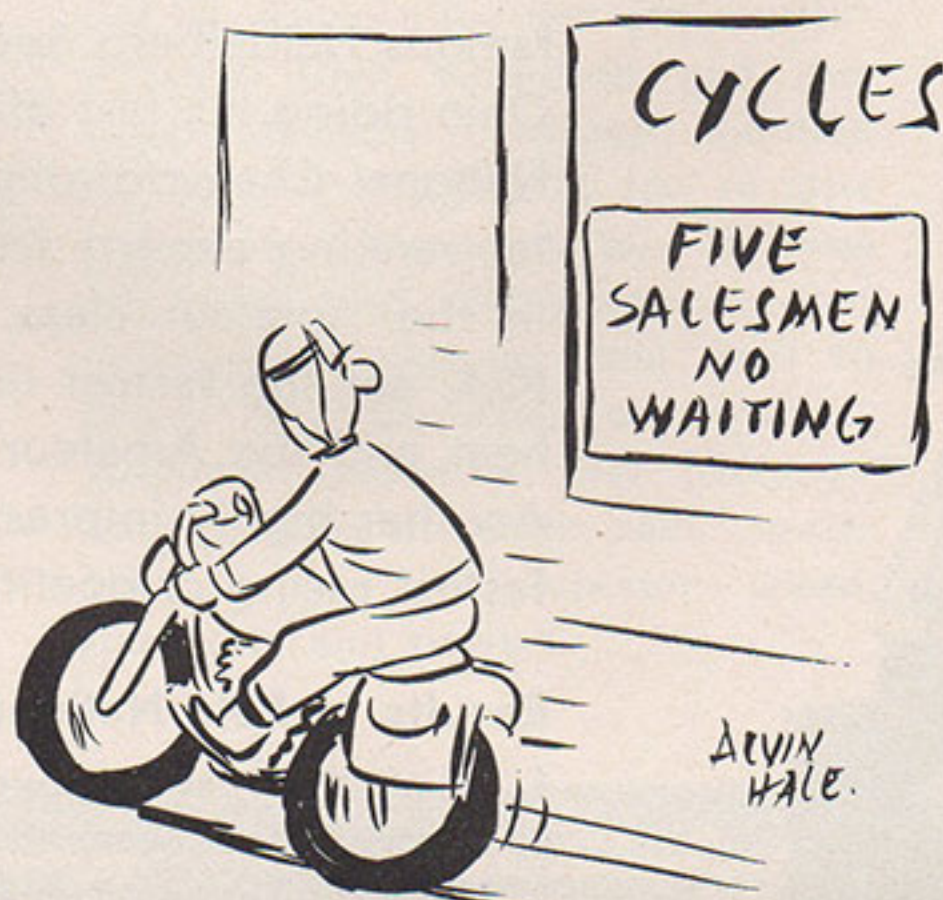
But that is by the way. What prompted this letter was a copy of AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING dated July 1958 which a non-motorcycling friend of mine

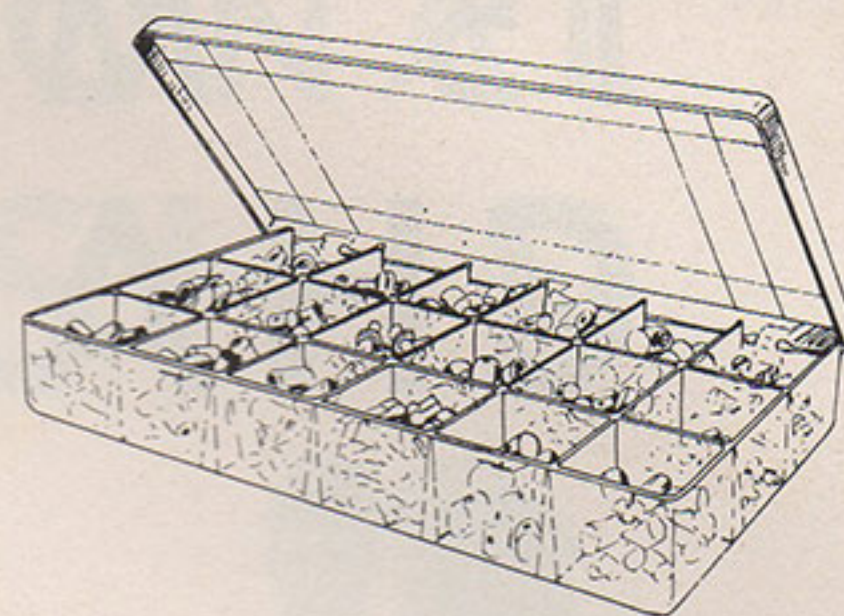
So, if you could help me in this I'd be very pleased.

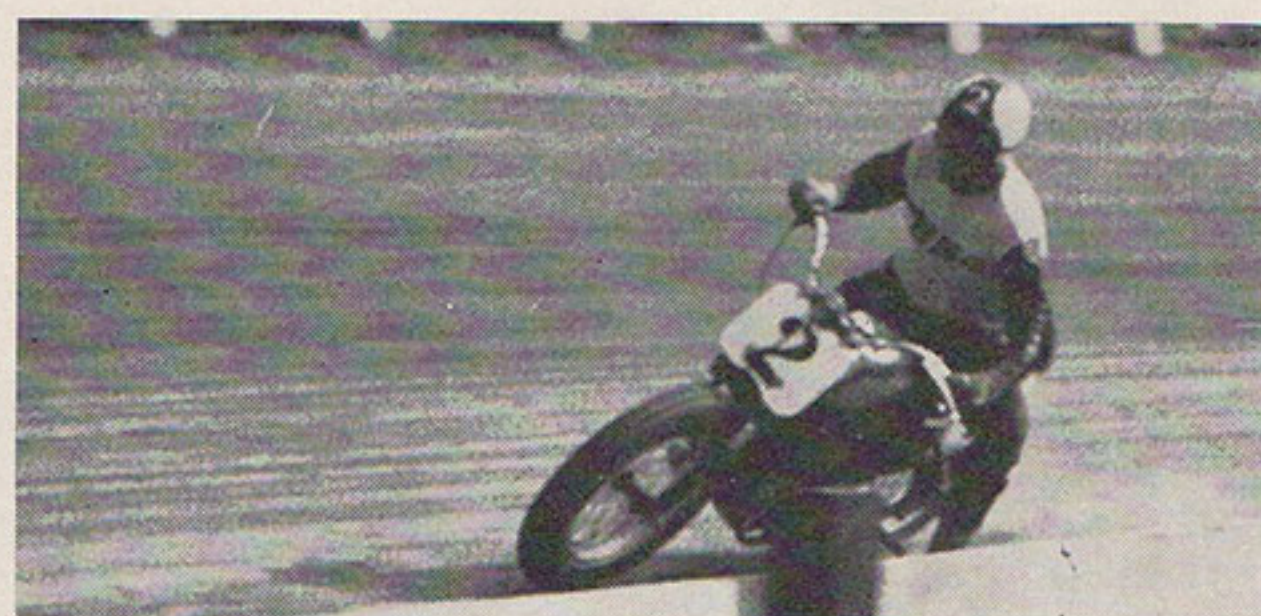

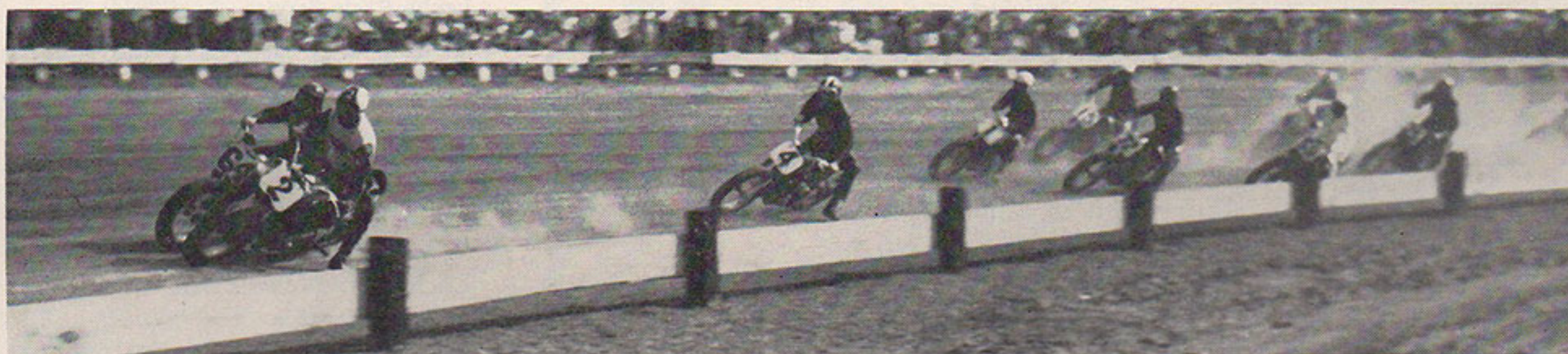

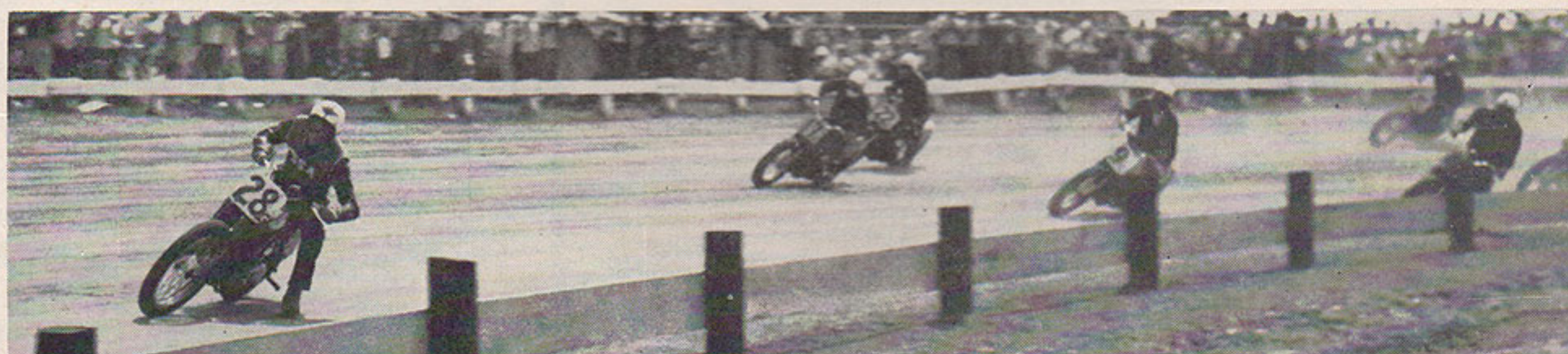

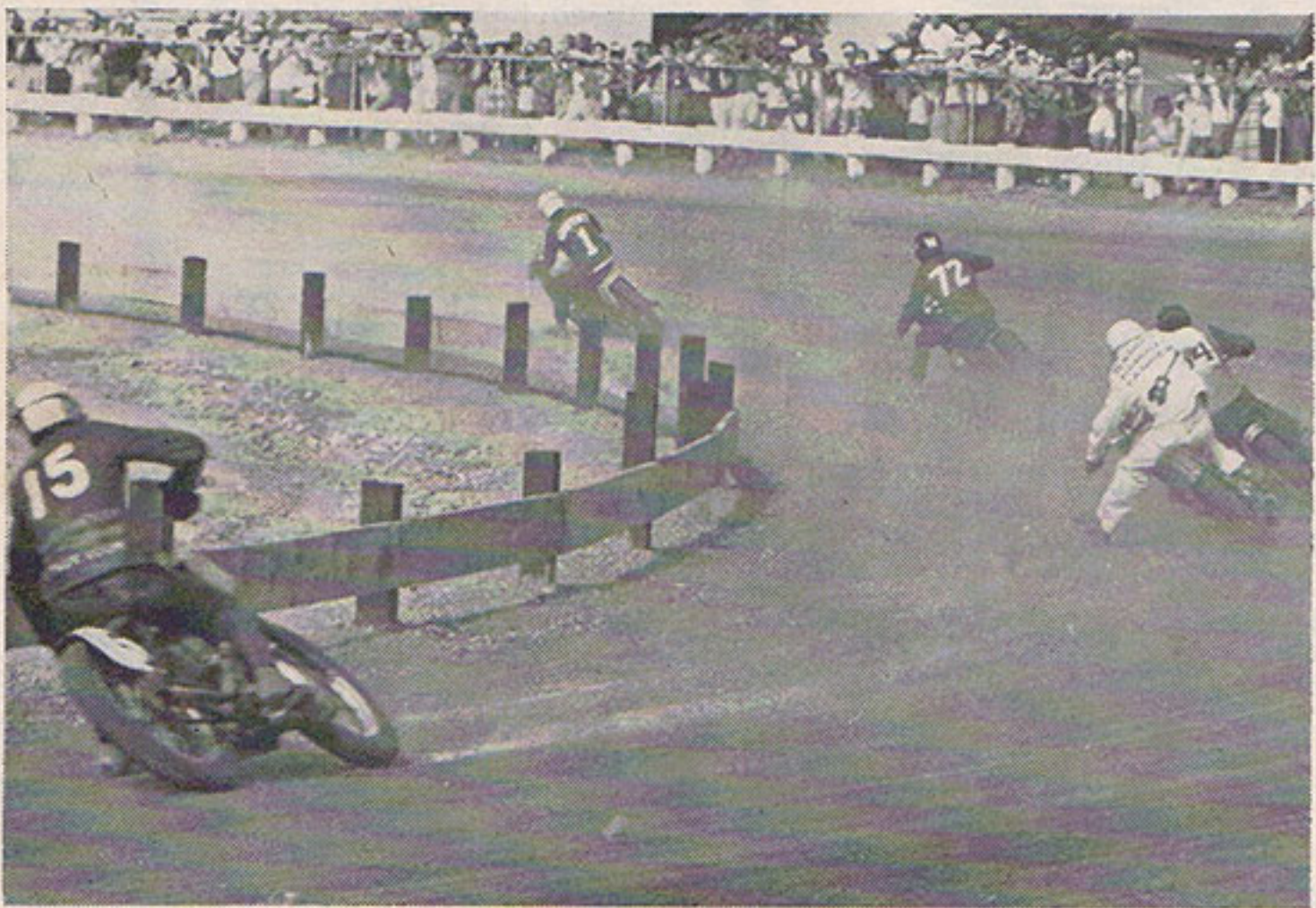

Klamfoth Wins Charity Newsies

CHARITY NEWSIES had the most perfect day of their 16 years in the promoting motorcycle races at the Ohio State Fairgrounds Sunday, June 28. The track was in good condition, and the result was just right for Ohioans as Dick Klamfoth of Groveport was the winner for the second straight year.

Klamfoth, looking like the class of America's motorcycle racing sport that he is, took the lead in the 10-mile event in the first turn, and although Dick Mann of El Sobrante, Calif., tried to head him out, Klamfoth came out in the lead on the second turn and took a 10-cycle length lead in the third turn and held it for the entire 20 laps, with Carroll Resweber of Cedarburg, Wis., following in second place.

Klamfoth rode his usual beautiful race and again gave the fans a terrific exhibition of how to race a motorcycle.

While Klamfoth and Resweber were leading the field, Bart Markel, Dick Mann, Bates Molyneaux and Sammy Tanner were putting on an exciting race of their own for third place. The four of them exchanged positions several times, but little Sammy Tanner finally got around and stayed in third spot. Molyneaux was fourth; Markel, fifth; Everett Brashear, sixth; and in the shuffle Mann's machine went bad and he was forced out of the race.

Klamfoth showed that he was ready in the second expert heat. He took off into the lead in the first turn and was never headed as he beat out Brad Andres of San Diego and Bobby Hill of Grove City, Ohio.

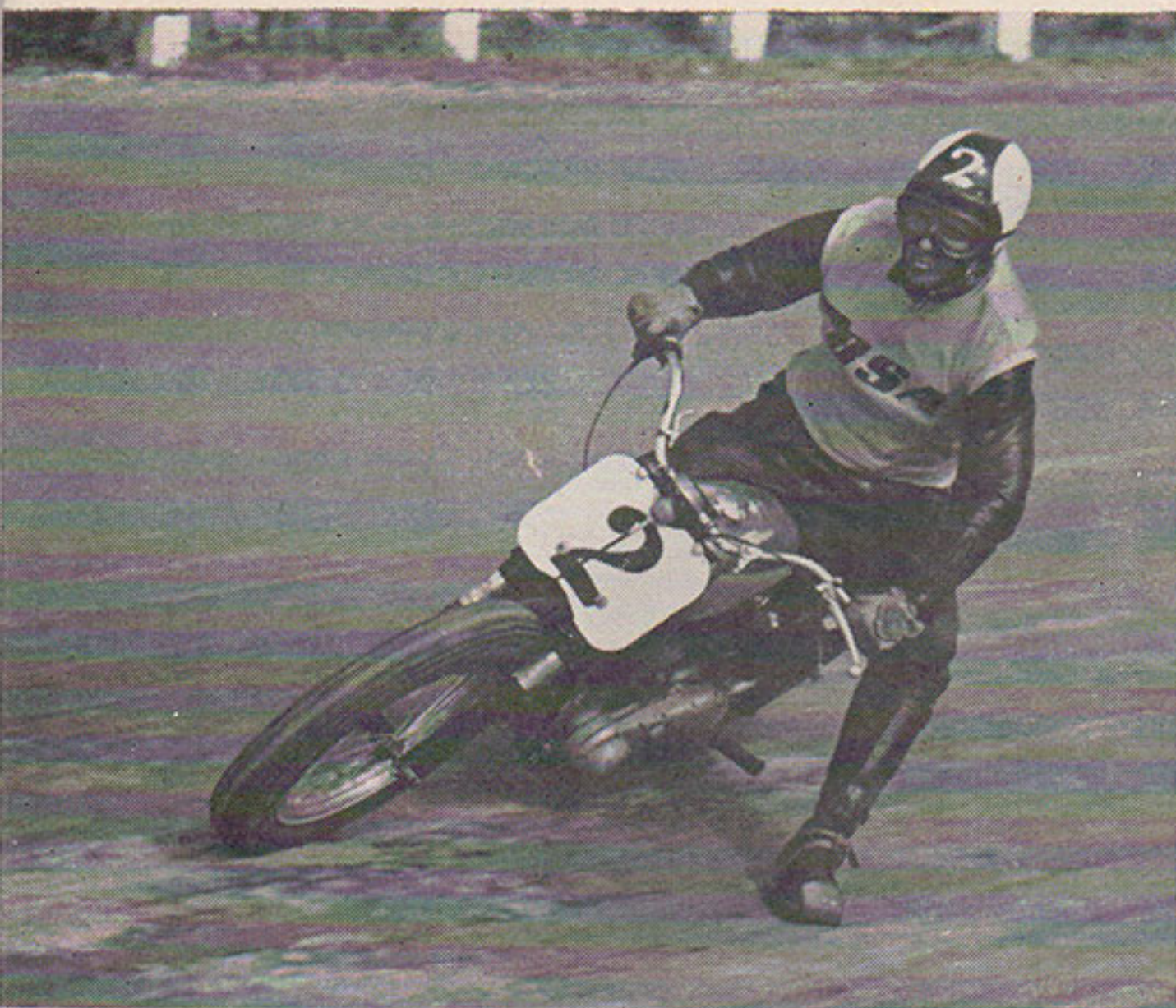
In the first heat, Elmer Morra of Pittsburgh, riding the finest race of his career, took the event ahead of Carroll Resweber and Bart Markel. Markel led it for five laps and then Morra got around and Resweber followed him into second spot.

Dick Mann won the third heat in the day's best event. He led for the entire five miles, but Bates Molyneaux was right on his heels all the way and they went over the finish line side by side.

Carroll Resweber had the day's best time trial at 27.52 seconds, one of the finest ever turned in at the fairgrounds. In the 10-mile national Klamfoth was clocked at 27.45 on the 17th lap. The 10-mile event was run in nine minutes, 14.48 seconds.

In the amateur events, Jimmy Koplinski of Milwaukee was the top rider of the day. He won the first heat and then took the eight-mile feature. In each race he got out front in the first turn and was never headed, thus winning by wide margins.

Bud Koehler of New Dundee, Ontario, Canada, won the second amateur heat and David Denny of Indianapolis took the third heat.

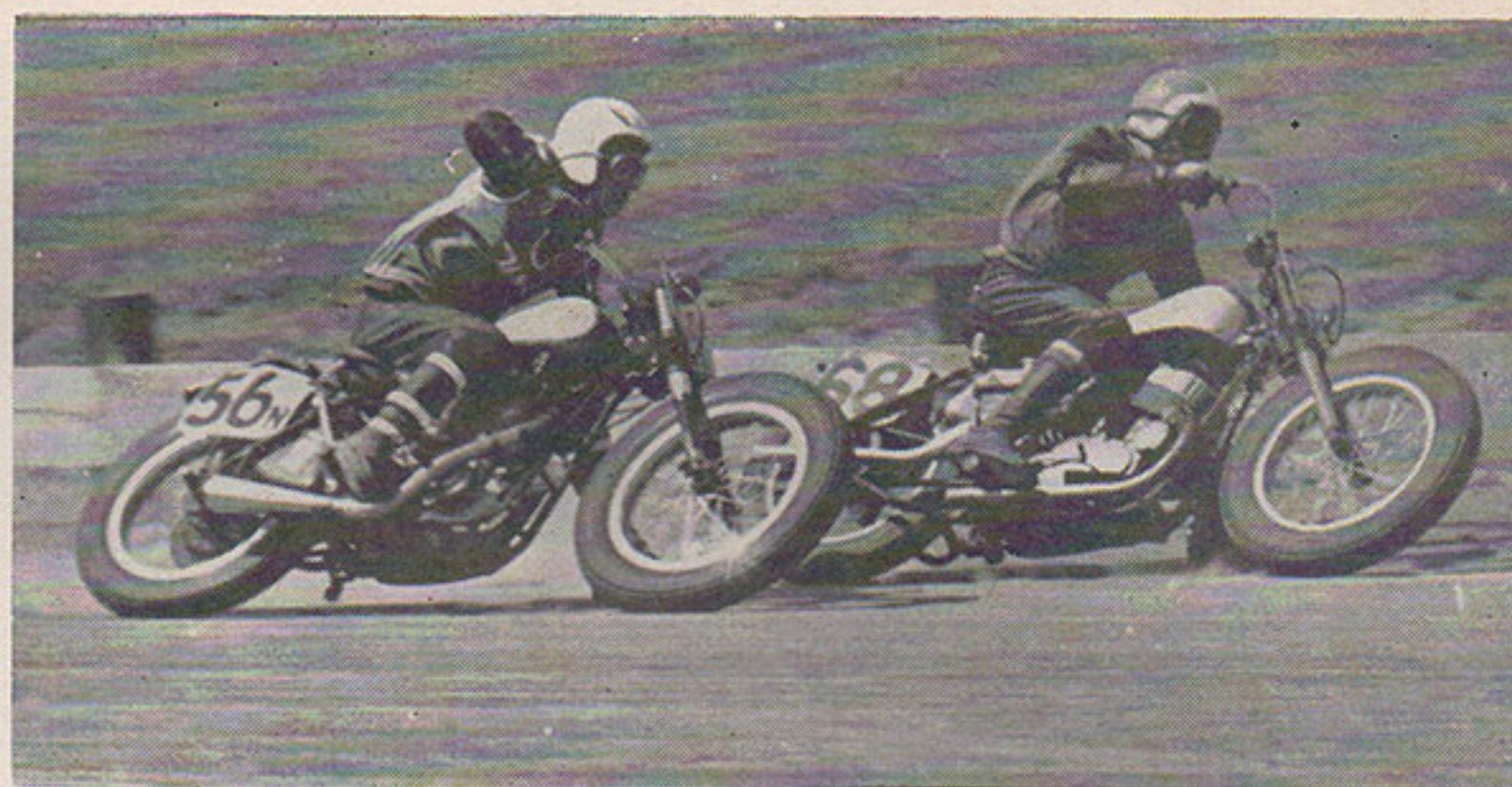

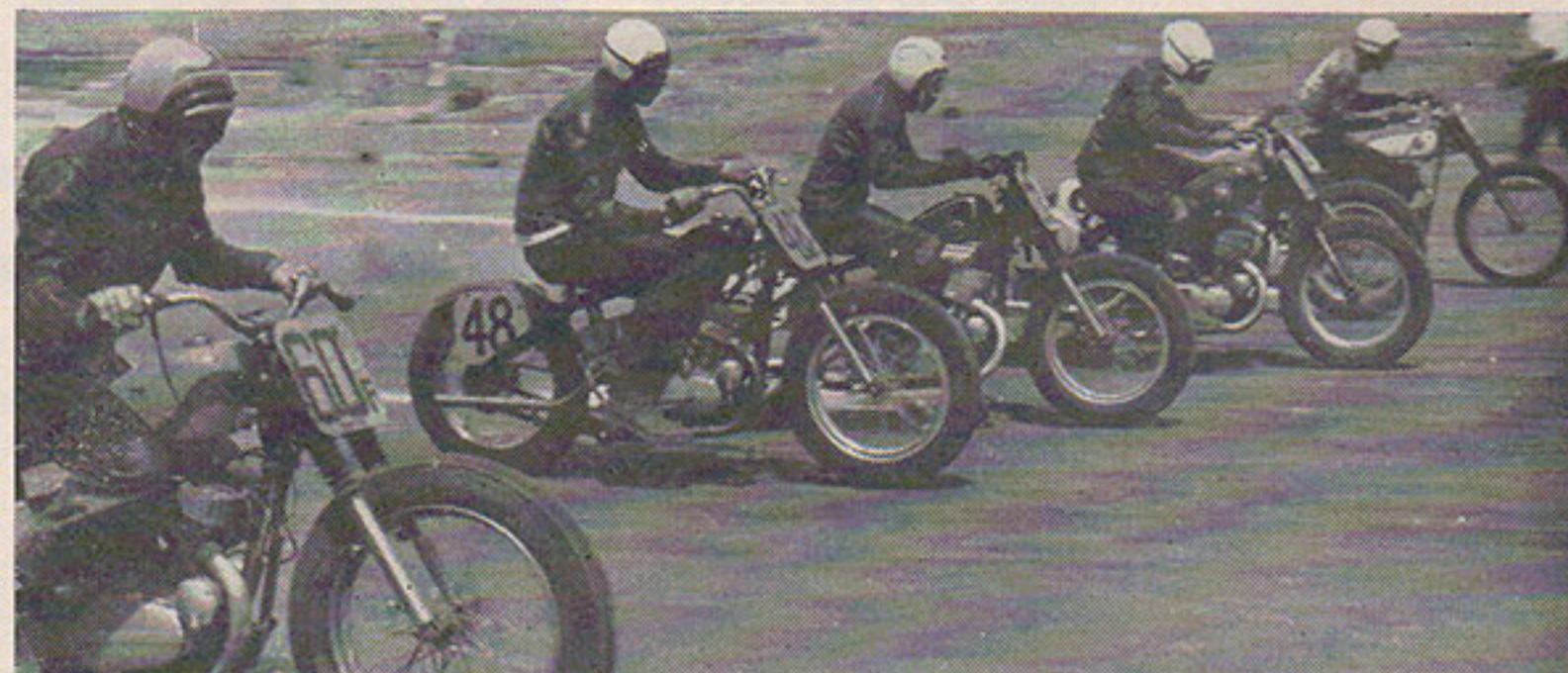

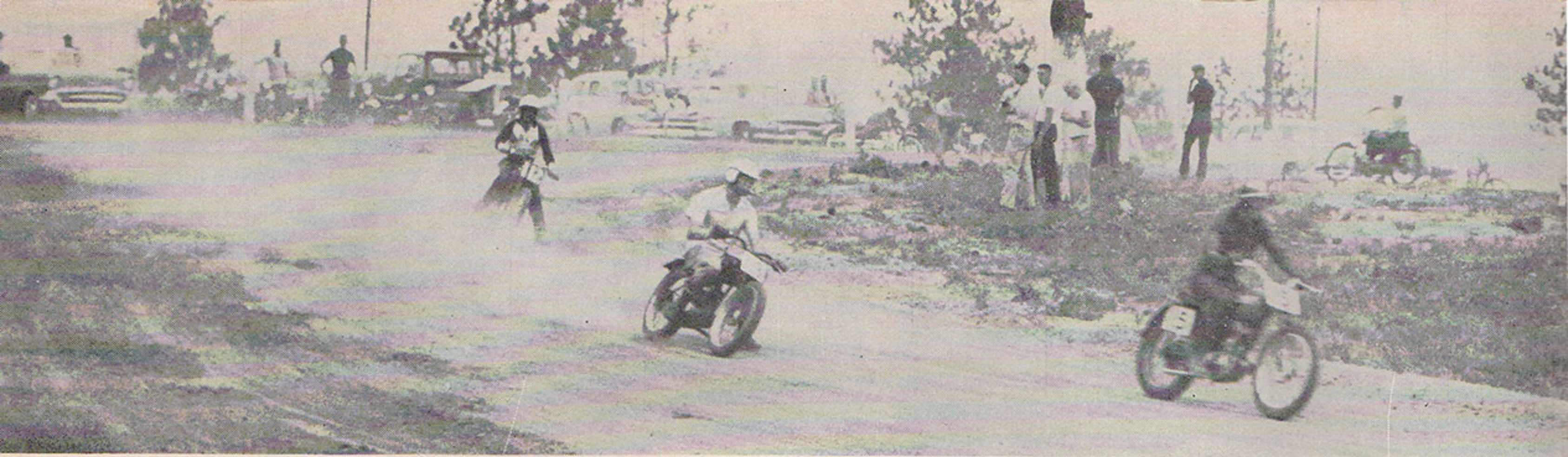

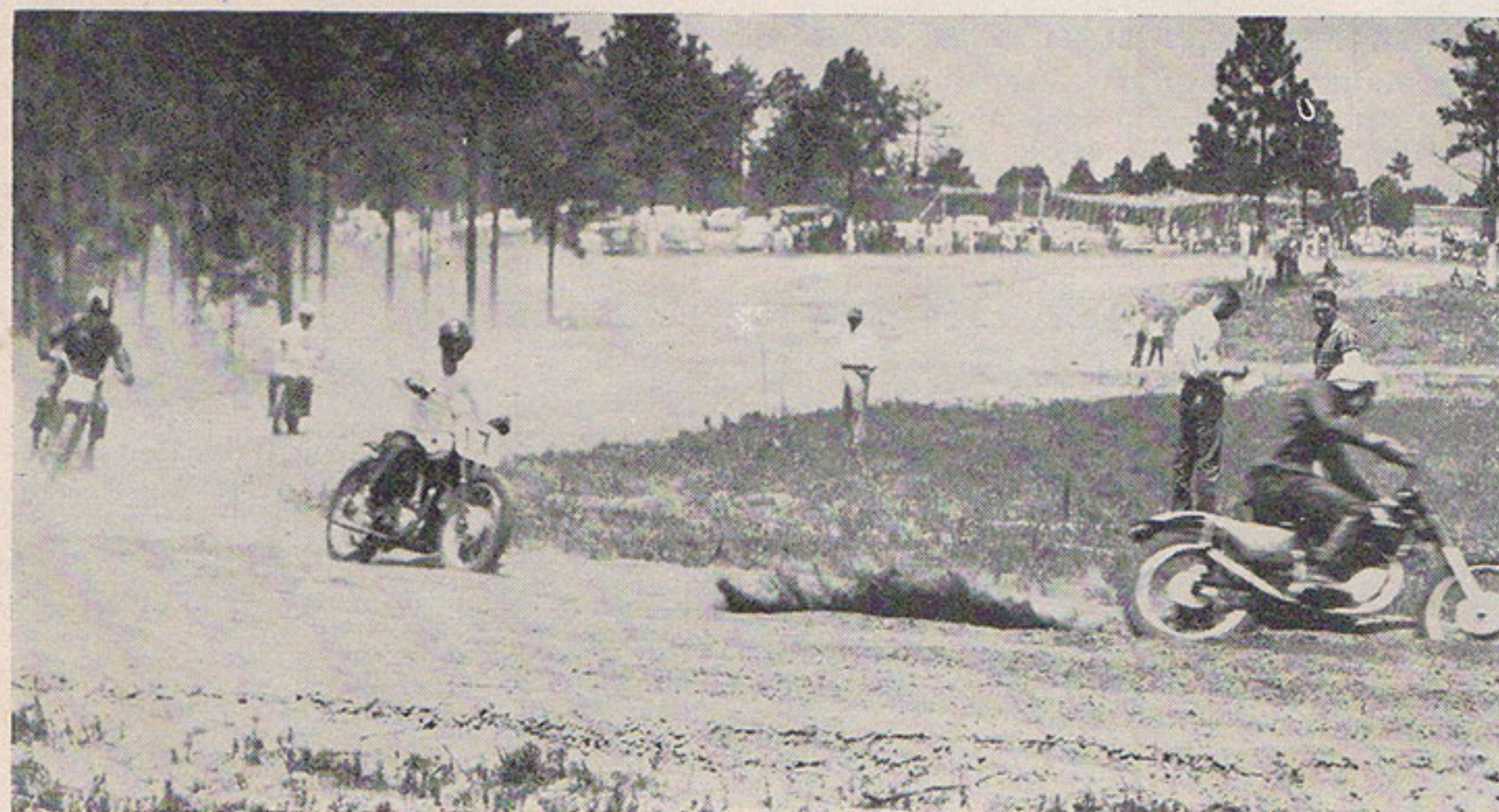
N. C. Johnny Johnson of Goldsboro, N. C. with a TR6/A placed second and Roger Wm. Arnesen's Bonneville model placed third.

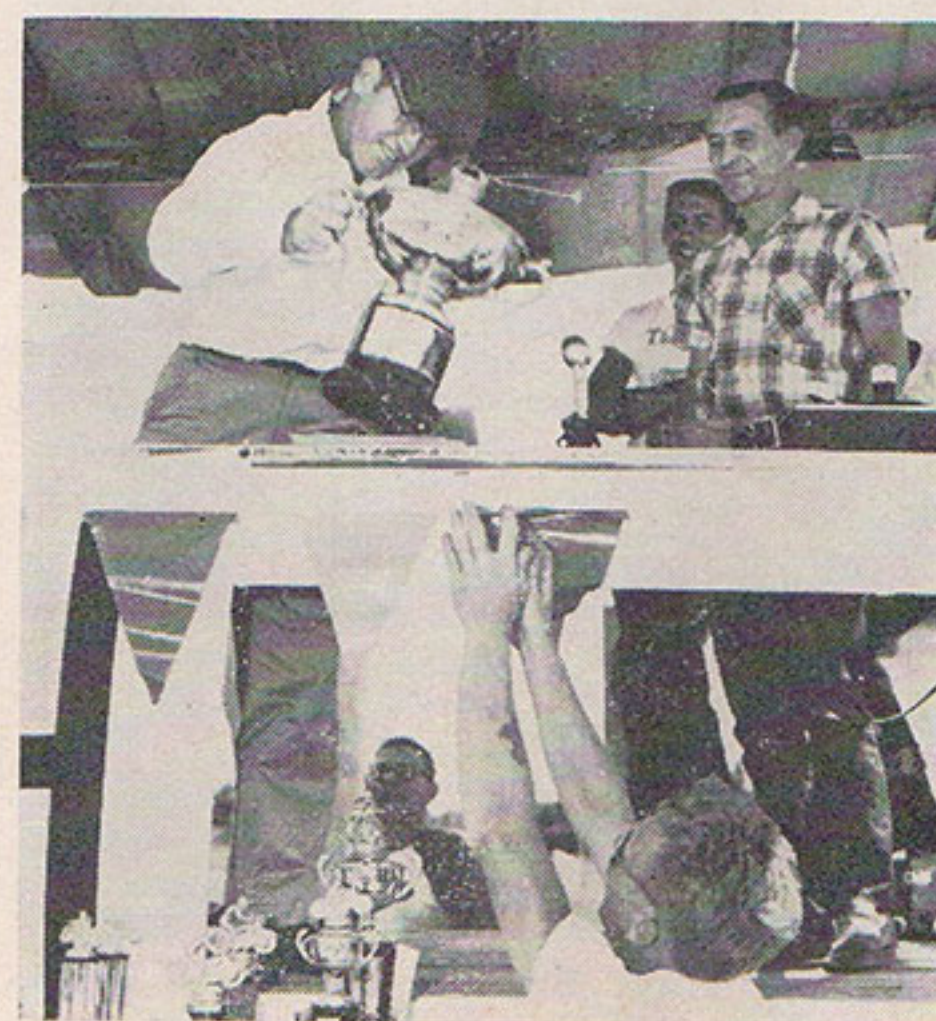
Following these ceremonies, 122 riders rode elimination heats in five lightweight and four heavyweight classes to qualify for the scrambles championships.

Qualifying lightweights in "the lineup" were champing at the bit, or handlebars as the case appeared, waiting for final instructions. Shortly, from an off-the-course position, the starter's flag turned loose the power of the mighty lightweights and they moved out fast, fighting for positions which would put them in line for first to reach the course itself. Ray Saintsing, Triumph, was first up the straightaway and the pack he outmaneuvered was close on his rear wheel. Benny Bootle, another Triumph, was putting up the biggest battle and was being pushed by Kenneth Hayes, still Triumph.

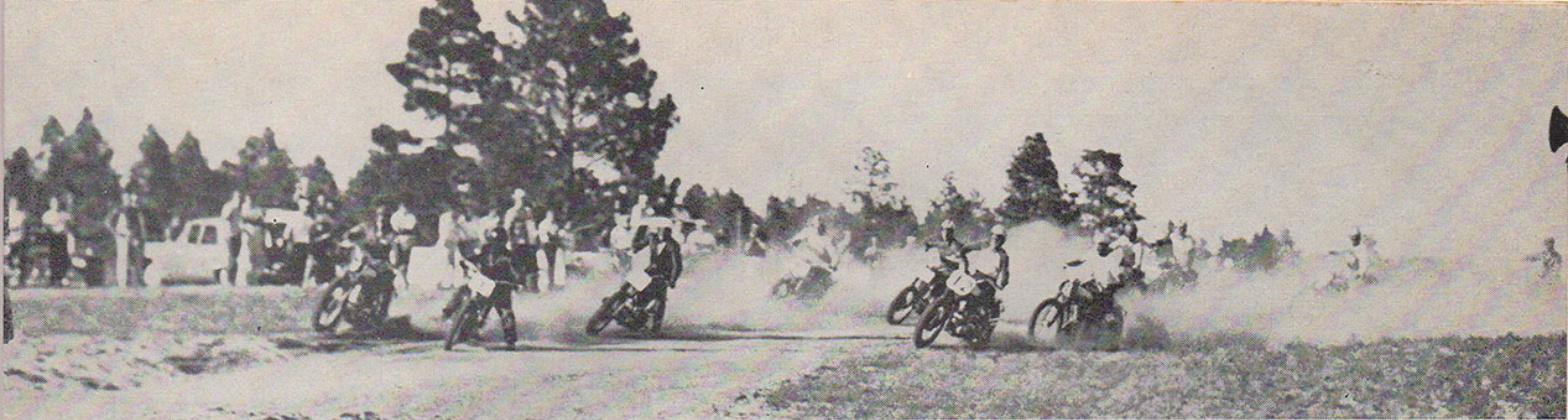
Starting off in high spots were Arnold Tomblin, Montgomery,



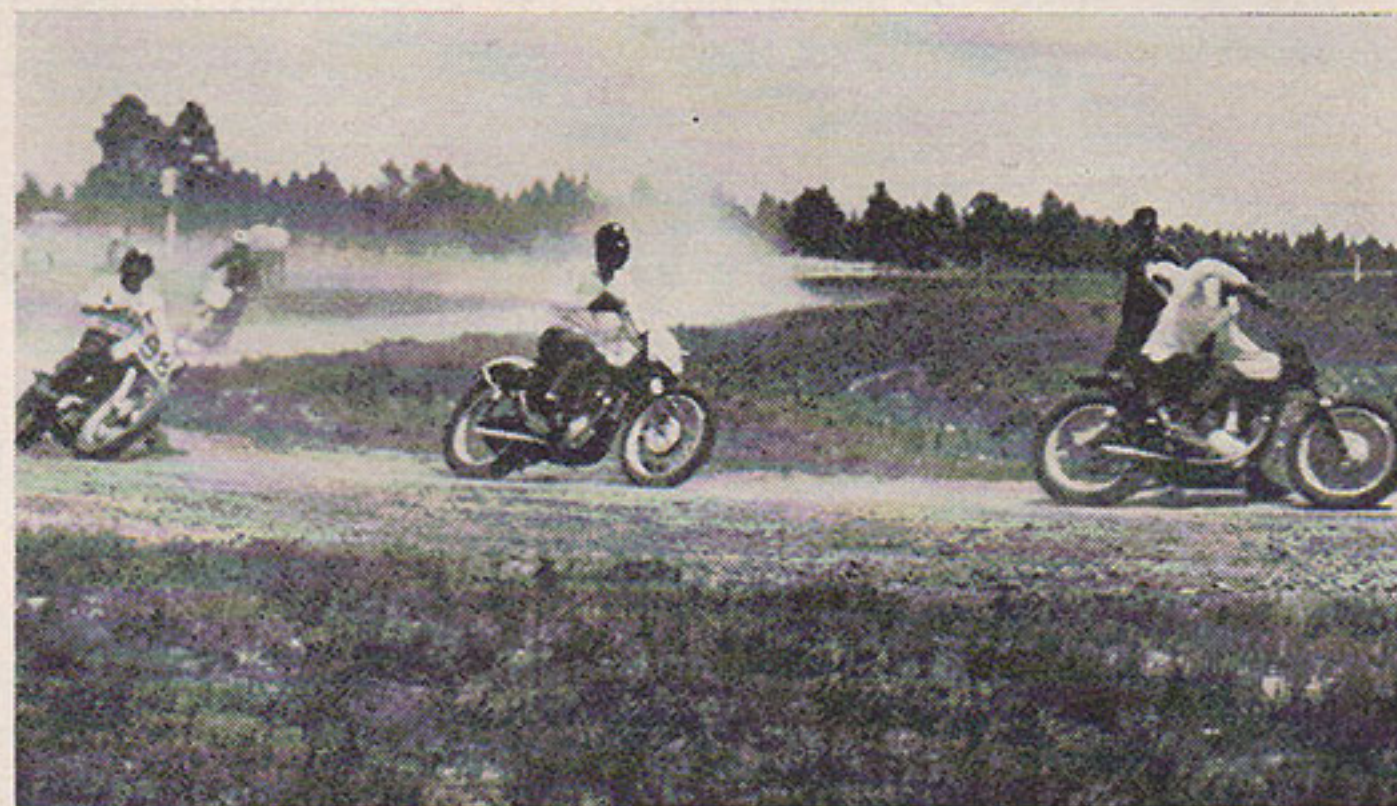
This heavyweight machine kicks up an "ocean wave" of dust as the rider pours it on for the coming straightaway.



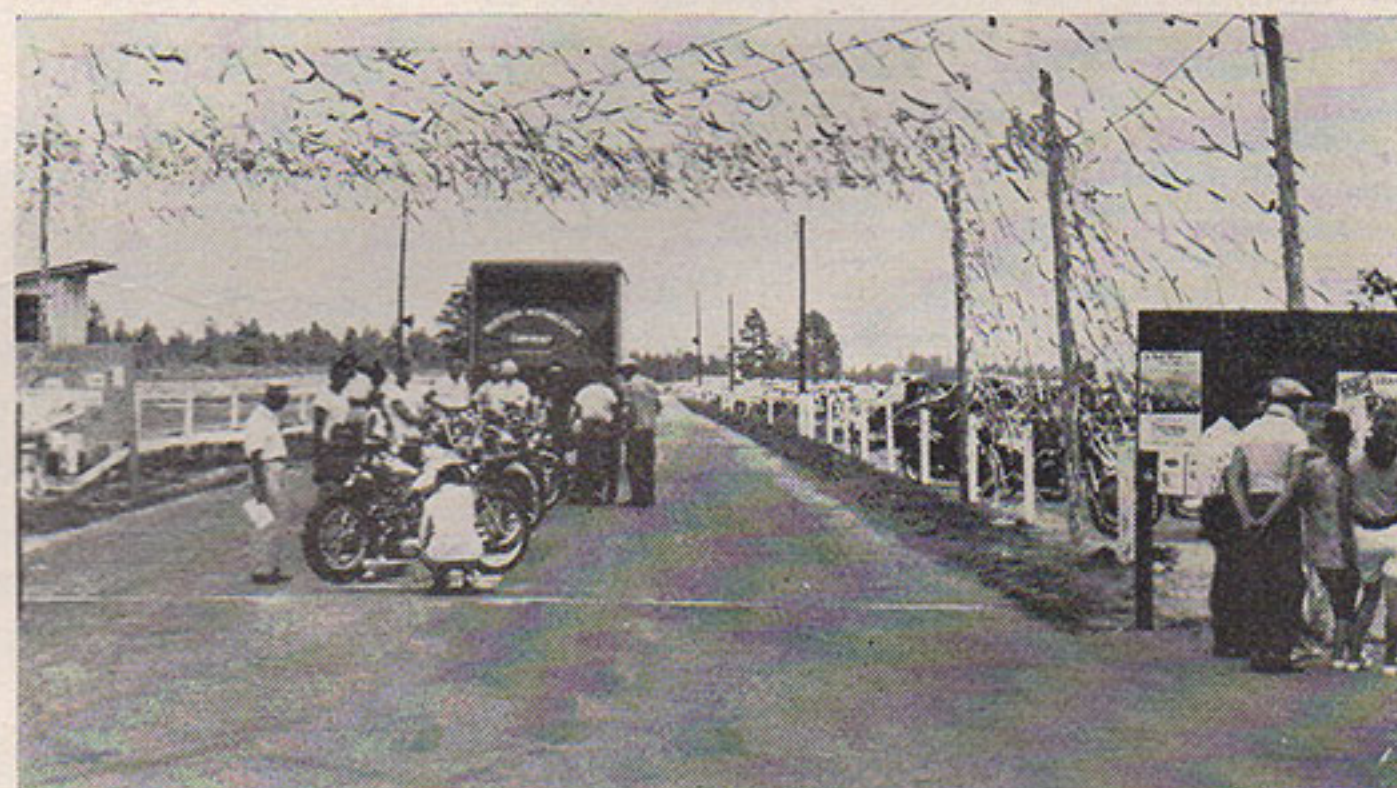
Red Nabors receives special trophy.

Ala., Harry Saintsing, Thomasville, N. C., Norman Farris of Baltimore, and Ted Hubbard, Weymouth, Mass.

Hayes gave Bootle about a lap to enjoy second place and then gave him a taste of his own medicine, or dust, as he left him behind. Hayes showed early that he had full intentions of holding the title he'd claimed as lightweight winner in the East Coast Championship in 1958. As soon as Bootle was safely behind, Hayes started working on Saintsing. Whether Saintsing knew it or not, his head start on the championship was not to remain with him for long. He only had its pleasure for two laps, as in the third lap the Hayes youngster put his Tennessee Cub in the lead. And for 22 more laps, he kept it there.

Hayes, Saintsing and Bootle held the first three places throughout the race, so the real battle raged between Arnold Tomblin of Montgomery, Ala., Triumph and Daniel Howard, Allstate, for fourth and fifth places. In the seventh lap Tomblin lost time and Howard moved into fourth position for the rest of the race.

There was constant excitement, also confusion, as the riders grouped up in many cases and came over the home stretch "jump" three and four abreast, keeping the checkers on their toes. Passing was going on simultaneously around the track and even in the "S" curve and places where sometimes the riders are forced to hold position because of the tricky course. First ten to get the checkered flag, in order, were:

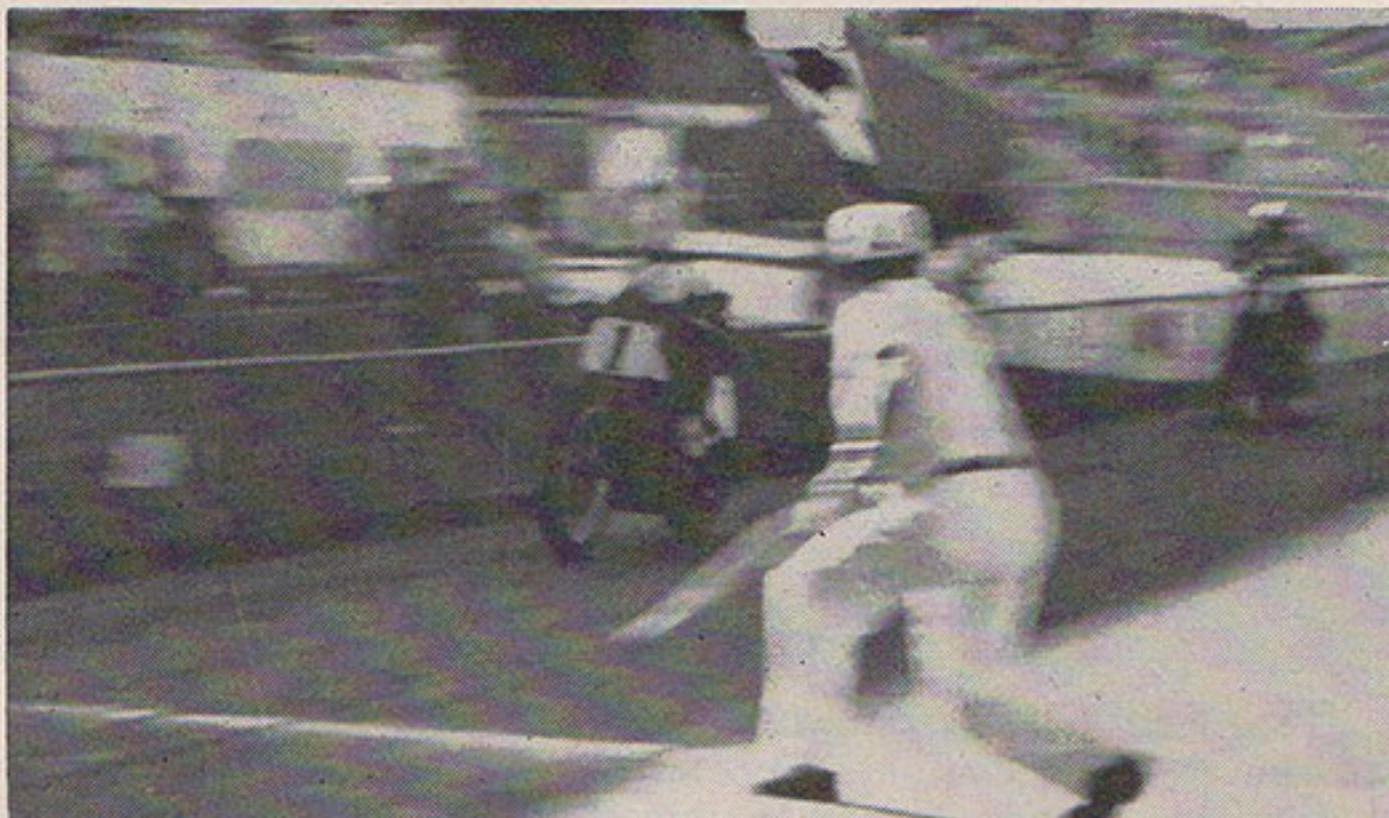

RESWEBER WINS 25 MILE NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP TITLE

HURRICAN HORSEPOWER took over the table-top-smooth dirt mile of the California State Fairgrounds in the Capital City of Sacramento on this 19th day of July as a crowd of 8,000 spectators watched Carroll Resweber of Cedarburg, Wis. win the 25 mile championship for 1959. Resweber was followed across the 25 mile finish line by Ohio's Dick Klamfoth, in third place was young expert Gary Emmick of Menlo Park, Calif.

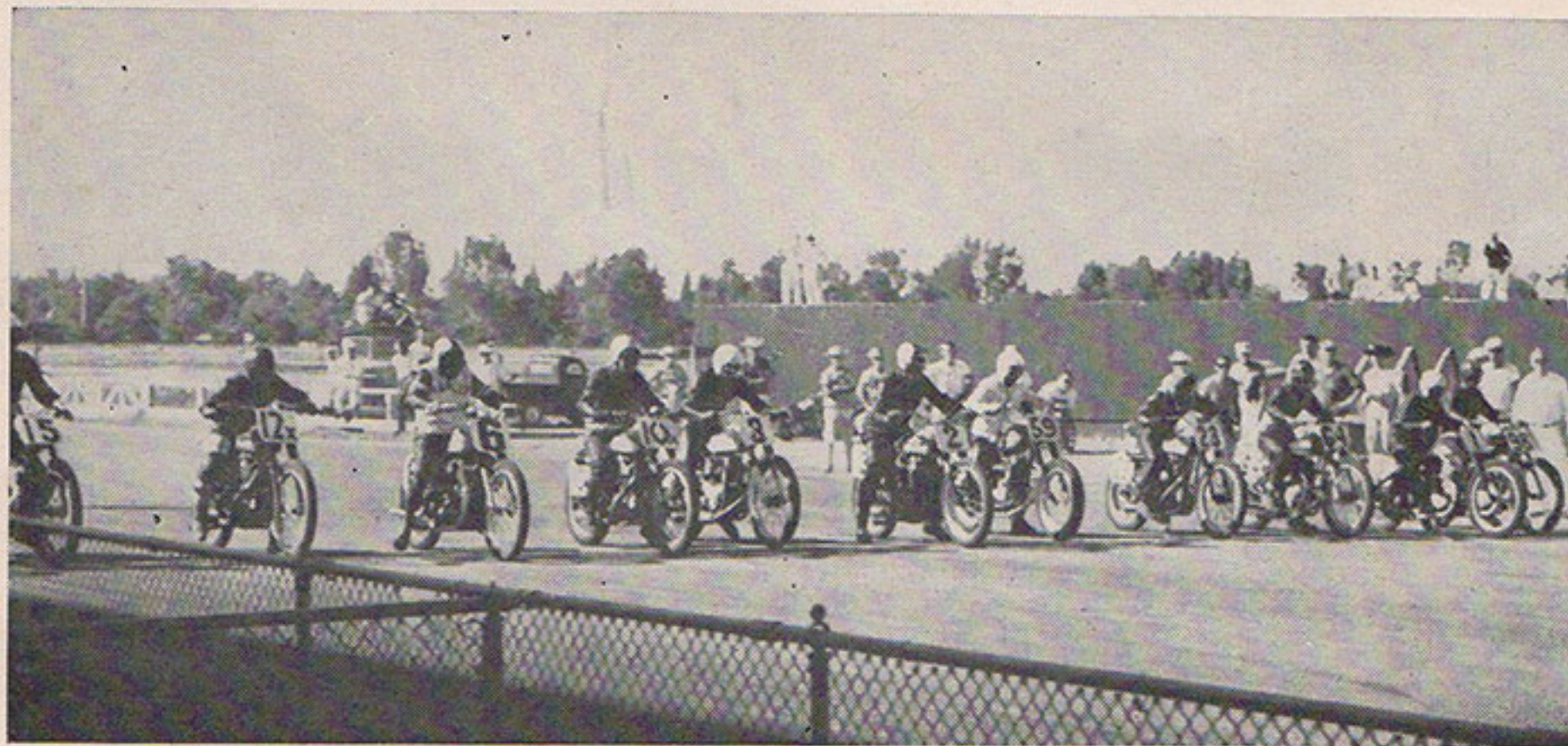
It had been a long time since the tandem two wheelers had performed on the state Fairgrounds mile, so long that only a few could remember much of the occasion. But, now retired, H-D dealer Frank J. Murray of Sacramento and a lifetime member of Capital City MC, well

recalls the times when motorcycles were equal in registration to the auto and led spectator support over the horses. Frank remembers the races of years 1912, 1913 and 1914, but particularly the national championships of three days in June of 1915 for titles to the 2-5-8-10-15-25 & 50 mile and how the Capital City MC "lost their shirt" in that promotion, that was the last time the cycles have been on the Sacramento mile until 44 years later one J. C. "Aggie" Agajanian gave the promotion a 'try' that is now believed to have permanency of an annual nature.

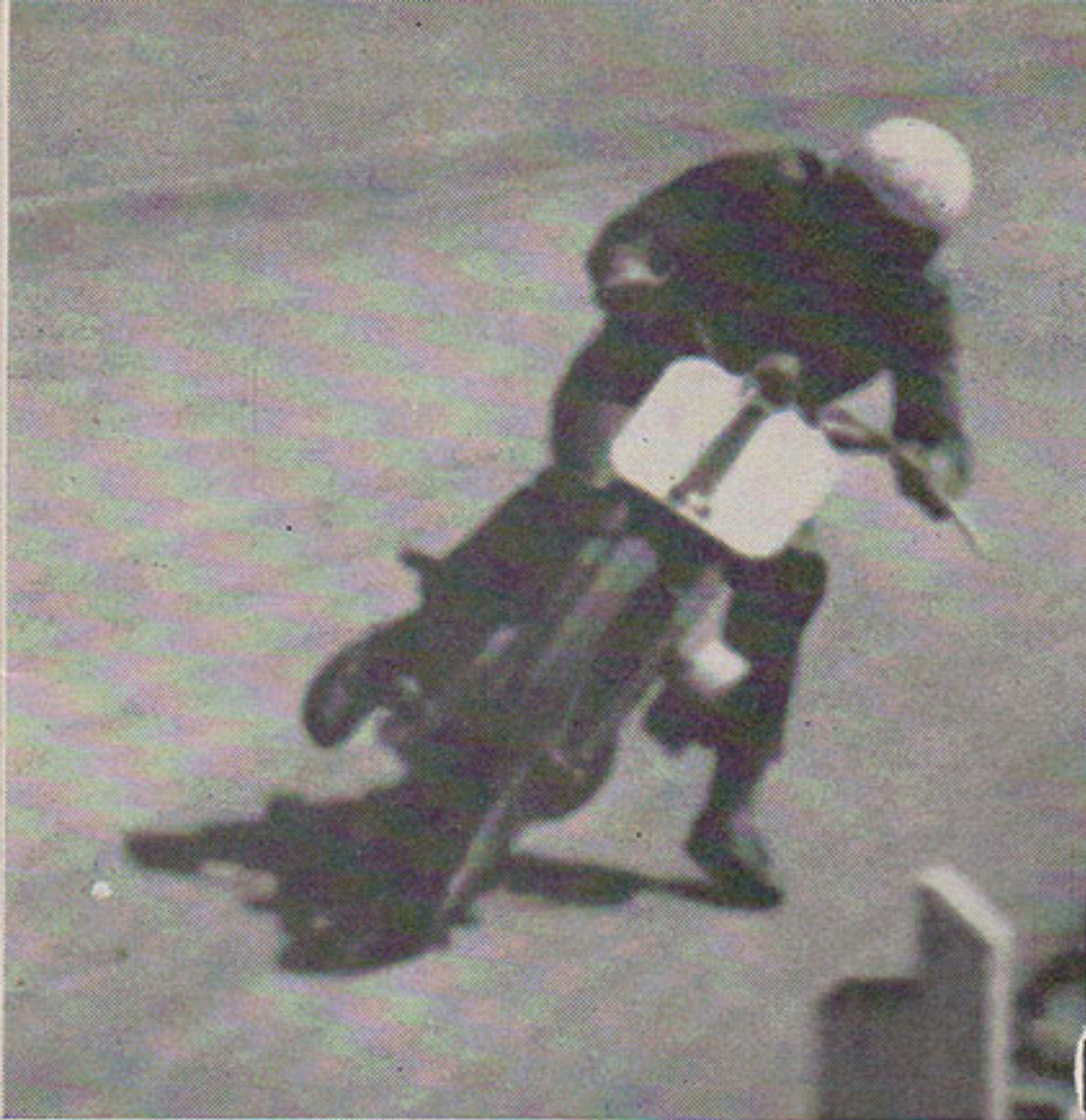
The weather was cool to warm, a predicted 92° turned to about 95°, the track was smooth and hard and slick when you got off the groove, and the competition was keen with experts like Andres, Klamfoth, Mann, Resweber, Tanner, Leonard (the top six in national point standings), Gun-

ter, Gibson, Hawley, Sir Kegian, Brashear, and a host of other good experts but perhaps not as well known nationally. Practice the day previous had brought most all the right gear but amateur time trials found Russ Whittinghill of Evansville, Ind., and his BSA tour the mile in 43.81 seconds, a time better than most expert practice laps; thus calculating and gear changing continued through Sunday morning practice and the first round of expert time trials. The first round found few getting into the 43 second bracket, Klamfoth drew the first 43 second applause and soon Gunter followed with Joe Leonard grabbing the pole position for the group after the second and final round of time trials with his 43.28 lap.

The West Coast has now seen national championships of 20 and 25 miles at Bay Meadows and San Jose and the majority of the wins to Californians but of late the eastern and Midwest boys have taken a liking to California tracks or been here so often now that they have found a combination. This is the first time though that a '1-2 blow' has been dealt to the western boys, a blow that made a big change in the national championship point standings. What with a Pacific Coast audience and the entry list heavy to the west, a 'local' win was the hope; but favorites like Leonard, Andres, Dorresteyn, Gibson, Mann, Gunter, and Hawley seemed to run into trouble that prohibited them from giving the expected competition or did this track, even after many years of absence of the two-wheelers, still remember how the eastern boys liked to win over the western boys when factories sponsored teams of riders. It is rare that chaps like Andres,

Gibson and Brashear are not in the main event lineup and it has been long since fellows like Leonard, Mann, Gunter, and Hawley haven't taken the checkered flag in one of the first three spots, but that is racing and the victory of the nation's Number 1 rider was well earned over the hard riding of the other finishers.

Tanner led the first lap in which Leonard went down when a rear wheel clipped his front as they prepared to enter the second turn, unhurt Joe was taken to the hospital for closer checking. Lap 2 saw Resweber across the line first, lap 3 went to Klamfoth with Resweber taking lap 4 and holding it throughout, being threatened only twice by Klamfoth (the only close rider) in laps 21 and 22 when the six to eight cycle-length gap closed to wheel and bike length. Third, fourth, and fifth spots were a 25 lap juggle between Tanner, Mann, Hawley, and Emmick with the later finally and barely nosing out Tanner.

The amateur main had more thrills in race closeness with Southern California riders Troy Lee, Jim Maxwell, and Emery McKeen, battling hard for the lead. 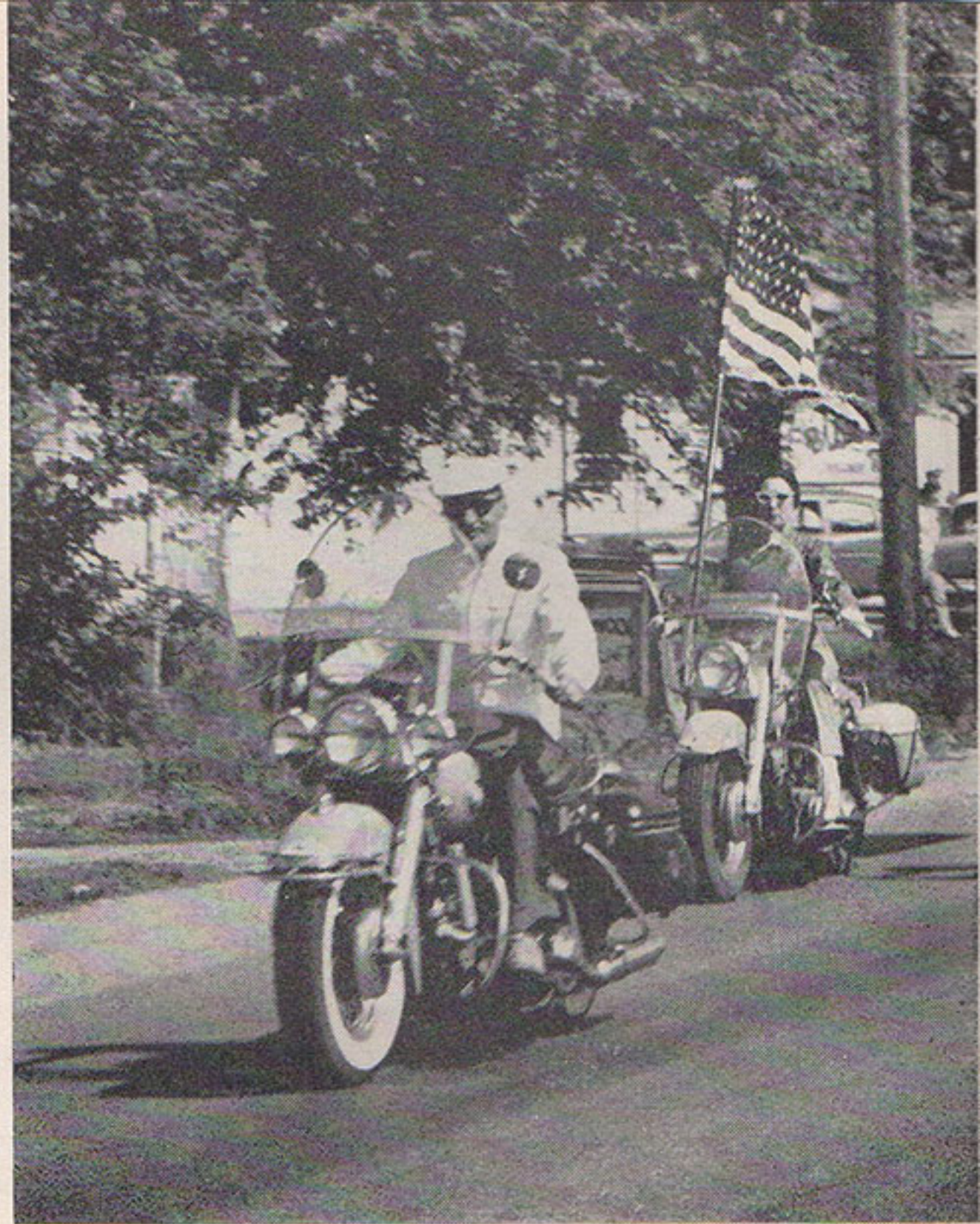

THE gypsy tour and state championship races held at Crystal Lake, Mich., over the weekend of June 6 were quite a success.

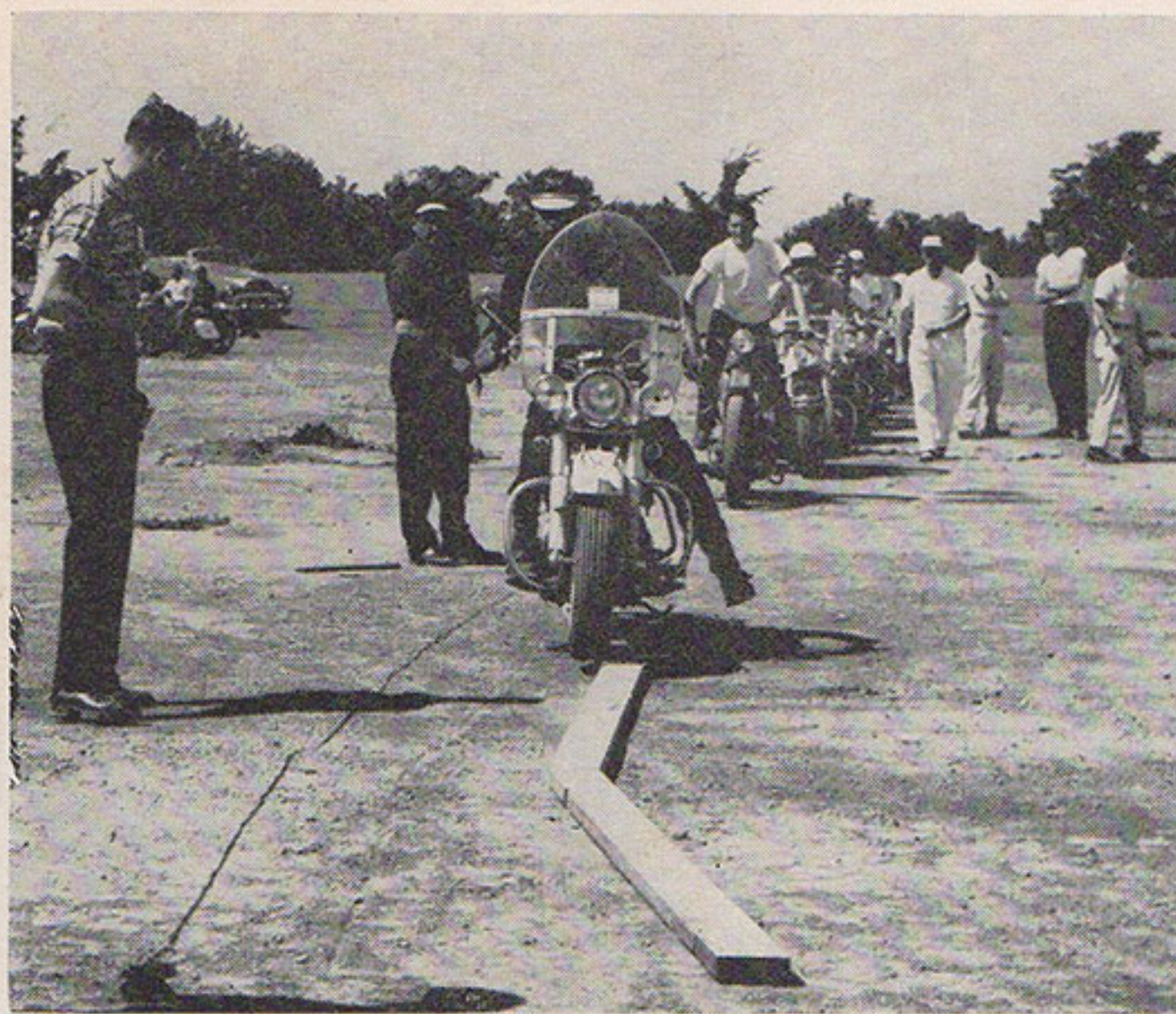

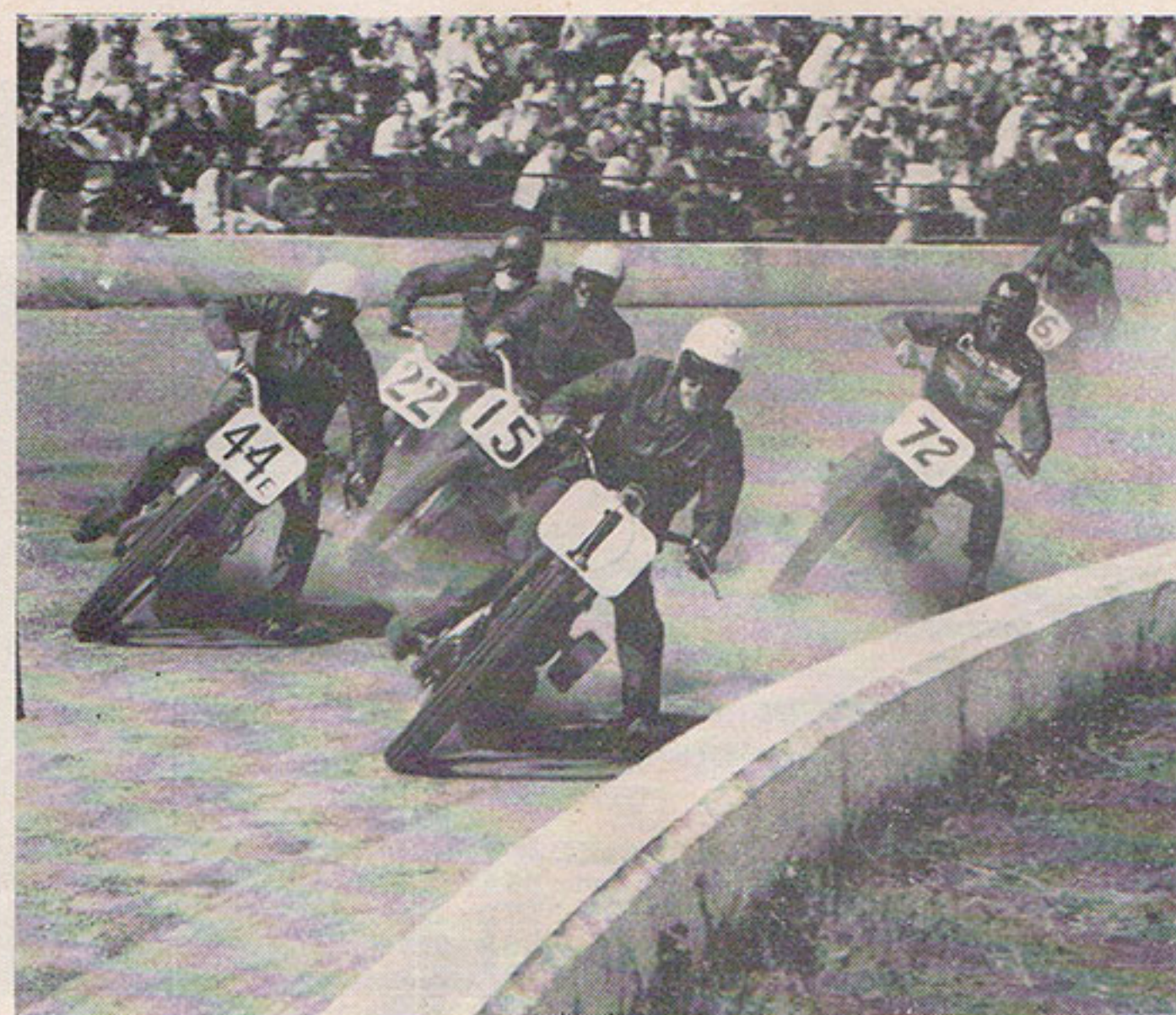

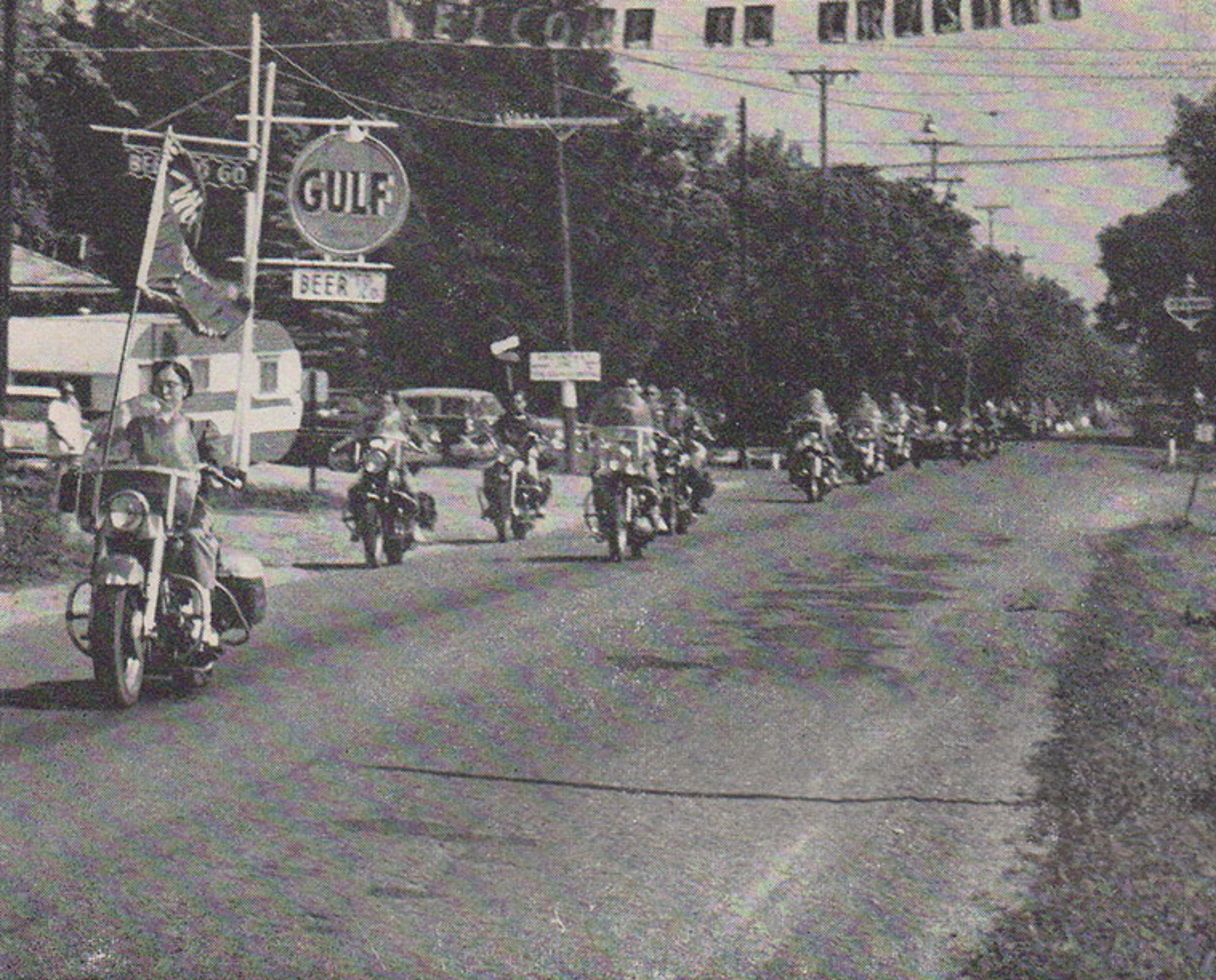

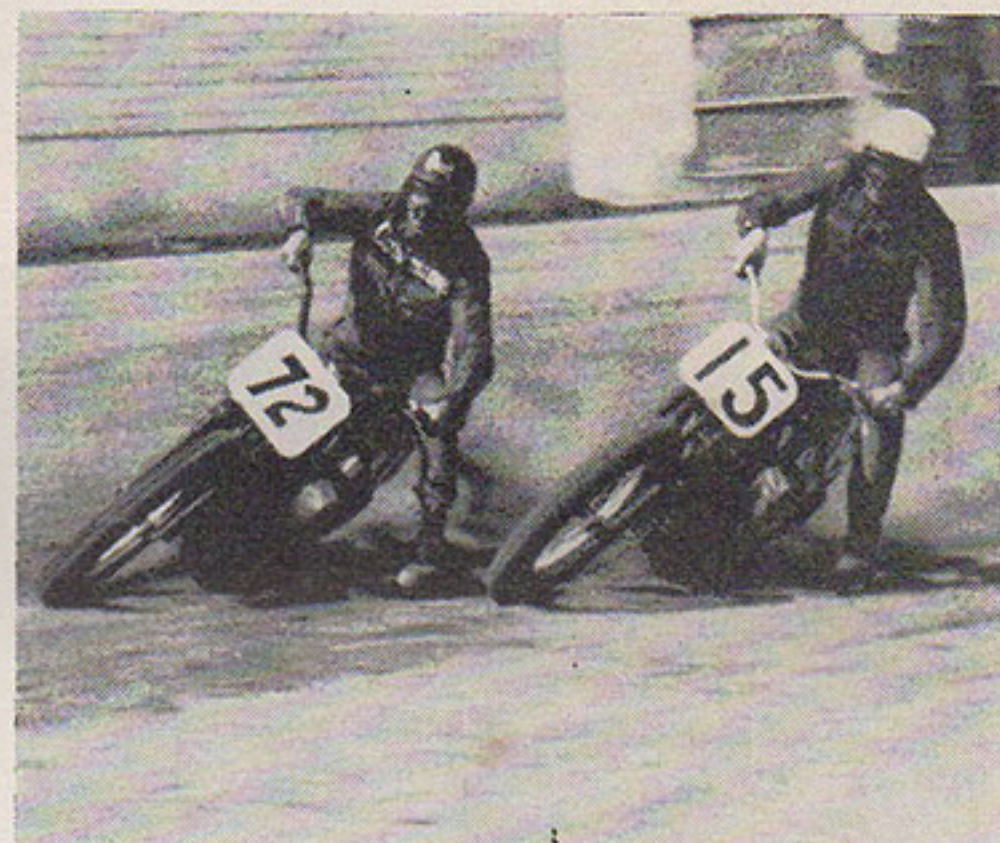
Zigging where he should have zagged, this rider is about to drop off the boards completely.



Carroll Resweber, who is leading the pack into the turn at the start of the expert final, never relinquished his hold on first place.



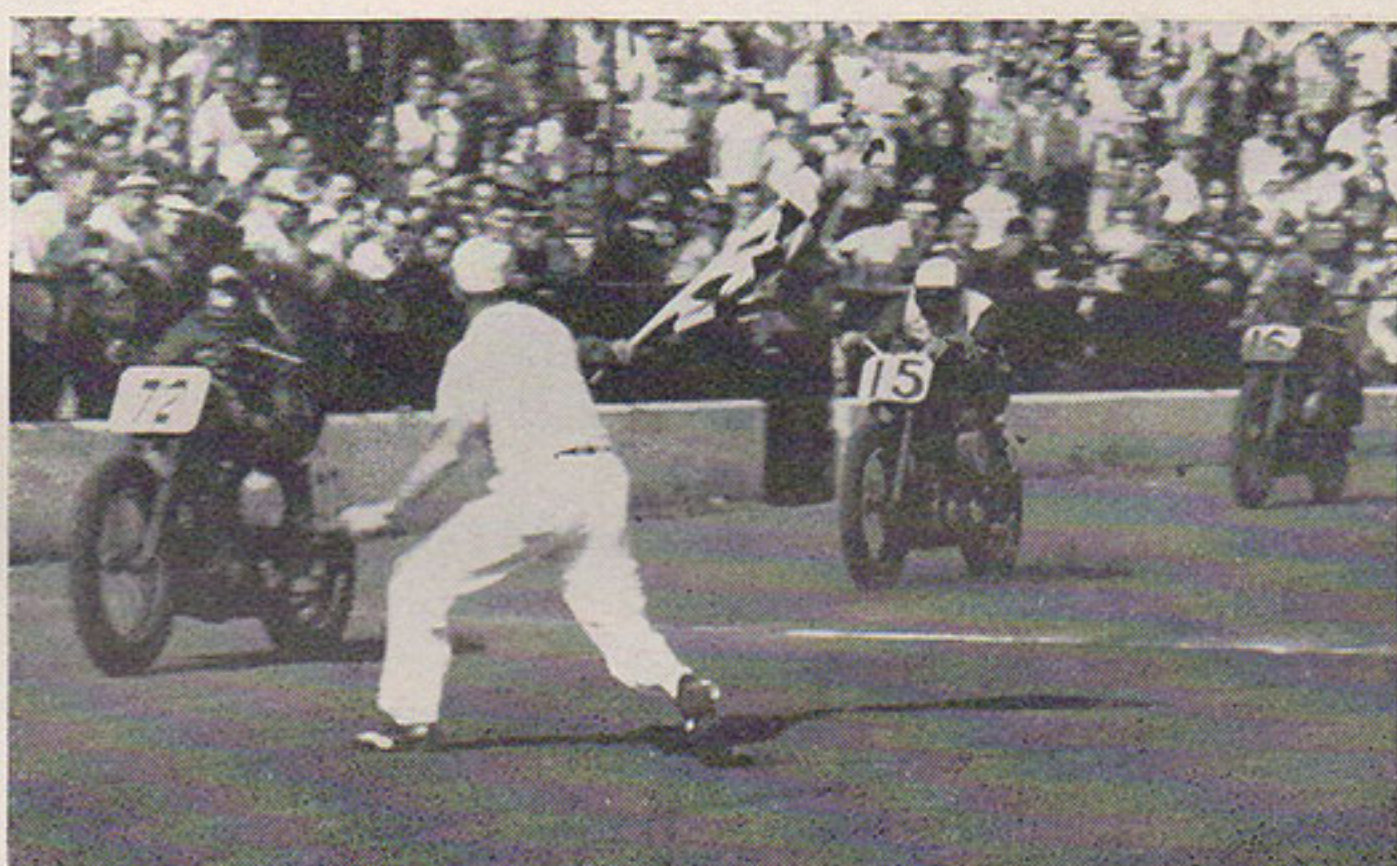

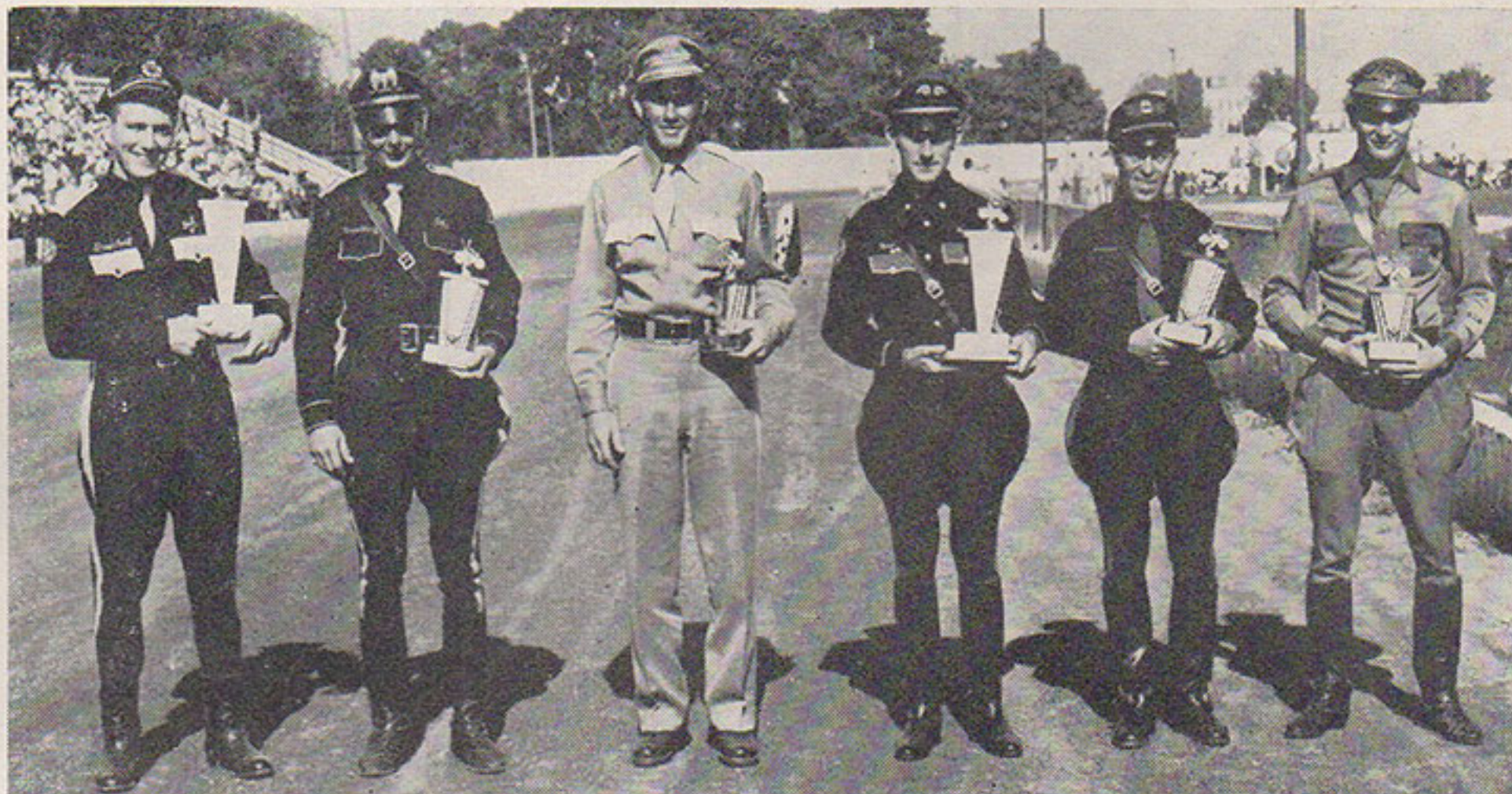

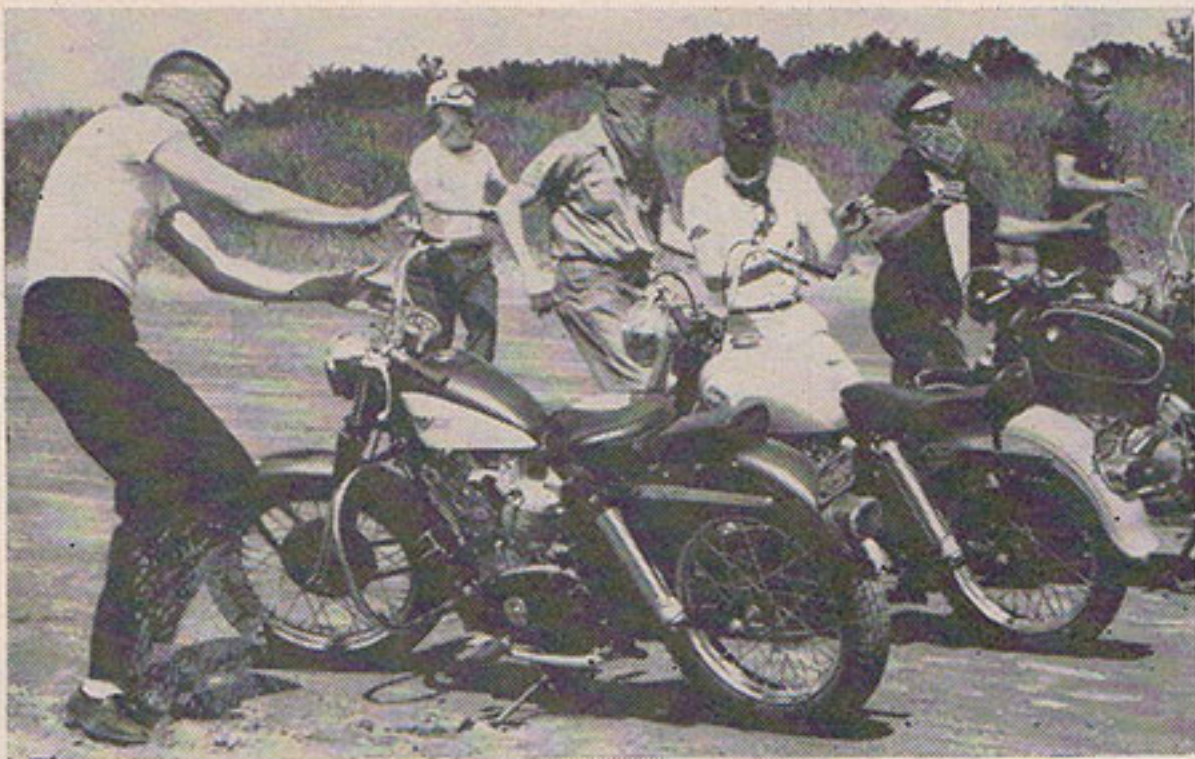
Finish of the state championship saw Markel beat Molyneaux across the line by only a few lengths. Rider number 16, in rear, is not third, but has been lapped.



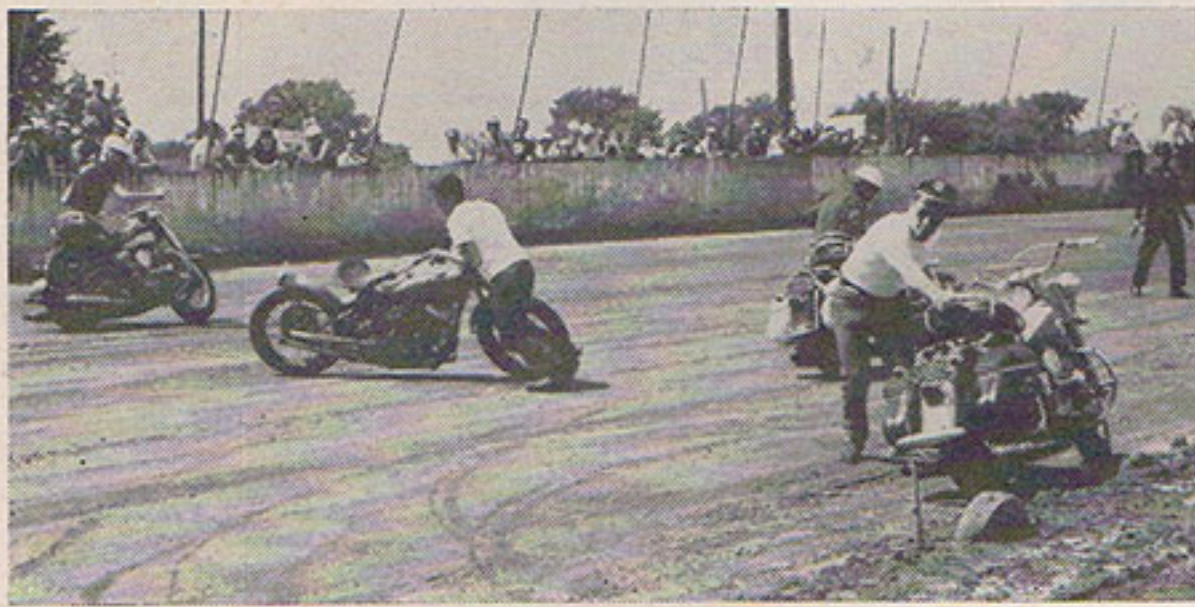
Knee-high in weeds, enduro riders head out over some flat open country.

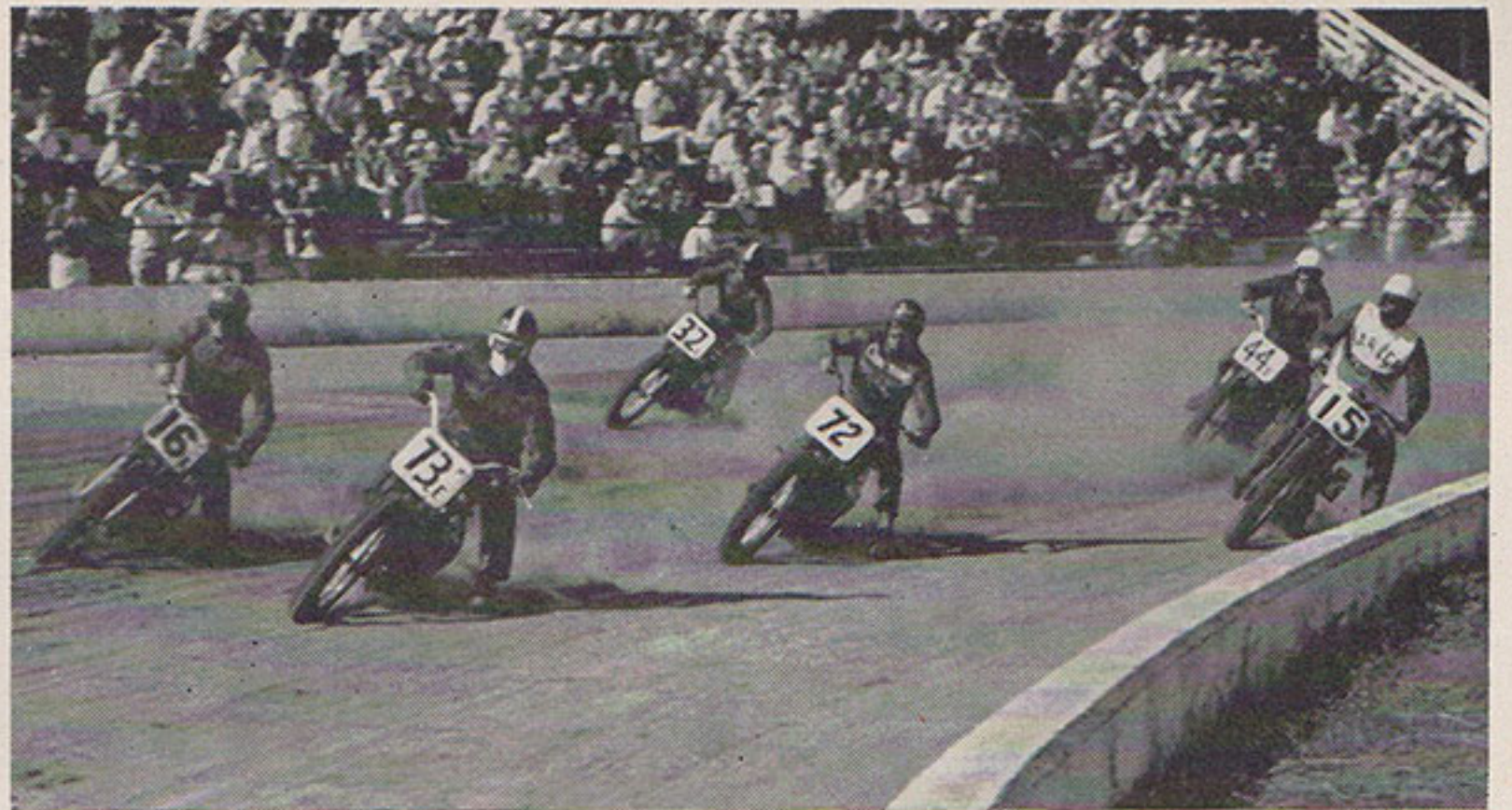
Slow race in the girls section of the field meet.

District Referees' Official Bulletin

by Jules Horky

● The AMA rule book is the basic guide which shall control all AMA sanctioned events and equipment. The AMA rules apply to all Sportsman riders, and the general rules for all competition still prevails if a question arises regarding Sportsman equipment or rules. It is primarily up to the club referees to start reading the rule book and enforcing some of these rules.

● At a recent road race, the race was

stopped by the referee because the riders were racing and passing on the "hold position" flag. To prevent this from happening in any race you enter, familiarize yourself with the AMA flags used by the starter. It is a good idea if all referees and starters hold a pre-race meeting and show and explain each flag to the riders like Referee Jim Davis did at the Charity Newsies race.

● In Sportsman events, control levers and foot levers must be rubber covered; front number plates must be flat and not curved; hand clutch and hand brake levers must have ball ends; and group #1 or #2 safety helmets must be worn by Sportsman riders.

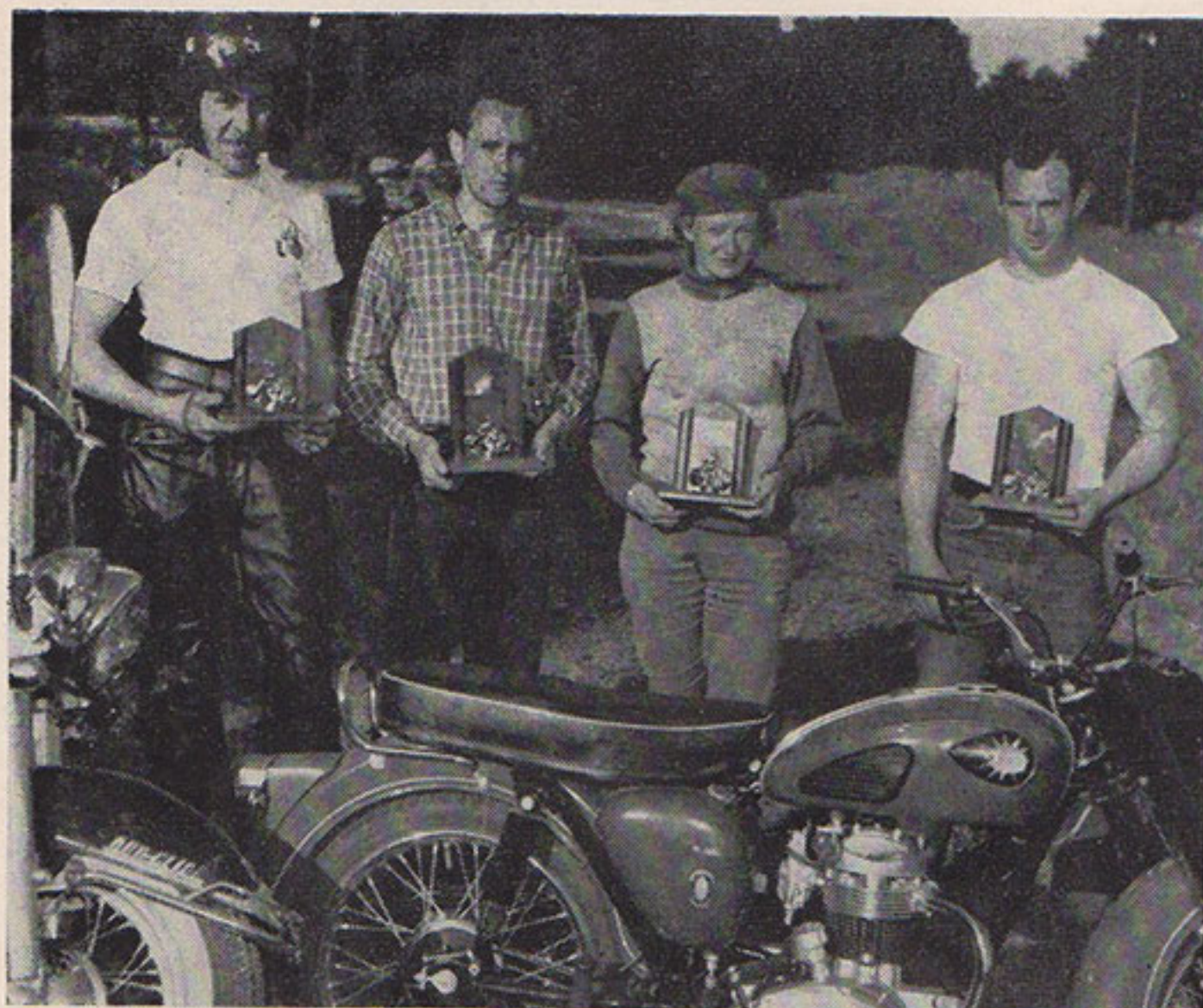

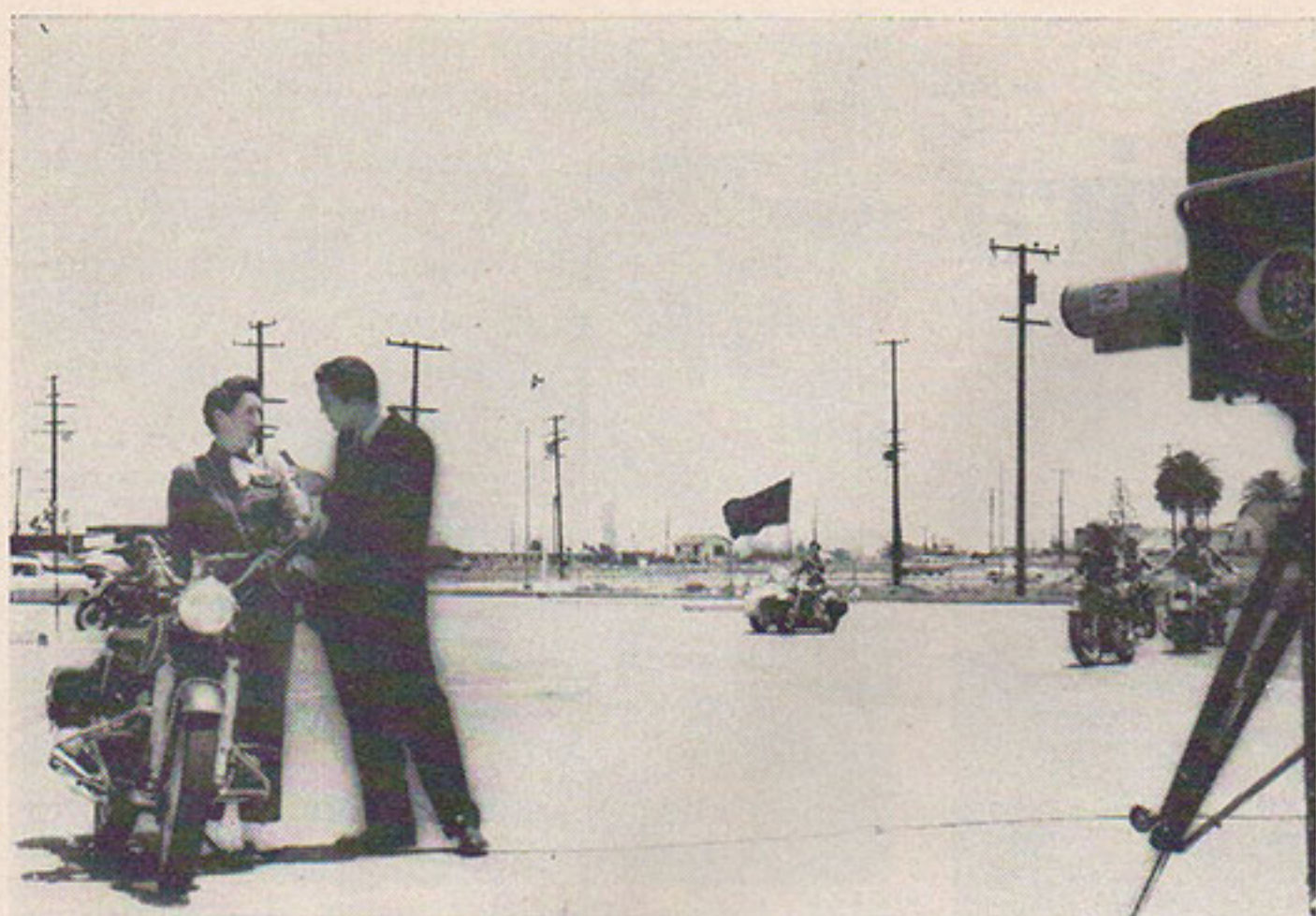

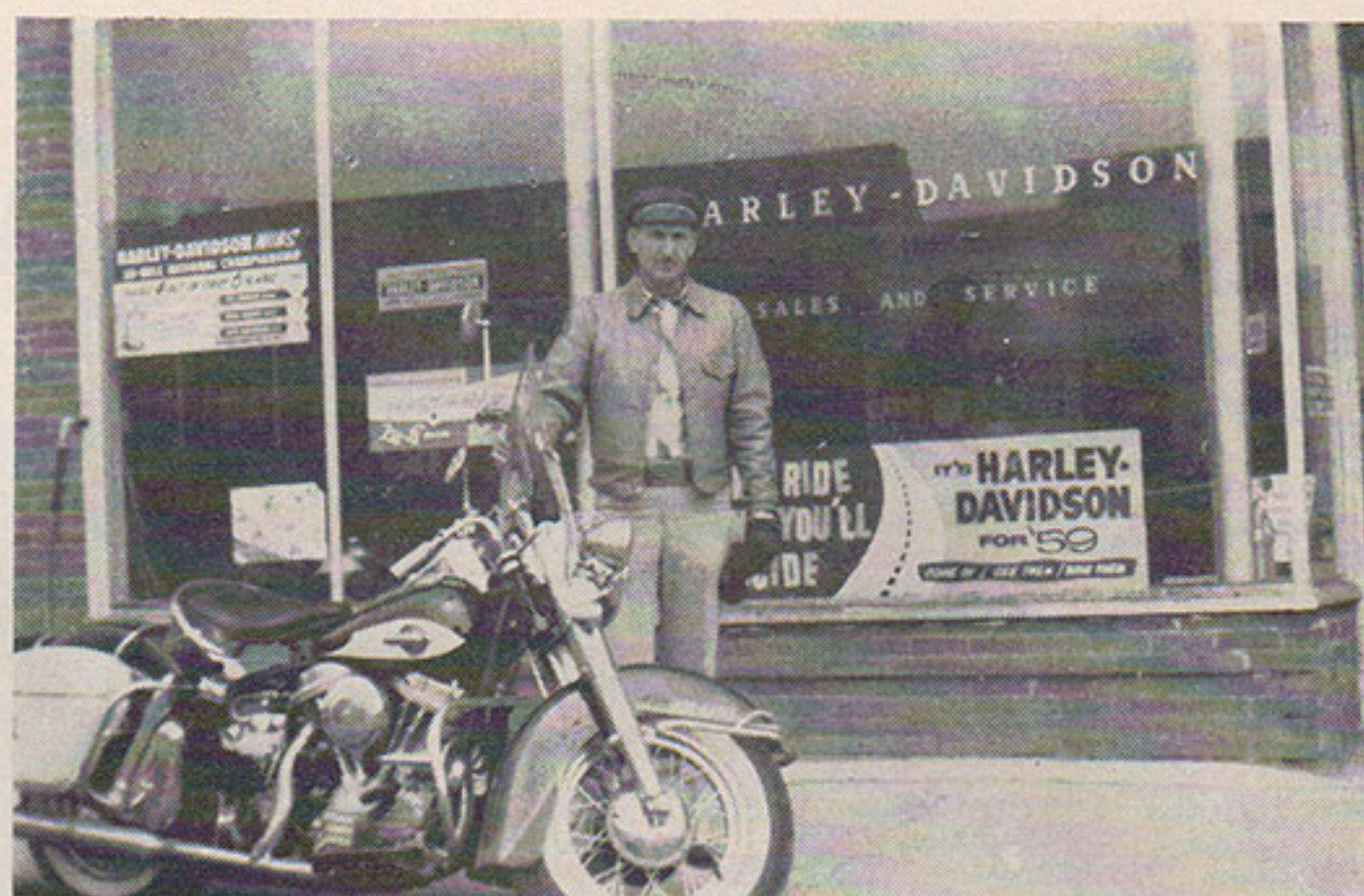

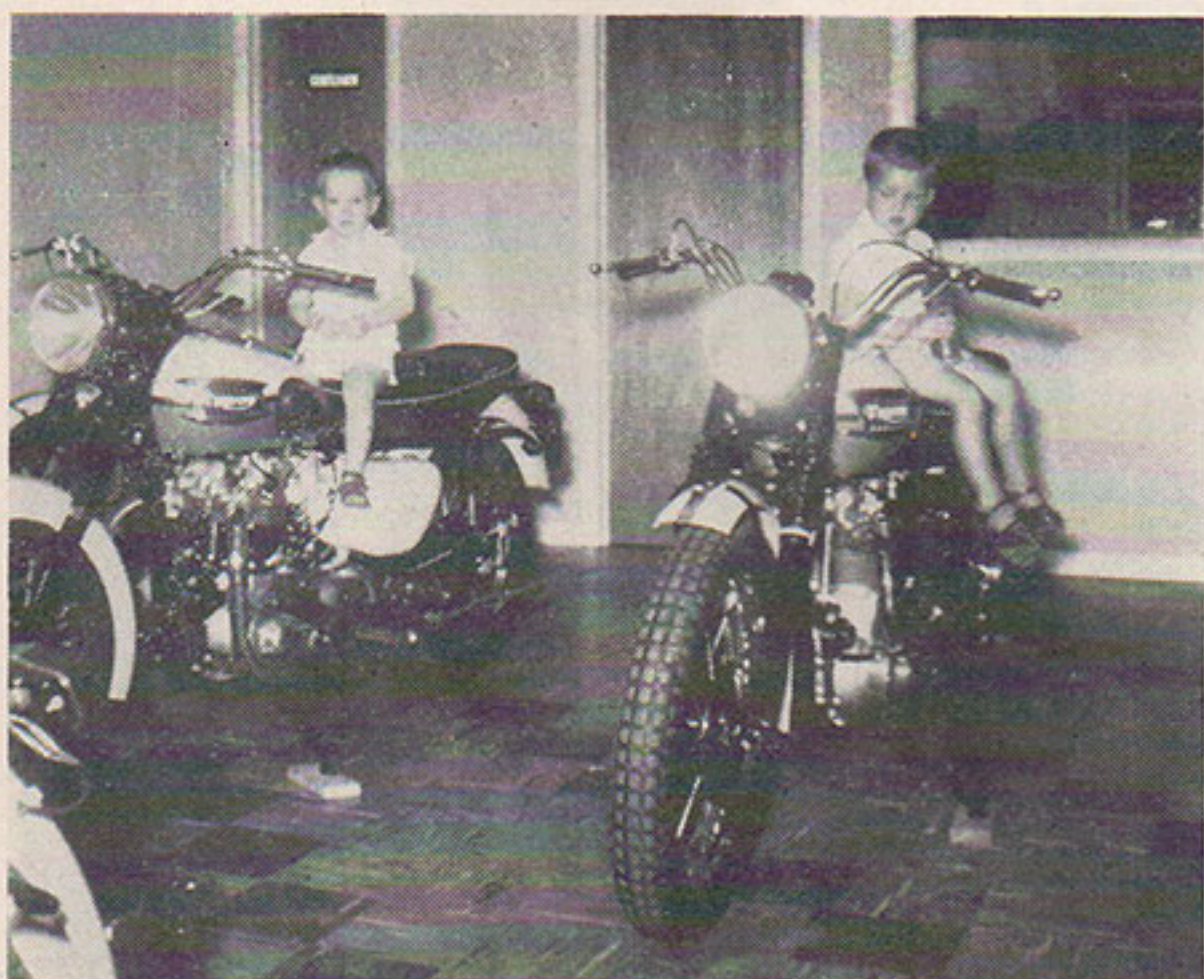

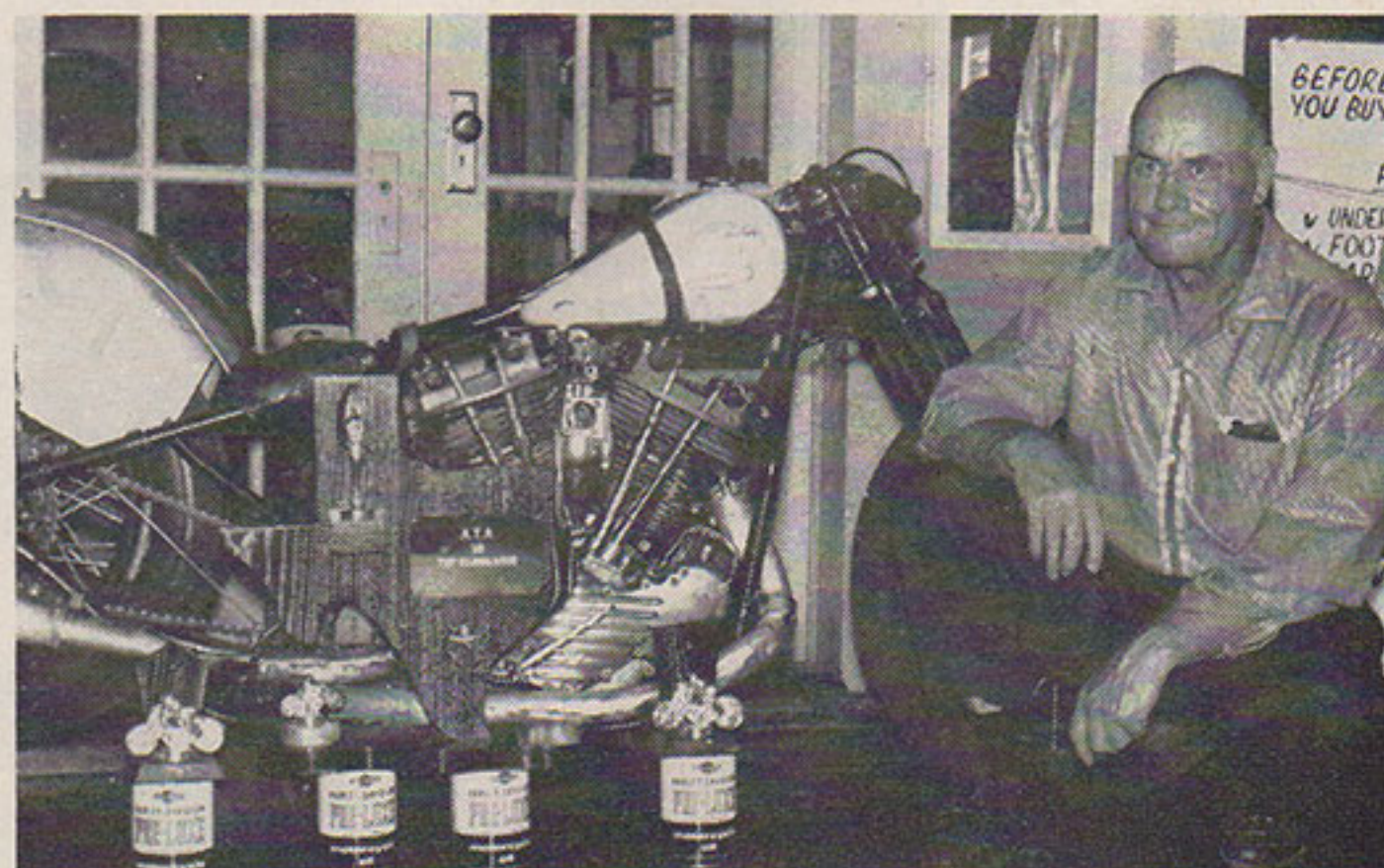

ANNUAL MIDWEST RALLY FOR DODGE CITY OVER LABOR DAY WEEK-END

DODGE CITY, Kansas, the oldest motorcycle racing center in the United States and in later years the background for Wild West and early day TV and radio shows, will again play host to thousands of motorcyclists.

On Sunday morning the National Economy Run will again be held, over a course blocked off by the police in Wright Park.

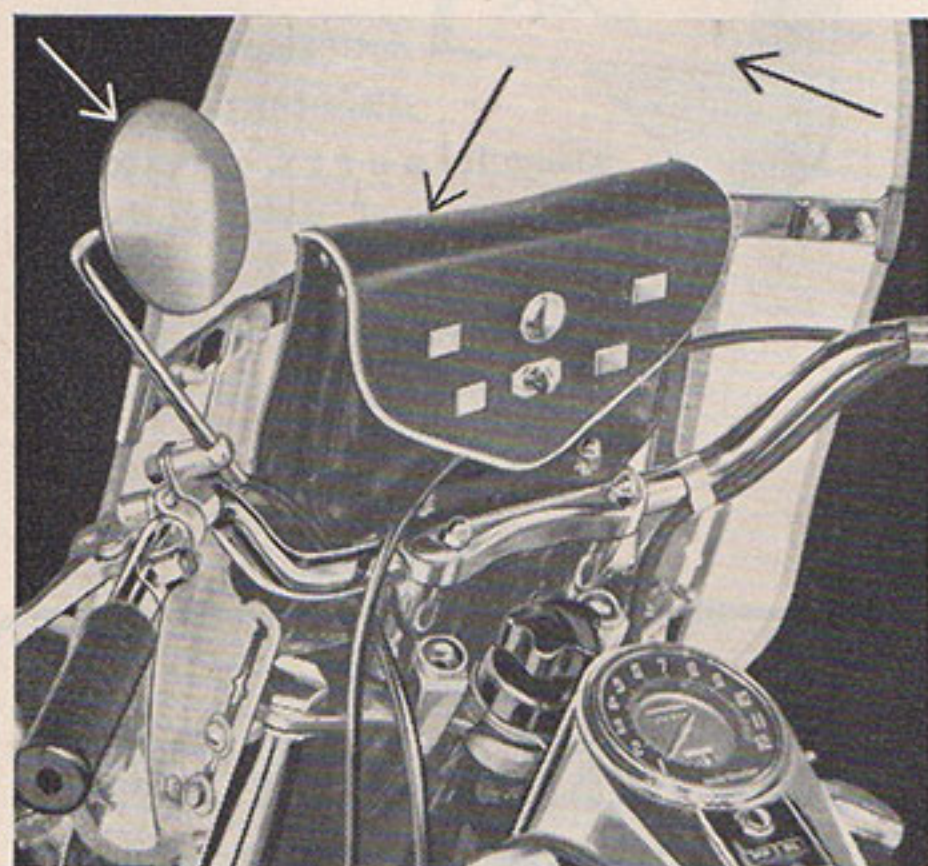

On Monday (Labor Day) the scene of

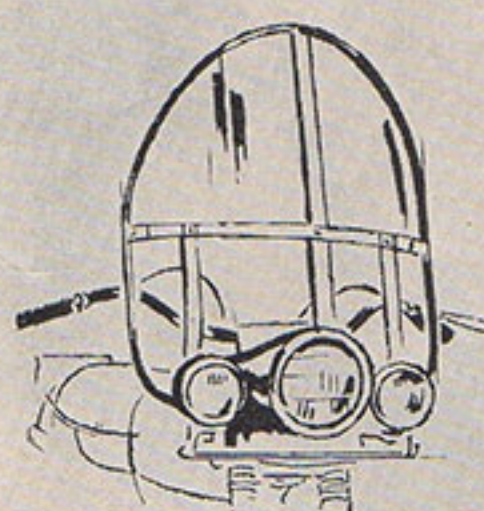

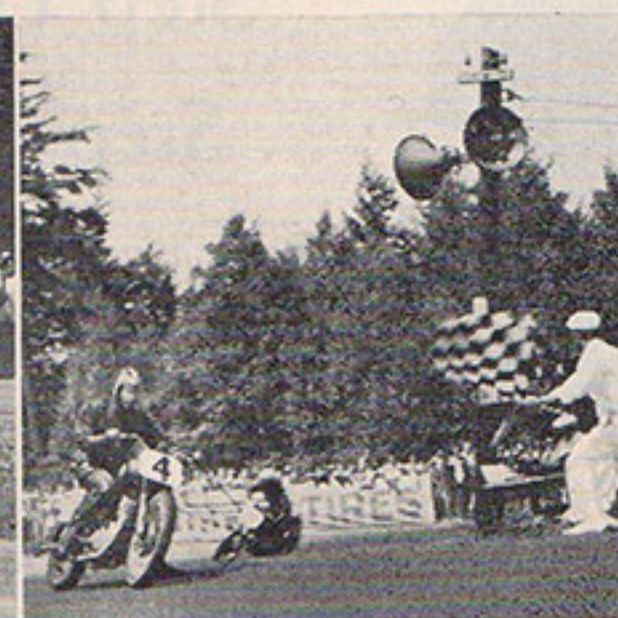

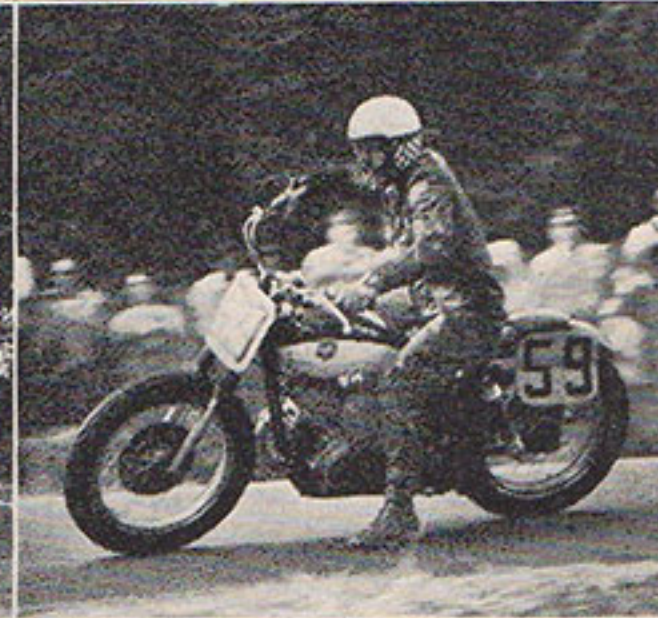

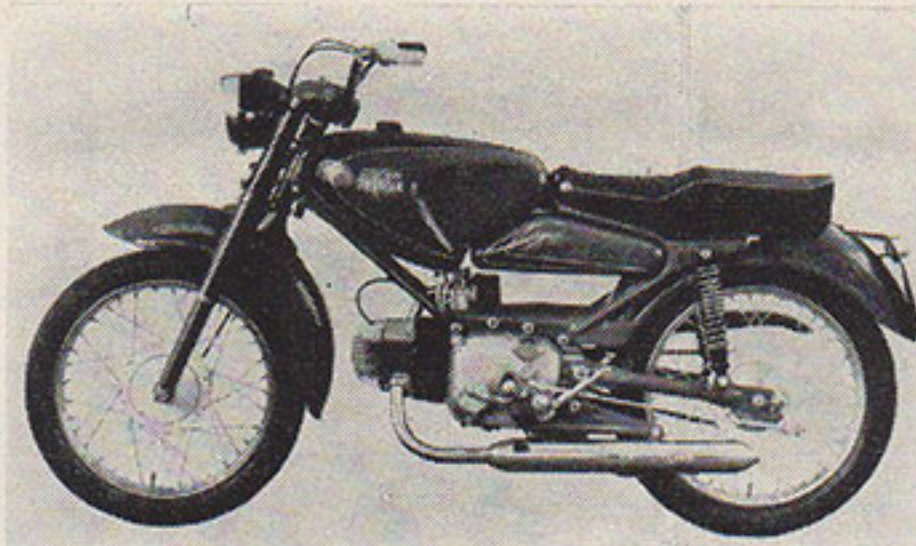

The engine forks and wheels, etc. will be interchangeable with Parilla's new "Ramjet". The machine will feature fly-wheel magneto, multiplate clutch in oil, 275 x 17 wheels and 120 miles per gallon.

HEAVYWEIGHTS MEAN BUSINESS

The few spectators who didn't want to cooperate with workers keeping the track clear didn't need any prompting to keep the curves free during the heavyweight event. A scheduled fifty lapper, the starter's flag made a "Thunder Road" out of the scrambles course which had four built-in "jumps" and which many of the riders said was about the best track, and in the best condition, of any track they had ridden anywhere in the country. And the ridden anywhere in the country. And the safest. As a matter of fact there was only one accident to mar the beautiful day and that was a minor one which resulted more in hurt feelings than anything else.

Ray Durham, Triumph mounted and last year's title holder in the heavyweight division fought his way up front as the big machines came onto the course. He got a good start towards repeating his last year's performance but the third lap proved to be his downfall. Like brother Ken in the lightweights, Jim Hayes, Jr., TR6, picked this same third lap to put himself out front and give the fans a show. Hayes never lost his first place during the race although the law of averages involving the Hayes and the Triumphs up to now could almost be set down as having the odds against his winning the heavyweight championship since Kenneth just won his second in a row and both boys had won their class events for the day.

In the shuffle Durham slipped to fourth place but by lap 12 had worked his way past E. W. Woodall and Don Burnette into second where he appeared to be picking up time.

Throttles cracked in the warm sunny afternoon, drifts and waves of dust came and went with the alternation of the field of riders who were still fighting it out in one of the closest groups of competition in various instances that has been witnessed in a long time. Speed was poured on as the laps mounted and each rider attempted to bring himself up just one more place at least, in the final results.

And then it happened. Ray Durham lost all hope as he pulled off the track and headed for the pits with engine trouble. This was in the 35th lap of the race. Woodall was again in line for second spot after 23 laps of riding it out in third.

The big engines droned on into the late afternoon as the laps piled up, and all in favor of Hayes. Hayes was defeating the law of averages. Hayes had made his own rules for that day.

AUGUST, 1959

ALL OVER BUT THE CHECKERED FLAG

Things went on all around the track. Like when occupants of the judges' stand looked curiously down as right below them a chain which had come completely off its sprocket was worked back on by a much concerned pit crew, the cycle given a push by about four pairs of hands, and the rider gotten back onto the track in time to retain his position.

There were no further changes in position among the leaders from this time on, and the checkered flag was metered out by Odell Cable, official AMA referee, to the following who were the first ten across the winner's line:

Over eighty trophies were the take-home remembrances for winners in the East Coast Championship Scrambles. All first three place winners in class events and finals were presented from a beautiful "Pedestal of Victory" designed especially for this purpose. It made a most impressive addition to the day's colorful activities.

From all appearances the raising of the Rebel Flag created a sensation. The New England boys especially turned out in goodly numbers, hoping to retrieve the winning trophies, only to find that Tennessee which is where the Hayes boys live, was the destination of the most important ones. One enthused Southerner was heard to say, "Well, I told you to keep those trophies in the South, but I didn't tell you to take them all!"

All in all, we who had anything to do with the championship feel we had a wonderful day. And seriously, we all appreciate the heavy support we got from the New England States, and all the rest. Without "YOU-ALL" it could not have been the wonderful event that it was. The Southern boys want the Northern boys to come back next year, and try again for the trophies.

And the word is, that, if you come down here and win the championship, you can have the rebel flag, too!! Which will probably be the biggest concession the South has ever made, for any cause, 'cause that flag is the personal property of Red Nabors himself, who is still fighting for the cause.

Antique Motorcycle Show At Springfield



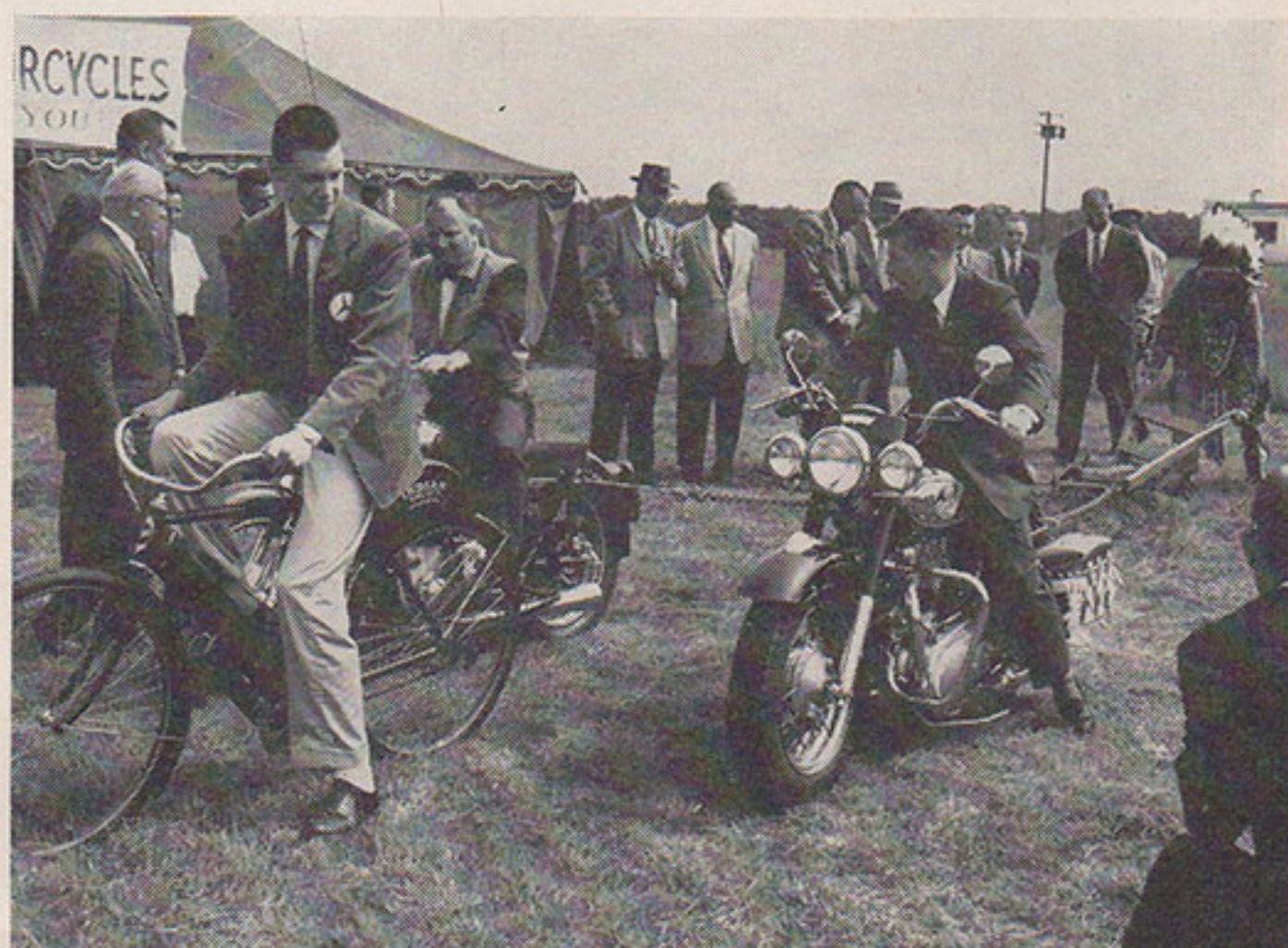
