to win the race, followed in by Cliff Guild, on a Triumph, who gave his usual fine performance.

Frank Thieme of Hicksville, N.Y., also Parilla mounted, took first place in the Class #4 amateur main event. He was followed in by Triumph mounted Sal Cardinale and Steve Richardson on a Ducati. An interesting feature of this event was that Rod Coates, who officiated at the race, timed the 4-lap expert heat as 11 seconds faster than the amateur 4-lap heat. Therefore, as the main event consisted of 15 laps, Coates gave the amateurs a 44 second head start. It couldn't have been much closer. The first place expert, Woodman, finished behind the third place amateur, and the second place expert, Guild, finished behind the fourth place amateur.

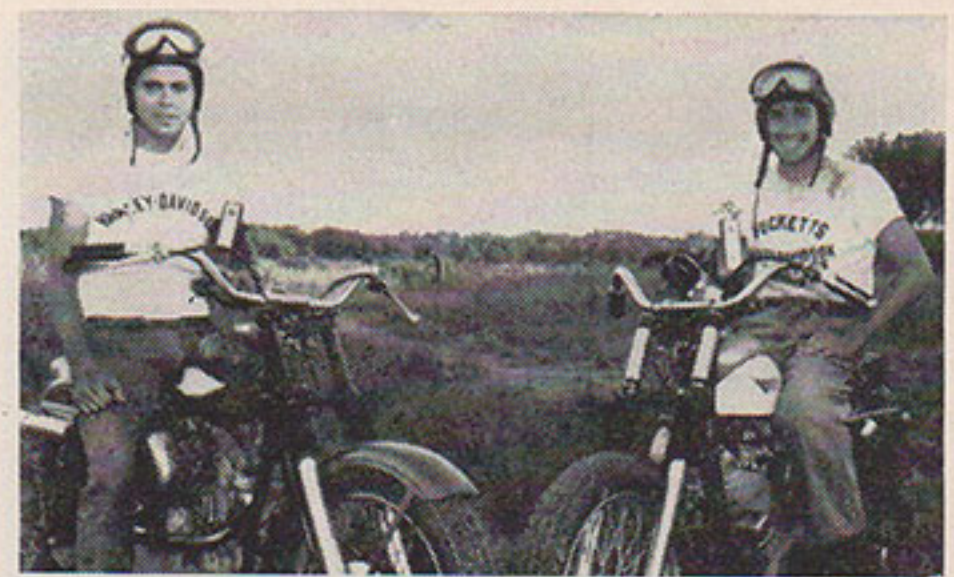

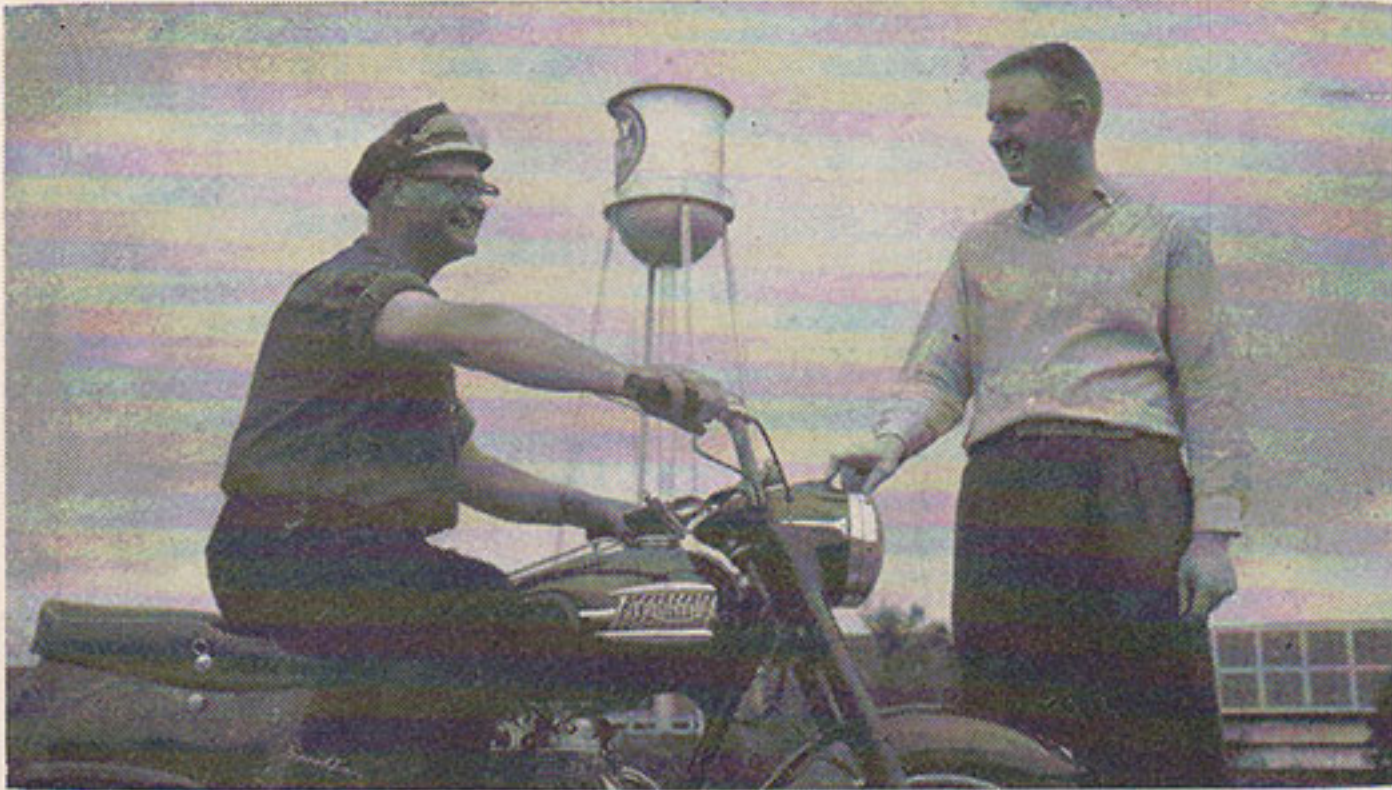

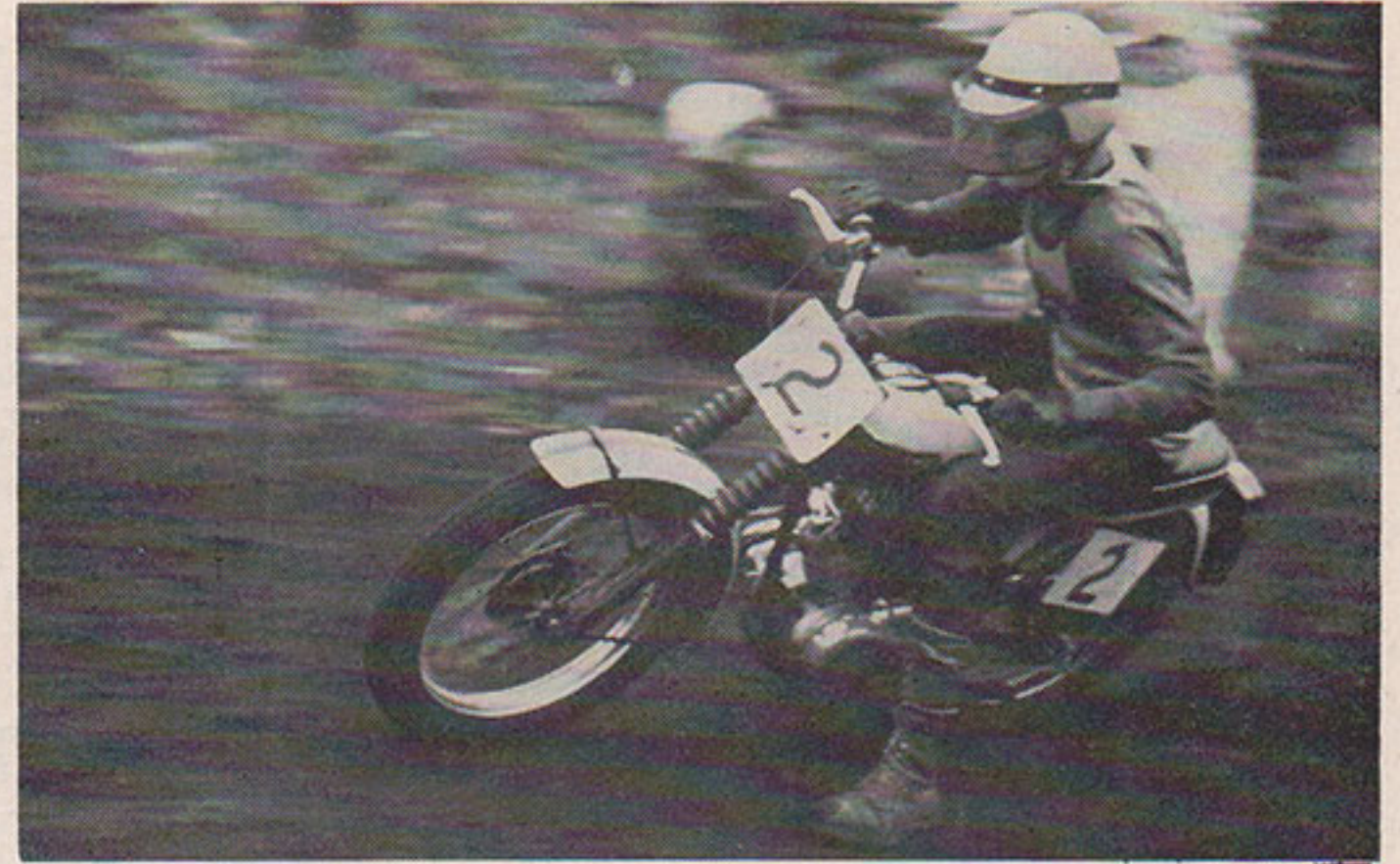

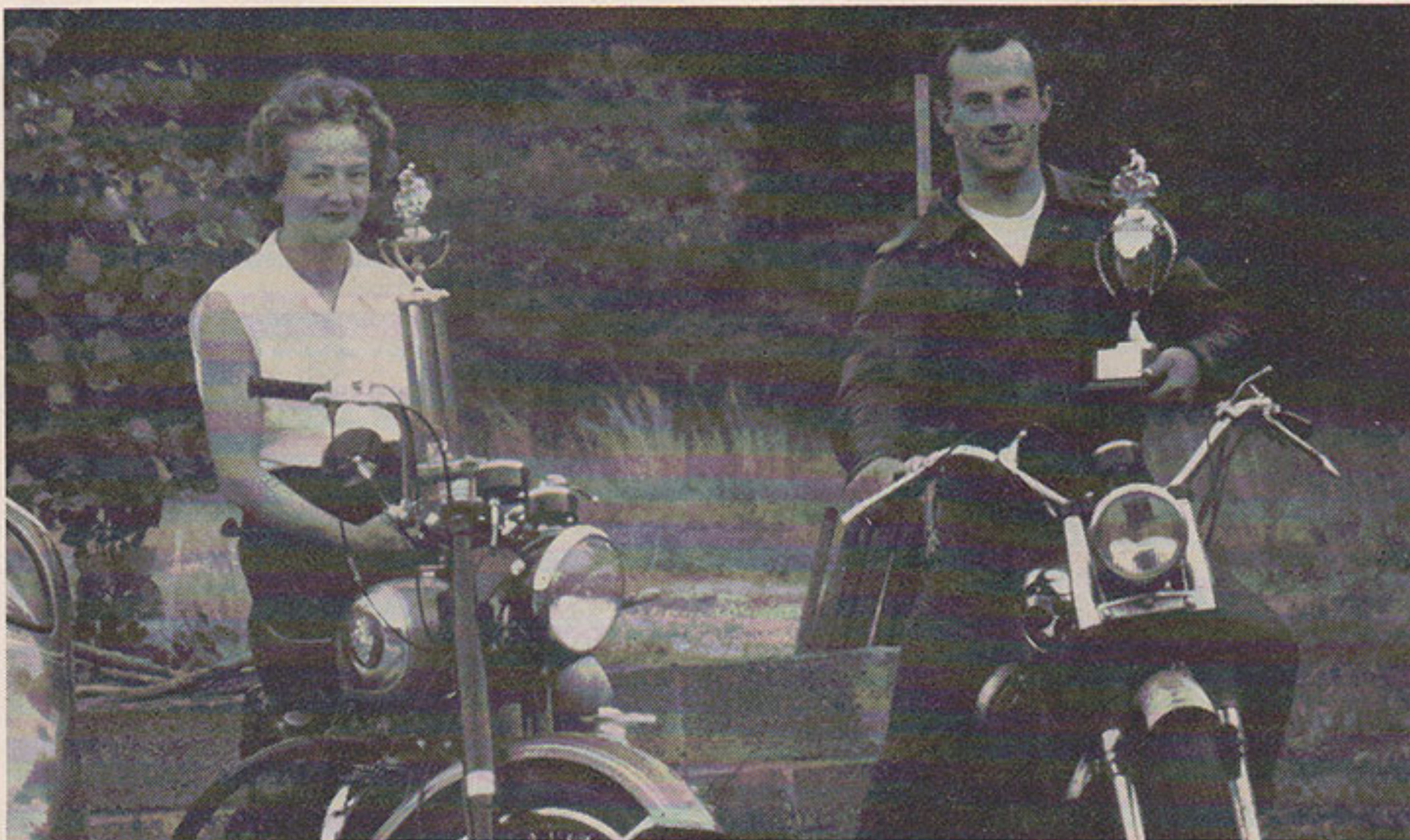

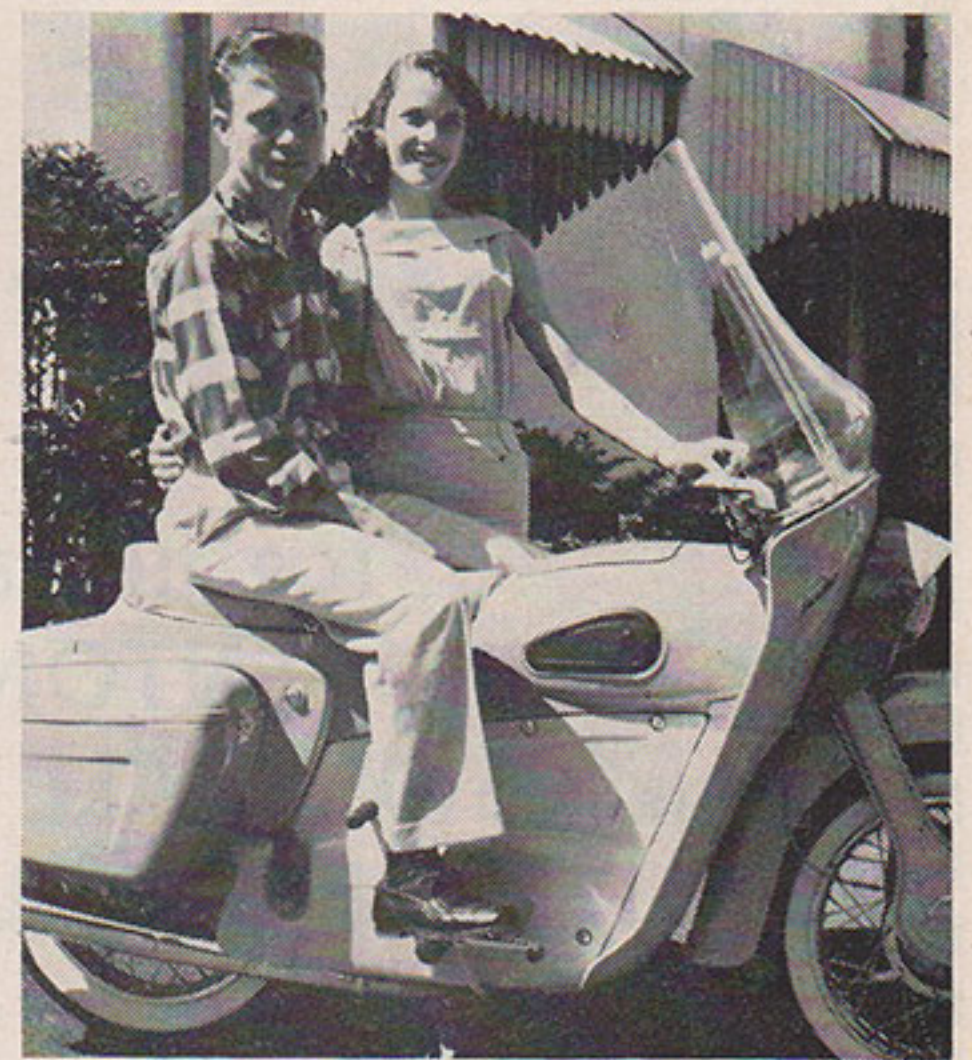
