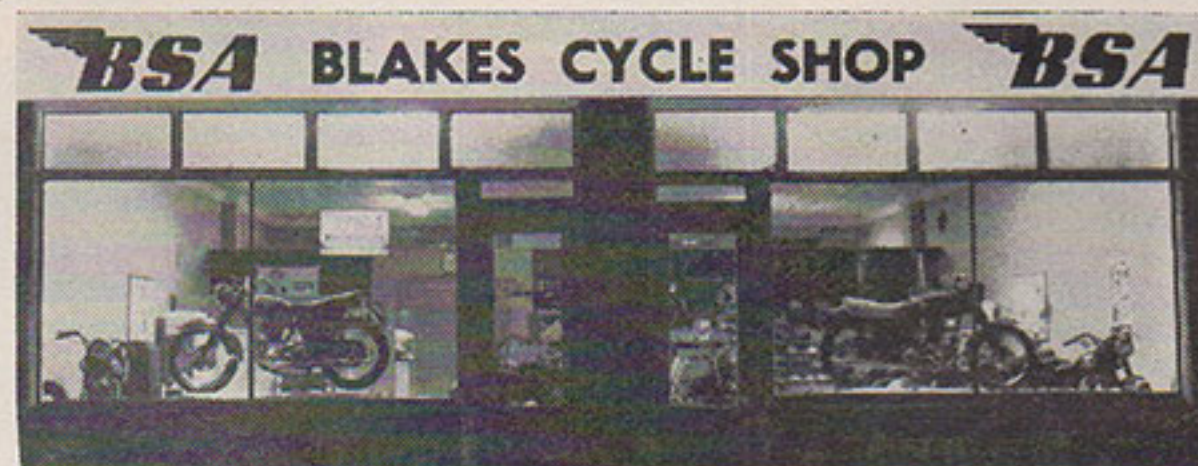

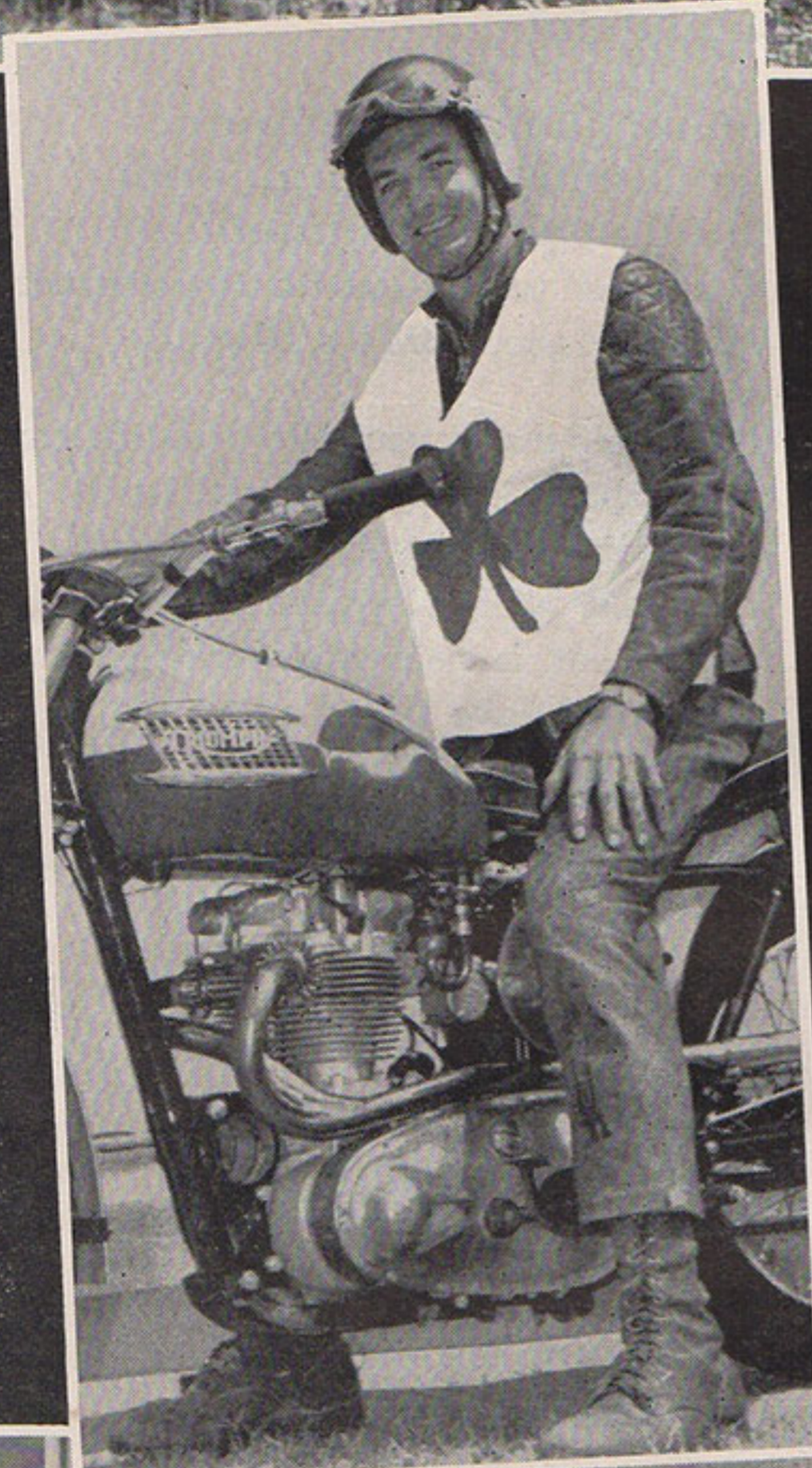
Buck Smith on TR-6 wins 1st Place in Sweepstakes

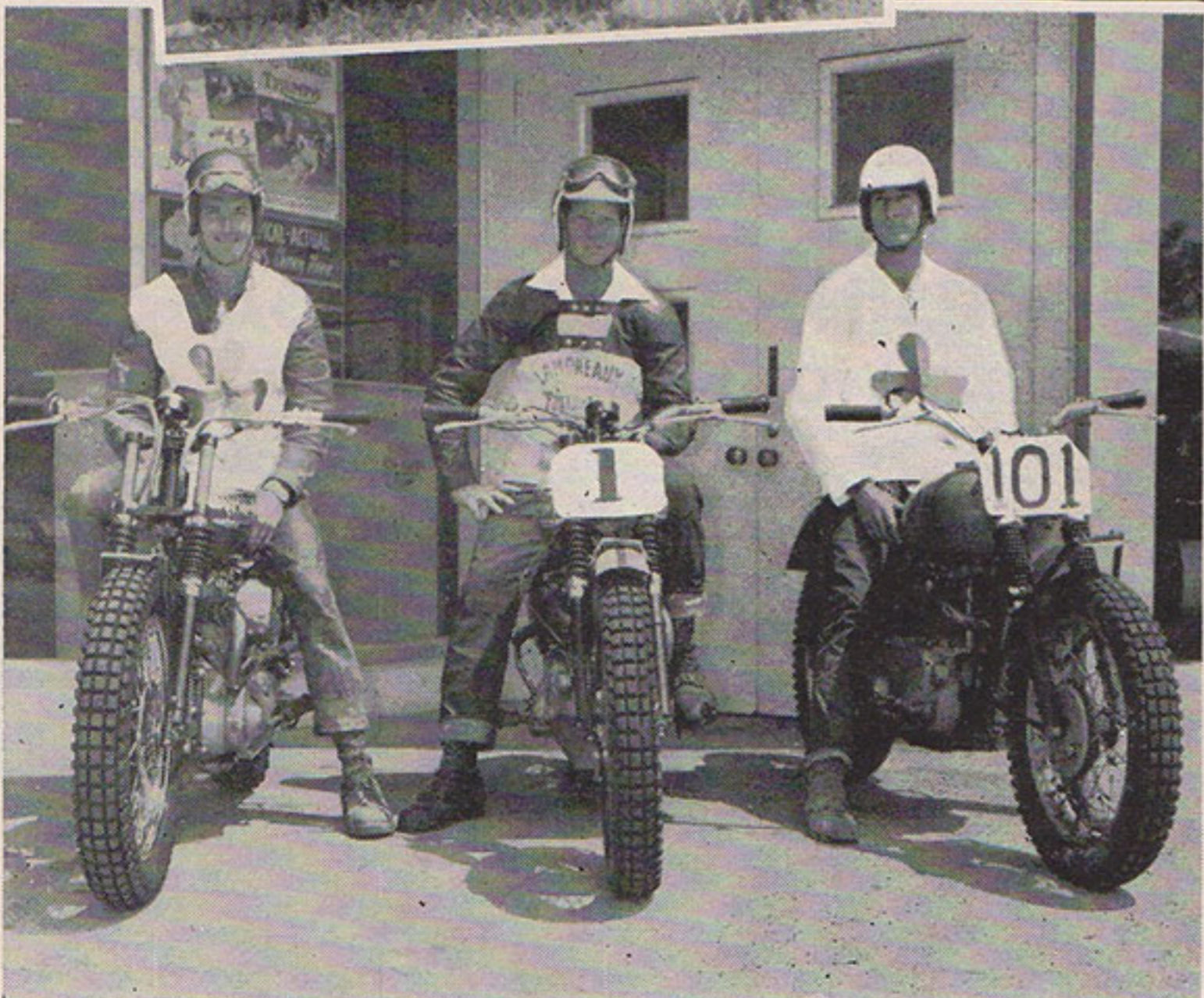
Triumphs again showed their superiority by winning more places than any other make. The reliable, high performance TR-6 turned the Enduro into a Triumph event.

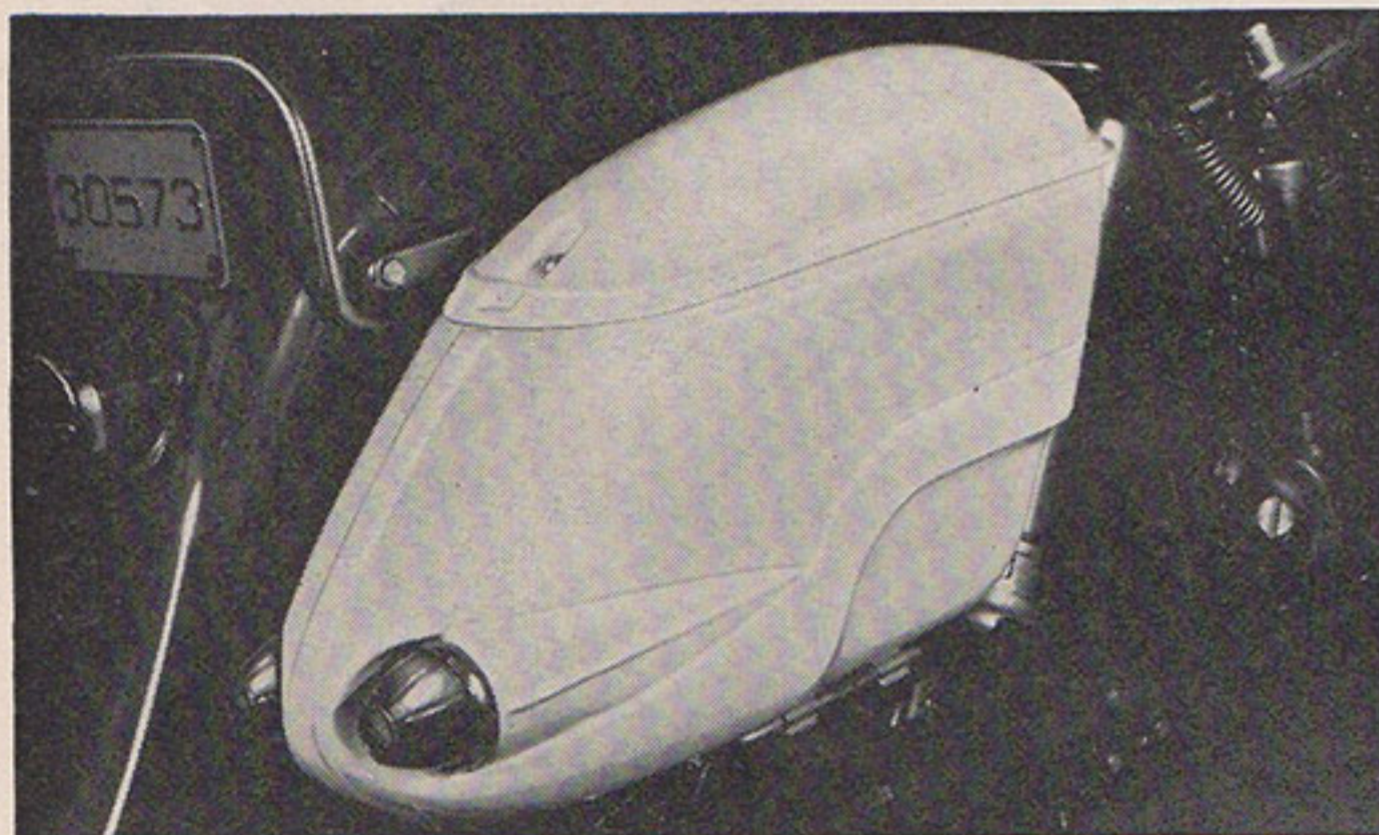

Laconia, N. H. Fall Round-up Sept. 12-13

The New England Motorcycle Dealers Association will hold their annual Fall Round-Up at Laconia, N.H. on Saturday and Sunday, September 12 and 13.

As a great many riders were disappointed on not being able to run the drag races on account of rain during the gypsy tour, they will be run on Saturday the 12th, entries to be taken from 10 a.m. on the starting line and will close at 1:30 p.m. They will be electrically timed by the Hank Miller Electric Time Service of New Jersey. After the drags the committee will also hold sport contests as long as light remains to work in.

From now on it is the intention of the Activity Committee to dress up all the Laconia races, also to make the Laconia track one of the best paid in prize monies. To start this off they are increasing the prize money of probationary novice races on Sunday, Sept. 13, plus awarding seven trophies, one to the winner of each event. This is only a start, and prize money will be raised as the riders cooperate in giving the show that will be demanded. They want the riders to wear colored competition vests, also insist on all mechanics being in clean whites and obey the rules at all times. A clean show will bring in more customers and this will mean heavier prize money.

Fifth Annual Death Valley Run And Tour

Plans are being rushed for the 1959 edition of one of the world's greatest motorcycle events, the fifth annual Death Valley Run and Tour.

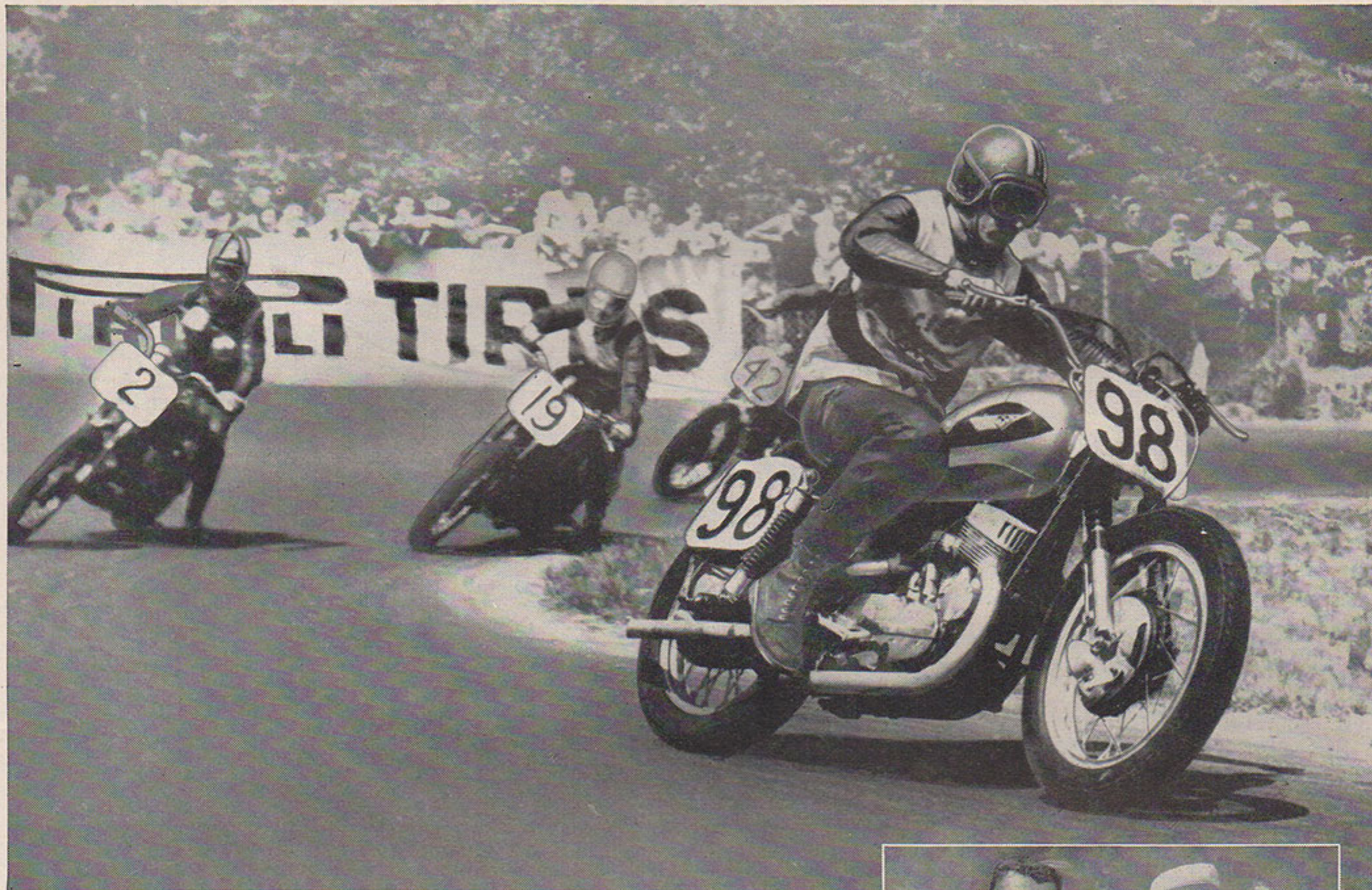
The run and tour will be held Saturday, Oct. 31, and Sunday, Nov. 1, starting from the San Bernardino County Fairgrounds at Victorville, Calif. Special arrangements have been made for riders and fans to camp at the fairgrounds the night of Friday, Oct. 31.

For the early birds there will be a program of dancing, music, refreshments and the showing of top grade motorcycling motion pictures. For the couples who bring the children, a free baby sitting service will be provided.

Official start of the Death Valley cycle run and tour will be from the fairgrounds on Saturday morning. Fifty new trophies are ready for the winners of the Gold Rush run. New type pins and tour awards will be given to all entries Saturday night at trophy ceremonies and a western dance will be held to mark the Death Valley finish at Furnace Creek Ranch.

Sunday morning the H-D Dealers Assn. will host entries at a breakfast and Sunday afternoon there will be conducted tours of Death Valley for those riders who remain over.

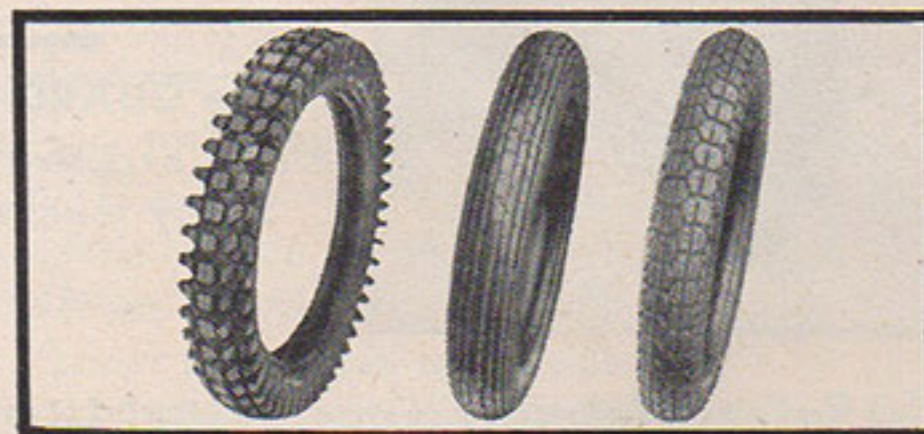

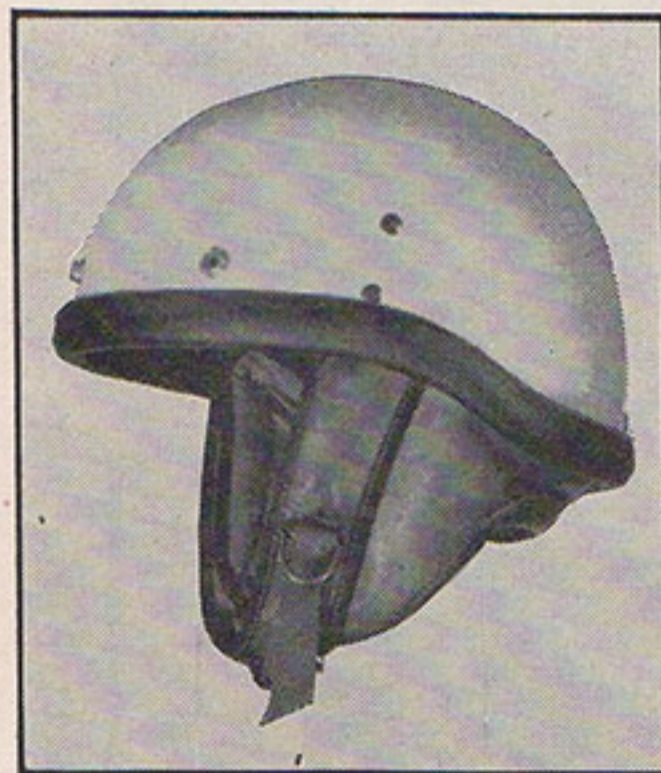

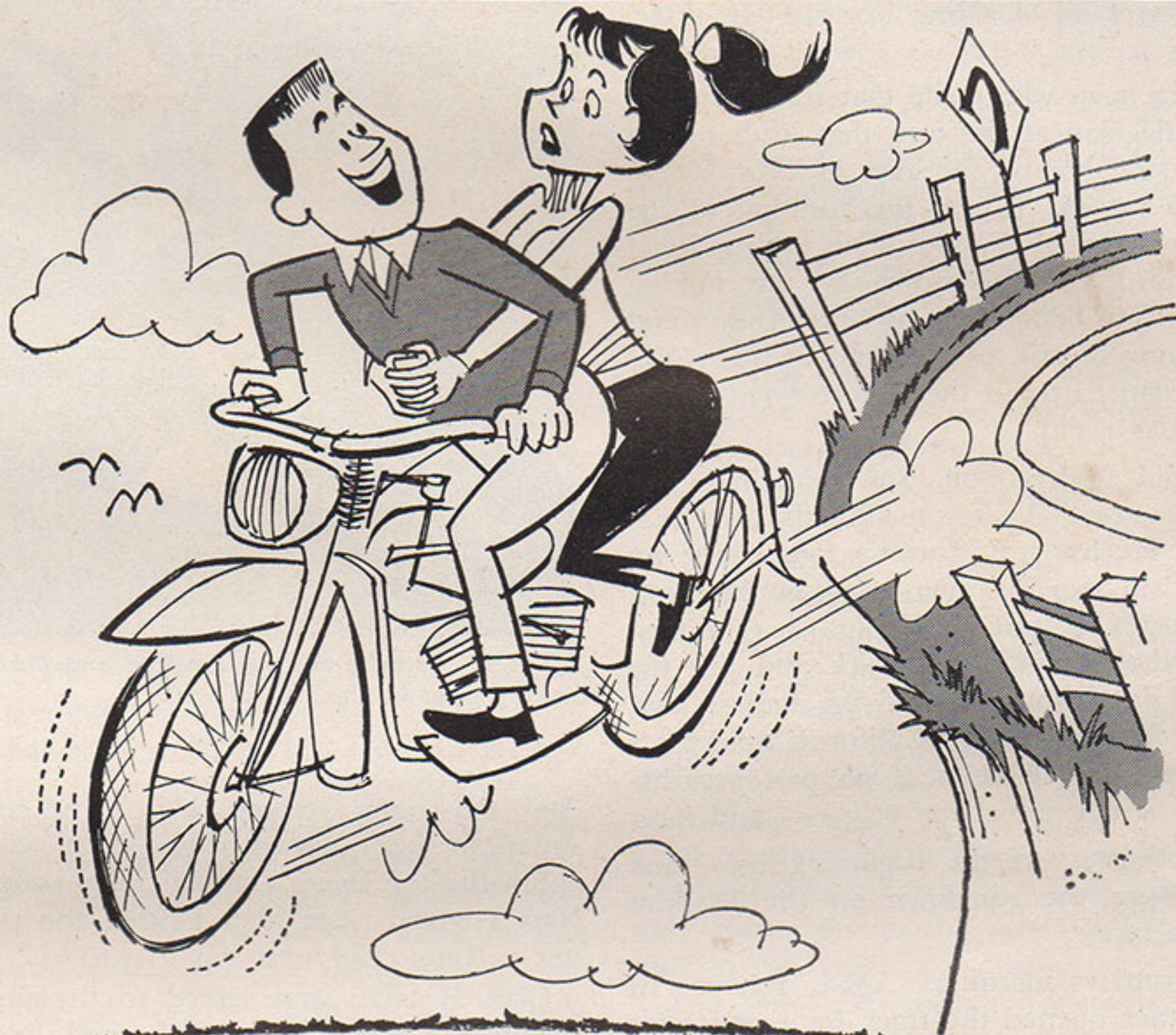

Andres Repeats Last Year's Win At Watkins Glen Grand Prix

THAT kind of riding just can't be done. I see it, but I still say it can't be done."

The man who made that statement was the flagman at the turn that leads to the big straightaway at the Watkins Glen, N. Y., track. It was the running of the second annual Watkins Glen International Grand Prix. The riding he was talking about was being done by Brad Andres and Tommy Morris, as they put on their lap-after-lap battle in the feature event of the two-day event.

Brad Andres won. You can almost say "of course." Andres made this two in a row. He has won Laconia four times; he has had two Daytona wins; he has won Dodge City—put Brad and his Harley-Davidson on a paved track and put the best riders you can find up against him, and then bet on this California road racer — he'll win. That is, if his past performance is any indication at all — and it is.

Let's start at the beginning now, and give you the run-down on the Watkins Glen races:

Saturday morning, AMA referee Al Gentner opened the track for practice for all riders. There was to be no practice on Sunday because of the New York "Blue Laws." So, we saw the five lightweight classes and the Class C novices, amateurs and experts in a preview of things to come.

Lightweights and the big bikes went back to the pits. Pretty soon, however, the announcer called the Class I bikes to the line.

Not long thereafter, starter Jim Davis dropped the flag. Class I (OHV to 100cc, 2 stroke to 125cc) was off and running. Almost all, that is. The little bikes were off to a fast start, but one was left standing: Number 202, a Rumi ridden by Karlheinz Baier, was still sitting. His mechanic ran out to the line, but before he got there, Karl was on his way. (Old-timers will remember the mechanic, Don Smith, one time expert, holder of the one-mile dirt-track Langhorne record.)

Karl had a screaming Rumi under him, and he revved the bike up to the top.

And, the young German rider, in his first American race, passed rider after rider.

Finally, the flying German rider passed New England rider Alan Leston, also riding a Rumi, and went on to win.

Class II bikes were called to the line. A bunch of hot Maicos were favored. Eddy Kreider, of Goodville, Pa., beat out second place man Fred Badessa, in a race that looked Maico from start to finish. Those are the official statements. But not the real

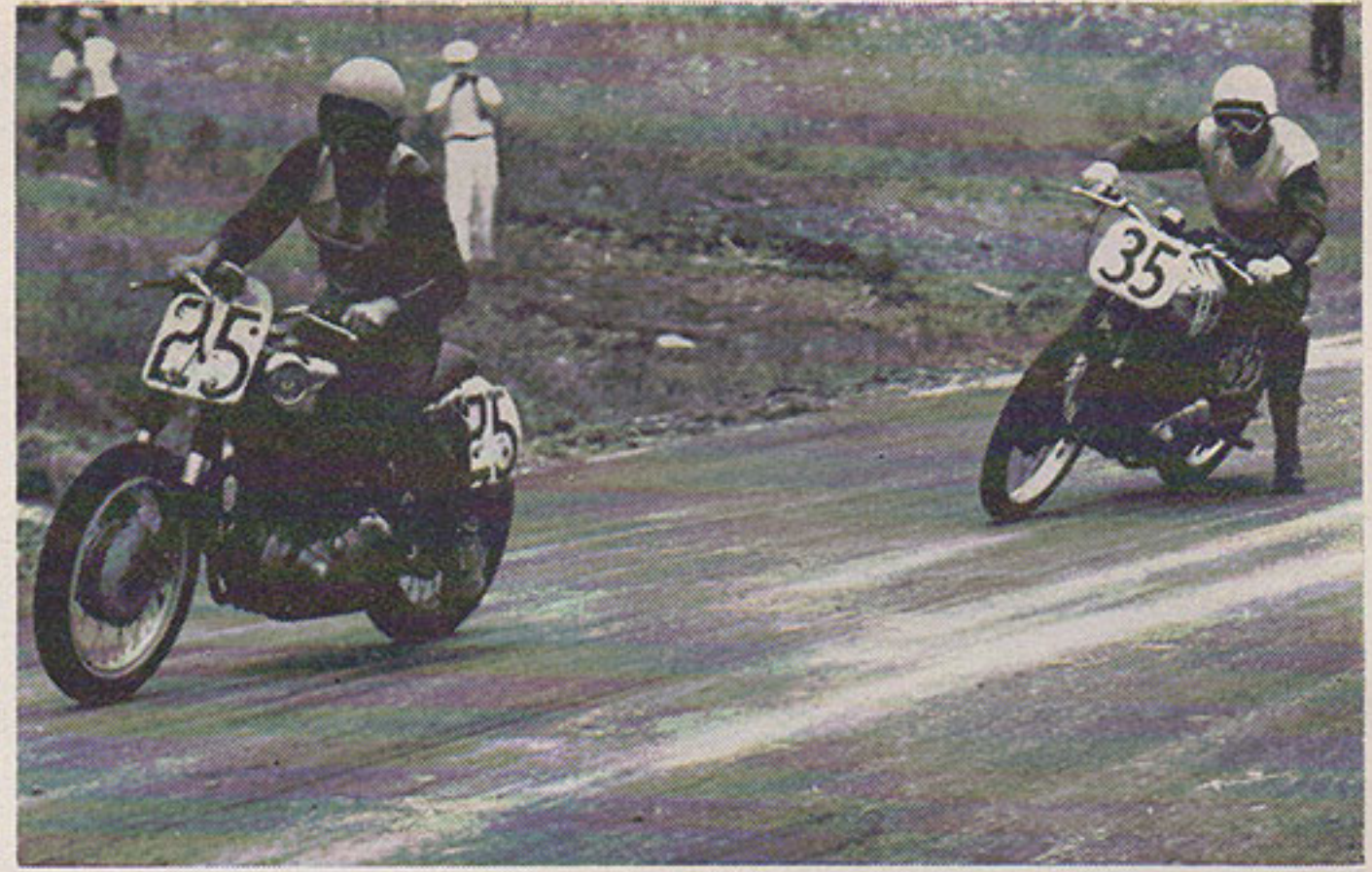
results. Battling along, lap after lap, were the broadsliding Volkmars. The Volkmars — Horace, George and Chick, well-known to eastern fans, are broadsliding experts on dirt or pavement. They have won race after race this year, with one or another of them bringing his 165 H-D into second and third. The Volkmars are the choice of many fans in the east. Despite their broadsliding, the Volkmars were beaten. It was a long race on a 2.3 mile course. After

the race, the Volkmar fans (of which, I frankly admit to being a charter member) decided that "Marlboro will be different."

Triumphs showed the way in Class III with flashy rider (and many-time winner) Jimmy Haymes, of Washington, D. C., getting off to a very big lead. But, Haymes lost his fire, and second place man Dave Harmon moved into the lead — a big lead — biggest lead of any race of the meet — and won with ease. Young Dave Harmon (no doubt being coached by Cliff Guild), rode a smooth and polished race, being especially noteworthy on his cornering — a bit of riding that resembled the riding of Eddie Kretz and Sherman Cooper, the expert racers from whom Dave Harmon is evidently copying his style.

Class Four was two races in one. Amateurs and experts were on the line. AMA referee Al Gentner gave the word to starter Jim Davis to get the first group under way. One minute after, and Jim Davis started the experts. Flash came Cliff Guild, one of the greatest lightweight racers in the country — and he overshot the first turn! The entire field got ahead of him. Billy Myers, Bill Burkholder, Dave Ball, Smiley Paulson, George Popp, Ed Fisher, Ron Watkins — these are some of the greatest small bike racers of this continent — and they got ahead of Guild. But Cliff kept his throttle turned on to

full wick. And he passed many riders. But not enough. He took fourth.

Bill Burkholder, the very popular Pennsylvania rider, won the expert race, followed by hard-riding Bob Burnett, the Ducati expert and Don Dahler. Ron Dahler — a very stylish rider — a "Englisher," was the man to beat, but he was up against a tough bunch of riders.

Steve Richardson, a Ducati rider of New Jersey, proved his riding skill by beating off a strong challenge from Triumph rider Sal Cardinale, of New York, in the sportsman section of Class 4.

Frank Thieme, riding a BSA Star, was the winner of the "big bike" lightweight class, with a masterful race. Class Five was a noisy race, with screaming bikes.

And — the Saturday feature. The Class C races, novice class. Four rows were on the line. They rolled their throttles, waiting for starter Jim Davis to drop the flag — and he did. Off they went. Through the tightly packed first turn — and nobody went down. This set the pattern. Throughout the two days, the ambulance never had a chance to run around the course.

Jim Davis got the novices off to a clean, fast start. This was the road racing you wanted to see. But lap after lap saw spill after spill as the novices went too deep into the turns.

Spill after spill — but no racer was hurt.

The novices were cracking it on. It's hard to say who did what and where. One thing stood out, however. Dan Barnes, BSA rider of Ithaca, N. Y., was really turning on the throttle. He was strongly challenged by Canadian rider Denton Craig, and fellow New Yorker Richard Randell, but Barnes won, after setting what is probably a novice record for the Glen.

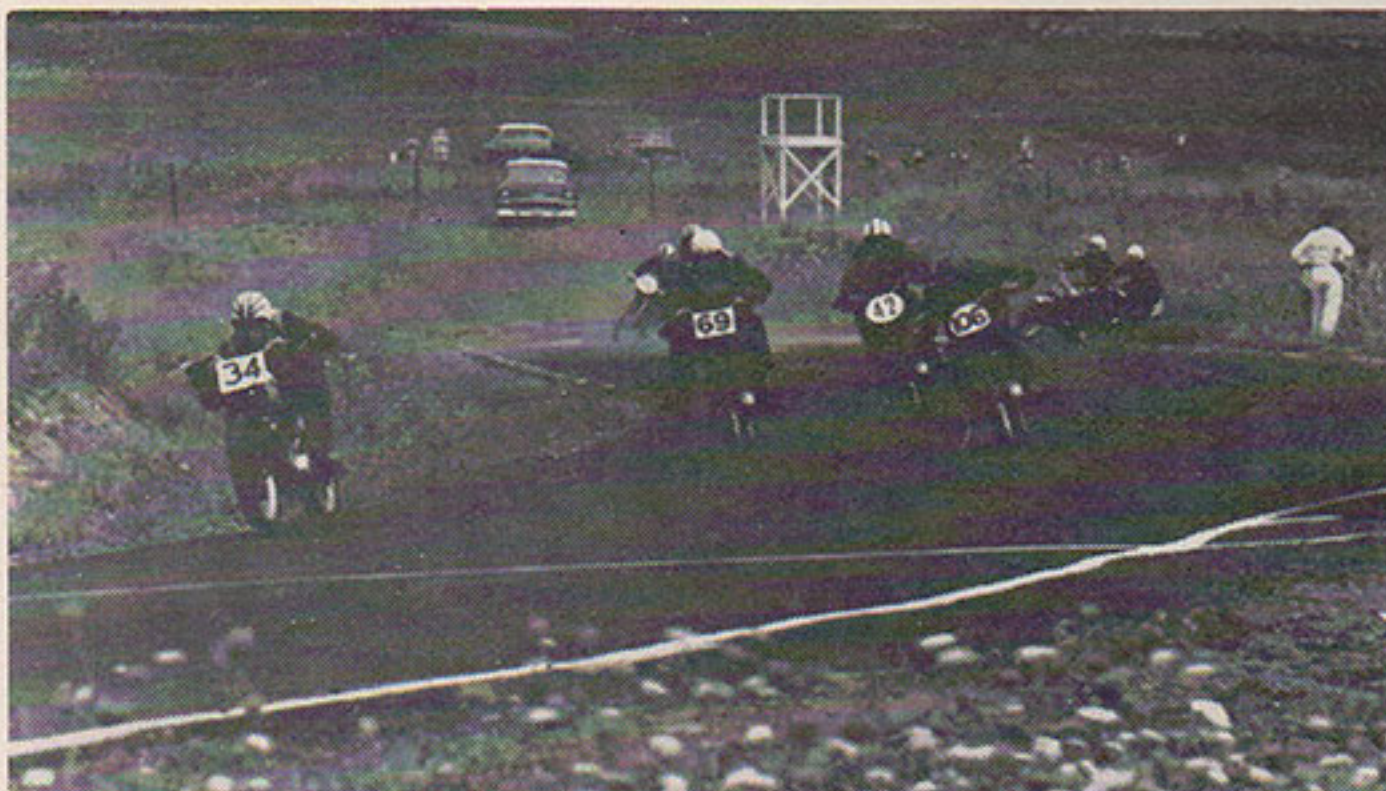
The novices passed and passed again. But — tuning and dependability plus riding skill, and perhaps a bit of luck — decided the winners.

Sunday morning. That was it. Early in the morning the Motor Maids met for breakfast; paraded from town up to the track and, after the line-up and judging of the uniformed clubs, the gal riders took a tour of the track.

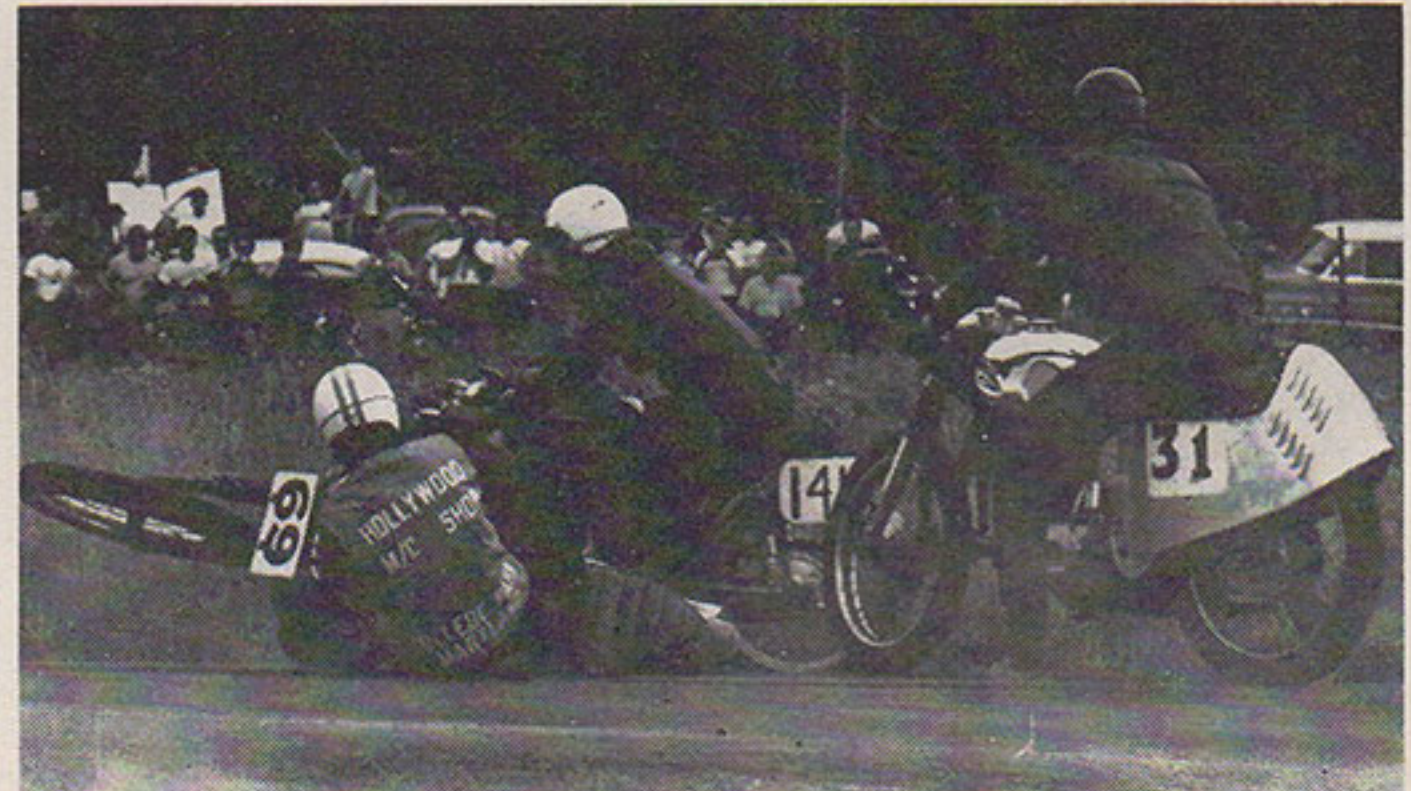
Mr. Gantner allowed a few laps of expert and amateur practice, and right he was, since a few of the racers hadn't had time to get around the course.

And now, excitement. Amateur riders to the line. The National Anthem is played. Motors are started. Then, a surprising announcement. There was to be a lap around the track, following the sidehack, and, if the racers were in position, Jim Davis was to drop the flag for a running start. It wouldn't work. But it did. They came around, with perfect discipline.

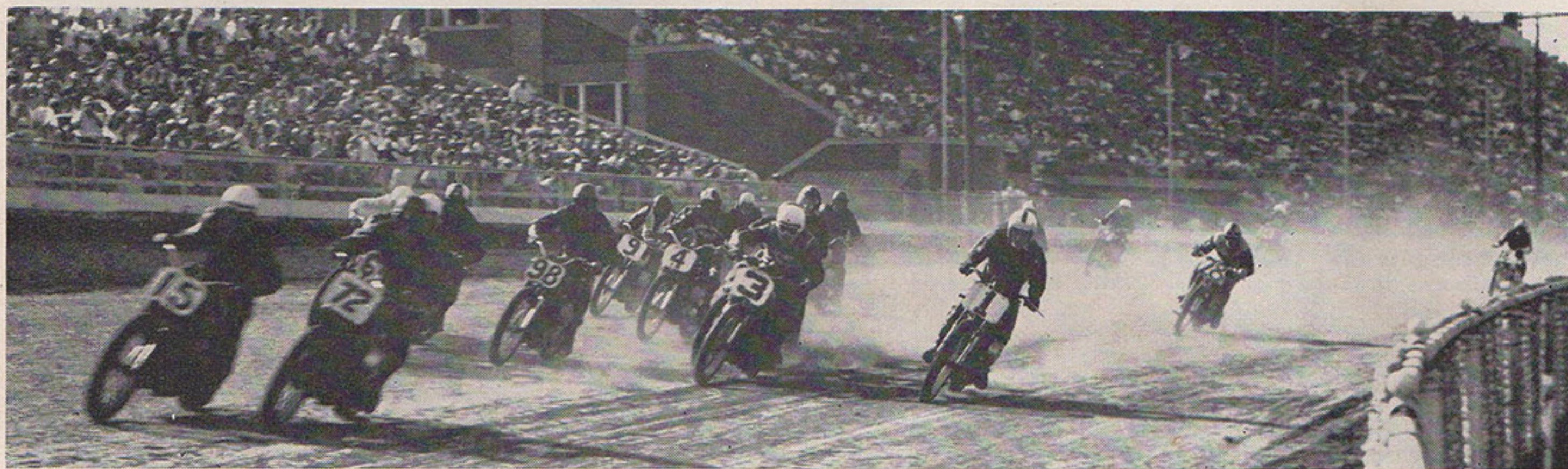


Lightweights sweep through S-turn on uphill grade.

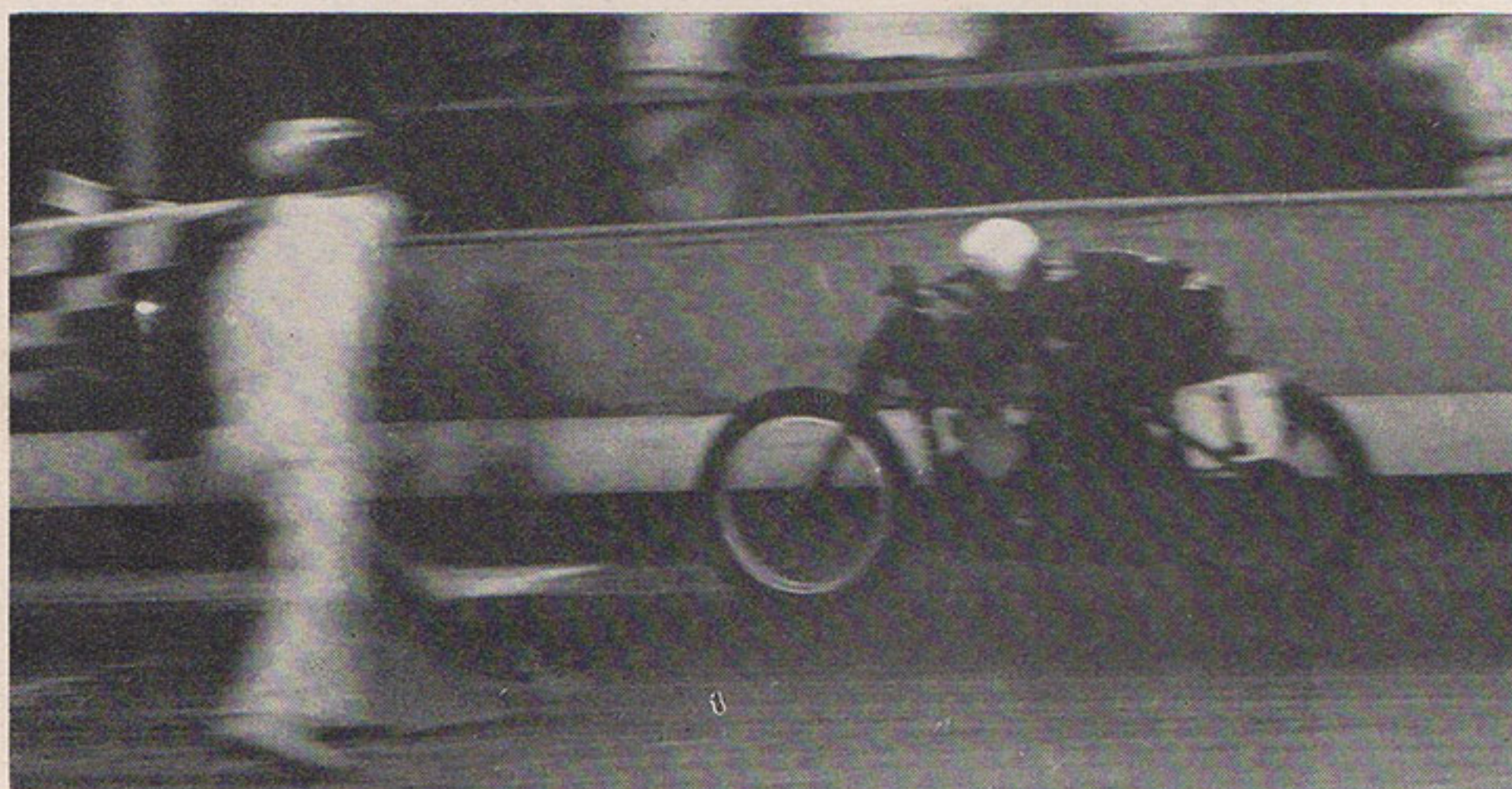


Down in the corner in a lightweight event, but not for long.

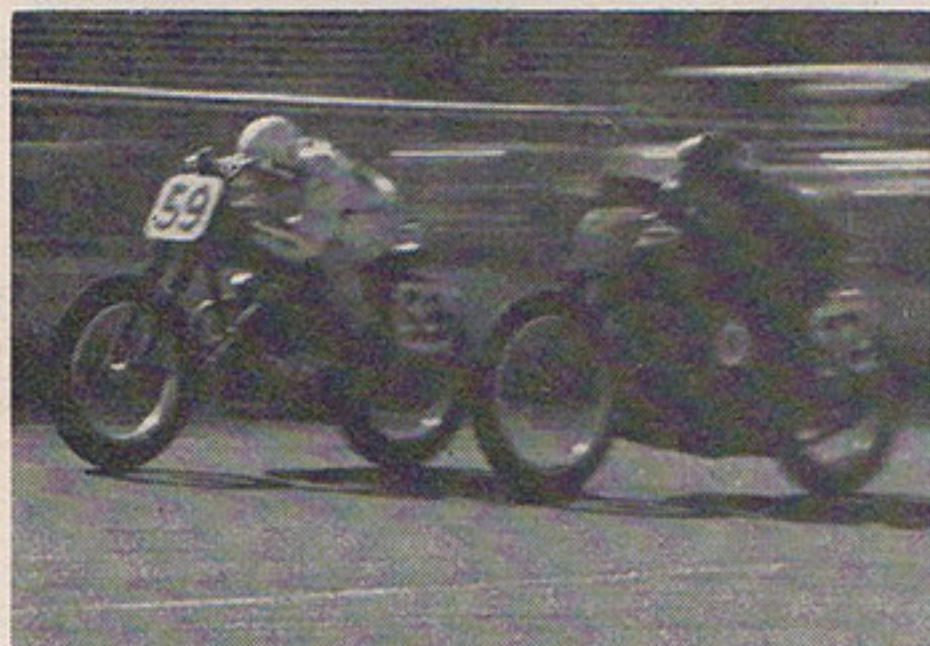
Resweber Romps To New Record In Springfield 50-Miler



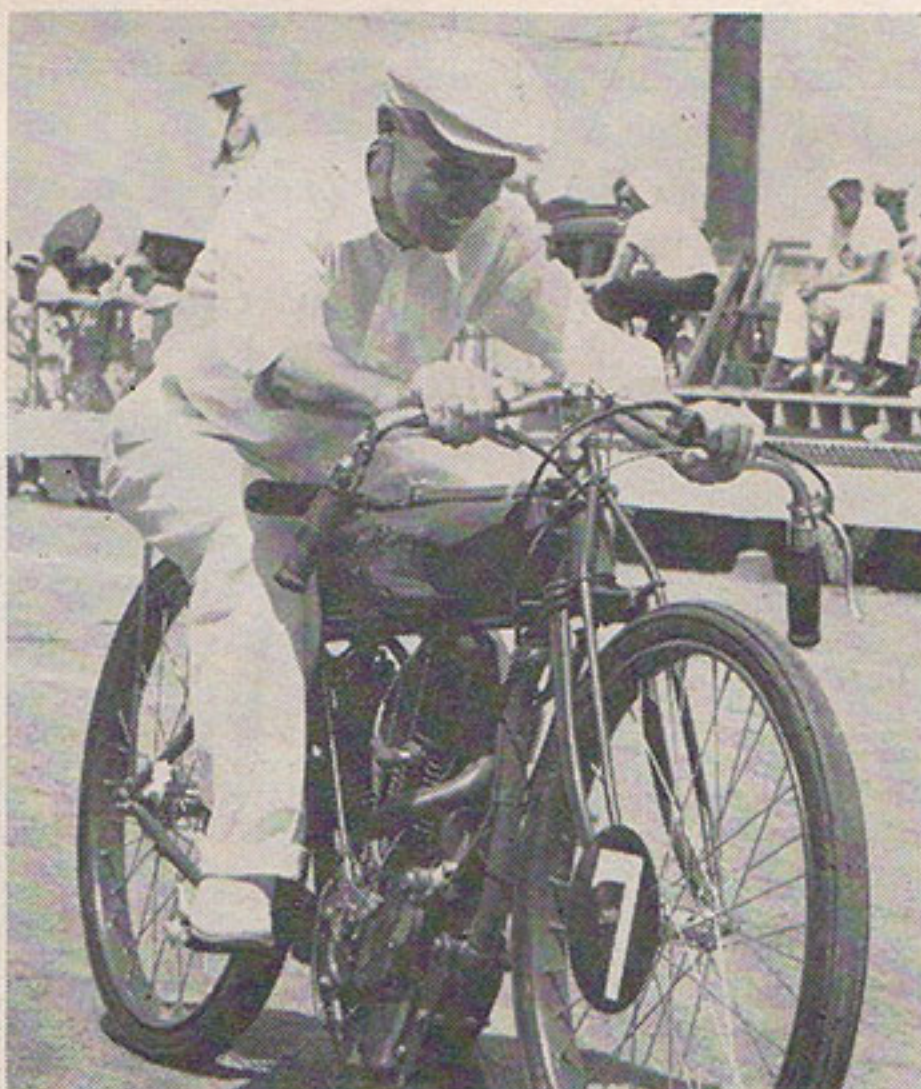

August 23, 1959—Carroll Resweber left little doubt today that he has earned the No. 1 that he carries. Twenty of the best experts for not only 1959, but for the past ten years, went to the starting line for the 50 mile national championship, and although Resweber's 40.81 time trial was the only one under 41 seconds, the winning times for the qualifying heat races gave no indication of a runaway by any one rider.

Resweber won the first ten mile heat in 6 min. 55.90 sec., Gunter took the second in 6 min. 56.03, Brashear the third in 6 min. 57.04, Joe Leonard the fourth in 6 min. 55.22 and Markel won the fifth and final heat in 6 min. 56.77 sec. With four men from each heat qualifying for the 50 mile national, the first line of ten was made up of Gibson on the pole (fastest heat), Resweber, Gunter, Brashear, Markel, Leonard, Courtney, Mann and Klamfoth. The second line had Tanner, Goff, Morra, Gholson, Andres, Molyneaux, Dorresteyn, Morris, Lassiter, David Gunter and Bobby Hill.

There is a breathless pause, with no sound in the air except the noise of the engines on the line being gunned, and then Starter Jim Davis drops the flag and 15,000 spectators are up with a roar to see the riders into the first turn. The pack came across the line after the first lap with Markel leading followed closely by Resweber, Gunter, Mann, Klamfoth, Leonard and the rest of the field not more than a wheel length off pace.

Immediately after crossing the starting line for the second lap, Resweber took over the lead and then proceeded to gain from 1 to 2 seconds on the field. The

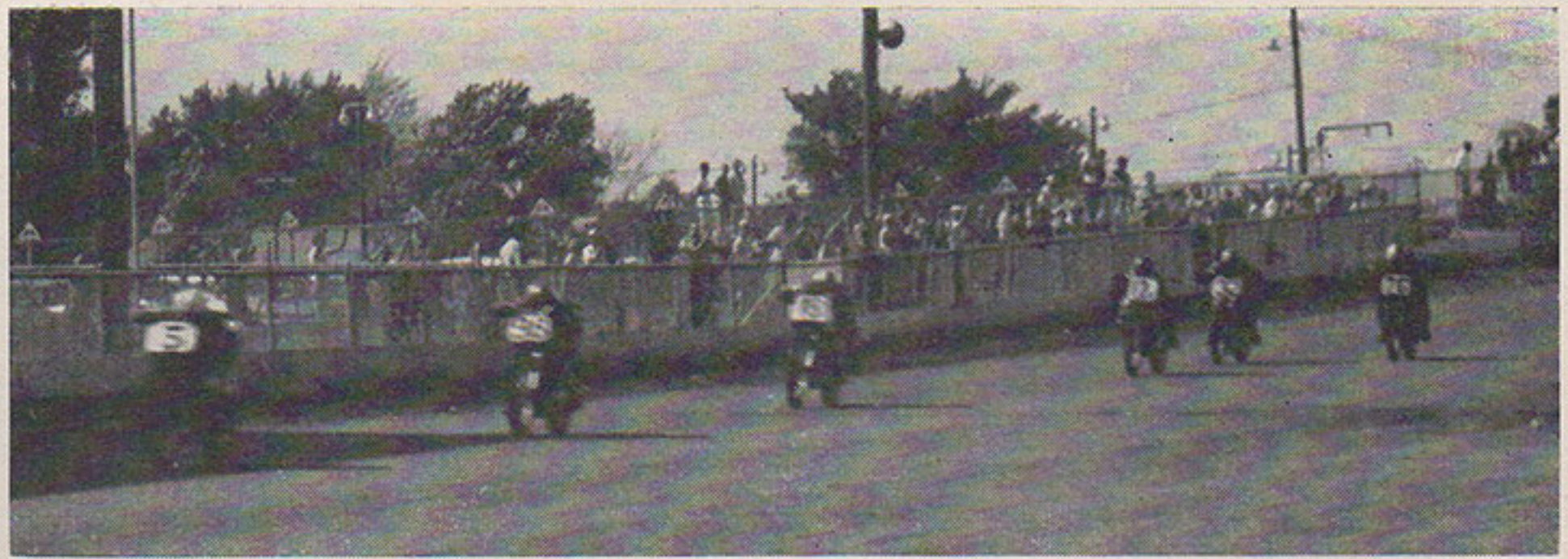


Packing double with the champ. Resweber's attractive wife, Delores, gives the new 50 mile champ a hug at race's end.

track was fast and smooth with a wide groove on the turns. It was a perfect track, and Resweber took full advantage of it.

Although Resweber was way out in front, the crowd was kept in a constant roar as the balance of the field rode in two tight groups of seven or eight riders each. Back in second place Markel held a safe margin over third place and the riders who followed; but from third place back to tenth place the positions changed constantly in and out of the turn. From tenth to sixteenth place the positions changed every lap. Gibson had to pull into the pits after the first lap to tighten up a handlebar, but returned to finish the entire race. Bates Molyneaux blew a tire, but also returned to finish in 18th place. Only David Gunter, leaving the race early and Tanner leaving after 25 laps, did not complete the 50 mile national.

This was Resweber's day, and a lot of credit goes to the tuning job done by Ralph Berndt. Even the "old pro's," Leonard, Klamfoth, Gibson, Andres, Brashear and nineteen other starters had to agree that Resweber had the feel today. Resweber didn't make any mistakes as he held it on a little longer in the turns and as he threaded his way through the field to lap every rider, except Markel (2nd) and Mann (3rd), at least once and lapped every rider back of seventh place at least two times. Resweber was a "Rider's" rider today as he won the 50 Mile national championship in the record time of 33 min. 25.11 sec. and picked up another 9 points in the Grand National Champion Point Standing to take the first substantial

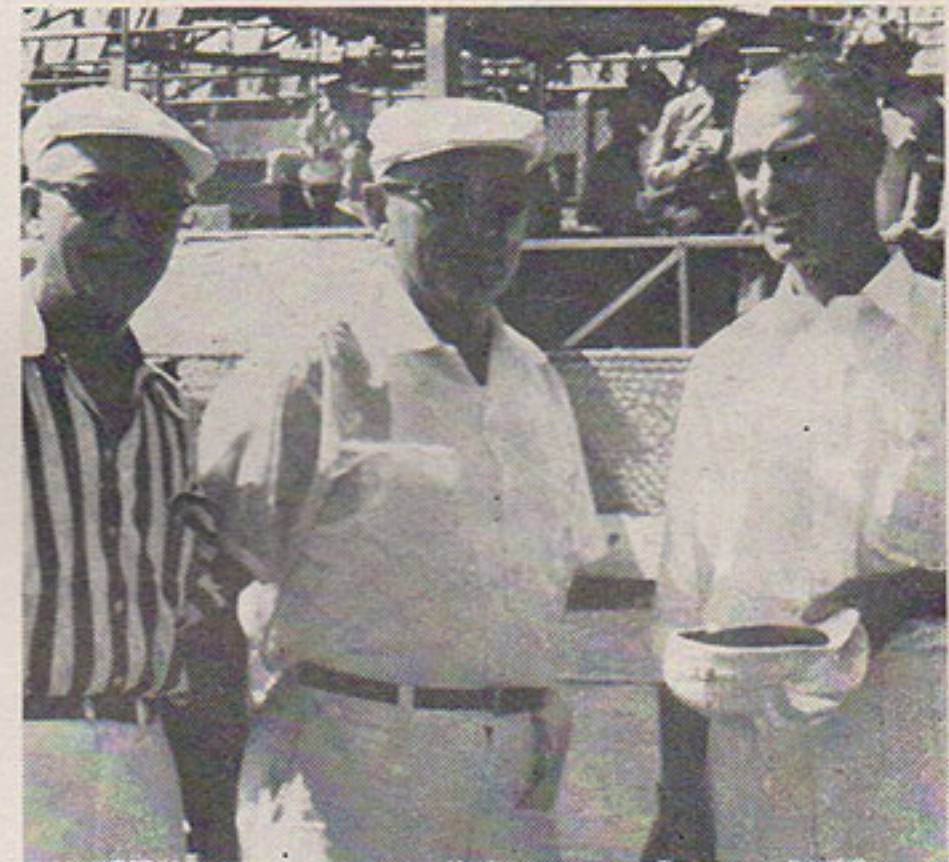

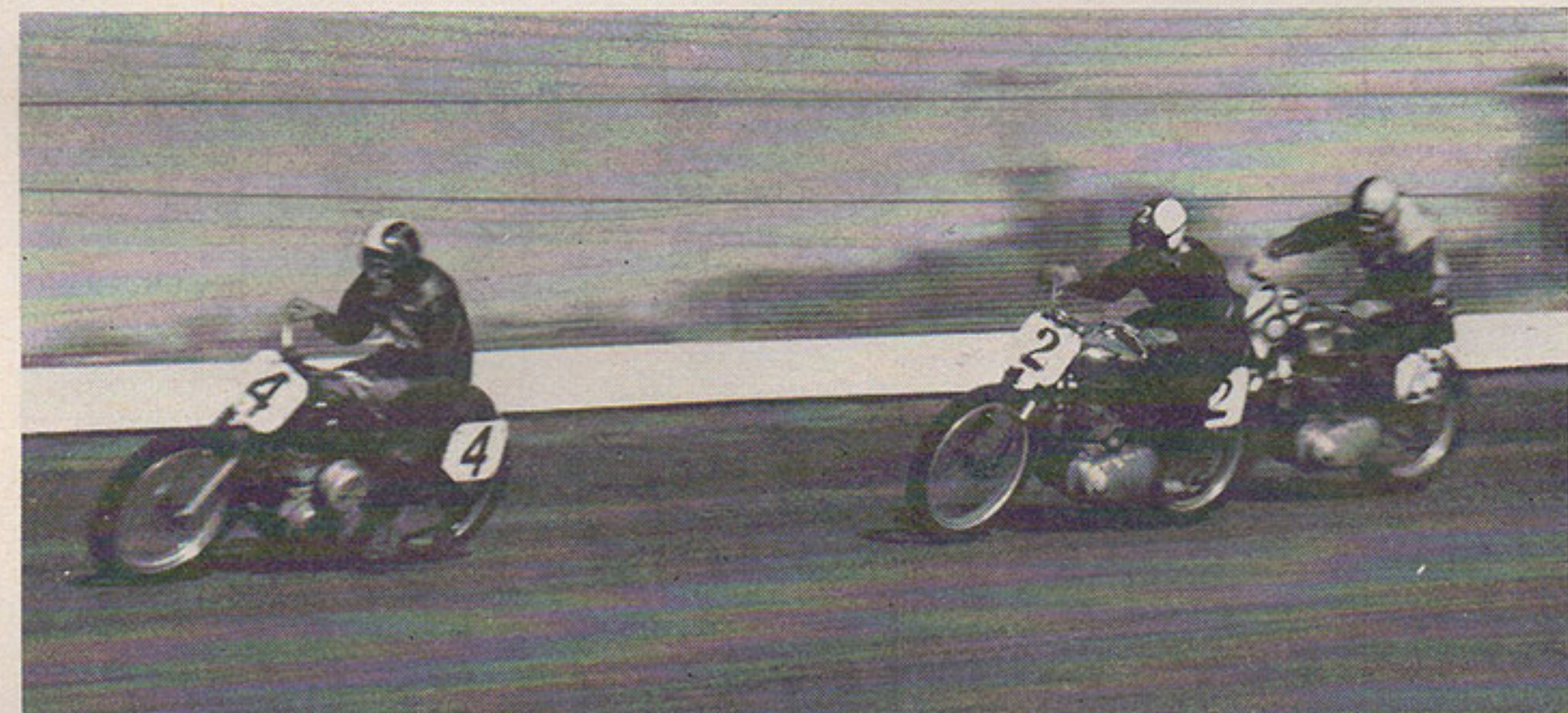

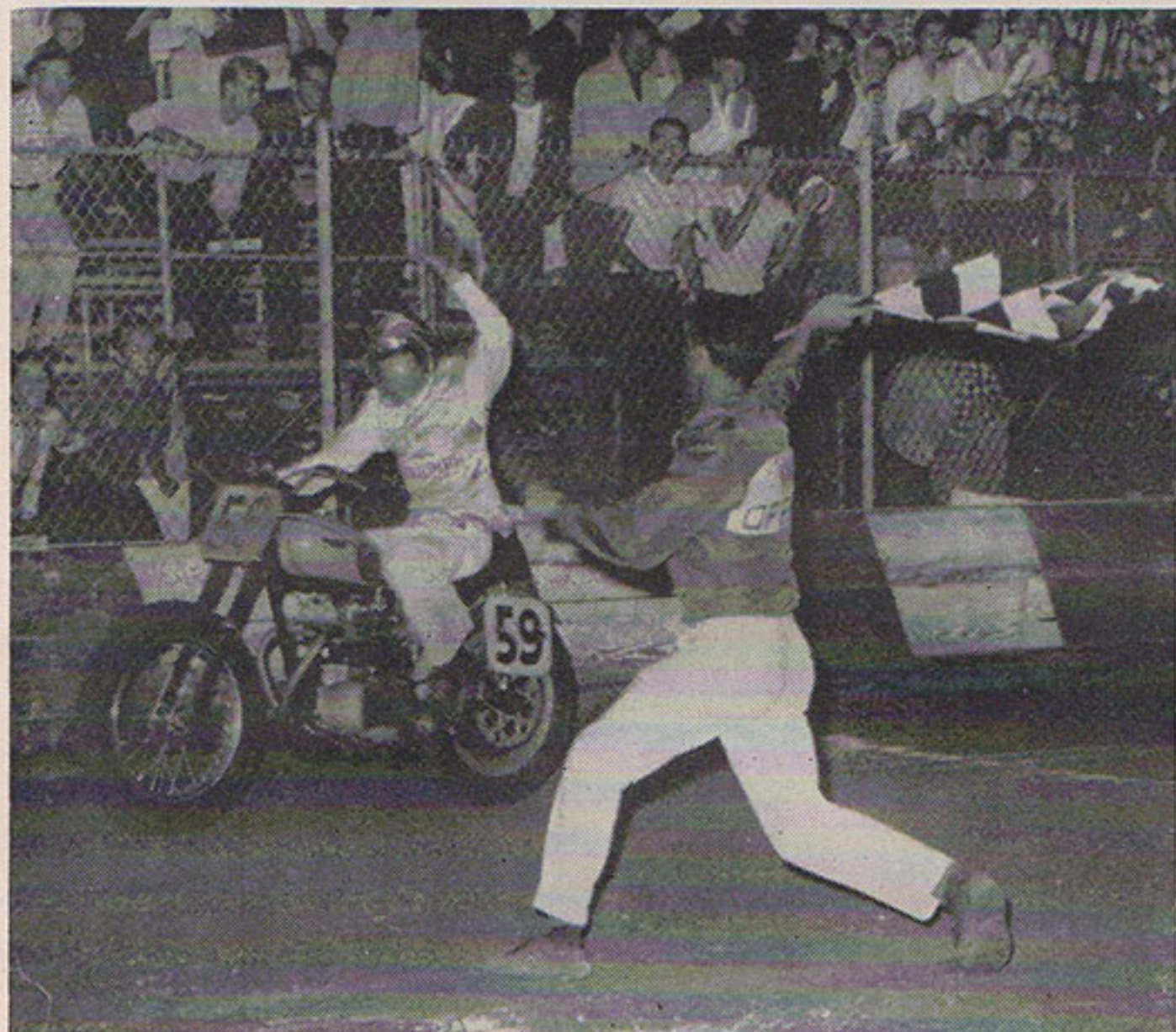
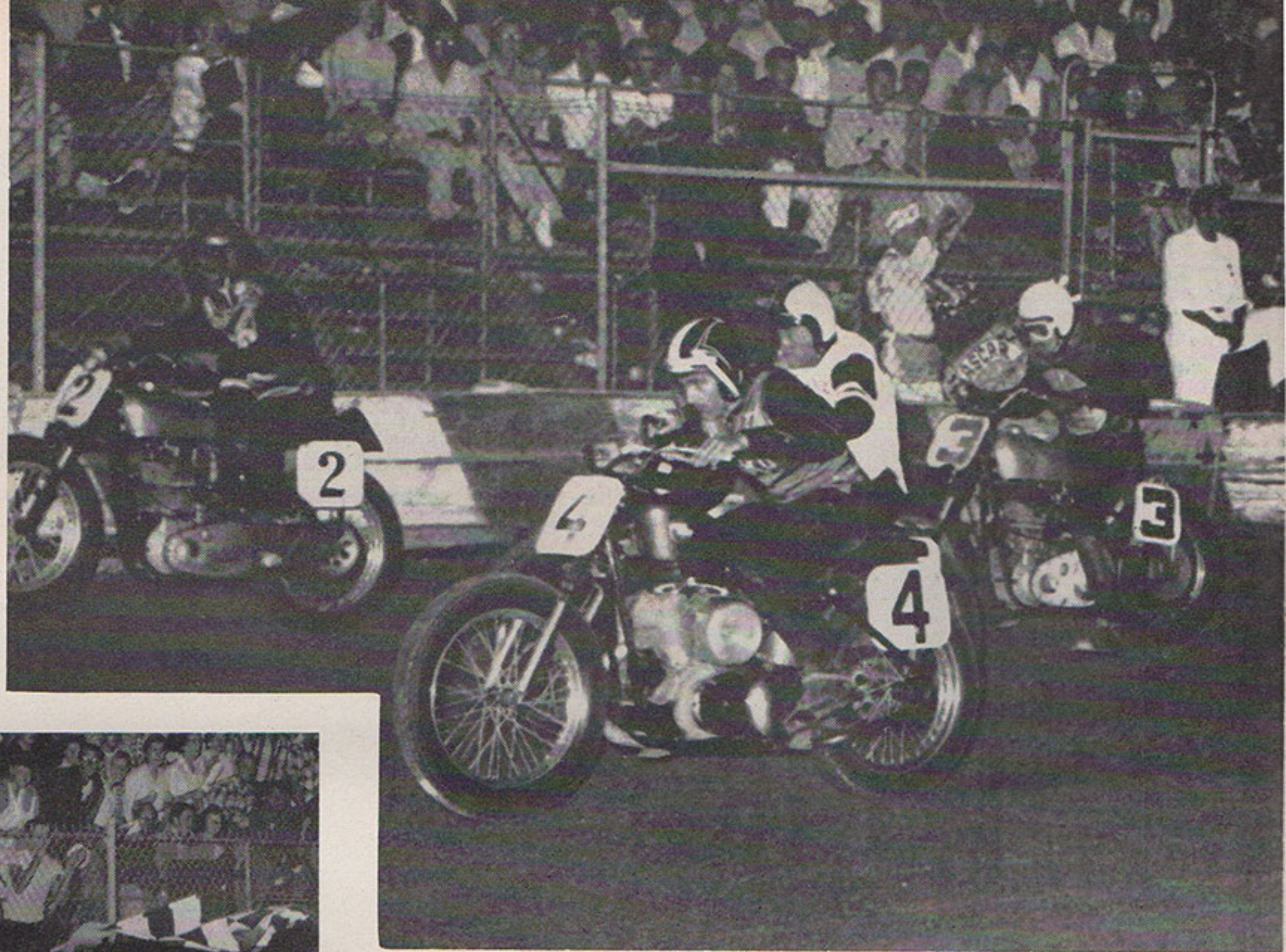


High on the backstretch, Brad Andres leads Dick Klamfoth and Elmer Morra into the third corner.

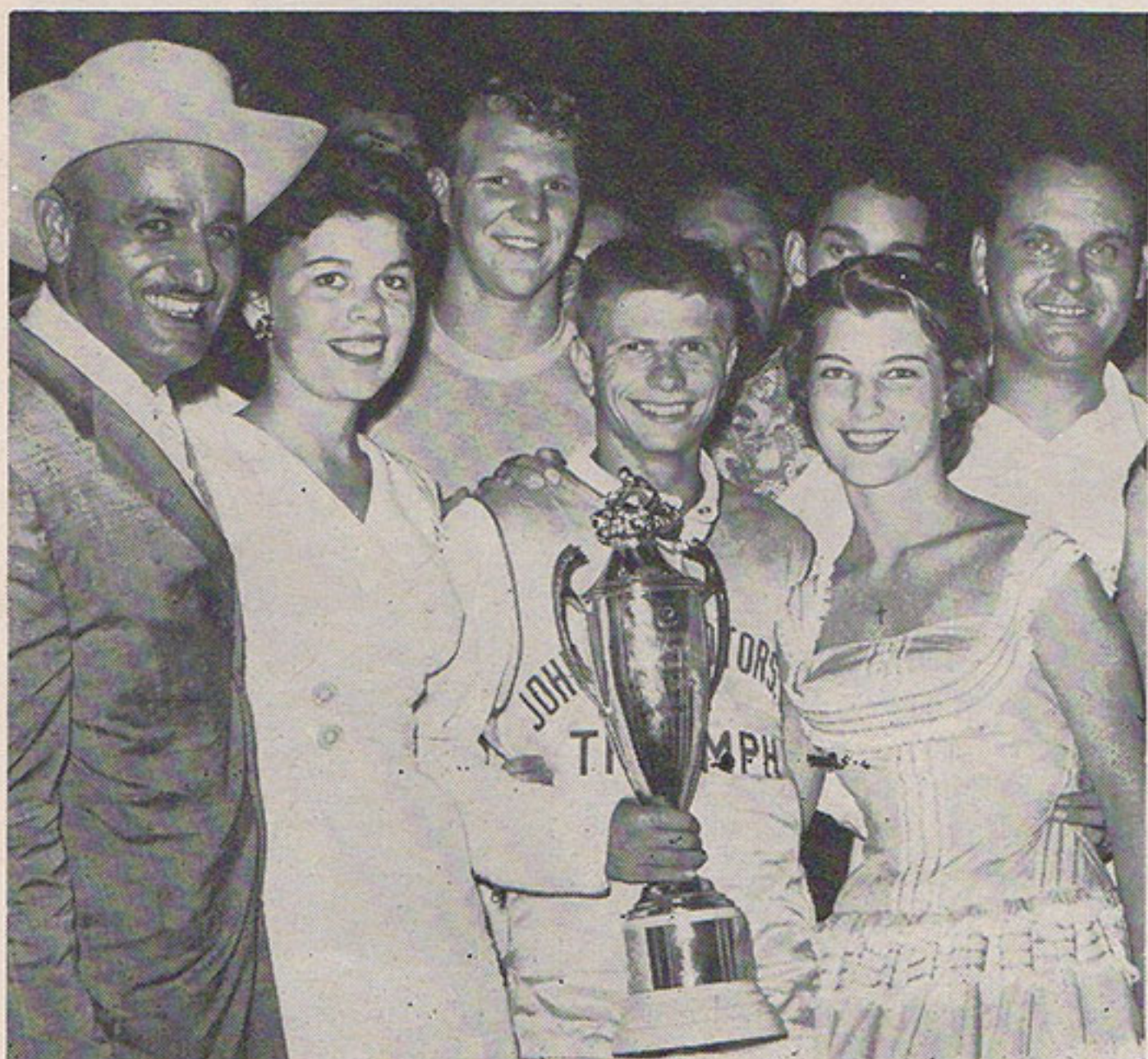

Tanner Wins Thrilling Eight-Mile National

SAMMY "The Flying Flea" Tanner found the long way around to his liking and proceeded to smash the country's foremost half mile motorcycle "pros" in his sterling eight mile national victory July 25th. at Ascot Stadium, Gardena, Calif.

Tanner mounted on a new 5TA Triumph was challenged heatedly through the 20-lap feature by Al Gunter (BSA).

Gunter and Tanner staged a wheel to wheel duel in the last few laps that has become a classic to southern California racing fans.

Pre-race speculation had placed national champ Carroll Resweber (H-D) as the probable winner, Resweber then added more fuel to this contention as he stormed into a record breaking time trial run, followed by a ten-lap victory setting another track record. But Resweber's streak "played out" in the eight mile feature, as he suffered minor difficulties placing him two spots behind the sensational Tanner for a third place.

Former national champ Brad Andres (H-D) lagged a solid fourth, after capturing a hard fought heat first place win.

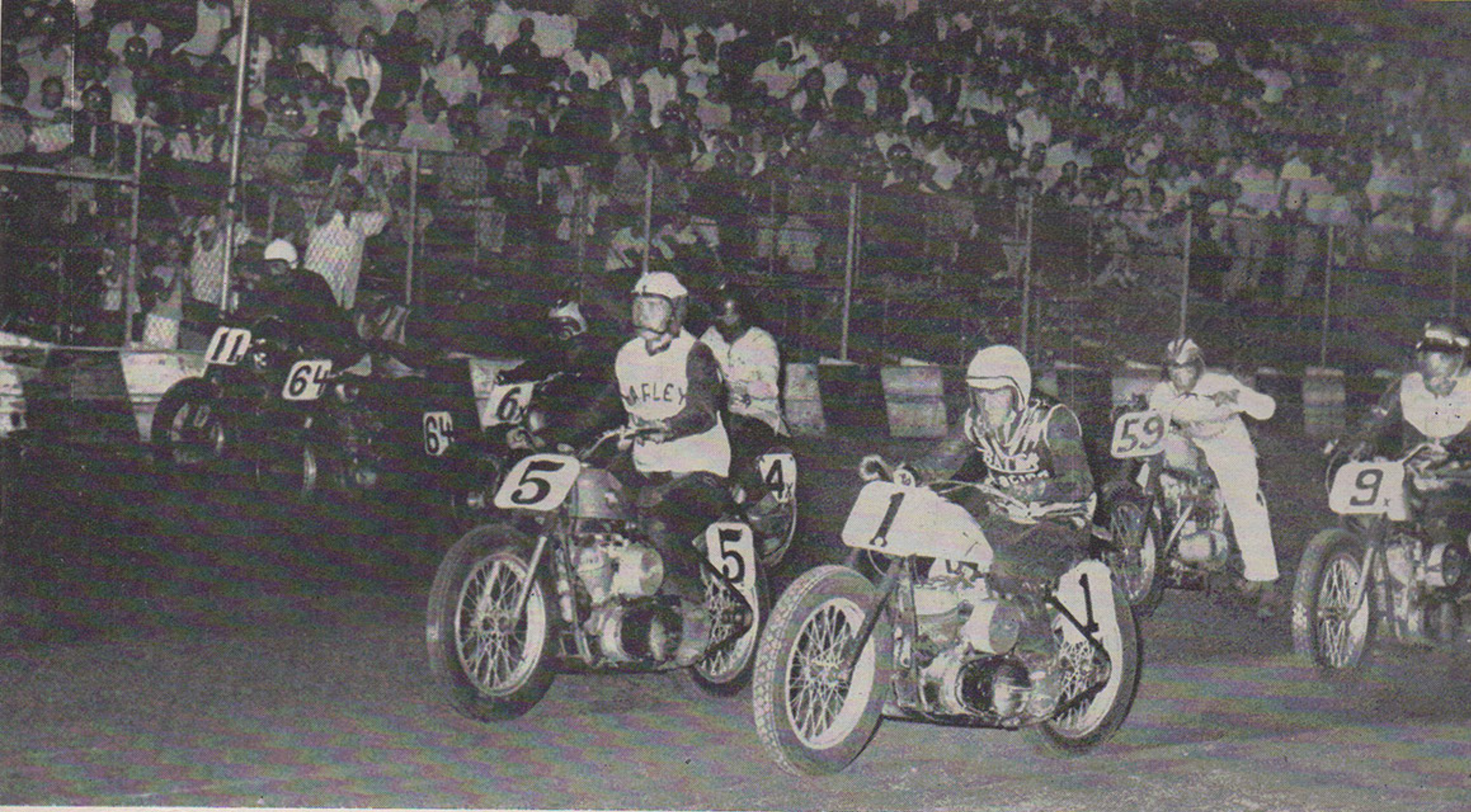
Flying Don Wehrman (H-D) motorcycle specialties rider followed Andres across the finish line for a fifth with Don Hawley (H-D) and Dick Klamfoth (BSA) lagging sixth and seventh respectively.

Tanner's outstanding showmanship and daring, placed him into the national spotlight as the nation's number four trackster in the 1959 point standings.

Troy Lee (H-D) and Jack O'Brien (BSA) dominated the amateur final, with the "Potent Mite" Troy Lee winning "going away".

O'Brien had set top time during time trials, but couldn't overhaul Lee in the feature.

With eight thousand screaming fans on their feet throughout the race, the 1959 eight-mile national has become a thrilling highlight in the classics of southern California.

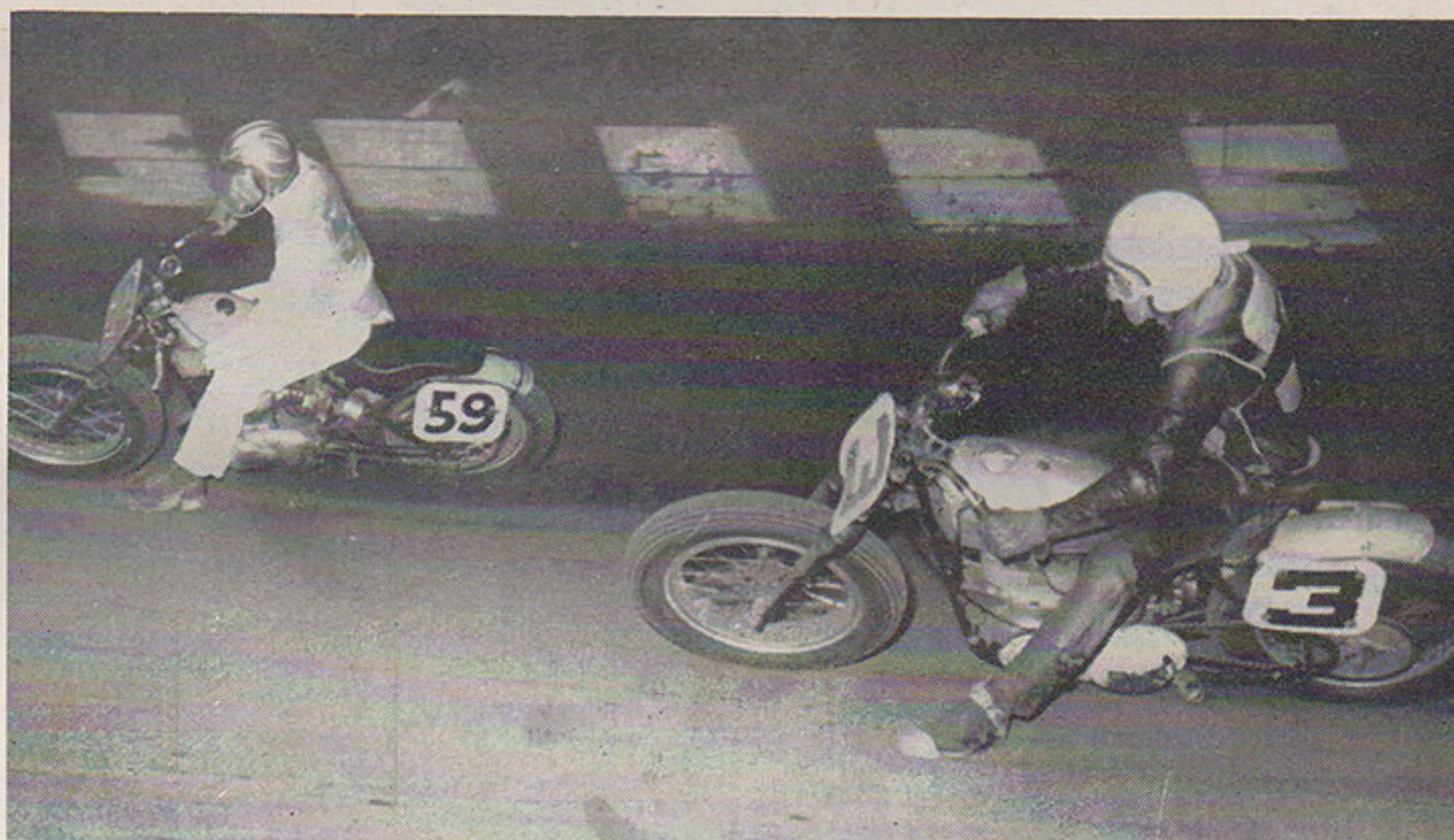

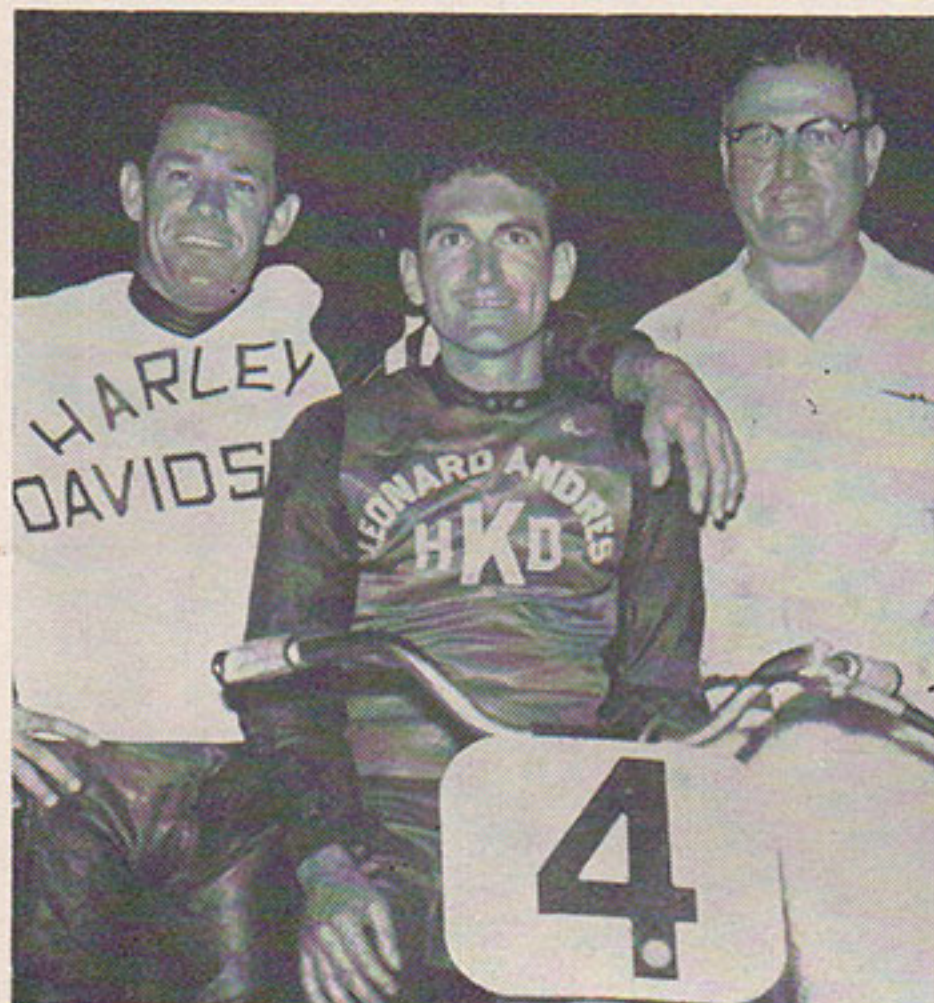

Tanner on the outside leads Gunter into a turn during their thrilling duel for the 8-mile national championship.

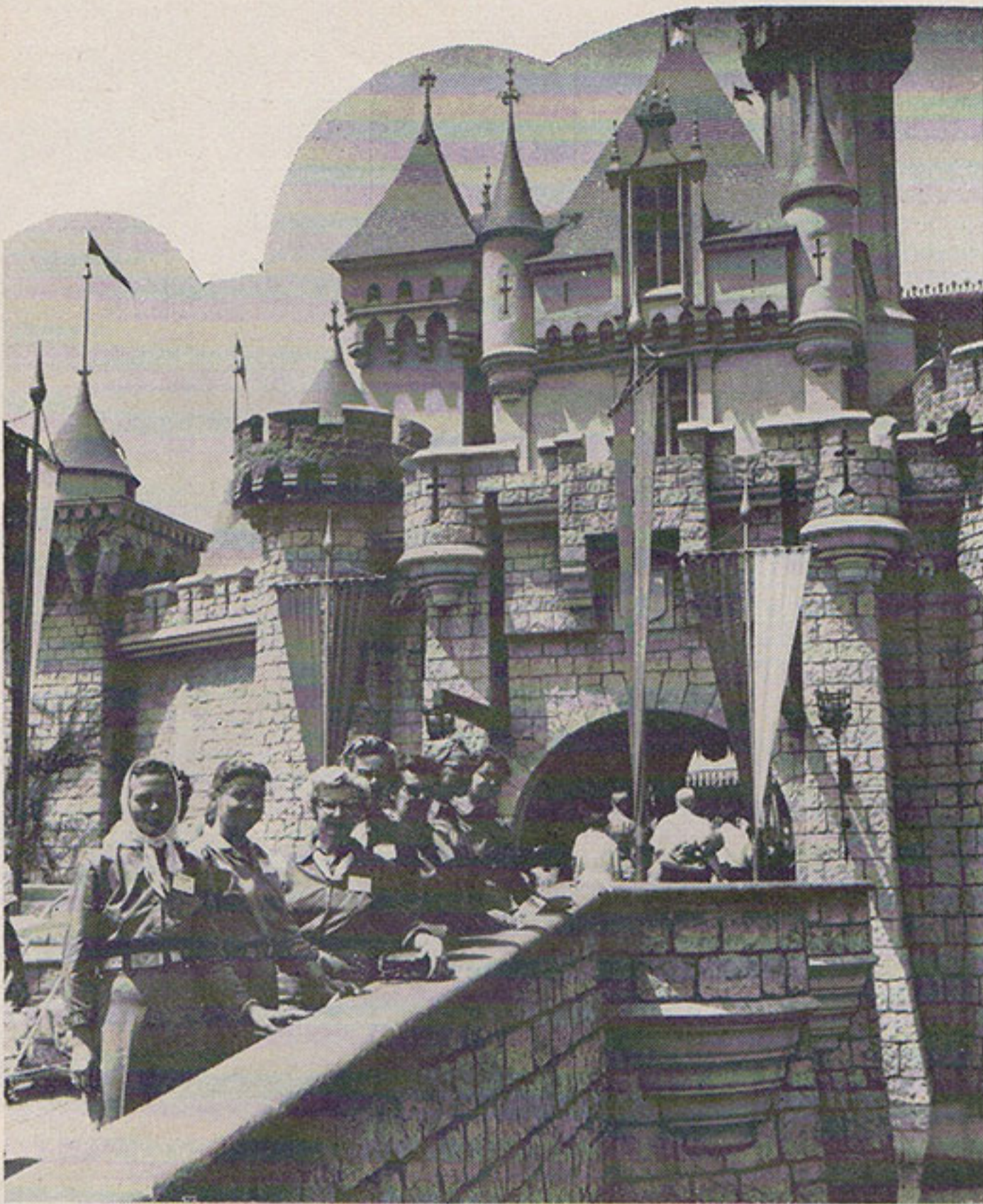

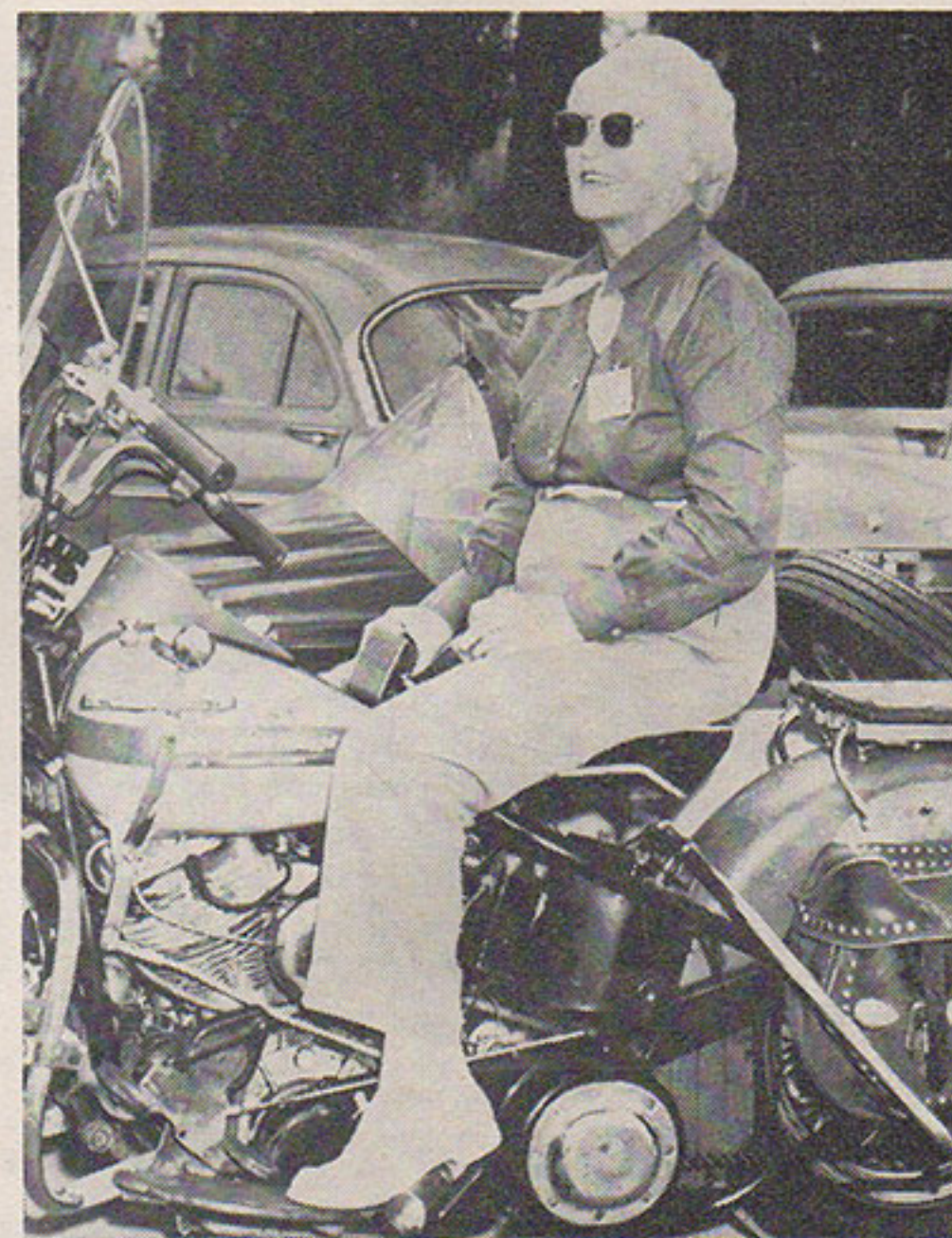

All entries must be postmarked no later than midnight, October 31, 1959. Entries postmarked after that deadline cannot be accepted. All entries and accompanying photographs become the property of AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING and will not be returned.

Voting will be by ballot. During the month of December ballots for the Most Popular and Typical Girl Rider will be mailed to all clubs. Each club will collectively agree on a first, second and third choice. First choice gives 50 points, second 30, and third 20. The winner will be presented her trophy at an outstanding event which will be announced later.

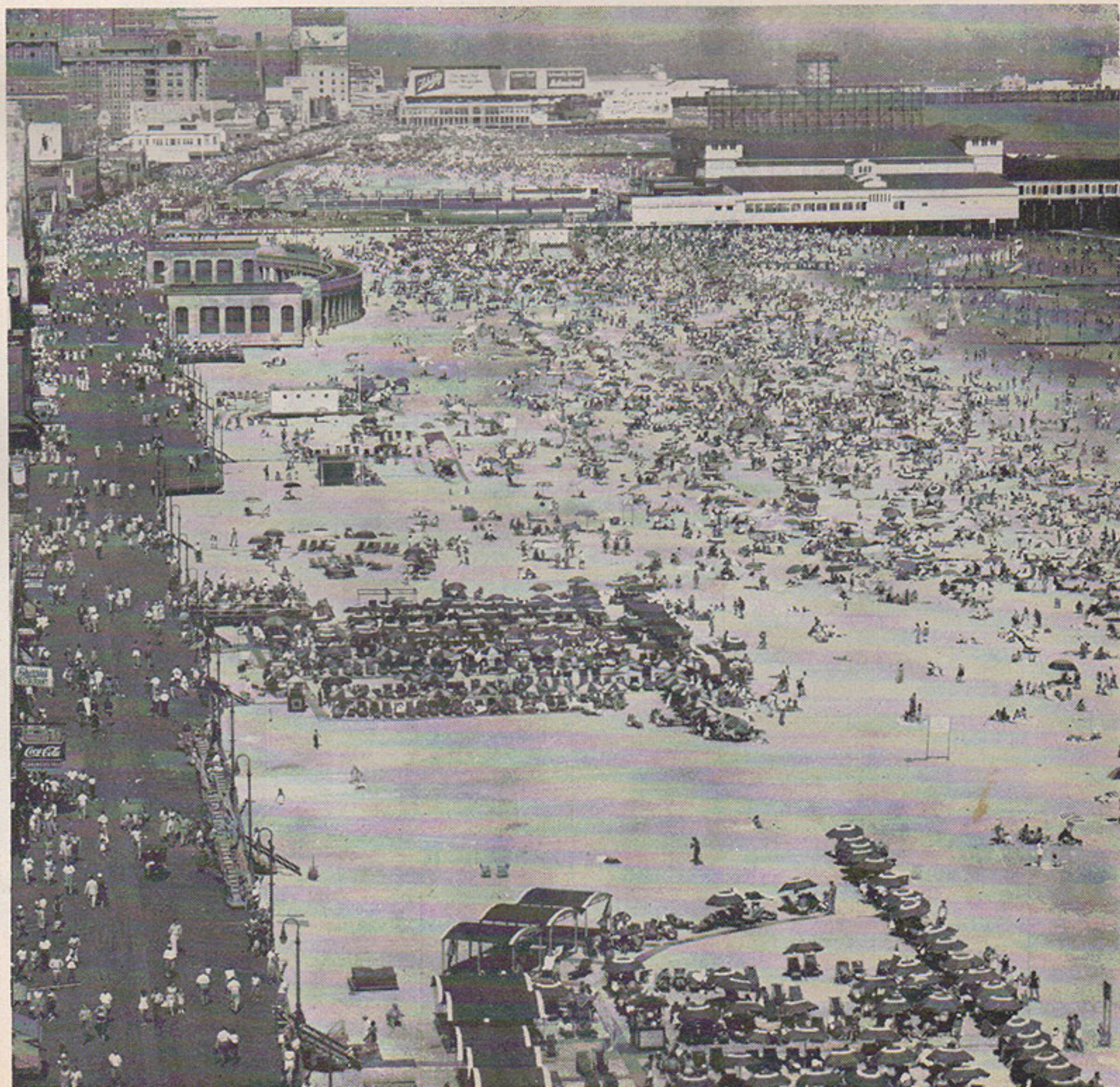
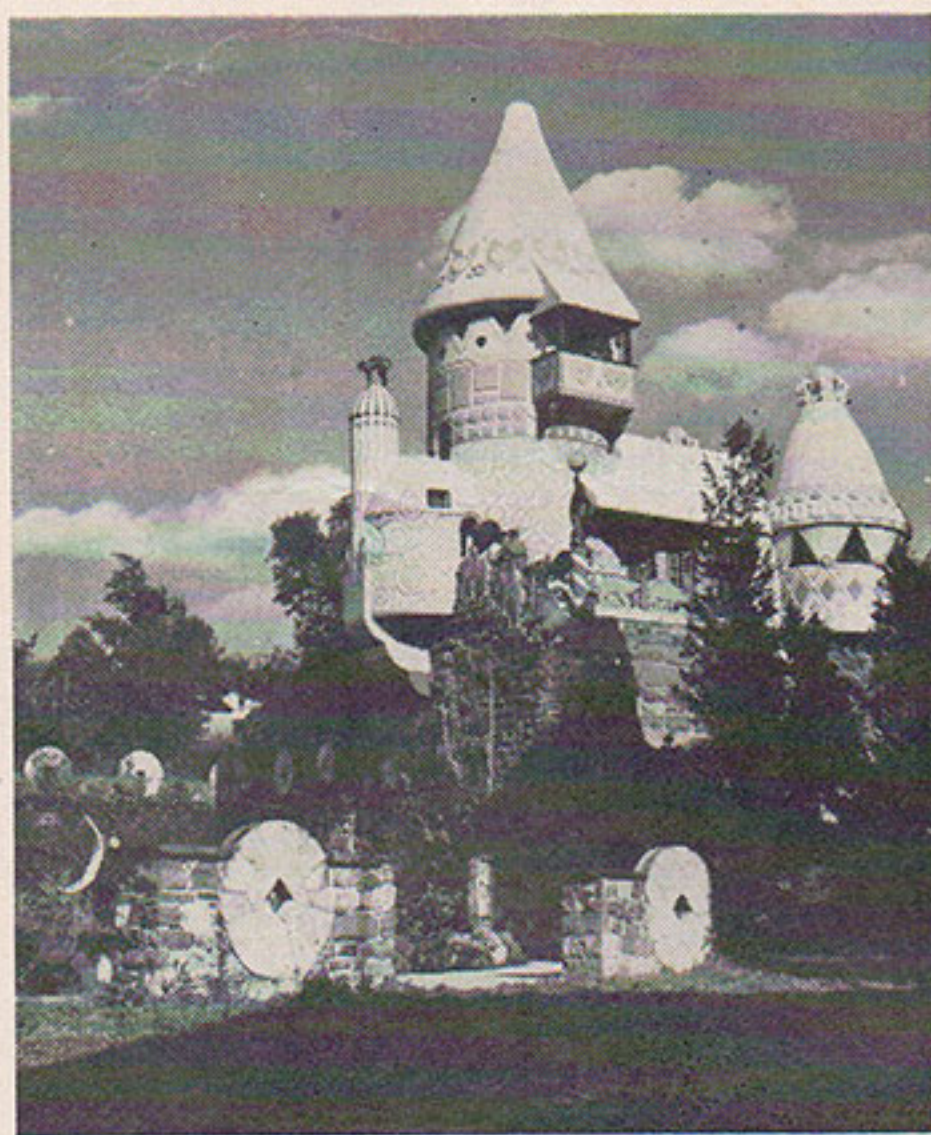

4. It is not necessary that a contestant be sponsored by more than one club.
5. All photographs become the property of AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING and none can be returned. AMERICAN MOTORCYCLING reserves the right to reject any entry.
6. Entries must be postmarked before midnight, October 31, 1959. Any entries dated after this deadline cannot be accepted.

Would you like to join us?

We're about to start out on a motorcycle trip which will take us from one end of the Garden State to the other. Before we get back home we will have tucked away enough pleasant memories to last us for years.

We find ourselves cruising down highway NJ-17, having just crossed the New York-New Jersey State Line near Suffern.

Klamfoth Wins Black Hills Events

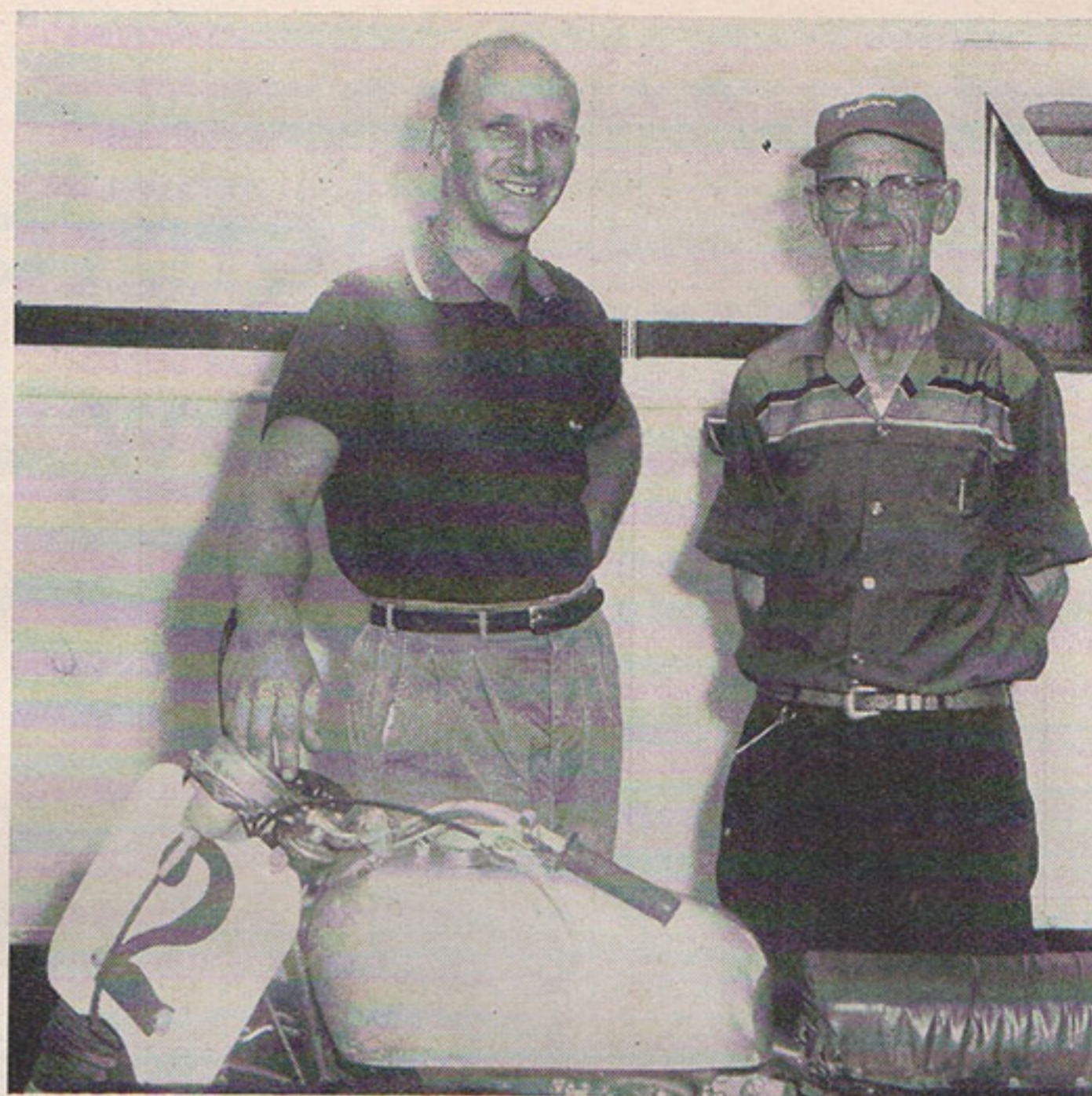

At Sturgis on August 8th, Dick Mann set a new track record of 27.12. The old record was held by Paul Albrecht who in 1952 set his record of 27.285.

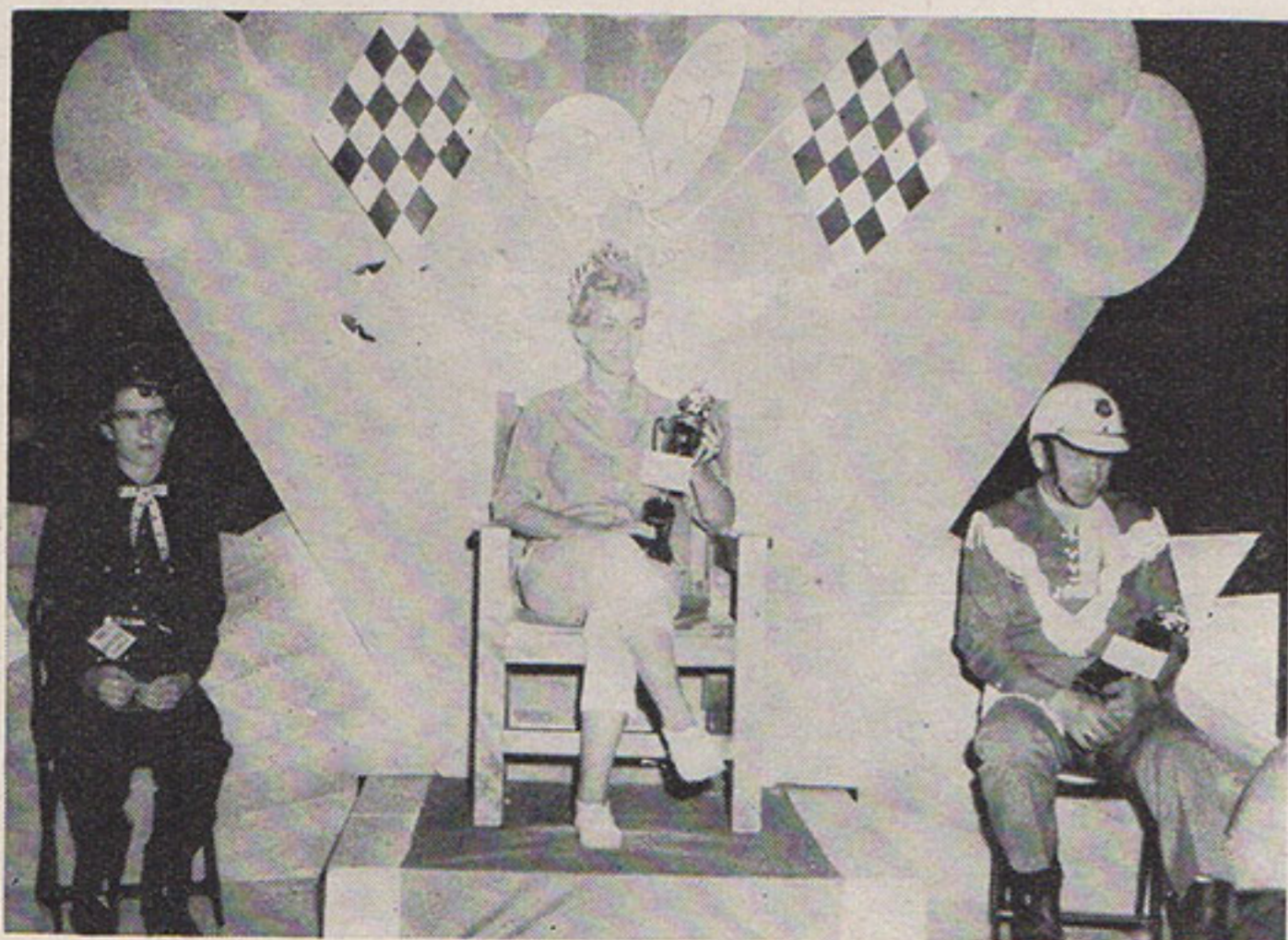

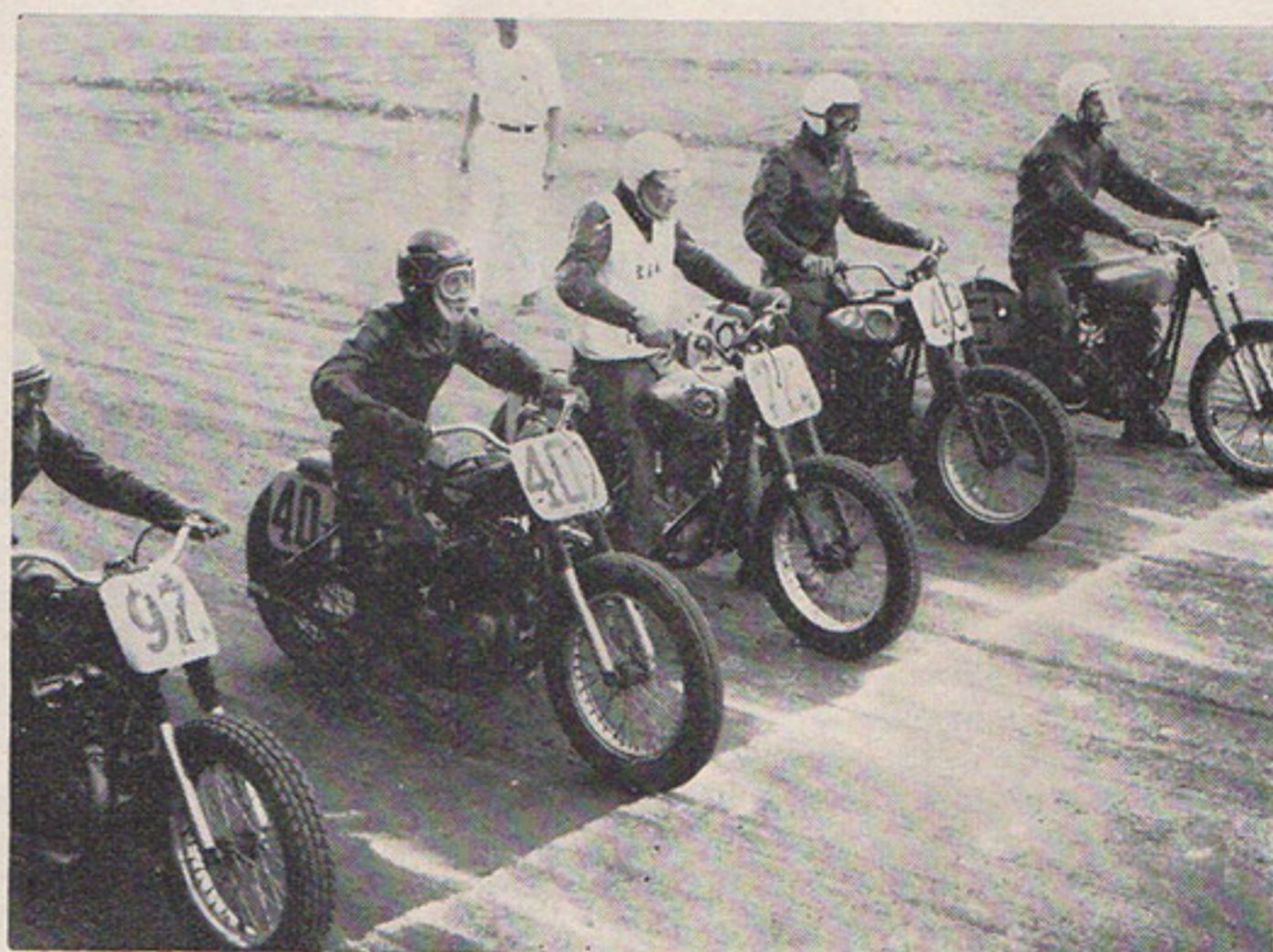

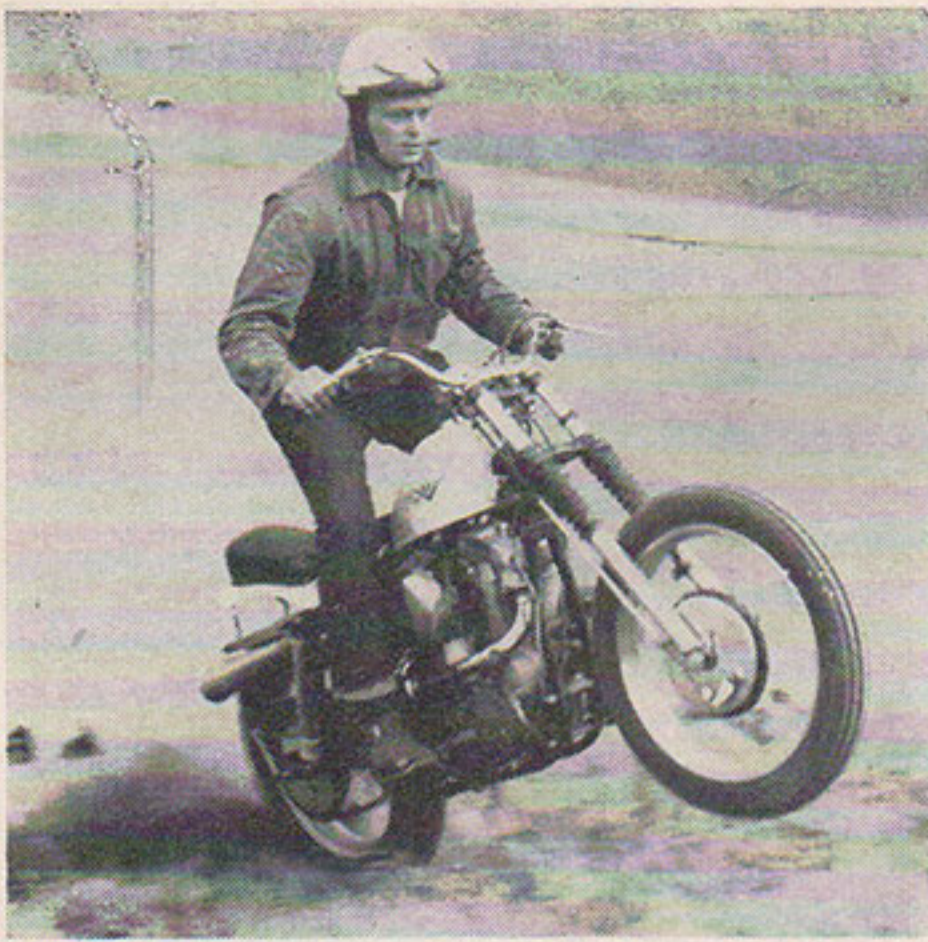

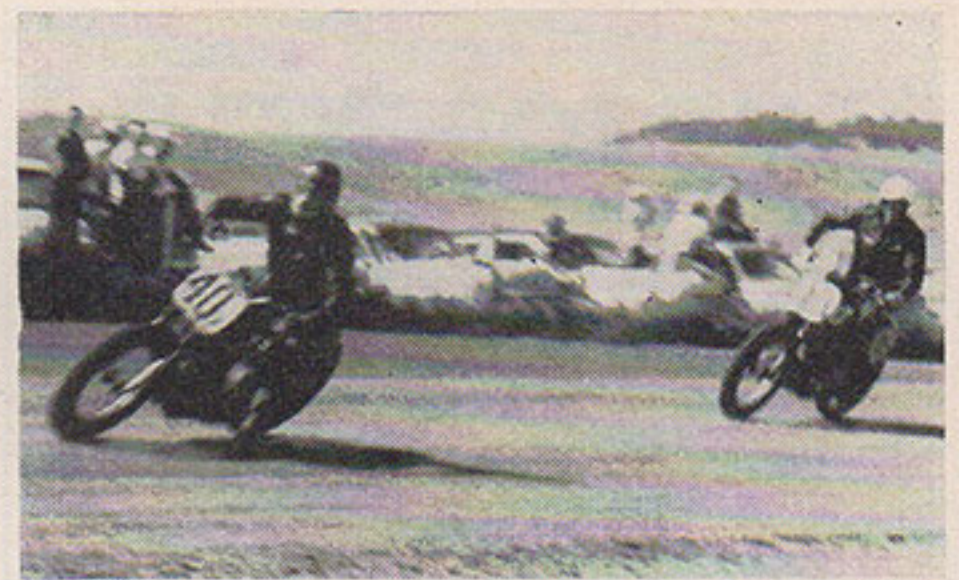

Middle Atlantic Racing

Motorcycle racing in the Middle Atlantic states looks to be the best ever. Hagerstown, Md., resumed bike racing; York, Pa., held its first annual race; Fort Ashby, W. Va., once again saw motorcycles cutting around the track. And, of course, the area is pointing to the biggest of all, the Tobacco Trail Classic to be held Labor Day at Marlboro Raceway in southern Maryland.

Even busier than the Class C riders, it seems, are the lightweights. With something scheduled for every weekend, the lightweight racers are showing the fans more excitement and real honest to goodness thrills than the big bikes — or so the

lightweight fans seem to think.

Lightweight riders (although only a few showed up) got a taste of flat track racing under the arcs each Friday night at Westport Stadium, on the other side of the river from Baltimore. The Baltimore Red Wings, however, will not be holding any more races there, since they evidently didn't see eye to eye with the stadium management. The Red Wings, with a real toughie of a scrambles course at Linthicum (or Westport) are now negotiating for use of a flat track at Dorsey, in Maryland.

Together with the Class C racing at Fort Ashby, the lightweights put on a night-time show. This was the second time some of the localites had a chance to put the small bikes on a flat track.

And now, it looks like the lightweights are going to have another track. Winchester, Va., a third-mile, banked oval, hard-packed clay — and the lightweights were there. Here's the story:

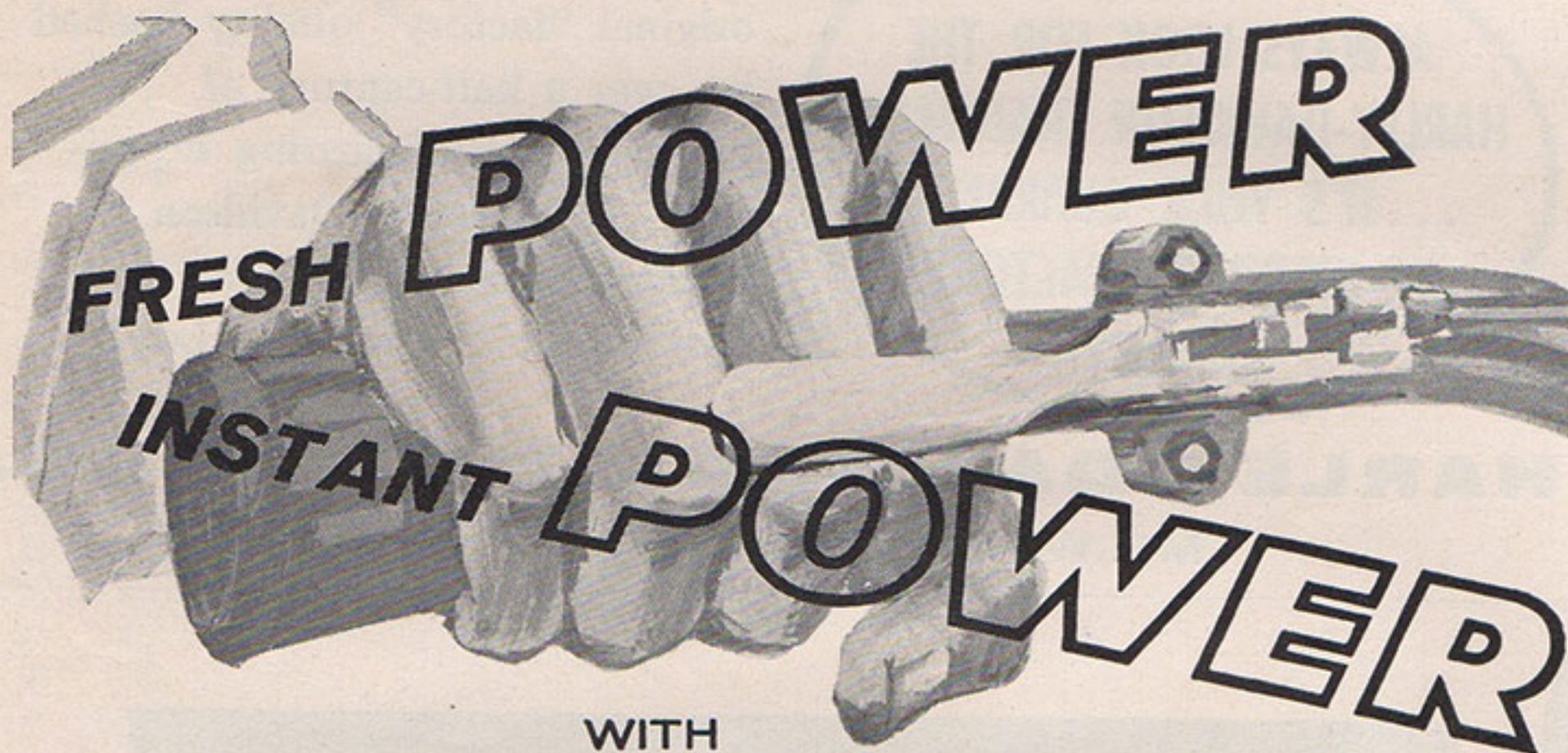
The track was fast, for the last race in July — and the day was hot. There was a good field of riders and it was a colorful show — not only in the hard-fought riding of every race but in the brilliant display of the racing colors the boys wore with blues, reds, yellows, etc. (Let's have more of them).

The Volkmar clan, riding 165 Harley-Davidsons out of Elmer, N.J., were in full form, fighting each other every inch of the way and keeping the crowd on their toes so as not to miss any of the action (that went on all around the track).

And there were other dyed-in-the-wool lightweight racers there, too. Walt McQueen (the only spill of the day, but not too bad at that); Big Bill Sontag; Jimmy Haymes; Norman "Sut" Farris; and others, each representing a club or group.

After a you-pass-me and I'll-pass-you-right-back duel in the heats, Bob Mann (H-D) won the feature 125cc race over Jimmy Somner (Jawa) with Dean Jones (C-Z) coming in a good third. Big Bill Sontag had battery trouble and went out, making this one of the few times this year he hasn't won a trophy.

The 175cc final was the race of the day. The fabulous Volkmarks, Harry, Chick and Horace, put on a display such as you

rarely see — unless you see the Volkmars. Chick won, followed by Harry and then Horace (all on 165 H-D's). Lyle Wilkins (H-D), of Winchester, Va., came in a close fourth. Taking fifth was a "Volkmar" by the name of Joseph Kelly. Kelly rides with the Volkmars and like them.

The big bikes of the lightweights — the 250cc class — put on another rip-roaring final. Despite competition from some of the best, Charles Welty (Tri) won the final with a terrific bit of riding. Charles Wilson, another Triumph rider from Baltimore, took a second, barely in front of Jimmy Haymes who closed hard and fast after having gotten off the starting line in about tenth position. Lap after lap Haymes worked his way up the line, through the pack. He seemed to be stuck in fifth, with a wheel-to-wheel battle with young Dave Wade, but Haymes' experience gained him the third when Dave Wade went too high on the banked west turn. Til Akehurst (ZUN), who led for several laps, finally ended in fifth.

The track at Winchester was in excellent shape, thanks to some fine work with a road scraper just before the race. Cam Dailey refereed a smooth race, adding the popular feature of a handicap series for each class of bike. The crowd filled the stands and filled the air with yells.

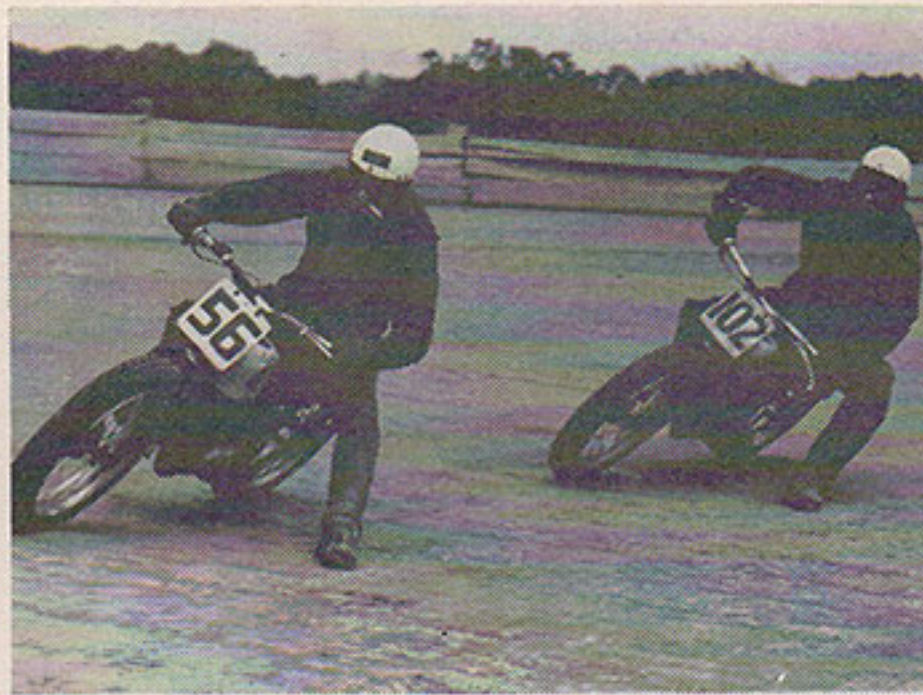
If you've ever been to Winchester, the apple capital, you'll know they're nice people up there, with two fine tracks, a very efficient ambulance crew, excellent care of their tracks, reasonably priced and good food — and luck with the weather.

Coming up is the three-day affair at Marlboro, with lightweights and Class C on pavement. Hanover, Pa., Richmond, Va., Williams Grove, Pa., and Winchester, Va., will each hold another race. Reading, Pa., has one more flat track race this year.

Then the sportsman races will be on in earnest.

District Referees' Official Bulletin

The Resistal Full Jet safety helmet manufactured and distributed by the Joseph Buegeleisen Co. of Detroit, Mich. has been examined, tested and approved for use in AMA competition. This helmet was placed in Group #1. The Protector and Guardian safety helmets, also a Buegeleisen product, were approved for AMA competition and placed in Group #2.

At a recent 3-star Class "A" short track event at Irvington, Neb. there were 47 entries. This has been the largest entry list at any Class "A" short track so far for 1959.

On July 12 at the 3-star "A" hillclimb at Hornell, N.Y. there were 34 hillclimbers entered, the largest entry anywhere in the USA.

A rider was injured recently because a home-made aluminum front wheel axle broke while he was riding in a Class "A" dirt track event. This is an uncalled for hazard. Any rider using unsafe equipment can be disqualified or refused entry.

Ernie Holbrook Obituary

Funeral services for Ernie Holbrook, who died July 6 after a year's illness, were held in Medford, Oregon on July 9; committal was at Jacksonville.



Holbrook Ernie was born at Lakeview, Oregon on July 3, 1910. In 1928 he moved to San Francisco where he began working as a motorcycle mechanic, and in 1933 joined the fraternity, "The Hot Shoe Boys." During WW II he worked as a civilian motorcycle instructor for the Army. Then in 1946 he opened up his own motorcycle shop in Yuba City, Calif. The next year he moved to Medford where he operated the Harley-Davidson S&S.

In 1939 Ernie won the 50 mile TT national championship and the 50 mile state championship District #36 TT at Lodi, Calif. He won the 200 mile National Championship Speedway race at Oakland, Calif. in 1941.

Ernie was a veteran member of the AMA and had been southern Oregon AMA referee for several years.

He is survived by his wife, Ginger; father, G. L. Holbrook of Klamoth Falls; and mother, Mrs. Agnes Tooney, of Denis, Nev.

H. P. Goedicke of Marion, Ohio and his son, Herb Goedicke, flat track motor-

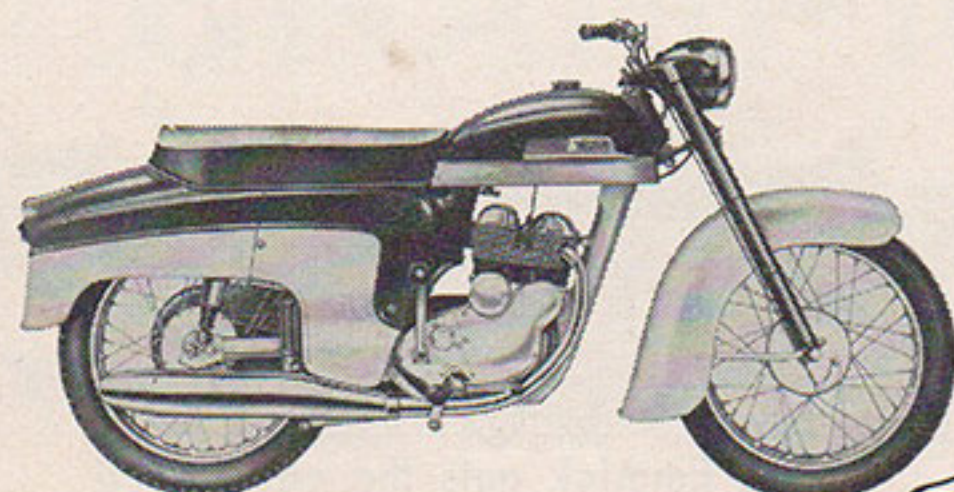
cycle racer for the past four seasons, are quitting the racing game. The reason, they explained, is that the cost of racing is too great for them to remain a part of it.

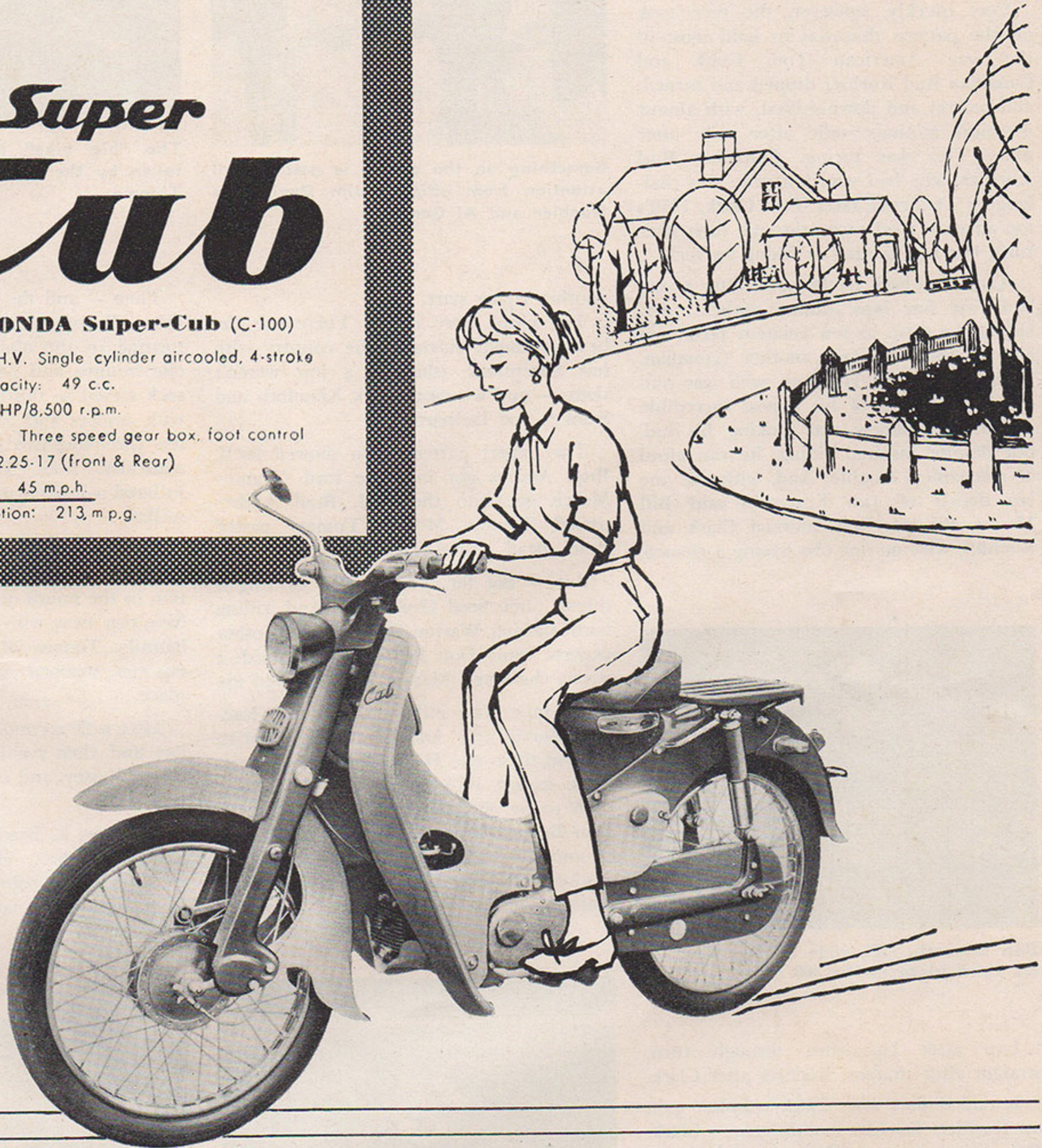

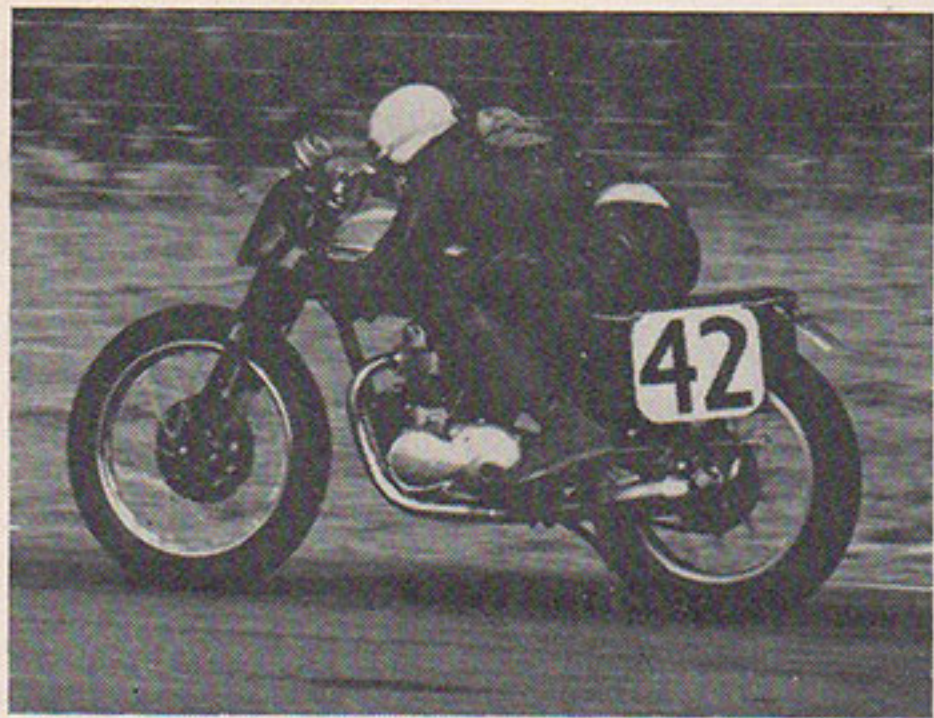

and they roared off. No spills on the first turn.

Two bikes stalled. Jim Koplinski. Bill Massey. Of all people, these two racers were favored to be high up, and perhaps one and two. After one minute, Florida racer Massey got off to a start. The entire field came around, and Koplinski got his start.

Very quickly, however, the race took on the pattern that was to hold most of the way. American Tom Clark and Canadian Bud Koehler dipped and turned, cranked on and down-shifted, with almost identical motions, mile after mile after mile. This was racing. Canadian Bud Koehler, who had won last year, was challenging Tennessee racer Tom Clark, 1959's top amateur road racer, through turn after turn, but not gaining or losing an inch.

And, from back in the pack, after a very bad first few laps, came another rider, riding the turns as few amateur racers are able — Don Haddow, another Canadian. The fans spotted Haddow, who was outstanding because of his almost incredible cornering. Haddow was making his bid, but despite inspired riding, he ran afoul of mechanical trouble. And, with the one lap deficit of Jim Koplinski and Bill Massey, the race was between Clark and Koehler, with no one else having a chance.

Lap after lap, turn through turn, straight after straight, Koehler after Clark.

It ended that way. Clark couldn't gain on Koehler; Koehler couldn't catch Clark. But — it was a race. Very quietly, Maryland rider Paul Kitchen steamed into third place, followed by Billy Britain and Wilfred Furlong. The expected duel of Furlong and the leaders, plus Charlie Kuster, didn't come off. Kuster spilled (although he later got up) and Furlong couldn't overtake the flying bikes of Britain and Kitchen.

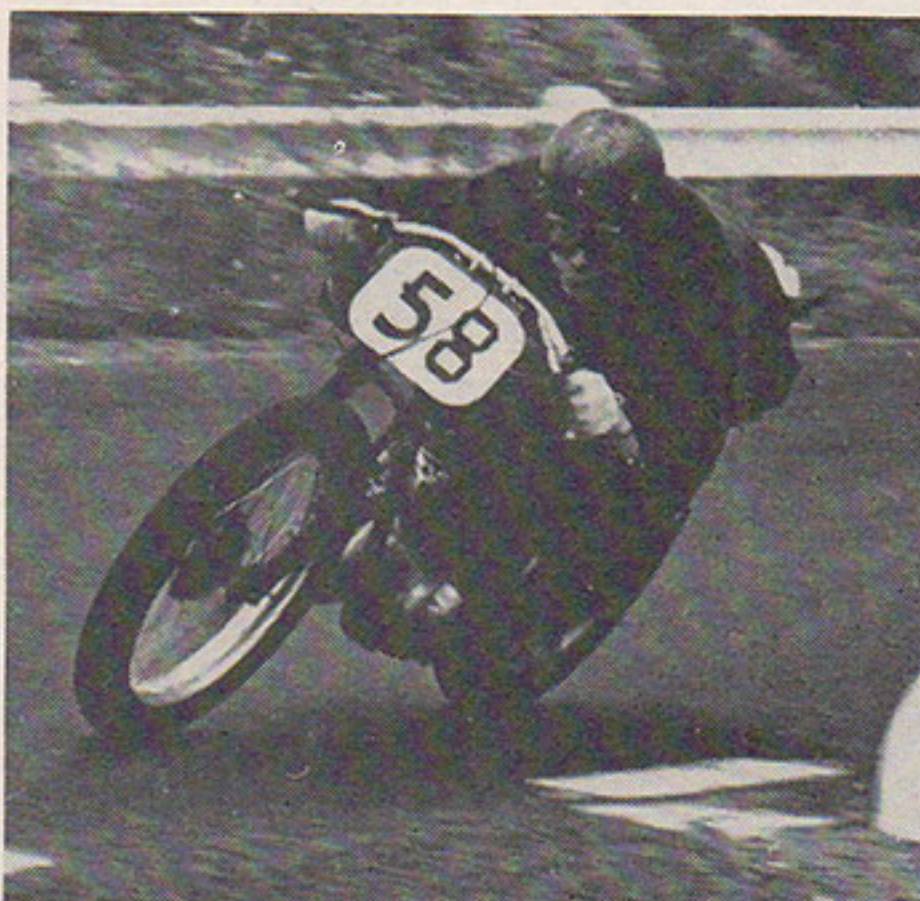
another flying start.

The chips were down. These are the best pavement riders in the country with few exceptions (that is, a few weren't there — and we mean Dick Klamfoth and Smokey Joe Leonard).

The expert pattern soon showed itself. Brad Andres got into the lead. Tommy Morris got into the lead. Brad Andres passed Tommy Morris. Tommy passed Brad. Brad passed Tommy.

But — not far behind, and showing a threat, came Seed Hedgecock. And, riding hard, passing Warren Sherwood and other experts, came Don Burnett. Then, with a strong challenge, Marvin Twigg moved up.

For mile after mile it was Andres leading Morris and Andres drafting Morris. Behind these two Harley-Davidson experts came expert BSA rider Seed Hedgecock, soon to be challenged by Triumph rider Don Burnett, who was in turn challenged by another BSA rider, Marvin Twigg. But, Andres and Morris drew ahead to a commanding lead.

Then — and the stopwatches will prove this — Burnett started gaining, and he was turning in the almost incredible time of one minute and 34 seconds. But Hedgecock stayed in third. Twigg gained. Then, with Andres and Morris trading the lead, the three-four-five position changed dramatically. Both Twigg and Hedgecock suffered a broken primary chain, and both spilled.

The race drew to a close. Andres took the lead. He turned it on, leaving a question in the minds of many — could Andres have run away with the race? Andres won, handily. Tommy Morris, riding a marvelous race, steamed across to take the second place.

After a 29 second pit stop, Don Burnett lost and then regained third place from Chuck Bassey, and charged in for the third spot.

That was it. Brad Andres had gone up against the best. He won. He has won great victories before. Judging from his almost effortless riding, he'll win again.

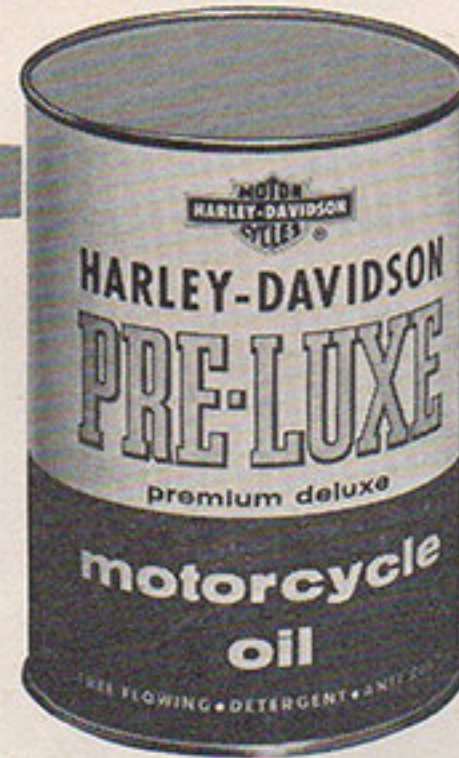

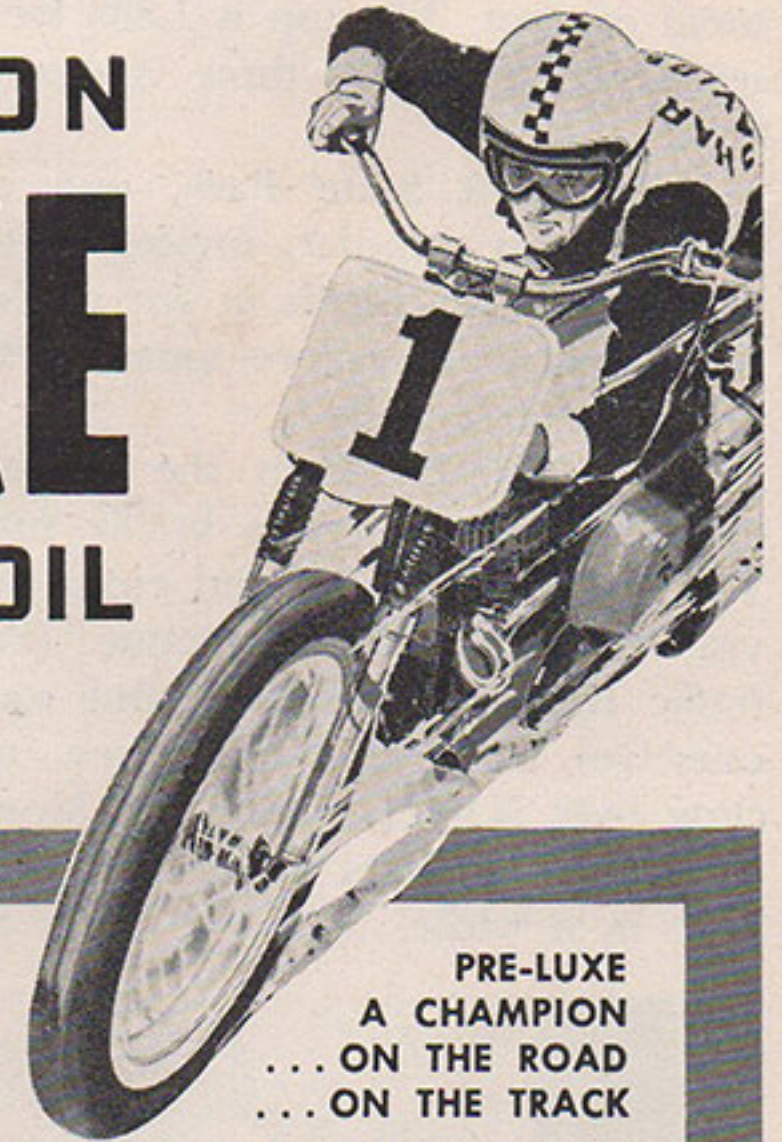

of endless mountains and a lush valley which is interrupted by frequent "lakes". But, they're not "lakes", we discover, when our drive joins NP-511. It's one big body of water known as Wanaque Reservoir. We travel close to some of its 30 miles of picturesque shoreline and pass a hundred-foot-high dam as we motorcycle south to NJ-23 at Riverdale. Highway NJ-23 will take us all the way to Port Jervis, N. Y.

Hamburg, the sign tells us, is the home of Gingerbread Castle. This creation is already more famous than most of the medieval castles, and better known than most of the castles found in storybooks. They tell us that "kids from 6 to 60" never go through Hamburg without paying a visit to Gingerbread Castle, a \$250,000.00 fairyland introduced by "Hansel" and "Gretel" guides. The brookside picnic area is free!

If you like motorcycle hill climbs, come on up to High Point with us. There are none of the dangers, but most of the thrills in this one. The black-top road winds up through heavily-wooded Kittatinny Mountains to reach the highest spot in New Jersey. And for a view that will leave you gasping, you might try climbing the 220-foot High Point Monument on foot. The top is 1,803 feet above sea level. Parts of three States can be seen.

High Point State Park, one of New Jersey's most popular, invites us to swim in Lake Marcia, picnic in one of the many shady spots, or explore some of its many miles of forest trails.

Taking NJ-23 down the western Kittatinny slope, we cross briefly into New York State, join US-6 and enter Port Jervis. At South Maple Avenue (there's a traffic light) we left-turn and soon find ourselves back in New Jersey, motorcycling over NJ-521, bound for Montague.

Each of us likes to get off by himself once in a while, leave the trials and tri-

bulations of life behind, and drink in the beauties of a country road which has not yet felt the full impact of civilization. That's just what we're doing right now, for much of this black-top NJ-521 was once The Old Mine Road.

When the early Dutch settled in this area, around 1650, they developed a copper mine down near Delaware Water Gap. The Old Mine Road, built to accommodate oxen-drawn wagons heading for Esopus on the Hudson (now Kingston) with loads of ore, became the region's Main Street. Its 104 miles make it the oldest thoroughfare of any extent in America. It still winds its picturesque way through some of the most beautiful countryside in the East . . . especially at this time of the year and in the fall.

One couldn't find a more pleasant place to ride a motorcycle. The road climbs mountainsides, explores beautiful valleys covered with fields of green pastureland, and frequently winds alongside of the Delaware River itself. Many of the old stone houses which stand along NJ-521 today, were built by the calloused hands of the early Dutch settlers. These houses could tell many a true hair-raising Indian story if they could talk. Stone markers, old grave stones and wagon-worn ruts add atmosphere.

Just a "stone's throw away" from The Old Mine Road is Stokes State Forest. What could be more enjoyable, after a long ride, than a quiet picnic lunch surrounded by some of Stokes' 12,429 acres of undisturbed forest. And then to be able to take a refreshing dip in the cool waters of Lake Ocquittunk or a relaxing stretch on the sandy beach. It's all free, including use of the bathhouse to change.

This is a place where you can spend a lifetime exploring the winding overhung roads or endless trails which always lead to the unexpected. One of them, for example, ends up on top of Sunrise Mountain which offers a sensational view of Sussex County and nearby Pennsylvania

with its Pocono Mountains.

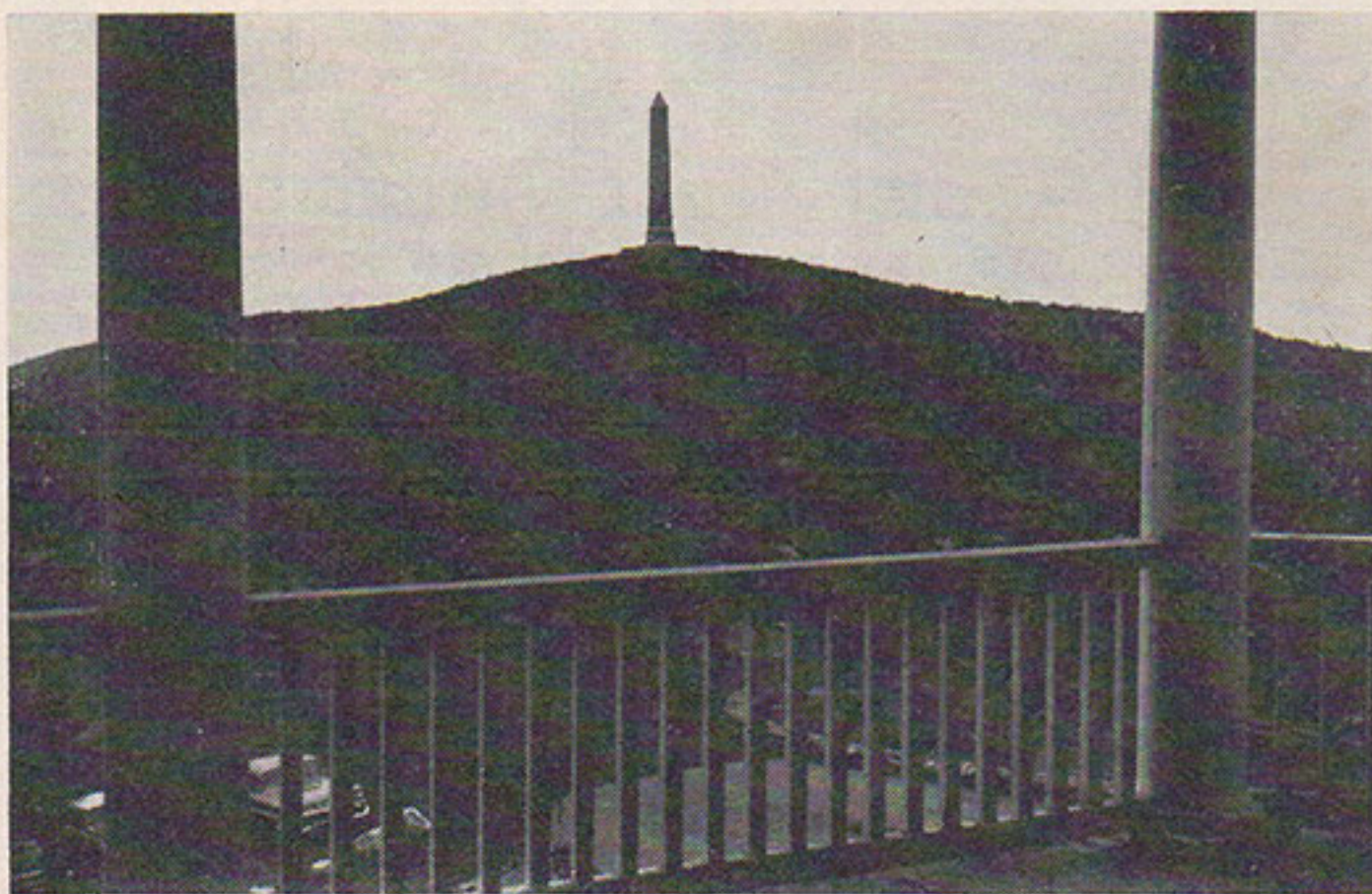
To reach our next destination we drop down to Newton, Blairstown and Columbia on the Delaware. Here we turn our motorcycle north on US-611 to parallel the swiftly flowing river. The narrow cleavage in the Kittatinny Range comes closer and closer until the full enormity of Nature's handiwork bursts upon us. Our wide modern motorway winds through Delaware Water Gap itself, as towering mountains crowd us from both sides. A modern toll bridge carries us from the Jersey side across the river into Pennsylvania.

Our return route is even more impressive, for we follow ALT. US-611 down the Pennsylvania side, paralleling the curving tracks of the Lackawanna Railroad and the river, through the Gap to the broad valley which lies to the south. We park our motorcycle in the spacious area across the road from the refreshment stand opposite Indian Head and take several pictures of the legendary promontory from this excellent vantage point.

At Portland we cross back into New Jersey (toll bridge), then head for Lambertville on the lower Delaware. At Oxford we pause to photograph and inspect the ruins of a blast furnace which made cannon balls for more than a century. We find Flemington's cut glass plant a very interesting stop.

At Lambertville we swing south on NJ-29 to motorcycle along the winding east bank of the Delaware River. At times, only the narrow feeder of the old abandoned Delaware & Raritan Canal separates our motorway from the important waterway. A low falls and plenty of picnic possibilities add to the interest of this route.

Washington's Crossing is an important location in the history of our Nation. Down there on the riverbank, Washington's poorly-fed and poorly-clad band of dedicated American patriots completed their hazardous Christmas Night crossing of the ice-choked Delaware, in 1776, to surprise

and rout an army of Hessian soldiers celebrating nearby. The attractive McKonkey Ferry House, with its interesting museum items, is where Washington is said to have found shelter that eventful night.

The New Jersey Turnpike is our magic motor carpet from Trenton south. Wide lanes of asphaltic concrete carry us effortlessly around the heavy traffic of the Camden-Philadelphia area. This vital superway runs through the heart of New Jersey's corridor which connects New York City and Philadelphia; the Turnpike then continues south, to end at a Delaware River Bridge crossing just south of Wilmington. We ride to the Swedesboro Interchange (No. 2). Highway NJ-77 is then our roadway leading deep into South Jersey.

Long before we reach the heart of the fabulous Seabrook frozen-food empire, we see evidence of the vastness of this enterprise which is said to be the largest vegetable farming and processing operation in the world. The vegetables from many of these farms which we are now passing, end up in a supermarket's frozen food showcase bearing the familiar Seabrook label. What makes the Seabrook Empire so fantastic? Well, modern methods of harvesting and processing produce from the more than 50,000 acres . . . plus an uncanny "know-how" of modern methods of mechanized farming . . . all add up to an annual sales record of \$30,000,000.00!

With the aid of US-40 we reach the opposite side of South Jersey. We see the impressive Atlantic City skyline across the salt marshes long before we actually reach the alluring city. Soon we are a part of the wonderment and excitement that goes to make up "The World's Playground".

The boardwalk is an ideal introduction to such fascinations as the jumbo-size ferris wheel and countless boardwalk shops overflowing with interesting things to buy or amusements to try. Then there are the long piers — The Million Dollar Pier, The Steel Pier and others — which jut far out into the Atlantic. *And*, we mustn't forget to buy a box of that delicious salt water taffy.

Motorcyclists find the Garden State Parkway much to their liking. Its 173 smooth miles are just about the safest toll road miles in existence. The Parkway generally serves the highly suburbanized areas of Northern New Jersey and the popular Jersey coast.

Long Beach Island, six miles at sea (via the Parkway's Manahawkin Exit) is a delightful retreat. At Beach Haven, we go aboard the *Lucy Evelyn*. This colorful authentic three-masted schooner, once sailed the high seas to Africa and beyond.

Up on the northern tip of Long Beach Island, we park our motorcycle and walk across the picturesque sand dunes to photograph "Old Barney", one of the Coast's most famous landmarks. For 69 years the 168-foot lighthouse sent light beams 30 miles to sea to warn shipping away from the treacherous Barnegat Shoals, known as "The Graveyard of the Atlantic".

Working our way up the coast, our next stop is at one of the Garden State's finest resorts . . . Asbury Park. There's always plenty to do in this popular seashore city with the long boardwalk. Many of the "name" bands have played in the palatial Casino, just across the board walk from the irresistible music of a huge merry-go-round on the shores of Wesley Lake.

Its quite an experience to walk up the broad boardwalk to the Convention Hall and beyond. The sand-surf-and-sun combination makes the beach seem especially inviting, and a swim in the blue Atlantic means plenty of fun.

But the Jersey Shore is not without its tragedy. The *Morro Castle*, fabulous modern liner returning from a Havana Cruise, caught fire just off the coast, almost within sight of its destination. When it drifted ashore here at Asbury Park on September 8, 1934, nothing remained but the charred wreckage. 125 lives were lost. Three years later, the sprawling dirigible base at nearby Lakehurst was the scene of another tragic fire when the zeppelin *Hindenburg* burned at its mooring mast after a trans-Atlantic crossing by air.

The coastal road from Asbury Park to Sandy Hook presents an endless marine panorama. Soon after crossing the big highway bridge over the Shrewsbury at Highlands, we head for the hills, *up* the steep road leading to historic Twin Lights perched on the highest point on the Atlantic Coast. In the shadow of the 97-year-old lighthouse which once reached its life-saving finger of light 22 miles to sea, we enjoy a marine view which doesn't stop until it reaches the distant New York City skyline. We stop in the museum to see the interesting collection of marine items.

Returning to NJ-36, we soon make a right turn to follow Ocean Blvd. (better known as "Scenic Drive") along the top of the Highlands. Frequent overlooks provide plenty of room for parking our motorcycles and photographing the dramatic views of New York Harbor, Sandy Hook and the nearby Atlantic, the New York City skyline again, and even far-away Coney Island.

With the help of NJ-36, NJ-35, and the towering Edison Bridge, we reach the Garden State Parkway again. This time it takes us north, through the heavily congested areas of Union and Essex Counties.

In East Orange, we leave the Parkway at Exit #146 and take Park Avenue west

to Main Street (in West Orange). At the Thomas A. Edison laboratory, we see the actual sprigs of ragweed he was experimenting with at the time of the great inventor's death, trying to find a new way to create synthetic rubber. And in Edison's Library, we see the big clock, its hands permanently stopped at the exact time of his death. Nearby, in an unnoticed alcove, is the cot which the great American used for brief rest periods when working around-the-clock on a stubborn problem.

In nearby Caldwell, opposite the Erie Railroad station, we enter a simple frame dwelling for a very worthwhile visit to the birthplace of another great American — Grover Cleveland. We discover many unusual things, including the quaint cradle of the baby boy who was to become our 22nd and 24th President, his White House chair, and even a piece of his wedding cake!

From Caldwell our route takes us to Highway US-46, a busy carpet of concrete which leads right to the George Washington Bridge and uptown New York City.

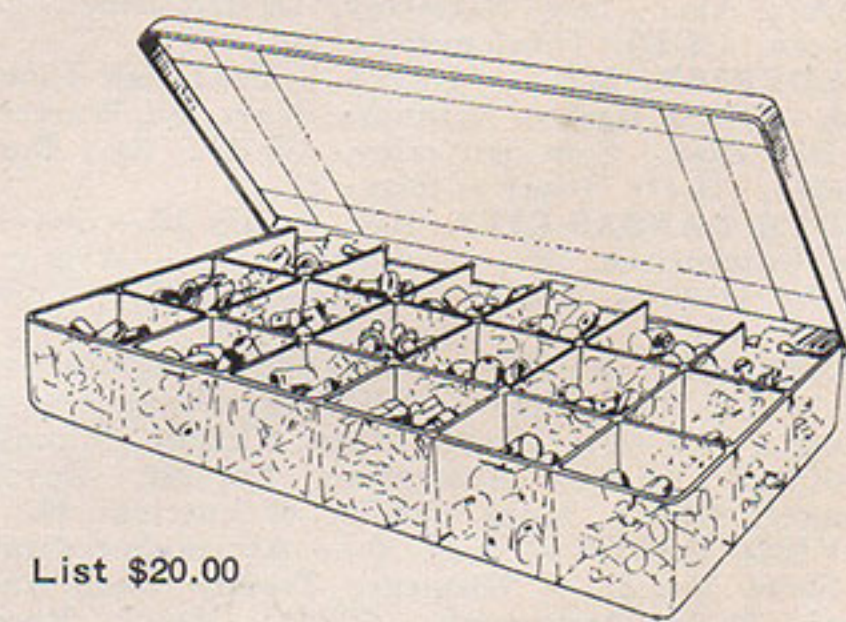
